Rep Tanner, Prime sponsor

This bill requires that a unique pupil identifier be made available to scholarship organizations for distribution of education freedom accounts.

She has been concerned about the tracking of EFA students.

Rep Luneau, HB 1626 vs HB 1649 regarding the scholarship organization

Response: The distribution of EFAs is important so it includes possible future organizations.

Rep Moffett, Why does this include information go to the DOE, the legislative budget office, and the Attorney General's office? Couldn't these organizations just go to the DOE for the information?

Response: Concern that information from DOE has not been totally accurate. She personally wants to make sure that these agencies have the ability to see this data.

Rep Ladd, The AG and LBA has the ability to do a performance audit on any of the educational areas of our state. When they are tasked to do this by this legislature, they do not go to the DOE to get necessary information. This way we get the information as quickly as possible.

Matt Southerland, Children's Scholarship Fund

He is here for technical assistance. The Commissioner does have the ability to give anyone access to the system.

The I4c system does allow them to upload to the DOE database, but it does not allow them to put in financial data, as it appears this bill is requesting. It simply does not have that capability. They are required to report aggregated assessment information at the end of each year.

Rep Ladd, In terms of the assessment data, aggregated data vs. individual.

Response: Exactly, aggregated.

Rep Ladd, More detail on breakdowns.

Response: He would need to get it to us later.

ANALYSIS

This bill requires that unique pupil identifier be made available to scholarship organizations for the distribution of educational freedom accounts.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to unique pupil identification for pupils in the education freedom accounts program.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Adequate Public Education; Unique Pupil Identification. Amend RSA 193-E:5, I(b)-(p) to read
2 as follows:

3 (b) The random number generator shall make available to each early childhood program,
4 district, ***scholarship organization for the distribution of education freedom accounts***
5 ***(EFAs)***, or postsecondary institution a unique pupil identifier for each pupil pursuing an education
6 in a New Hampshire early childhood program, district, ***scholarship organization for the***
7 ***distribution of EFAs***, or postsecondary institution. The unique pupil identifier itself shall not
8 permit pupil identification within a subcategory including, but not limited to, early childhood
9 program, district, postsecondary institution, sex, age, grade, or county of residence.

10 (c) The unique pupil identifier shall be requested and maintained by the early childhood
11 program, district, ***scholarship organization for the distribution of EFAs***, or postsecondary
12 institution. The unique pupil identifier shall remain in the pupil's file throughout his or her
13 academic career in New Hampshire.

14 (d)(1) Access to the random number generator shall be limited to an early childhood
15 program director or designee, a district superintendent or designee, ***or the director of the***
16 ***scholarship organization for the distribution of EFAs***, or a postsecondary institution registrar
17 or designee, and only for pupils pursuing an education in that early childhood program, district,
18 ***EFA***, or postsecondary institution.

19 (2) A parent or legal guardian shall, upon request made in person to the early child
20 program director, school district superintendent for the district which the child last attended,
21 ***scholarship organization for the distribution of EFAs***, or postsecondary institution registrar,
22 have access to their child's unique pupil identifier and their child's data maintained in the data
23 warehouse. A person who is 18 years of age or older shall, upon request made in person to the early
24 child program director, school district superintendent for the district which the person last attended,
25 or postsecondary institution registrar, have access to their unique pupil identifier and their data
26 maintained in the data warehouse.

27 (3) Any person who knowingly violates the provisions of this subparagraph is guilty
28 of a class B felony and may be subject to involuntary termination of employment.

29 (e) The random number generator shall create and maintain a comprehensive audit trail
30 for all users accessing the random number generator.

1 (f) The data warehouse shall create and maintain an audit trail for all users accessing
2 secure information.

3 (g) No person, including an individual, business, government, or governmental entity,
4 shall require an individual to provide a unique pupil identifier as a condition of doing business,
5 providing a service, or receiving a benefit of any kind, except as provided in RSA 193-E:5, I(c) **or**
6 ***unless receiving public funding for the education of a New Hampshire student.*** Any person
7 or entity who knowingly violates the provisions of this subparagraph shall be liable for actual
8 damages or \$25,000, whichever is greater, for each violation. Each denial of services or benefits
9 shall constitute a separate offense under this subparagraph.

10 (h) If a pupil's records become part of an administrative action outside of the pupil's
11 early childhood program, district, ***scholarship organization distributing EFAs,*** or postsecondary
12 institution, or a part of any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding, the part of the record containing the
13 pupil's unique pupil identifier shall be redacted by the early childhood program, district, or
14 postsecondary institution prior to release.

15 (i) The information maintained in the data warehouse shall be available to the
16 department of education, ***the legislative budget office, the attorney general's office,*** and to the
17 public using the data maintained by the department of education. No personally identifiable
18 information shall be required as a condition of access or usage under this subparagraph, nor shall
19 such access or usage be tracked. Under no circumstances shall the unique pupil identifier be made
20 available to the public.

21 (j) Information maintained in the random number generator shall be exempt from the
22 provisions of RSA 91-A.

23 (k) Authorized personnel at the department of education shall administer and maintain
24 the unique pupil identification system.

25 (l) Except as provided in RSA 193-C:12, the department of education shall provide no
26 personally identifiable information collected pursuant to this chapter, including but not limited to
27 name, date of birth, or social security number to any person or entity, other than an early childhood
28 program, district, ***scholarship organization distributing EFAs,*** or postsecondary institution
29 authorized to access this data, absent a court order. Under no circumstances shall personally
30 identifiable information or the unique pupil identifier be provided to any person or entity outside of
31 New Hampshire. Any person who knowingly violates this provision is guilty of a class B felony and
32 may be subject to involuntary termination of employment.

33 (m) Early childhood programs not receiving Head Start or child care scholarship funds,
34 private schools comprised of kindergarten through grade 12, and all private postsecondary
35 institutions may participate in the data warehouse and random number generator. Participating
36 early childhood programs may volunteer to include data for pupils for which Head Start or child care
37 scholarship funds are not received. Permission of a parent or legal guardian of a pupil enrolled in an

1 early childhood program shall be obtained before a pupil may participate in the data warehouse and
2 random number generator. For the purposes of this section, such voluntary participating early
3 childhood programs shall be included in the definition set forth in RSA 193-E:4.

4 (n) Notwithstanding subparagraphs (a)-(m), to enable the department of education to
5 ensure the accuracy of the data, the commissioner of the department of education may, in writing,
6 grant individuals access to the data warehouse, including but not limited to, access to the unique
7 pupil identifier for the purpose of connecting information in the warehouse with the random number
8 generator.

9 (o) At the request of an early childhood program, school district, ***scholarship***
10 ***organization for the distribution of EFAs***, or postsecondary institution, the department of
11 education shall provide pupil-level data from the unique pupil identification system to an early
12 childhood program, school district, or postsecondary institution for pupils pursuing an education in
13 that entity. Except as otherwise specifically provided in statute, the department shall not provide
14 for any purpose any student personally-identifiable data to any public or private individual or entity,
15 including the local, state, or federal government, or department or agency thereof, regardless of
16 whether such individual or entity is for profit or not-for-profit, ~~and regardless of whether the public~~
17 ~~or private individual or entity is involved in any way with the pupil's education]~~ ***unless receiving***
18 ***state public funding including funds from the educational trust fund.***

19 (p) New Hampshire home educated pupils pursuing an education in a postsecondary
20 institution who have not been assigned a unique pupil identifier may, without penalty, opt out of
21 being included in the unique pupil identification system for postsecondary pupils ***unless receiving***
22 ***state public funding including funds from the educational trust fund.***

23 2 New Paragraph; Educational Freedom Accounts; Scholarship Organization Authority and
24 Responsibilities. Amend RSA 194-F:4 by inserting after paragraph I the following new paragraph:

25 I-a. The scholarship organization shall request and maintain unique pupil identifiers
26 pursuant to RSA 193-E:5, which shall be kept to aggregate data reported to the department of
27 education, to certify student eligibility with regard to residency, age, and income, to determine
28 enrollment status with resident districts, to record annual records of attainment, to report qualifying
29 expenses records, and to determine compliance with rules and requirements.

30 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
