Dear Members of the House Education Committee and my local representatives of the NH House,

I am writing today with a great deal of concern regarding HB1671 which removes a number of core educational components from our state's academic curriculum.

We, as a society, need to place high value in the future of this state and the students that will one day be in your seats. There is no argument that the curriculum must include math, science, language arts and social studies, however, equally important in this ever-evolving world are world language, engineering, computer science, digital literacy, physical education and the arts & humanities. New Hampshire is fortunate to have a strong education system, albeit equitable funding could still use some work. We should not be looking to send a message that our students would be sufficiently educated by 4 core subject areas and a happenstance on the other skills, talents and focus that will produce the workforce of our future and the 'fire' in our communities. The educational disciplines that are listed as 'non-core' in this bill are likewise responsible for giving each student a fair chance to learn from multiple experiences.

Does it come down to money and funding? It appears so! What price can we put on an individual with a well-rounded education. Students can learn many things via television and gaming screens, yet we know that this type of passive environment does not stimulate the brain as much as a series of active and engaging teachable moments. We have made use of Zoom and other such platforms to get us through the tough educational times associated with the COVID pandemic. We've seen some positive outcomes and have heard many a tale of the negative results as well. The nation has lost many valuable educators as a result of the additional stresses associated with forced on-line learning.

We cannot be serious about allowing this bill to actually take hold. Educators in all disciplines navigate similar training and education prior to stepping a single foot in a classroom. Those disciplines, identified here as non-core, require additional and specialized training to ensure the effective delivery of their own subject matter. They certainly cannot be replaced by the "...VLACS or some other means..." as the commissioner suggested in a recent interview. VLACS has its place and some students are fortunate to have access to those programs, however, this is not the educational norm that our students deserve; it is also not the educational format traditionally funded by the state's taxpayers.

Yes, one can have composition projects in music class, visual arts experiences in language arts lessons, discussions of health and physical activity in social studies; ALL of these topics can be integrated. However, that does not mean that this process is what is best for our students. Few people can teach the importance of physical activity better than the physical education specialist. Few people can invoke the benefits of music and art in to everyday existence better than the music and arts specialists. It strikes me as eerily similar to allowing a general physician to step in for the many specialists on which we so depend for our personal health care concerns. Yes, the Nurse Practitioner can do many things to positively affect the health and well-being of his/her patients, but one could not be expected to know everything about all

of the many intricate systems in our bodies. So, too, it is in education. School systems must work to provide the best education possible for our students and the best education includes ALL of the above mentioned disciplines as a rule. Education is already negatively impacted by so many distractions in and out of the classrooms. Let's not make it worse by minimalizing what having a decent education entails. Build a strong, well-rounded education system and build a strong future; for students, for pass times, for careers, for businesses, for economics, for society, for engagement, for compassion, for confidence, for life!

HOUSE BILL 1672

AN ACT relative to misuse of education freedom account funds.

SPONSORS: Rep. Luneau, Merr. 10; Rep. Myler, Merr. 10

COMMITTEE: Education

ANALYSIS

This bill requires the transfer of funds from terminated education freedom accounts to the education trust fund, requires investigation of and ineligibility for misuse of funds, and requires the department of education adopt the rules on policies and procedures for administration of the program.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Education Freedom Accounts; Program Funds. Amend RSA 194-F:2, VII to read as follows:
- VII. An EFA shall remain in force, and any unused funds shall roll over from quarter-to-quarter and from year-to-year until the parent withdraws the EFA student from the EFA program, the student becomes ineligible for the program, or until the EFA student graduates from high school, unless the EFA is closed because of a substantial misuse of funds. Any unused funds shall revert to the education trust fund established in RSA 198:39 and be allocated to fund other EFAs.
 - 2 Accounts; Termination. Amend RSA 194-F:3, VI(a) and (b) to read as follows:
- (a) Enrolling as a full-time student in the resident district public school shall result in the immediate suspension of payment of additional funds into the student's EFA[. However, an EFA that has been open for at least one full school year shall remain open and active for the parent to make qualifying expenditures to educate the student from funds remaining in the EFA. When no funds remain in the student's EFA, the scholarship organization may close the EFA], termination of the EFA, and the transfer of any remaining funds back to the education trust fund.
- (b) If an eligible student decides to return to the EFA program, [payments into the student's existing EFA may resume if the EFA is still open and active.] a new EFA may be
- established [if the student's EFA was closed].
 - 3 List of Education Service Providers. Amend RSA 194-F:4, I to read as follows:
 - I. The scholarship organization shall maintain an updated list of education service providers and shall ensure that the list is publicly available through various sources, including the [Internet] department's website.
 - 4 Scholarship Organization Responsibilities. Amend RSA 194-F:4, XI-XVII to read as follows:
 - XI. The scholarship organization [may] **shall** make any parent or EFA student ineligible for the EFA program in the event of [intentional and] substantial misuse of EFA funds.
 - (a) The scholarship organization shall create procedures to ensure that a fair process exists to determine whether [an intentional and] a substantial misuse of EFA funds has occurred.
 - (b) If an EFA student is free from personal misconduct, that student shall be eligible for an EFA in the future if placed with a new guardian or other person with the legal authority to act on behalf of the student.
 - (c) The scholarship organization [may] **shall** refer suspected cases of [intentional and] substantial misuse of EFA funds to the attorney general for investigation [if evidence of fraudulent use of EFA funds is obtained].
