Amendment to HB 1535-FN

Amend the bill by replacing all after the enacting clause with the following:

- 1 New Section; Retirement System; Cost of Living Adjustment; Supplemental Allowance. Amend RSA 100-A by inserting after section 41-e the following new section:
 - 100-A:41-f Annual Cost of Living Adjustment; Supplemental Allowance.
- I. Any retired member of the New Hampshire retirement system or any of its predecessor systems, who has been retired for at least 60 months prior to or on July 1, 2022, or any beneficiary of such member who is receiving an allowance, shall be entitled to receive a cost of living adjustment (COLA) as a supplemental allowance, on the retired member's first anniversary date occurring on or after July 1, 2022. The amount of such supplemental allowance shall be 1 1/2 percent of a member's or beneficiary's annual retirement allowance which is \$30,000 or less, or otherwise 1 1/2 percent of the first \$30,000 of a retired member's or beneficiary's allowance.
- II. The total actuarial cost of the supplemental allowance under paragraph I, as determined by the actuary and certified by the board of trustees of the retirement system, shall be terminally funded from the state general fund. The sum necessary is hereby appropriated to the board of trustees. The governor is authorized to draw a warrant for said sum out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
- III. The supplemental allowance shall become a permanent addition to the beneficiary's base retirement allowance and shall be included in the monthly annuity paid to the retired member, or to the member's beneficiary if the member is deceased and the beneficiary is receiving an allowance under RSA 100-A:8, 100-A:9, 100-A:12, 100-A:13, or similar provisions of predecessor systems.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill establishes a cost of living adjustment in 2022 to be paid by the retirement system on the first \$30,000 of a retired member's or beneficiary's allowance. The cost of this supplemental allowance is paid from the state general fund.

TESTIMONY

Rep. Infantine, co-sponsor, introduced the bill and spoke in support. He noted that while transfers within state agencies happen without delay, new hiring process takes so long that by the time a job offer might be made, the candidate has found some other position. He said there was no "agenda" with this study committee – no intended outcome. He described the committee as "innocuous" – just seeking a solution. He took Committee questions regarding the cause of the delay, how many openings are there.

Rep. Caplan spoke in support. He described the hiring process, spoke of the job market and that we are losing good candidates. He took a Committee question.

Rep. Sullivan spoke in support. He spoke of the need to hire qualified personnel and that bill was bipartisan. He said we need answers to streamline the process. He took a Committee question as to whether there was a difference between hiring in the private sector and public sector.

Carolyn Russell, Senior Operational Analyst with DAS, said that she has been embedded with the division of personnel for 2.5 years working on modernization of the division. She took Committee questions noting that there was a 19% vacancy rate and described current efforts in the division to streamline. She said that her department would work with such a study committee.

ANALYSIS

This bill establishes a committee to study the hiring process used by state agencies.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT

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establishing a committee to study the hiring processes used by state agencies.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study the hiring processes of New Hampshire state agencies and whether the process has a direct impact on the state of New Hampshire's ability to hire employees in a reasonable time frame.
 - 2 Membership and Compensation.
 - I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:
- (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
 - (b) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
- II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties of the committee.
- 3 Duties. The committee shall study the hiring process of New Hampshire state agencies. The study shall include consideration of the complexity of the initial application for job openings at state agencies, the hiring and on-boarding process, and the turnaround time from the initial application to the start date, and if these various aspects of the hiring processes impact the state of New Hampshire's ability to fill vacant job positions. The committee may solicit information and testimony from any individual or entity the committee deems relevant to its study..
- 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2022.
 - 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
