HB1470 Requires Voting Machines to show the number of Overvotes for each Race on the Ballot The Windham vote showed a machine error, when compared with the hand recount. The overvotes were incorrectly registered by the machines for those individuals. We need to know if the machines are not functioning properly.

HB1527 Voting Machine Paper Tapes & Results for each Machine, for each Town Published on NH SOS Web Page.

I learned first hand how time consuming and confusing it is to go to my Town Hall to request the Voting Machine Tapes. It took several trips to get all the information, since I was given copies of duplicate tapes, but not all the originals. It is imperative to have access to this data to ensure election integrity for each town.

HB1496 Mandate Voter Checklists are Available in Spreadsheet Format Allow for the access of voter checklists to allow the public to verify the integrity of elections.

HB1252 Prohibits Any Business Organization That Receives Grants from the State of NH from Making Political Contributions to Candidates and Political Committees

HOUSE BILL 1527-FN

AN ACT relative to the storage of total vote counts produced by electronic ballot counting

devices.

COMMITTEE: Election Law

ANALYSIS

This bill requires local election officials to photograph or scan the receipts of total vote counts produced by electronic ballot counting devices, and requires the secretary of state to publish such photographs or scans on its website.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to the storage of total vote counts produced by electronic ballot counting devices.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 New Section; Election Procedure; Preservation of Electronic Ballot Counting Device Vote 2 Tallies; Publication by Secretary of State. Amend RSA 659 by inserting after section 103 the 3 following new section:
 - 659:104 Electronic Ballot Counting Device Receipts.

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- I. Immediately after an election, local election officials in any political subdivision that utilizes an electronic ballot counting device shall scan or photograph in their entirety the transaction log report, the zero totals report, and the election results report that includes the options settings, the sort settings, and the tally settings for each such device for that election. Election officials shall retain such reports indefinitely and shall forward the photographs or scans to the secretary of state.
- II. The secretary of state shall publish on the department of state's Internet website every scan or photograph received pursuant to paragraph I for each election. If a political subdivision does not utilize electronic ballot counting devices, that information shall be published to state such fact.
- III. The secretary of state shall publish on the department of state's Internet website, a publicly available spreadsheet document for each town that lists the data contained in every scan or photograph of the election results report received pursuant to paragraph I for each town's election. The spreadsheet shall keep the results from each device separate from the other machines, and shall be available for the public to download. If a political subdivision does not utilize such devices, that information shall be published to state such fact.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill would require local election officials to photograph or scan the receipts of total vote counts produced by electronic ballot counting devices after any election and forward the images to the Secretary of State for posting in a database on the Department of State's website. The Department of State would also be required to publish a public spreadsheet on their website containing all digital data received from towns.

The Department of State indicates there would be an indeterminable increase in General Fund expenditures as the Department would need additional software enhancements to transfer data from scanned images to digital images on their websites as well as ensuring these postings are ADA compliant. Lastly, the Department states that to the extent towns do not yet have the technology to comply with this bill the State would have to provide the equipment.

The New Hampshire Municipal Association states there will be an indeterminable increase to local expenditures as the additional requirements in the bill for localities will require additional time by election officials on election nights resulting in increase personnel costs. The amount of increase in expenditures will vary by town

It is assumed the fiscal impact would not occur until FY 2023.
