• Asked about wording and Rep. Litchfield explained

• Asked for clarification re: "population increase"

Rep. Litchfield

• Explained that meant <u>Student population</u>.

• Advocated developing some sort of "weighted methodology" a developing propositional school board representation

Barrett Christina - School Board Associate

• Explained that concerns over proportioned school board representation go way back and suggested a possible study team to address the issue.

Rep. Luneau

• Affirmed that the relevant statute goes back to 1963 and wondered if the statutory language should be updated.

Barrett Christina

• Described that other states were forcing consolidation (Maine, VT) but NH seemed to feature movements away from consolidation.

Chair Rep. Ladd

• Explained that the proposed study team should be a more formal 2 year commission as opposed to an interim study commission.

Eric Pauer - Brookline

- A former school board worker
- Spoke in favor of the bill, but endorsed proportionately, "one man one vote" and offered to serve on a proposed commission.

Such other method of selection of cooperative school board members compatible with 20 proportional representation, one-man one-vote principle as may be approved by the state board of 21education. 22[VI.] II. The terms of the members of the cooperative school board shall be as provided in the 23bylaws or articles of agreement provided that in no case shall such terms exceed 3 years. 24Whenever the bylaws or articles of agreement provide for the election of 25 cooperative school board members pursuant to this chapter, said election shall be with the use of the

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
