

**Statement by Gilles Bissonnette, ACLU-NH Legal Director**  
**House Education Committee**  
**ACLU-NH Testimony on HB1576**  
**Hearing: February 8, 2022**

I submit this testimony on behalf of the American Civil Liberties Union of New Hampshire (“ACLU-NH”), a non-partisan, non-profit organization working to protect civil liberties for over 50 years. HB1576 would repeal last year’s “banned concepts act.” We prefer that this Committee instead adopt HB1090. However, to the extent this Committee is not inclined to adopt HB1090, we respectfully urge the Committee to vote HB1576 *ought to pass*, as the banned concepts act is unconstitutionally vague and is being challenged in New Hampshire federal court in two lawsuits.

**I. The Ambiguities of the Banned Concepts Act and its Penalties.**

The banned concepts act is so unclear and vague that it fails to provide necessary guidance to educators about what they can and cannot include in their courses. This ambiguity invites arbitrary and discriminatory enforcement.

The banned concepts act essentially contains four of the ten “banned concepts” that were in President Trump’s September 22, 2020 Executive Order. The Executive Office of the President’s September 28, 2020 memorandum implementing this Order specifically referenced the third banned concept (which is in New Hampshire’s banned concepts act)—namely, that “an individual, by virtue of his or her race or sex, is inherently racist, sexist, or oppressive, whether consciously or unconsciously”—and made clear that it was targeting trainings that, for example, use the phrases “white privilege,” “intersectionality,” “systemic racism,” “racial humility,” and “unconscious bias.”

On December 22, 2020, a federal court partially enjoined the Executive Order, in part, on the ground that the plaintiffs were likely to succeed on their vagueness challenge. *See Santa Cruz Lesbian & Gay Cmty. Ctr. v. Trump*, 508 F. Supp. 3d 521, 543 (N.D. Cal. 2020). The district court found that the Executive Order’s banned concepts are “so vague that it is impossible for Plaintiffs to determine what conduct is prohibited.” Despite this decision in *Santa Cruz*, the banned concepts act in New Hampshire includes four of the ten banned concepts from President Trump’s Executive Order.

Rather than curing these ambiguities identified in *Santa Cruz*, the banned concepts act imposes penalties for violating its vague provisions. One remedy for a perceived violation is a civil action in Superior Court against a government entity (including a school district)—and potentially even the employee—for damages and equitable relief, including an injunction to stop the instruction of or training on the banned concept.<sup>1</sup> The private right of action afforded to “[a]ny person aggrieved by an act made unlawful” under the banned concepts act serves to compound the chilling effect of the law.<sup>2</sup> For example, under RSA 193:40 III, a student (or the parent of a student) assigned a book perceived as being prohibited by the banned concepts act could file a Superior Court lawsuit against the teacher’s school and potentially the teacher themselves.

The act also contemplates especially harsh and punitive sanctions for educators. In particular, the act states that “[v]iolation of this section by an educator shall be considered a violation of the educator code of conduct that justifies disciplinary sanction by the state board of education.” RSA 193:40, III; *see also* RSA 193:40, V (establishing that this section extends to “[a]dministrators, specialists, and teachers”). Violations of the Educator Code of Conduct can lead to the occupational and professional “death penalty” of revoking an educator’s license to work in the state.

## **II. The Banned Concepts Act Chills Discussions and Instruction on Race and Gender That Are Critical to an Informed Citizenry and Promoting a Sense of Belonging.**

Because of this vague language and stiff penalties, some educators will inevitably avoid important topics concerning race and gender because they fear being the subject of a complaint or lawsuit from an angry parent or student who does not like what is in their curriculum.

For example, is Tiffany Jewell’s book *This Book is Anti-Racist* banned under the act? Is the book *Stamped (For Kids): Racism, Antiracism, and You* banned under the act? No one knows, and the State will not provide concrete answers as to whether specific texts are covered or not. As a result, in order to avoid the act’s penalties, teachers are currently pulling books from staff and course instruction out of a fear of liability—even if these books may not necessarily be covered by the act. In other words, books are essentially being banned out of a fear of the banned concepts act.

These discussions on race and gender are critically important. This is for at least two reasons. *First*, the act’s chill of education focusing on race, gender, and DEI concepts harms all Granite Staters because the inclusion of such concepts in classrooms provides a multitude of benefits for students and society at large. Student body diversity—and the resultant diversity in views and perspectives that flows from such diverse students’ participation—improves critical thinking and problem solving, increases cross-racial understanding, reduces stereotypes and prejudices, and develops leadership and critical thinking skills and many other skills necessary to thrive in an increasingly diverse society.<sup>3</sup> These benefits manifest for all students.

*Second*, these discussions of race and gender are particularly important as New Hampshire rapidly becomes more diverse. The 2020 census indicated that—while New Hampshire’s population grew by a modest 4.6% during the past decade—the number of residents who are people of color increased by 74.4% to 176,900 in 2020. Black, Hispanic, and other people of color now represent 12.8% (176,900) of the state’s population compared to 7.5% (101,400) in 2010. This diversity is particularly prevalent in the southern part of New Hampshire. For example, the population of Manchester and Nashua was 98% White in 1980 according to census data. Manchester now is 85% White. Nashua now is 82% White. As the Carsey School of Public Policy at the University of New Hampshire explained, “children are at the leading edge of the state’s growing diversity.”<sup>4</sup> The *Union Leader* also recently reported that “more than 2 of every 5 children in Manchester and Nashua hail from families of color,” and that, “[i]n 30 years, Manchester’s youngest generation has shifted from 94% White in 1990 to 57% last year.”<sup>5</sup> Instruction on race and gender, including DEI concepts, serves to close existing opportunity gaps and inequalities faced by students

of color in New Hampshire and other historically marginalized groups. It also helps these students to feel a better sense of belonging in New Hampshire.

### **III. The Harm of Censorship, Even of Ideas We Do Not Like.**

Lastly, the banned concepts act is, put simply, about censorship in schools. Censorship is a dangerous concept. In schools, we should be allowing ideas to be discussed—even those we do not agree with—so students are exposed to alternative perspectives and taught to evaluate issues for themselves. This skill set is necessary to educate the next generation of adults who have critical thinking skills and can meaningfully participate in our democracy.

But through the act's chill, students are (and have been) robbed of the information, ideas, and instructional approaches that would prepare them to engage in the robust dialogue and analytical thinking necessary to effectively function as citizens in America's democratic system. Our schools are "nurseries of democracy." See *Mahanoy Area Sch. Dist. v. B. L. ex rel. Levy*, 141 S. Ct. 2038, 2046 (2021).

For these reasons, the ACLU-NH supports HB1576 to the extent this Committee is not inclined to adopt HB1090.

To correct the purposefully vague 'divisive concepts' law. Factual and honest teaching of history is necessary for students to become informed and well-rounded adults. The teaching of history plays a large role in determining people's perceptions about others as well as testing one's own moral sense. Society cannot learn from past mistakes if society does not know and/or have accurate knowledge about them.

HB1576-FN - Title: repealing the law relative to certain discrimination in public workplaces and education.

New England has a flawed past with finding the truth and acting on it. One instance of it involved determining if people, fellow citizens, were witches. And then after a trial before a judge and statements taken from other citizens deciding whether the defendant was, in fact, a witch and subject to the penalty of hanging or not and exonerated.

People in early New England were persecuted for witchcraft, and not just in Salem, Mass. The Plymouth (Mass.) Colony made it a crime to “form a solemn compact with the devil by way of witchcraft.” Salem’s witchcraft hysteria was the most spectacular. Many people faced charges, and 20 died at the executioner’s hand. In Connecticut, witch hysteria took hold 45 years before Salem began its mass executions. The colony formally tried 43 people for witchcraft. Most were acquitted or escaped, but nine men and two women were executed as witches between 1647 and 1663. Hartford, CT had its own mini-witch hysteria, as did many towns scattered throughout New England. By 1715, the laws making witchcraft a capital offense were off the books, and the witchcraft hysteria died down. **For heaven’s sakes, repel this law and remove any semblance of witch hunting among the ranks of dedicated public school teachers - a blot on the reputation of New Hampshire.**

Statement of support on NHHBills 1090 and 1576-FN

To Members of the Education Committee:

Thomas Jefferson, writing to Charles Yancey in 1816, stated the case:

If a nation expects to be ignorant and free in a state of civilization, it expects what never was and never will be. The functionaries of every government have propensities to command at will the liberty and property of their constituents. There is no safe deposit for these but with the people themselves, nor can they be safe with them without information. Where the press is free and every man able to read, all is safe.

And to Pierre Samuel Dupont de Nemours in the same year he wrote:

Enlighten the people generally, and tyranny and oppressions of body and mind will vanish like evil spirits at the dawn of day....I believe it (the human condition) susceptible of much improvement, and most of all in matters of government and religion, and that the diffusion of knowledge among the people is to be the instrument by which it is to be effected.

The historical record is clear: the first black slave to set foot in Portsmouth, NH, was back in 1645. Who was he? Where did he come from? How did he get here? What happened to him? Why did Portsmouth become a portal for slaves captured in Africa and transported to America? How could our forebears even contemplate—let alone tolerate, let alone condone, justify, support—the very concept of slavery? Given our Declaration of Independence (authored by Jefferson), given the words we state reciting our Salute to the Flag, given Articles 1 and 2 of our Bill of Rights in the NH Constitution, are not these questions of the greatest urgency for examination in our public schools? And are not the teachers who are educated to enlighten the minds of our young people on these very questions—and who are licensed to do just that pursuant to rules approved by the State Board of Education—the proper ones to judge how best to go about it? Jefferson again: a nation cannot be both ignorant and free. Teachers must be free to teach—to elucidate the historical record—and their students free to learn the truth. It is the truth which sets us free. And will only keep us free if we are brave enough to face it.

Hearing: February 8, 2022**

I submit this testimony on behalf of the American Civil Liberties Union of New Hampshire (“ACLU-NH”), a non-partisan, non-profit organization working to protect civil liberties for over 50 years. HB1576 would repeal last year’s “banned concepts act.” We prefer that this Committee instead adopt HB1090. However, to the extent this Committee is not inclined to adopt HB1090, we respectfully urge the Committee to vote HB1576 *ought to pass*, as the banned concepts act is unconstitutionally vague and is being challenged in New Hampshire federal court in two lawsuits.

**I. The Ambiguities of the Banned Concepts Act and its Penalties.**

The banned concepts act is so unclear and vague that it fails to provide necessary guidance to educators about what they can and cannot include in their courses. This ambiguity invites arbitrary and discriminatory enforcement.

The banned concepts act essentially contains four of the ten “banned concepts” that were in President Trump’s September 22, 2020 Executive Order. The Executive Office of the President’s September 28, 2020 memorandum implementing this Order specifically referenced the third banned concept (which is in New Hampshire’s banned concepts act)—namely, that “an individual, by virtue of his or her race or sex, is inherently racist, sexist, or oppressive, whether consciously or unconsciously”—and made clear that it was targeting trainings that, for example, use the phrases “white privilege,” “intersectionality,” “systemic racism,” “racial humility,” and “unconscious bias.”

On December 22, 2020, a federal court partially enjoined the Executive Order, in part, on the ground that the plaintiffs were likely to succeed on their vagueness challenge. *See Santa Cruz Lesbian & Gay Cmty. Ctr. v. Trump*, 508 F. Supp. 3d 521, 543 (N.D. Cal. 2020). The district court found that the Executive Order’s banned concepts are “so vague that it is impossible for Plaintiffs to determine what conduct is prohibited.” Despite this decision in *Santa Cruz*, the banned concepts act in New Hampshire includes four of the ten banned concepts from President Trump’s Executive Order.

Rather than curing these ambiguities identified in *Santa Cruz*, the banned concepts act imposes penalties for violating its vague provisions. One remedy for a perceived violation is a civil action in Superior Court against a government entity (including a school district)—and potentially even the employee—for damages and equitable relief, including an injunction to stop the instruction of or training on the banned concept.<sup>1</sup> The private right of action afforded to “[a]ny person aggrieved by an act made unlawful” under the banned concepts act serves to compound the chilling effect of the law.<sup>2</sup> For example, under RSA 193:40 III, a student (or the parent of a student) assigned a book perceived as being prohibited by the banned concepts act could file a Superior Court lawsuit against the teacher’s school and potentially the teacher themselves.

The act also contemplates especially harsh and punitive sanctions for educators. In particular, the act states that “[v]iolation of this section by an educator shall be considered a violation of the educator code of conduct that justifies disciplinary sanction by the state board of education.” RSA 193:40, III; *see also* RSA 193:40, V (establishing that this section extends to “[a]dministrators, specialists, and teachers”). Violations of the Educator Code of Conduct can lead to the occupational and professional “death penalty” of revoking an educator’s license to work in the state.

## **II. The Banned Concepts Act Chills Discussions and Instruction on Race and Gender That Are Critical to an Informed Citizenry and Promoting a Sense of Belonging.**

Because of this vague language and stiff penalties, some educators will inevitably avoid important topics concerning race and gender because they fear being the subject of a complaint or lawsuit from an angry parent or student who does not like what is in their curriculum.

For example, is Tiffany Jewell’s book *This Book is Anti-Racist* banned under the act? Is the book *Stamped (For Kids): Racism, Antiracism, and You* banned under the act? No one knows, and the State will not provide concrete answers as to whether specific texts are covered or not. As a result, in order to avoid the act’s penalties, teachers are currently pulling books from staff and course instruction out of a fear of liability—even if these books may not necessarily be covered by the act. In other words, books are essentially being banned out of a fear of the banned concepts act.

These discussions on race and gender are critically important. This is for at least two reasons. *First*, the act’s chill of education focusing on race, gender, and DEI concepts harms all Granite Staters because the inclusion of such concepts in classrooms provides a multitude of benefits for students and society at large. Student body diversity—and the resultant diversity in views and perspectives that flows from such diverse students’ participation—improves critical thinking and problem solving, increases cross-racial understanding, reduces stereotypes and prejudices, and develops leadership and critical thinking skills and many other skills necessary to thrive in an increasingly diverse society.<sup>3</sup> These benefits manifest for all students.

*Second*, these discussions of race and gender are particularly important as New Hampshire rapidly becomes more diverse. The 2020 census indicated that—while New Hampshire’s population grew by a modest 4.6% during the past decade—the number of residents who are people of color increased by 74.4% to 176,900 in 2020. Black, Hispanic, and other people of color now represent 12.8% (176,900) of the state’s population compared to 7.5% (101,400) in 2010. This diversity is particularly prevalent in the southern part of New Hampshire. For example, the population of Manchester and Nashua was 98% White in 1980 according to census data. Manchester now is 85% White. Nashua now is 82% White. As the Carsey School of Public Policy at the University of New Hampshire explained, “children are at the leading edge of the state’s growing diversity.”<sup>4</sup> The *Union Leader* also recently reported that “more than 2 of every 5 children in Manchester and Nashua hail from families of color,” and that, “[i]n 30 years, Manchester’s youngest generation has shifted from 94% White in 1990 to 57% last year.”<sup>5</sup> Instruction on race and gender, including DEI concepts, serves to close existing opportunity gaps and inequalities faced by students

of color in New Hampshire and other historically marginalized groups. It also helps these students to feel a better sense of belonging in New Hampshire.

### **III. The Harm of Censorship, Even of Ideas We Do Not Like.**

Lastly, the banned concepts act is, put simply, about censorship in schools. Censorship is a dangerous concept. In schools, we should be allowing ideas to be discussed—even those we do not agree with—so students are exposed to alternative perspectives and taught to evaluate issues for themselves. This skill set is necessary to educate the next generation of adults who have critical thinking skills and can meaningfully participate in our democracy.

But through the act's chill, students are (and have been) robbed of the information, ideas, and instructional approaches that would prepare them to engage in the robust dialogue and analytical thinking necessary to effectively function as citizens in America's democratic system. Our schools are "nurseries of democracy." See *Mahanoy Area Sch. Dist. v. B. L. ex rel. Levy*, 141 S. Ct. 2038, 2046 (2021).

For these reasons, the ACLU-NH supports HB1576 to the extent this Committee is not inclined to adopt HB1090.

My name is Frank Ferraro and I am a resident of North Hampton, New Hampshire. I urge you to vote reject HB1576, a bill that would reinstate discriminatory actions within the public school system.

I am in full support of teaching our history, the good and the bad. Our history is full of flawed individuals and times that, along with our exceptionalism, should be taught, but without personal opinions or biases. Telling children that they are an oppressor or an oppressed solely because of the color of their skin or their sex or their religion is not education and it should not be acceptable under the law.

If a teacher finds it difficult to teach history without including personal opinions then I suggest that individual is not educating the students, but is attempting to indoctrinate them.

The final wording on this issue in HB2 was already compromise from the language of HB544, the so-called divisive concepts bill, and no restrictions at all. I ask you to stand firm and vote to reject HB1576.

Dear House Education Committee,

I have no idea if this will reach you in time, but I'm inclined to write it just the same.

My name is Nick Fegley. I was born in Concord Hospital and raised in Center Barnstead. I attended Prospect Mountain High School in Alton, NHTI in Concord, and UNH in Durham. After graduating with a B.S. in math, I taught parttime at NHTI and later fulltime at Bishop Brady High School in Concord. I also had the opportunity to substitute teach at several different NH schools while I was working on my degree. Suffice to say, I am intimately familiar with education in NH, both from the perspective of a student and a teacher.

Three and a half years ago I moved to Zhengzhou, China. In many ways, teaching in China is similar to teaching back home, but there are, of course, many differences. In the interest of keeping this letter short and relevant, I'll highlight just one difference: Here I must be constantly vigilant about not saying something that would anger the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). A wrong word about the systematic persecution of the Uyghurs could land me in jail. Countless books are banned, and I need to check with my Chinese coworkers before recommending a book to a student. When we taught history, the textbooks we used had pages blacked out (or removed entirely) by CCP censors because it wasn't inline with their version of history. Starting this year, foreigners are not allowed to teach history at all.

The recent attack on "divisive concepts" in American schools is terrifyingly similar. You just need to swap out "Uyghur" for "people of color" or "books about the Tiananmen Square" for "books about race or gender" to see the parallels. This blatant attack on our God-given freedom of speech is unamerican and certainly has no place in the live free or die state.

The idea that American students are too fragile to be exposed to challenging and complicated concepts like race and gender is frankly laughable. Students should be challenged by perspectives other than their own. They should be exposed to new ideas and new ways of thinking. I have seen firsthand the effect of removing so-called "divisive concepts" from the curriculum, and it is tragic. It creates closedminded and intellectually fragile students. Please don't let New Hampshire go any further down that path.

In the introduction to her 2013 book, *Priests of Our Democracy: The Supreme Court, Academic Freedom, and the Anti-Communist Purge*, Marjorie Heins observes: “Although contemporary fears of a return to the repressive zealotry of the late 1940s and early ’50s—the legislative inquisitions, loyalty investigations, and test oaths—are overblown, we do face threats to academic freedom in the 21st century, both institutionally and in the courts. Often, these threats arise from a habit of mind, long prominent in American politics, that seeks simple answers to complex problems, that shuts out nuanced or radical critique, and that demonizes dissent, especially from the left.” I am reminded of these words, and of the valuable history recorded by Heins and others, as I contemplate a slate of bills proposed during this and last year’s legislative session here in New Hampshire.

Frankly, I don’t believe “contemporary fears of a return to repressive zealotry” are overblown in 2022. Since late 2020, the Republican Party at the national and state levels has been vigorously engaged in a legislative project ostensibly concerned with preventing discrimination but which effectively chill speech in the classroom. They have done so by insisting that we have a real problem with radical teachers telling little white children they are inherently racist by dint of their skin color. That’s not what Critical Race Theory is all about, but Christopher Rufo and other architects of the national movement to muzzle teachers have admitted in public that the meaning of “Critical Race Theory” is irrelevant so long as the GOP base believes that it is vicious and pervasive. Once that belief took hold, with the help of Tucker Carlson and FOX News where anti-CRT rhetoric has dominated for a year, the decades of nuanced scholarship that actually entail CRT became moot. It doesn’t matter that Kimberlé Crenshaw can run intellectual circles around Carlson, because he has a bigger megaphone.

HB 544 died in committee in early 2021 only to be revived in HB 2, a “must-pass” budget bill. Now, in the “Live Free or Die” state, teachers and others may be sued by “[a]ny person claiming to be aggrieved” by teachings or trainings that include disclosure and discussion of uncomfortable truths concerning the lasting, contemporary impacts of historical events in this state and the country. The framers of HB 544 and its revenant form in HB 2 repackaged a list of “divisive concepts” from an executive order promulgated by former president Donald Trump, despite that order being halted by a federal court on grounds that it violated free speech and due process rights. Not content to rest on their laurels, the NH GOP are back this year with bills that would extend HB 2’s prohibitions across the state’s university and community college systems and revive a McCarthy-era teacher loyalty law.

Responding to questions during the 11 January 2022 hearing of HB 1313, which would extend HB 2’s prohibitions to the college and university systems of the state, bill sponsor Rep. Rick Ladd said that “we don’t want to tell [students] what to think; we want to teach them how to think.” I completely agree. However, I must disagree with Rep. Ladd’s suggestion that the past is past and that’s where it should stay. If we are to encourage and teach critical thinking, we must attend to the lasting effects of past actions and stop pretending that yesterday has nothing to do with today. Passing HB 1090 or 1576 won’t be enough, but would be a good start.

HB544 is harmful to democracy. This law is poorly written, and encourages discord in our State. Granite Staters by and large have a long history of respecting other people's opinions in political discourse, which is based on taking the time to listen to each other. Bills such as the "divisive concepts" bill encourage people to stop listening to each other, and instead to jump onto the latest direction the political wind is blowing, and then lash out at others who disagree with them. Dear Honorable Members of the Committee:

Please accept this correspondence as testimony submitted by the New Hampshire School Boards Association (NHSBA) relative to HB 1090, HB 1576, and HB 1638. NHSBA supports each of these bills for the following reasons.

First, one of NHSBA's bedrock principles is that local school boards should retain local control over local educational matters. These principles are established by the following NHSBA Resolutions, adopted and in some cases repeatedly reaffirmed by NHSBA member school boards at our annual Delegate Assembly. The pertinent Resolutions are as follows:

***NHSBA supports diversity, equity, and inclusion in all aspects in our schools, is committed to the concept that **free and open dialogue around such concepts as racism and sexism is a vital component to education, and opposes any actions which limit this free exchange of ideas.** (October 2021)***

***NHSBA opposes any branch of New Hampshire government adopting or supporting curriculum standards that usurp state's rights and de-emphasize and limit local control of curriculum and local school board oversight.** (2011)*

***NHSBA supports local boards and their responsibility for establishing the structure, accountability, advocacy and delivery of instruction within their local district. This includes statutory changes that affirm this managerial policy confided exclusively to public employers. Specifically, governing bodies have the right to determine standards for evaluation, compensation, selection, layoff and retention, discipline, assignment and transfer, and other traditionally accepted managerial rights so as to continue public control of governmental functions.** (2013)*

***NHSBA supports state and federal legislation that affirms the responsibility for Education resides with the states, which have delegated to local school boards the power and authority to adopt policies, establish priorities, and provide accountability to direct the operation of the schools, including the school system's mission and goals, organization, budget, program, curriculum and services, all essential to the daily operation of schools, consistent with state laws and regulations. (2014)***

Second, these principles are already supported in current New Hampshire law. Primarily, NHSBA directs the Committee to the following statutes:

***RSA 189:1-a, II: Elected school boards shall be responsible for establishing the structure, accountability, advocacy, and delivery of instruction in each school operated and governed in its district. To accomplish this end, and to support flexibility in implementing diverse educational approaches, school boards shall establish, in each school operated and governed in its district, instructional policies that establish instructional goals based upon available information about the knowledge and skills pupils will need in the future.***

***193-E:1, II: Respecting New Hampshire's long tradition of community involvement, it is the purpose of this chapter to ensure that appropriate means are established to provide an adequate education through an integrated system of shared responsibility between state and local government. In this system, the state establishes minimum standards for public school approval and academic standards for inclusion and delivery of educational services at the local level. School districts then have responsibility and flexibility in implementing diverse educational approaches to instruction and curriculum tailored to meet student needs.***

***193-E:2-a, V(a): It is the responsibility of local teachers, administrators, and school boards to identify and implement approaches best suited for the students in their communities to acquire the skills and knowledge included in the curriculum, to determine the scope, organization, and sequence of course offerings, and to choose the methods of instruction, the activities, and the materials to be used.***

Third, the principles of local control over local educational and curricular matters have been embedded in Department of Education Rules for decades. Largely Ed 306, Minimum Standards for Public School Approval, place various requirements on local school boards the responsibility of overseeing curriculum standards, graduation requirements, and instructional resources through school board policy-making obligations.

In sum, New Hampshire law has traditionally and should continue to respect the right of local school boards to determine local educational standards for their local communities. SB 304 properly returns this right to the local school boards.


Aside from respecting local control over local educational matters, NHSBA has significant concerns regarding the disruptive impact that last year's "anti-discrimination" bill has had on the delivery of educational services to New Hampshire students. Since the passage of HB 2 last year, multiple educational associations and organizations have repeatedly asked the New Hampshire Department of Education for clarification as to what would actually constitute a violation of this law. While the NHDOE and the Attorney General's office did issue a technical assistance advisory last summer, that advisory is just as vague and uninformative as the bill itself. Follow up requests for guidance have received little response, and in many cases, no response. At the very least, those charged with overseeing and enforcing this law should provide thorough guidance to New Hampshire teachers, administrators and school boards.

Due to the lack of clear answers and guidance, school boards have spent numerous hours at board meetings fielding questions that are unanswerable. This creates the false belief that school boards are not being transparent, when in reality, no one in charge of enforcing this law has been able to get a straight answer on what is allowable and what is not allowable under HB 2.

For these reasons, NHSBA supports HB 1090, HB 1576, and HB 1638 and respectfully asks the Committee to recommend this bill ought to pass.

Dear Members of the House Education Committee:

My name is Ann Marie Banfield and I am a resident of North Hampton, New Hampshire. **I urge you to vote ITL on HB1576** which would reinstate discriminatory actions within the public school system.

In 2021, we saw an influx of the radicalized Critical Race Theory training for teachers, and curriculum aimed at children in the public schools. This came in under the umbrella of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Justice. It was so alarming to teachers and children, that many of them mobilized to affirm our civil rights through the non-discriminatory language that was passed in HB2.

We saw teacher training in SAU16 that described everyone as white supremacists if they believed in a colorblind society. We had parents assuring their children that they were **not** responsible for slavery after receiving a lesson in history that placed the actions of slave owners on young children sitting in our classrooms today.

These are violations of the Civil Rights Act, but parents and teachers do not want to have to take their school district to court. There are costs involved and it can be a lengthy process, as we are seeing in SAU16 right now. The district has tax-payer funded attorneys at their disposal, so it can be a daunting task to spend thousands of dollars on a private attorney to fight for our basic civil rights.

Currently there is an ongoing lawsuit in SAU16 where a resident is just trying to compile documents to look how CRT was implemented in the school district. Residents already uncovered information that shows that they were planning to push more bias and prejudice on the students. The Superintendent is using tax-payer funded school district attorneys to fight against producing these documents. SAU16 has already spent roughly \$10,000.00 to keep these documents hidden.

We do know that SAU16 purchased books for the students on anti-racism. Anti-racism includes the same toxicity as the radicalized Critical Race Theory that we are seeing in public schools today.

For instance, in the book SAU16 purchased for 8th grade children, the author

says that there are two categories that we all fit in. You fit into the **dominant culture** if you fit into any of these identities:

- 1) White
- 2) Upper-middle-class
- 3) Cisgender
- 4) Male
- 5) Educated
- 6) Athletic
- 7) Neurotypical
- 8) Able-bodied

If you don't fit into this box you are in the **subordinate culture**. Those in the subordinate culture identified as:

- 1) Brown
- 2) Indigenous people of color of the global majority
- 3) Queer, transgender, nonbinary, cisgender women, youth,
- 4) Muslim, Jewish, Buddhist, atheist, non-Christian
- 5) Neurodiverse
- 6) Those living with disabilities
- 7) Or those living in poverty, and more.

A student or teacher must then determine which of those two boxes the student fits in.

This is why [Condoleezza Rice](#) rejected CRT, and said she didn't agree with the way they are talking about race relations today. She disagreed with requiring white people to feel guilty for everything that has happened in the past. She mentions one of the most important features of CRT which is, the idea that black people have to feel disempowered.

She rejects this radical worldview, and goes on to say that she wants black kids to be completely empowered, to know that they are beautiful in their blackness. But in order to do that, she doesn't want to make white kids feel bad for being white. Condoleezza Rice just summed up why the CRT agenda is wrong for students in New Hampshire.

While this may be wrong, the CRT/DEIJ/Anti-Racist agenda also violates our basic civil rights. Those rights were affirmed in HB2 with the anti-discrimination language.

Why would anyone think it's ok to discriminate against any group of people based on their skin color? Why would we want to go backwards? Why would you not want to affirm the civil rights of all of the children and teachers in the public school system?

This kind of discriminatory behavior has been happening in many of the New Hampshire schools like Litchfield, Sanborn, Exeter, [Hollis-Brookline](#), and

Hopkinton to name a few.

Parents have set up [websites](#), Facebook pages and have objected to this discriminatory behavior at school board meetings. HB2 has helped those parents and teachers require that their school administrators focus on academic achievement for all of their students.

Teachers are in a very difficult position speaking publicly, but HB2 helped them so they aren't subjected to this kind of hate and prejudice in Professional Development.

It was David Ryan, Superintendent of SAU16 who admitted in a public meeting that they would have to change their professional development because of the anti-discriminatory law. The professional development in SAU16 provided by 2Revolutions was questioned at a public meeting when someone asked about the Professional Development East Kingston teachers had to endure.

8. Celebrates Columbus Day
9. Claims reverse racism
10. Assumes good intentions are enough
11. Believes that...we're all one big human family....there's only one human race.

This is the kind of professional development we have seen in New Hampshire Schools. This is not training that is focused on helping all students succeed academically, but training teachers to blame and shame their colleagues and the children in their care.

The teachers in SAU16 were subjected to professional development by 2Revolutions who was hired to work with the teachers. According to 2 Revolutions if you live in an area that funds public education through property taxes, you are a white supremacist. That would mean that every resident in New Hampshire is a white supremacist, including all of the members of the House Education Committee.

If children happen to be in a subordinate culture, children may begin viewing

themselves as abnormal, and inferior. How is that good for black and brown children? Condoleeza said it best when she said she wanted black and brown children to feel empowered and beautiful in their blackness.

There are many more examples I can share but I think you can see the kind of destructive bias we saw in New Hampshire schools prior to the passage of HB2. This was damaging to teachers and children in our public schools.

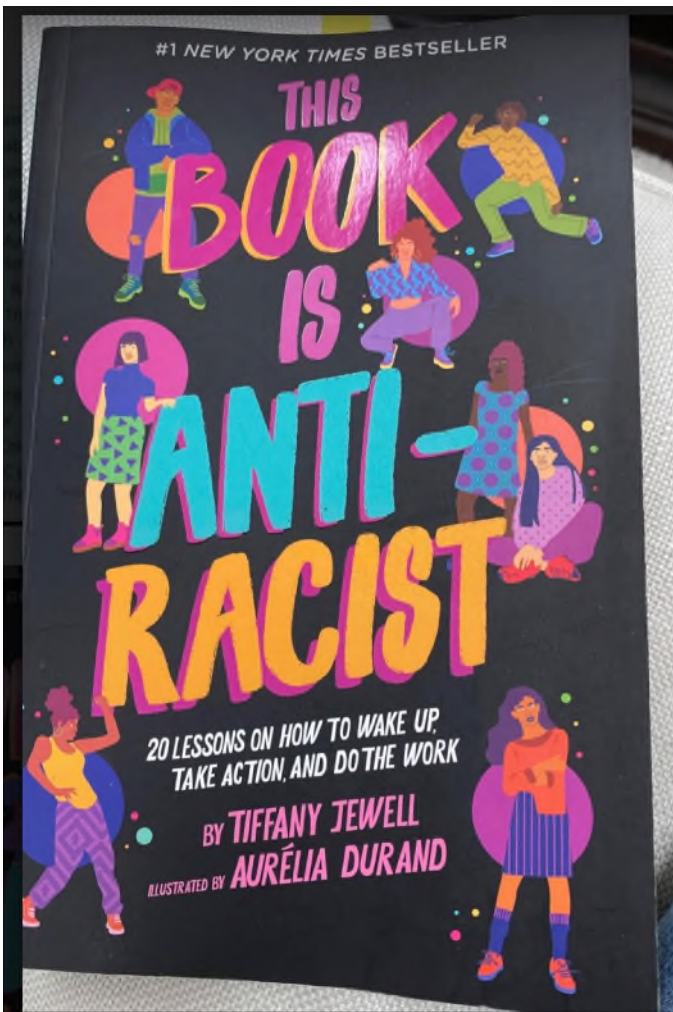
There is now a way for parents and teachers to fight back against the prejudice aimed at them. They shouldn't be used as a political tool by political radicals. Our schools should be focused on academic excellence and literacy in the core subjects. That is how you uplift all children. That is how you support public schools in New Hampshire.

Perfectionism	Little appreciation expressed among people for the work that others are doing; appreciation that is expressed usually directed to those who get most of the credit anyway
Sense of Urgency	Continued sense of urgency that makes it difficult to take time to be inclusive, encourage democratic and/or thoughtful decision-making, to think long-term, to consider consequences
Defensiveness	The org structure is set up & much energy spent trying to prevent abuse and protect power as it exists rather than to facilitate the best out of each person or to clarify who has power and how they are expected to use it
Quantity over Quality	Things that can be measured are more highly valued than things that cannot; Little or no value attached to process; If it can't be measured, it has no value
Paternalism	Those with power think they are capable of making decisions for and in the interests of those without power
Either/Or thinking	Good/bad; right/wrong; with us/against us; linked to perfectionism in making it difficult to learn from mistakes or accommodate conflict. No sense that things can be both/and
Power Hoarding	Little, if any, value around sharing power
Fear of Open Conflict	When someone raises an issue that causes discomfort, the response is to blame the person for raising it, rather than looking at the issue which is actually causing the problem. Culture of politeness

Mr. Chairman and Honored Representatives: Thank you for your service and for this opportunity to address you. I am Rabbi Jonathan Spira-Savett. I live and work in Nashua, and I am the father of three children who are students and grads of our Nashua public schools. I myself have been a high school teacher of American history and literature, and I currently serve on our state's Commission for Holocaust and Genocide Education. I come to speak to you in strong support of HB 1576.

This country saved the life of my family and my wife's family, from the tyranny of the czar and the genocide of Hitler. I am a proud American and a religious person who says a blessing over freedom whenever I vote – and on voting days and occasions like today, I wear those commitments together on my body, above my head. I feel that my own group's history obligates me in gratitude to be a civic leader in this country, and I carry responsibilities as a member of both a religious minority and the white majority.

Earlier in my career I had the opportunity to create from scratch a course for juniors about America in place of the usual AP history and literature out of that sense of obligation. I was working at a private Jewish high school, and together with a colleague, we set out to give our students interdisciplinary tools to look at American history and culture, and to look at themselves as critical citizens -- *connected critics*, to use the terminology of the political philosopher Michael Walzer. Perhaps this was natural for us as Jews, a group of whom so many have lived the "American Dream" and a group so often the targets of violence and discrimination even in this country. But what we did in that school was to prototype a concept with application far beyond our specific group and private school setting.

I am proud that the alums of that course have become those connected and critical citizens – doing work in everything from our national defense and intelligence, to representing the underrepresented before our Supreme Court. Facing all of our story as a nation, in an honest and questioning spirit, only fueled their engagement and their intense dedication to our country, their resilience to keep working on problems especially in times of crisis from 9/11 through now.

How will we motivate our public school students to locate themselves as creators of a more perfect union? How is it possible to draw lessons about the dynamics between one's ideals and group pressure, if you don't learn about three-fifths compromise and sit in shame and embarrassment, as well as understanding of political strategy? How is it possible for our students to learn about the inner challenges of actual leadership, what it's like to sit where you sit where we hope they will one day -- unless they can probe Thomas Jefferson in both his idealism and his cowardice? Why bother reading Thoreau if we don't allow students to take seriously his indictments of the nation and even of his own friends? How can we study Twain without asking whether he was lampooning the racism of his time or swept up in it?

Sometimes as teachers we have to make sure that a perspective that was or is in our history, that is so opposite of what a patriot teacher like me would ever want to entertain or say out loud, is made vivid and alive in class so students know what's at stake – slaveholder, or Stalinist -- so it can be addressed in the safe and trusting container of our classrooms.

If the creators of divisive concepts laws such as the existing one are concerned about America lapsing into an unpatriotic socialism – well it is the hallmark of socialist dictatorships to write laws that hide their implications behind innocent sounding words, in order to sow doubt about whether you or someone else is breaking the law, and to create a situation where an official or another citizen can take legal action against you or just threaten to do so. Which is exactly what is happening in New Hampshire and elsewhere with such laws.

Members of my Jewish community have lived under such laws in our lifetimes in other lands, and that's why they came here. I have had

conversations with people running for school board or attending meetings – they are at my kid’s school, in my American neighborhood -- and there is never any actual incident of a teacher declaring that someone is “inherently racist” or that America is. There is only “I have heard of a few times”; “no, I can’t tell you the name of a school” and “I’m just trying to make sure it doesn’t happen here.” That is what the current law is, and it sure doesn’t sound like the American Constitution to me.

If that is not how you intended the current law, then consider my remarks to be teacher comments on an essay whose thesis was confusing and needs a rewrite. If you are serious about education for a proud and patriotic American citizenship, not just for diversity but for a difficult unity -- and I hope that you are, then show you are serious, by getting engaged with the fine work of our social studies leaders and our civic education thinkers. Pump more substantive standards into our system and invest in the resources and training for our educators around critical citizenship and a true patriotism. And in the meantime, get these words out of our current laws and pass HB 1576. Thank you for your time and I am happy to respond to any questions.

My name is Jude Farley, and I am currently a senior in high school at Pinkerton Academy in Derry. I am writing to you today in support of HB 1576, which would repeal the state ban on “divisive concepts” in schools and other public institutions.

As a high school student in New Hampshire, I have seen firsthand the detrimental impacts this ban has had on our public schools. Our social studies curriculum already does little to address this country’s history of slavery, cruelty to indigineous people, and other deep-rooted inequality. HB 1576 has given the New Hampshire General Court the opportunity to right this wrong. I urge the committee to not only seize this opportunity, but to advocate for a more robust social studies curriculum in the future.

Public schools are the bedrock of American democracy. Shying away from confronting “divisive concepts” contradicts the rich history of our education system as a place that produces informed voters and encourages respectful discourse. Schools must allow students to have the difficult conversations that allow them to grow as citizens.

Before the passage of this ban, many of my social studies classes provided opportunities for discussion of politics and current events. Never was I encouraged to adopt a certain set of beliefs; never was “critical race theory” or a comparable doctrine mentioned. Civics and history classes are enriched when teachers and students can address how class topics affect their daily lives.

Now, my teachers shy away from doing anything of the sort. I don’t blame them– they fear retribution from the ban that threatens the very mission of public education. After I graduate, I hope that my fellow students will be left with schools that can mold them into informed citizens. I certainly feel that the education system I grew up with was successful in doing so. I want the same thing for them.

Dear Committee Members,

I am a resident of Salem, NH, a public school teacher, and a grandmother of two mixed race children. I am appalled that anyone would promote one race over another in our country. Martin Luther King worked hard to promote love of *all*, not just one race. It is a beautiful thing, his message of togetherness and kindness for all Americans. How *dare* this "progressive" movement ridicule and dismantle the civil rights' movement's hard work. This is what we are seeing in our state, and it must be stopped immediately. Children will suffer no matter what race you happen to claim.

A couple of years ago our district hired a young woman who had just graduated from UNH. She seemed to be a good candidate at the time. Since she needed a place to live, my husband and I offered her our basement apartment for a very nominal amount. She accepted and lived with us for a year. She met our family, which includes our two grandchildren whom we are raising and have permanent guardianship over. As noted above, they are mixed race.

We, as a department embraced her and all seemed to be going well for her first semester. The second semester was when covid hit. We all went home to teach. After awhile we missed our colleagues so we decided to have a zoom lunch. Many in our department attended, and we even had a couple of retirees there. It was enjoyable until the discussion turned to racism. One teacher said her son had a black friend who had to tell his son "everyday" when he walked out of the house, to be careful because people are mean to blacks. The child was 5 years old. I made the comment that I would never tell our grandchildren anything of the sort because it would put a chip on their shoulder. This young woman proceeded to turn into someone we didn't recognize by calling the entire department racist. We were appalled. She said that racism was systemic and that we didn't even know we were racist! She told us that she could teach us about racism because she had studied it extensively and was an authority on the subject. We were all dumbfounded. Not only did she know us and our grandkids, but I am from north Florida and grew up in an extremely diverse community, something New Hampshireites know little about, I'm sad to say. Not only that, but she grew up on the Cape (0.71% black in her town), went to UNH (1% black), and chose a school district that is 1.1% black! She truly offended all at our lunch that day for sure. We did not report this to our administration.

Our district resumed classes in the fall and many of us had changed our opinion about her. She was so disrespectful that day, and I believe she truly hurt people.

One day I had to go to her classroom and when I was standing talking to her I noticed an offensive flag hanging. It was a "black lives matter" flag. I was once again appalled at her putting something like that on the wall. I decided to report it to my boss because that did not need to be in a public school classroom in my opinion. It represents a Marxist movement (not my words but the founders words, speaking of themselves). My boss said she would ask her to remove it but she might have to use my testimony. I said no problem! As it turns out, my boss ended up hearing two students discussing the very flag the next day. They were upset. That's all my boss needed. The flag was removed.

There were more incidents, however these were the two big ones that I thought you should hear.

None of this should be occurring in our state, much less our country. Let's make New Hampshire a state where we lead in defending the rights of ALL people, not just certain groups.

I urge you to vote ITL on HB1576 and affirm our civil rights.

## **HB 1576 Testimony, Rep. Manny Espitia (D-Nashua)**

Thank you, Mr Chair

Committee members I come to offer HB 1576 to what is known as a repeal to the divisive concepts legislation. To give context in 2021, a ban on divisive concepts was voted in and ended up being tabled. But like so much legislation in the past, it came back in HB2 of the budget. As we all know, the budget and the trailer passed last year and was signed by the Governor.

I spoke to colleagues who believed that while they supported a majority of the budget this and other pieces of HB2 were things they were not happy with but believed this budget needed to pass. So I and other colleagues are here to repeal this provision of the budget.

I'll start with what this bill denies our student from learning. It denies our students from actually learning the history of our country. For example, they won't learn that slaves were actually owned here in New Hampshire past the Revolutionary war. They won't learn that heroes like Fredrick Douglass denounced the practice of building statues of confederate soldiers known as the "lost cause". Is the history of trail of tears uncomfortable? Of course. But I heard that if we do not learn about her history we are doomed to repeat it. This means teaching our younger generation of the struggle that so many faced in the past and that we don't sugar coat it.

This is not meant to cast blame on the sins of our forefathers or on us today. This is meant to see how the effects of discrimination in the past is still present in our current systems still. We still see discrepancies in generational wealth between racial and ethnic groups. We still see that in parts of our country, people can still be hired one day and fired another because of their gender orientation.

We even know that by prohibiting the conversation of the history of the disability community we are preventing ourselves from learning how recent the ADA has been around in our country.

We have made strides for progress to so many vulnerable groups. The establishing of this ban has made it incredibly difficult for our educators to do their job. We have seen a website created to report any educator in our state from doing their job, at a time during a global pandemic when their jobs are hard enough just to keep our kids healthy and safe. It's bad enough our educators spend money out of their pocket so that they can provide a great experience in the classroom or that the resources your classroom receives relies entirely on the zip code you live in. We are doing a disservice to our educators, public employees, and our citizens by gagging their speech and trying to erase our history.

So I urge members of this committee to vote OTP on HB 1576 to repeal this dangerous provision from law and I'll answer any questions.

Good afternoon,

My name is Jonathan Weinberg, and I am a member of the Concord School Board, and while I am here in my capacity as an individual and not speaking on behalf of the board, I see how HB 1576 is critical legislation for many aspects, but firstly to combat the fear in teachers that they will be reported for merely teaching history. As we all surely know, the group, “Mom’s for Liberty” placed a bounty on teachers’ heads if they were found guilty of teaching so called “divisive concepts”. If this wasn’t enough to make educators weary, concurrently, the state of NH instituted a snitch system where parents and individuals could report educators who violated the recently passed “divisive concepts” legislation. Yet, outside of the legislative chambers, it appears no one can really define what divisive concepts are.

Last summer, as a member of the City and Community Relations Committee on the Concord School Board, I represented the board with fellow members at a booth every Saturday by the Statehouse. This created a unique opportunity to engage with constituents and community members outside of a formal meeting setting. As expected, we received many questions about back to school, but the most common questions were about if we taught “CRT, or critical race theory”. One of the main questions, I inquired of those asking was what do they define as Critical Race Theory? Then, individuals would typically say that “it is when you make white people hate themselves” and what was even more staggering was when someone said to me “it is basically a new version of slavery”. I was taken aback by this claim that Critical race theory was slavery reincarnated. I wanted to recommend the book, *The New Jim Crow by Michelle Alexander*, as that provides an actual view on what a new iteration of slavery is; yet that would unfortunately most likely fall under the forbidden books list.

Other times, people made comments equating critical race theory to Nazi propaganda. As not only an individual in education, but especially as a Jewish person, to hear these comments comparing the teaching of history to a time when my great grandfather was in a concentration camp is despicable.

We live in a state where critical race theory has become an umbrella term for everything it is not.

**And what is even more tragic is how the state of New Hampshire and state legislature have only fanned the flames of misinformation as they legitimized the misidentification of “critical race theory” as either Nazi Propaganda or encouraging people to suggest that it is new age of slavery.**

**This must stop. I urge you to vote to pass HB 1576.**

Mr Chairman and Honored Representatives: Thank you for your service and for this opportunity to address you. My name is Jonathan Spira-Savett. I live in Nashua where I also work as a rabbi, and I am the father of three children who are students and grads of our Nashua public schools. I myself have been a high school teacher of American history and literature, and I currently serve on our state's Commission for Holocaust and Genocide Education. I come to speak to you in strong support of HB 1576.

This country saved the life of my family and my wife's family, from the tyranny of the czar and the genocide of Hitler. I am a proud American and a religious person who says a blessing over freedom whenever I vote – and on those days and occasions like today, I wear those commitments together above my head. I feel that my own group's history obligates me in gratitude to be a civic leader in this country, and I carry responsibilities as a member of both a religious minority and the white majority.

Earlier in my career I had the opportunity to create from scratch a course for juniors about America in place of the usual AP history and literature out of that sense of obligation. I was working at a private Jewish high school, and together with a colleague, we set out to give our students interdisciplinary tools to look at American history and culture, and to look at themselves as critical citizens -- *connected critics*, to use the terminology of the political philosopher Michael Walzer. Perhaps this was natural for us as Jews, a group of whom so many have lived the "American Dream" and a group so often the targets of violence and discrimination even in this country. But what we did in that school was to prototype a concept with application far beyond our specific group and private school setting.



I am proud that the alums of that course have become those connected and critical citizens – doing work in everything from our national defense and intelligence, to representing the underrepresented before our Supreme Court. Facing all of our story as a nation, in an honest and questioning spirit, only fueled their engagement and their intense dedication to our country, their resilience to keep working on problems especially in times of crisis from 9/11 through now.

How will we motivate our public school students to locate themselves as creators of a more perfect union? How is it possible to draw lessons about the dynamics between one's ideals and group pressure, if you don't learn about three-fifths compromise and sit in shame and embarrassment, as well as understanding of political strategy? How is it possible for our students to learn about the inner challenges of actual leadership, what it's like to sit where you sit where we hope they will one day -- unless they can probe Thomas Jefferson in both his idealism and his cowardice? Why bother reading Thoreau if we don't allow students to take seriously his indictments of the nation and even of his own friends? How can we study Twain without asking whether he was lampooning the racism of his time or swept up in it?

Sometimes as teachers we have to make sure that a perspective that was or is in our history, that is so opposite of what a patriot like me would ever want to entertain or say out loud, is made vivid and alive in class so students know what's at stake, so it can be addressed in the safe and trusting container of our classrooms.

If the creators of divisive concepts laws such as the existing one are concerned about America lapsing into an unpatriotic socialism – well it is the hallmark of socialist dictatorships to write laws that hide their implications behind innocent sounding words, in order to sow doubt about whether you or someone else is breaking the law, and to create a situation where an official or another citizen can take legal action

against you or just threaten to do so. Which is exactly what is happening in New Hampshire and elsewhere with such laws.

Members of my Jewish community have lived under such laws in our lifetimes in other lands and that's why they came here. I have had conversations with people running for school board or attending meetings, it's my kid's school and it's in my American neighborhood -- and there is never any actual incident of a teacher declaring that someone is "inherently racist" or that America is. There is only "I have heard of a few times"; "no, I can't tell you the name of a school" and "I'm just trying to make sure it doesn't happen here." That is what the current law is, and it sure doesn't sound like the American Constitution to me.

If that is not how you intended the current law, then consider my remarks to be teacher comments on an essay whose thesis was confusing and needs a rewrite. If you are serious about education for a proud and patriotic American citizenship, and I hope that you are -- then show you are serious, by getting engaged with the fine work of our social studies leaders and our civic education thinkers. Pump more substantive standards into our system and invest in the resources and training for our educators around critical citizenship and a true patriotism. And in the meantime, get these words out of our current laws and pass HB 1576. Thank you for your time and I am happy to respond to any questions.

Good morning,

First, and as always, thank you for your service to the state. All of us know, you are barely paid, volunteer legislators.

My name is Bruce Berk and I reside in Pittsfield and I am a retired teacher of history, committing 35 plus years to this profession.

I support HB 1576 for the following reasons.

One, NH is a state that believes in local control. Therefore, let us trust our local superintendents and principals to maintain a high and balanced caliber of teaching within our schools.

Two, truth be known, instructing at the high school level means intersecting with 4-5 sections of reluctant learners each day. Perhaps you have forgotten your teen years, but it is unlikely that you came into each of your five to six classes each day ready to learn. Instead, it is the task of every educator to build energy and intellectual interest. Teenagers, by their nature, want something they can relate to, that has relevance to their lives. Often, something they can debate. Teaching about dead people or ideas positioned in the 18th century is not the central focus for teens inspired by tik tok. A teacher's challenge then is to make the classroom come alive, to invest it with facts and ideas that both educate and entice. You need to give us the freedom and trust to do just that.

Imagine for a moment that we are exploring the Declaration of Independence. It might be fascinating to adults in this room, but not so much so to a 16 year old. How to make it come alive knowing that what will engage students in one class may flop in the next. Teachers need to have the freedom to be nimble and spontaneous.

Mention taxation without representation- watch eyes gloss over. Instead, it might be more interesting to ask them if it is fair for England to impose taxes for a war they fought in America, might be interesting for them to understand that the tax rate was much lower for the colonists rather than their English brethren - hmm, might this phrase just be an effective piece of disinformation (fake news??) by the colonists and is this OK?

"Why should we have taxes anyway" asks another student? Are we allowed to talk about socialist Finland and Sweden where education and medical care are not crippling expenses?

Or, another example. What did Jefferson delete from his initial draft of the Declaration and wny? Answer???? A condemnation of slavery. Should the ensuing discussion be limited, fearful of saying something deemed unAmerican or ideological

Might be interesting to explore what Jefferson deleted from his initial declaration and why? In all of these cases (and innumerable others) teachers under the current law should worry that they would say something that felt ideological, maybe unAmerican. Teachers are trying to engage,

interest, challenge students to think more deeply - to be both critical and fair thinkers. In reality, find a middle ground of educating and acknowledging youth's limited experience)The beauty of history (and i use to tell my students that they would all agree in 20 years) are its nuances and complexity. We do them an injustice if we do not explore the complexity and contradictions of Jefferson or Lincoln.

Often, and unspoken, I wanted my students not only to understand, but appreciate operating in the context of their times, and importantly how these issues of the 18th, 19th 20th century are not merely history, but a continuum of an experiment called the American experience. The study of history is a conversation with many twists and turns

Let us be self confident enough to be self critical. Let us be trusting enough to believe in our teachers who beyond health care workers may have the most difficult time during the pandemic. Let us create an educational template that will encourage young people to become teachers and encourage existing professionals to want to come to NH

## **The Flaws in Critical Race Theory**

Like many of our neighbors, we recently received a black and white postcard boldly proclaiming that "Critical Race Theory is the understanding that:" \*Racism affects every aspect of US society and culture.\*Racism is not merely the product of individual bias, prejudice or action, it is systemic. Racism is embedded in our legal, social, economic, medical and educational systems."

All this was declared without providing any proof that these statements are substantiated by facts. On what basis are we to "understand" this unproved theory?

When examined, one learns that the argument is based on flawed reasoning, described in Latin as a Post Hoc ergo Propter hoc argument, which describes an argument that event B occurred after event A, therefore B was caused by A., which is not necessarily so. Critical Race Theory asserts that racism is unavoidably inherited and concludes that all cultural values and beliefs of US Society are embedded with racism, therefore the dominant culture cannot be forgiven or corrected, only demolished and reconstructed. This runs counter to what we learn from many religions and from shared human experience, in which forgiveness and redemption follow confession of sin or error and form the basis for hope of salvation.

Critical Race Theory is an expression of nihilism, a viewpoint that traditional values and beliefs are unfounded, and existence is senseless and useless. The basis of much of American society has always been hope, so why should we "understand" an unsubstantiated, unproved assertion as fact, any more than we believed Hermann Goering's assertions about Jewish people being sub-human in the 1930s and 1940s? He thought that if one asserted an untruth often enough, one could convince enough people it was true.

America fought a long, hard war (in which two of my uncles fought) that cost many American lives to overcome that racist Nazi notion. Americans have been opposing the terrible legacies of racism for many years in the U.S., of which I, being born and reared in Louisiana am only too aware.

Yes, we need to teach the whole story of American history, but that is no justification for concluding Americans cannot learn from our mistakes and we are a nation without hope. Rather, we should teach that "Hope underlies the American Experience" and often has enabled us to overcome some of our worst human failings.

There was a time too many Americans routinely referred to their fellow citizens by pejorative names, like Mick, Spic, Guinea, Dago, Wop(without papers), Honky, Red Neck, the, ugly, and hurtful "N" word, Burr head, Jew boy, Christ-killer and more, like PO-Lock, Frog etc. etc., and too many of our citizens with names from various cultures still pronounce their names the way they were mispronounced by immigration officials or by school yard ruffians who spoke only English and beat them up when they pronounced their names correctly.

Thus, some adults still pronounce "Le Blanc" as Le Blank "Jean" as Gene", etc. A neighbor of mine recently told me how he quit pronouncing his name correctly after three boys in school with Irish surnames beat him up repeatedly. I do not say this disparagingly; My mother's name was Lynch.

These are just examples of the many challenges of realizing the motto of our nation "E Pluribus unum, From Many(people), One (nation) . Often, these distinctions were used to assert a social, ethnic or economic bias, as in the signs in store windows that declared "No Irish Need apply" or to separate entrances to restaurants by race and extended to separate water fountains and bus seating for racial separation.

All too often it was an expression of "our" interests against "theirs" or "not one of us" and since people tended to settle into neighborhoods by cultural affinity, their churches reflected the local citizens. Inevitably, so-called "Irish, French and Italian" churches of the same denomination came into being, and Black churches, even in cultures where slave owners once had permitted slaves to attend their church but seated them in the back rows.

in regions where competition for jobs was an issue, terms like Cajuns, Okies, hillbillies Red necks and Canucks were coined, as well as other variations on European names as immigration expanded the population after various world wars.

ALL this history needs to be taught and in context, including the fact that European Kings and Queens funded explorers to sail around the world to discover new lands, to claim as additions to their own empires, and, through military technology and force overcome whatever system of government or system of land ownership existed and claim the land in the name of the king or queen, regardless of the people who lived there or whatever color of skin they might happen to have. That these explorers might have arrived after the Chinese, exploring on orders of their emperor had already "discovered" these peoples was irrelevant and would not be documented by scholars until the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

What mattered to the King/Queen/Emperor was claiming the land and the conquest of any and all people living there. What mattered to religious leaders were converts, and what mattered to the immigrants who came to these "discovered" lands was the hope of owning land and the prosperity that owning land made possible, as well as the promise of freedom of religion and politics. There is much evidence of how and what methods were employed to achieve their various objectives, but racism has not been proved to be their primary concern, even when an economic or political factor.

That racism was a significant factor is evident, however, and should not be discounted or ignored, any more than it should be asserted, without substantial evidence, as the only cause for all decisions not favorable to people of color and with people of color as the only victims. A photo study of child labor in America by Lewis Hines early in the 19<sup>th</sup> century documents child labor throughout America, North and South, of all colors of skin, all disadvantaged and

struggling. Some were further disadvantaged by race, but economic, geographic and other social factors shaped the lives of all the children in these photographs as well.

To reduce all their motives to racial bias as a dominant factor in their lives is inaccurate. I know this for a fact, because I can look at some of those photos and identify my mother, my aunts, an uncle, and their second cousin when they were only a few years older than my mother. I have dined at their tables slept in their homes, helped pick their cotton and pecans, hunted squirrels and rabbits and branded cattle with them and their children, as well as attended their churches and prayed for their safe return from war. Some of them also were talented singers and musicians, as well as scholars who went to college, three of whom later earned a Ph.D.

I reject the baseless assertion that everyone in that generation was "inherently racist" because we were white, nor do I think an unproved theory should be taught as fact, any more than the economic factors in the Civil War should be ignored either.

Teach ALL that is known and substantiated and discuss it without bias so we can continue to learn from the good and the bad. Examine as well, all the facts of the pernicious impact of the Ku Klux Klan on both black and white communities; this should not be left unexamined, as it had to be unmentioned in some communities to avoid Klansmen turning on you or your business. Also, you should not leave unexamined the racial bias in the armed forces and in the defense industry, schools and colleges and churches for many years.

Just don't ask anyone to accept as fact, an hypothesis you have not proved. It does not pass the smell test, nor would it pass English 101, English composition.

From the beginning, this is the story of people struggling to thrive in a world none of them created and whose world view often originated in Europe. This subject needs to be treated as the subject of serious scholarship: objective, honest, thorough, fact-based and candid, not as a virtue signaling, unproved accusation based on assumptions from a university's Social Science "laboratory." I was taught that a laboratory is a place where one tests hypotheses for their validity, then based the conclusions on the rational analysis of results of the tests.

Critical Race theory presupposes, then proclaims the outcome, using flawed reasoning. To whatever degree their objective of examining the influence of racialism on contemporary American culture might be desirable, its adherents do not get to assume/"understand" the facts needed to prove their theory, nor use flawed reasoning to argue its validity.

**METHODOLOGY:**

This bill repeals provisions of the law relating to the right to freedom from discrimination in public workplaces and education and the prohibition on teaching discrimination.

The Judicial Branch indicates this bill would repeal RSA 354-A:29 through 354-A:34 relative to the right to freedom from discrimination in public workplaces and education and RSA 194:40 relative to the prohibition on teaching discrimination. RSA 354-A:29 through 354-A:34 provides for certain restrictions on certain educational programs by public employers and allows any person aggrieved by an act made unlawful to pursue all of the remedies available under RSA 354-A, RSA 491, RSA 275-E, or RSA 98-E, or any other applicable common law or statutory cause of action. RSA 194:40 provides for certain restrictions on certain educational programs by public schools and provides for disciplinary sanctions to be taken by the Board of Education against educators who violate the statute. It also authorizes the Attorney General to initiate a civil action against a school or school district in superior court for legal or equitable relief, or with the Commission for Human Rights as provided in RSA 354-A:34. The remedies under current law could result in cases or appeals being filed in the Superior or Supreme Courts. The Branch indicates the current law has not been in effect long enough to know how many cases will be filed in the courts arising out of violations. The Branch is, therefore, unable to determine how many fewer cases, if any, would be filed if the sections referenced are repealed.

The Department of Justice states the Attorney General is empowered to bring enforcement actions under RSA 354-A, including to redress these recently enacted provisions. Repeal of these provisions would likely save the Department the cost of investigating and litigating certain

claims, which would likely reduce litigation costs related to these provisions. Because provisions are new, any potential cost reduction is indeterminate. There would be no impact on state revenues.

The Human Rights Commission indicates the fiscal impact is indeterminable because it is uncertain if there would be fewer cases due to a repeal of these sections.

The Department of Labor indicated it would not be impacted by this bill as it does not administer the statutes being repealed.

It is assumed that any fiscal impact would occur after FY 2022.
