As part of the continuing refinement of the Fetal Life Protection Act, this bill incorporates changes in three areas. First, both the majority amendment and the minority amendment contain identical language clarifying the legislature's intention that ultrasound tests be required only in such cases necessary to confirm the gestational age of the fetus of at least 24 weeks. Second, exceptions to the 24-week standard are defined to include cases in which fetal anomalies are incompatible with life, or a medical emergency makes it necessary to preserve the life or health of the pregnant woman. The third change eliminates the criminal and civil penalties for violation of the Fetal Protection Act. Medical care in the reproductive health or gynecology field, including abortion, is provided by medical professionals who are licensed by the NH Board of Medicine and the NH Board of Nursing. These boards oversee the education, background, and training of every doctor, nurse, nurse practitioner, and physician assistant in New Hampshire. In addition to state requirements for professional licensing and continuing medical education, both licensed providers and facilities are subject to professional credentialing and quality assurance reviews from insurance companies. Therefore, the state already has in place a comprehensive system for requiring compliance with state law and regulations.

1 Amend the title of the bill by replacing it with the following:

5 Amend the bill by replacing all after the enacting clause with the following:

7 1 Fetal Life Protection Act; Prohibitions; Ultrasound Examination Requirement. Amend RSA
8 329:44 to read as follows:

9 329:44 Prohibition.

10 I. Except in the case of ***fetal anomalies incompatible with life or*** a medical emergency
11 as [~~specifically~~] defined in paragraph III, no abortion shall be performed, induced, or attempted by
12 any health care provider unless a health care provider has first made a determination of the
13 probable gestational age of the fetus. In making such a determination, the health care provider shall
14 make such inquiries of the pregnant woman and perform or cause to be performed all such medical
15 examinations, imaging studies, and tests as a reasonably prudent health care provider in the
16 community, knowledgeable about the medical facts and conditions of both the woman and the fetus
17 involved, would consider necessary to perform and consider in making an accurate diagnosis with
18 respect to gestational age, provided, however, that the health care provider shall conduct an
19 obstetric ultrasound examination of the patient for the purpose of making the determination. ***This***
20 ***subdivision shall be construed to require the performance of an ultrasound only if the***
21 ***provider either knows that the fetus has a gestational age of at least 24 weeks or is***
22 ***conscious of a substantial risk that the fetus has a gestational age of at least 24 weeks.***

23 II. Except in ***the case of fetal anomalies incompatible with life or*** a medical emergency
24 as [~~specifically~~] defined in paragraph III, no health care provider shall knowingly perform, induce, or
25 attempt to perform an abortion upon a pregnant woman when the probable gestational age of her
26 fetus has been determined to be at least 24 weeks or in the absence of a determination by a health
27 care provider pursuant to paragraph I as to the fetus' probable gestational age.

28 III. For the purposes of this subdivision only, "medical emergency" means a condition in
29 which an abortion is necessary to preserve the life ***or health*** of the pregnant woman whose life is
30 endangered by a physical disorder, physical illness, or physical injury, including a life-endangering
31 physical condition caused by or arising from the pregnancy itself, or when continuation of the

***Rep. Simpson Sponsor Support**

Judiciary was my first committee in 1977. The first bill then was regarding reproductive rights. Many people prefer the term abortion. I think reproductive rights is better because it deals with a much broader subject including reproduction, health education, and more in addition to abortion. Abortion has been around forever. Nothing we do here will change the fact that sometimes pregnancies occur that, in a better world, shouldn't. We hear plenty from both sides about situations that may or may not be true. There was never a good reason for abortion language to be placed in the budget. We here today are trying to undo the damage done by that language not coming through the appropriate policy committee. All I ask today, is to ensure the NH Legislature act honorably, regardless of how we feel about abortion. If we repeal the existing law, the actual policies will be debated in this committee and other relevant ones.

Rep Altschiller Sponsor Support Freedom independence and privacy are outlined in the first couple of articles in the NH constitution, except for abortion. The current law is an egregious violation of women's inherent rights. These restrictions on abortion make it harder to attract OBGYNs. Repealing this ban is critical for providers whose patients are going through very complex situations. The attacks on bodily autonomy are relentless. The Legislature has inserted itself into the most private decisions woman make. No one here should have any sway over the personal decisions women make to abort. Trust the women and doctors.

Q Notter: What section requires a transvaginal ultrasound:

Ans: We've heard testimony that such an abortion would require that type early in pregnancy and women can't access abortion care without one.

***Rep Folsom Graf 11 Opposed**

There is no ultrasound requirement for an abortion in the first 6 months. All the law does is follow the guidance of SCOTUS to implement the state's requirement to protect that early life. There is a problem with the law, we do, as we did in my committee, we fix the problem.

Q Chase: Please explain the fix you reference?

Ans: A lawyer will follow me to do that.

Q McLean: Is it true, the existing law already clarifies, in the penalty phase, that it applies only to covered abortions?

Ans: I agree that is the correct reading of the law.

Rep Hakken-Phillips Graf 12 Support

OBGYNs believe the current law can send them to jail now and this bill will remove that threat. She reviews the stipulations in the Fetal Life Protection Act. We know this bill is deeply unpopular. Governor Sununu has gone on record suggesting that exceptions should be added.

Rep Matt Simon Graf 14 Opposed

What I have not heard is whether the victim of these abortions is a human being or not. SCOTUS moved the place at which the state interest in protecting life is at viability because at that time, that state's interest is stronger than the woman's right to privacy. The current law protects people not just at 24 weeks.

Q Notter: Please expound on the ultrasound requirement?

Ans: when that provision is taken alone, it does sound like an ultrasound is required throughout pregnancy. But, taken in context of the penalty clause, the object of the ultrasound is to ensure the child is at least 24 weeks and, thereby, covered by the law.

Rep Murray See Written

Abortion can be provided via telemedicine, that is with abortion pills, but the ultrasound requirement prevents that.

***Danielle Albushies NH Medical Society Support**

It is very possible that a woman with a problematic pregnancy will carry beyond 24 weeks before a full diagnosis is known. A woman should not be forced to continue such a pregnancy any longer than she has to.

Q Horrigan: What percentage of pregnancies have issues

Ans: in the first trimester about 20% of pregnancies end in miscarriage. As to the fatal diagnoses, I don't know.

Q Chase: How can we find the age of the fetus without an ultrasound?

Ans: Early in the pregnancy that is the only way.

Q I have never heard of a transvaginal ultrasound. How come?

Ans: Typical ultrasounds done later in pregnancy are not transvaginal, but more complicated ones require them to get an accurate age of the fetus.

Q Is there any other area of medicine subject to law like the Fetal Life protection Act?

Ans: No

Ian Huyett Cornerstone Policy Opposed

HB1609 in the House and SB399 in the Senate clarify the ultrasound requirement in law applies only to those abortions covered by the current law. We strongly suggest no changes to the Fetal Life Protection Act or modifying it to become a violation of basic human rights, we would favor a full repeal.

Q Notter: Do other states have 24-week abortion bans?

Ans: We have seen a big push to repeal that type of legislation in Democrat states in the last couple of years. Prior to that almost every state had such bans. NH went in the opposite direction last year.

Q Does our law deal with Fetal anomalies?

Ans: No. Almost all of those are diagnosed well before the 6-month age we have in law. An alternative would be to use the 'viability' standard, but when we tried that in NH, the medical community testified that was too subjective and would force mothers to carry those babies even longer.

Q Does the act prevent removing a dead baby?

Ans: No.

Q Horrigan: Was our laws drafted by some national organization?

Ans: No. I work for Cornerstone and we drafted the language locally.

Q Did this bill go through the House?

Ans: The Senate moved the content of HB1625, which did pass the House, into the budget, so I think the answer is yes.

***Matthew Houde VP Gov't relations Dartmouth Hitchcock**

DH opposed the Fetal Life Protection Act last year for various reasons. I have a written statement [he reads] [see written Dartmouth-Hitchcock]

***Catherine Peternel Self**

When I was born in 1968, against the wishes of my Maternal grandmother. Fortunately, abortion was illegal. I had a problematic pregnancy and a baby who, delivered by emergency C section at 23 weeks, lived only a short time. That time with my son was invaluable.

***Kayla Montgomery VP PPAF**

You should repeal the unnecessary ultrasound requirement from the FLPA. Over the past months you have heard about pregnancies with fatal fetal anomalies discovered only later on pregnancy. They may not happen very often, but they do happen regularly. People should be able to make decisions in these cases without interference from the State. We would prefer the law be repealed completely.

Q Notter: How many late-term abortions were performed in NH

Ans: PP only odes abortions up to 16 weeks, so I don't know.

Q Does Planned Parenthood do ultrasound prior to their abortions?

Ans: We obey the law.

Q Would you do an abortion without an ultrasound?

Ans: Generally, but some patients just don't need one. If they know how old the fetus is, they can just take pills and abort at home.

***Lori Safford Self & Sons Oppose**

When my children were young, I was told they would not survive. Today they both have a fatal fetal anomaly, they are alive today and children and others like them, I'm doing well. My friend wants ne to share her story. She was told her baby wouldn't survive, but she is now 21. Had she listened to her doctor, she would have killed her before birth.

***Frank Knaack ACLU NH Supports** The civil penalty in the FLPA allows some people not involved in the abortion to sue.

Jason Hennessey NHRTL Opposed

The big question we face is "Who is a person?" Great tragedy has been evidenced when this question is answered wrong. The FLPA only protects people older than 24 weeks, but the human life begins at conception. Giving birth is safer for the mother than late-term abortion so for fetal anomalies, delivery is better than abortion.

***Devan Quinn NH Women's Foundation Support**

She reads her written testimony.

Samantha Marccoux Opposed

I am here because I was born, and everyone deserves that right. See Written Marccoux

*** [email] Michelle Cilley Foky Support**

I had a fatal diagnosis for my daughter. She had heart problems and others. We had her delivered and she was stillborn.

Sarah Marcoux Opposed I was pressured to abort my daughter. There is an outcry from real people, being drowned out by big money corporations. There are many negative consequences from late-term abortions.

Q Chase: How do you know women who have abortions have higher cancer rates?

Ans: the NHRTL website.

Q Notter: Have you heard of Dr Lanfranchi?

Ans: No

Maris Toland Self Support

The mandatory ultrasound sends a message of distrust. The wide range of people here shows why we need an array of medically safe options. Many women do not want abortions and shouldn't have to, but others do and should be able to. Providers should not be penalized for providing safe options to their patients.

Q Paige: In your experience, is there a scenario, where our ultrasound requirement would mean a trans-vaginal ultrasound?

Ans: An obstetrical ultrasound is to determine the fetus' age Depending on the age. If the pregnancy is very, very early, that may require a transvaginal ultrasound, but normally not.

Q McLean: What kind would be used if there is doubt about if the baby is 24 weeks old?

Ans: External ultrasound would confirm the age.

Q Notter: How many late-term abortion done in NH?

Ans: I don't know. It is quite uncommon. However, there are exceedingly rare situations where fetal diagnoses cannot be made until after 24 weeks,

Roy Dennehy Self Opposed

This is a law that prevents a baby being killed after it reaches 24 weeks old. Those who oppose the FLPA advocate for killing babies over 24 weeks old. They are spending millions to advertise against this protection. We should be defending the right to life of all pre-born children.

Janes O'Shiere Self Support

I am 15 years old. We are the ones who will be affected by your laws today. We deserve to control our bodies.

Q Chase: Do you think it is appropriate for the Legislature to tell people what to do with their bodies?

Ans: No. The legislative body can't know what I feel in my body.

***Shannon McGinley Self Opposed**

If the baby in question is even close to 24 weeks, it will be very obvious, and no transvaginal ultrasound would be required. A friend had a baby with serious problems. It was delivered early and lived a very short time, but that time was extremely valuable to the family. I had a pregnancy later in life and got a diagnosis of fetal anomaly. We refused the offered abortion solution, and my son was born totally fine.

Q McLean: Do you have any data about how Fatal Fetal anomalies were addressed in Massachusetts under that law?

Ans: No

***Margaret Drye Self Opposed**

Today is day 41 of the Fetal Protection Act and the legislature is already taking action to clarify it. Last month we heard testimony from mothers around the state who have had babies with fetal anomalies. Today we can handle far more situations than we could even twenty years ago. We should always be trying to protect both lives.

Sandra Rigazio Self Opposed

She read s a letter from "Debbie": I chose adoption for a baby girl instead of abortion. In a later pregnancy we chose to not abort and had a son who lived normally 20 years and died in a car accident.

Kelley Potenza Self Opposed

Repeal of the FLPA would legalize even partial birth abortion. She describes the partial birth abortion procedure in pretty graphic detail. This is horrific. This isn't a partisan issue. We know what is going on. Please kill this bill.

Rep Perez Self Support

Women need and deserve to control our bodies. I have a granddaughter. I don't wish abortion for her, but we have done enough damage to women in our state.

Honorable Chairman and members of the House Judiciary Committee,

I'm Dr Amy Paris, a NH native and OBGYN taking care of the women of NH for four years. I strongly support both HB1673 and HB1674, but I can't be in person at the hearing because I will be taking care of patients. Please include the following as a part of the public record.

As an Obstetrician-Gynecologist, born in Manchester, raised in Hooksett, and now practicing in Lebanon, NH, I understand that every Granite Stater should have access to the health care they need - including abortion - without government interference.

Let me tell you about a couple, patients of mine. Newly married in their late 30s, their prayers were answered when they were able to get pregnant right away. Everything seemed to be going perfectly with the pregnancy until the ultrasound at 20 weeks. This is the big one every couple looks forward to, when they get to see 3D images of their baby and learn the gender. Only for this couple, the news was not good. The bag of water was nearly empty and the baby was smaller than she should have been. After visits with a team of specialists and undergoing an amniocentesis, the couple learned of their baby's poor prognosis: she would either die before being born, or shortly after birth. This couple found themselves faced with a terrible decision, which they were able to get through with the support of their loved ones and the care of their doctors.

Although abortions later in pregnancy are rare (just 1.2% of abortions are performed at or after 21 weeks), these frequently occur after a couple learns information about their pregnancy that was not able to be learned earlier in pregnancy. In these complex and often devastating situations, it is more important than ever for patients to get the care from their trusted medical team close to home. We shouldn't have to send Granite Staters to Boston or New York to get the care they need when we are perfectly equipped to provide patients health care they need right here. But without New Hampshire solutions, people in need of abortion care - at any stage of pregnancy - might be forced to leave New Hampshire, if they can afford it.

We are in a crisis moment in our country - nearly half a century of legal precedent is about to be upended at the US Supreme Court. We need New Hampshire solutions to protect and expand access to abortion care.

We've seen what happens when politicians stand in the way of women's health and interfere in these deeply personal medical decisions. In states that have passed laws like this, some women and their families have been put into unimaginable situations — needing to end a pregnancy, but unable to do so.

I and my physician colleagues support access to safe abortion as an integral component of reproductive health care. New Hampshire has a strong tradition of supporting the

doctor-patient relationship without interference, and these bills give us an opportunity to further this tradition.

I strongly urge you to support HB1673 and HB1674.

My name is Chloe Ezzo. I am a 23-year-old student at Dartmouth College. I am writing to ask that you oppose HB 1673-FN. Once again, by their latest attempt to repeal New Hampshire's modest Fetal Protection Act that safeguards the preborn in their last months, Democrats have clearly demonstrated their lack of respect for all preborn life. They have hidden behind the argument that an ultrasound is an unnecessarily invasive procedure before an abortion. Fortunately, HB 1609 and SB 399, as amended by their respective committees now both clarify the ultrasound requirement as only being required when there is the likelihood that a child may be in their 24th week or later. It is required to determine the gestational age; otherwise, the law is unenforceable.

Unlike the claims of pro-abortion organizations like Planned Parenthood, abortion is not a routine "medical procedure" or "healthcare," but a form of physically traumatic violence against both the mother and her preborn child.

Freedom, independence and privacy. Constitutionally protected rights outlined in Article 1, Article 2 and article 2b.

Except when pregnant. When pregnant, the state legislature has a seat at your table. While you make decisions about your medical care during pregnancy, legislators in New Hampshire have already decided you are incapable of making medical decisions for your own health.

This is an egregious infringement on the autonomy of a pregnant person's rights.

We heard from providers that there are a very limited number of OBs who can deliver late term fetal abnormality abortion care, and this bill criminalizes them for doing their job. Leaving this legislation in place makes recruiting and training providers in our state much more difficult. Why would a doctor looking to practice gynecology and obstetrics want to practice in a state where the state has made a hostile environment for practicing reproductive medicine? Repealing this ban is critical for providers whose patients are going through potentially incredibly complex situations. They risk facing criminal charges for delivering critical care and patients who are already in a stressful situation to leave their home state to get care.

The attacks on bodily autonomy are relentless and they are about power and control. Who is a fully recognized and whole person able to make their own decisions about their reproductive health. The legislature has inserted itself into the very personal and private medical decisions of pregnant women. Not just metaphorically but literally as women are forced to endure ultrasounds to

access abortion healthcare. It boggles the mind as to why the state insists on a vaginal ultrasound so that a woman can access the oral abortion healthcare, mifepristone and misoprostol, which can be safely used up to the first 70 days (10 weeks) of pregnancy. But first, the state insists you endure an ultrasound. Who is in control in that situation? Who is exercising power? It's not the pregnant woman.

It should not matter if a pregnancy is the result of failed birth control, sexual assault, incest, or decision that best serves the person whose body is actually pregnant. A pregnancy is not an invitation for the state to jump in with medical advice. It's no one's business but the person who is pregnant. It's their body and no one here should have any claim on what their very personal reproductive healthcare options are. Unless the underlying desire is for power and control.

I strongly urge the committee to repeal the fetal protection act that more accurately should be named the power and control over pregnant women act. Trust New Hampshire women with their pregnancy healthcare decisions, trust doctors to deliver critical care to women without threat of criminal penalty.

AN ACT relative to certain provisions of the fetal life protection act requiring an ultrasound examination.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Fetal Life Protection Act; Prohibitions; Ultrasound Examination Requirement. Amend RSA
2 329:44, I to read as follows:

3 I. Except in the case of a medical emergency as specifically defined in paragraph III, no
4 abortion shall be performed, induced, or attempted by any health care provider unless a health care
5 provider has first made a determination of the probable gestational age of the fetus. In making such
6 a determination, the health care provider shall make such inquiries of the pregnant woman and
7 perform or cause to be performed all such medical examinations, imaging studies, and tests as a
8 reasonably prudent health care provider in the community, knowledgeable about the medical facts
9 and conditions of both the woman and the fetus involved, would consider necessary to perform and
10 consider in making an accurate diagnosis with respect to gestational age, provided, however, that
11 the health care provider shall conduct an obstetric ultrasound examination of the patient for the
12 purpose of making the determination. ***This subdivision shall be construed to require the***
13 ***performance of an ultrasound only if the provider either knows that the fetus has a***
14 ***gestational age of at least 24 weeks or is conscious of a substantial risk that the fetus has a***
15 ***gestational age of at least 24 weeks.***

16 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.



Support HB 1673 - Prevent the Government from Controlling Private Healthcare Decisions

Bill Summary: HB 1673 would repeal RSA 329:43 through 329:50 – the so-called “fetal health protection act.” Under RSA 329:43 through 329:50:

- Abortions are banned at or after 24 weeks, with limited exceptions for the life of the pregnant person or serious risk of substantial and irreversible impairment of a major bodily function.
- An ultrasound is required prior to all abortion care - at all stages of pregnancy.
- Abortion providers can face both criminal and civil liability for providing abortion care to their patients.

No one should be forced to carry a pregnancy against their will. Current New Hampshire law denies Granite Staters their right to decide for themselves whether or not to end a pregnancy. When it comes to the most personal decisions in life — such as preventing or ending a pregnancy or having a child — it should be up to the pregnant person, free from punishment, judgment, or political interference.

Current law deputizes people unconnected with an abortion to sue health care providers. The civil remedies section of the abortion ban allows the spouse or parent(s) of a person who has an abortion outside of the ban to sue the health care provider who performed the abortion for civil damages. In reality, this means that an abusive spouse or estranged parents have legal standing to sue a medical provider.

This legislation places both medical providers and their patients at risk. It imposes potential sanctions on abortion-providing doctors unless the procedure is intended to prevent death or serious risk of substantial and irreversible impairment of a major bodily function. Because there is no clear, universal definition of the point at which a pregnant person’s life becomes endangered, even when a physician is certain that an abortion or another intervention which poses a threat to a pregnancy is in the patient’s best interest, the risk of prosecution will incentivize waiting to act until the patient’s symptoms become demonstrably life-threatening. The threat of criminal and/or civil liability directly conflicts with a doctor’s ability to effectively treat a patient needing medical care.

The vast majority of Granite Staters support safe, legal abortion. Sixty-six percent of Granite Staters support keeping abortion legal in all/most cases, rejecting the idea that bodies are public property to be regulated by government officials.ⁱ In fact, only three states have a higher percentage of residents who support safe, legal abortion access.ⁱⁱ As this polling makes clear, Granite Staters don’t appreciate government intervention into their private health care decisions.

The New Hampshire Legislature should focus on the pressing health care needs of Granite Staters. Over two thousand Granite Staters have died from COVID-19.ⁱⁱⁱ Over 285,000 Granite Staters have had COVID-19.^{iv} At least 181 people are currently hospitalized in New Hampshire with COVID-19.^v New Hampshire has 13 percent remaining capacity in their ICUs.^{vi} Nearly one in four New Hampshire hospitals are experiencing a critical staffing shortage.^{vii} Instead of expanding the government’s control of private health care decisions, legislators should be focused on the acute needs of medical providers in New Hampshire to combat COVID-19.

The New Hampshire Women's Foundation invests in equality and opportunity for New Hampshire women and girls through research, education, advocacy, and grantmaking.

We believe HB1673 Ought to Pass because an 24-week abortion ban and ultrasound mandate impose inequitable barriers to accessing abortion and create a culture of shame and stigma for those seeking reproductive health care.

24 Week Abortion Ban Creates Inequitable Access to Care

A 24-week abortion ban places an inequitable burden on some people who will be forced to seek abortion in another state who may not have the means to do so. This would include low-income women, women living in rural areas, survivors of domestic violence and control who are limited in their movement and travel, and those without access to transportation. A 24-week abortion ban in New Hampshire targets women who need local, compassionate, reliable, and affordable care the most.

Ultrasound Mandate Creates Culture of Shame and Stigma

The ultrasound mandate, when applied to people who would not medically need or personally want an ultrasound, sometimes very early on in a pregnancy, contributes to a culture of shaming women. We believe this medically unnecessary requirement exists for one reason only: to add an additional barrier to a person seeking reproductive healthcare. In so doing, it is clear that the intent is to disempower women and individuals seeking an abortion.

Conclusion

We believe women and people who can become pregnant should have access to the full range of reproductive health care, including abortion, free from shame and stigma. We urge the Committee to recommend HB1673 Ought to Pass.

Today is Day 41 for the Fetal Life Protection Act. Though on the books less than six weeks, already there have been attempts not to tweak it or fine-tune it or clarify it, but to repeal it.

A bill to clarify it hasn't even gone to the floor for a vote yet.

Repealing this statute would allow abortion without restriction throughout pregnancy.

This is 2022. Things are much different from 1973, when *Roe v. Wade* was decided. Ultrasound has given us an incredibly accurate window to the womb. We understand that unborn children are capable of feeling pain. Pre-natal surgery is better. There were no pregnancy care centers in 1973, now there are thousands, including multiple ones in New Hampshire.

The common reasons given for allowing abortion after 24 weeks are that it is rare and usually involves a fetal anomaly or a risk to the mother. Last month, I sat through a morning of testimony from mothers who, though given a discouraging diagnosis, gave birth to healthy children. I sat behind a young woman who was born at 24 weeks gestation and listened as she read us her testimony.

We have almost 50 years worth of technological and medical advances available now that weren't available in 1973. Why are we trying to take our abortion law back to 1973? When presented with these hard cases, we have a choice before us – we can treat the two patients involved, trying the best to save both, or we can disregard the living, kicking, pain-capable patient in the womb who is destroyed in a late-term abortion.

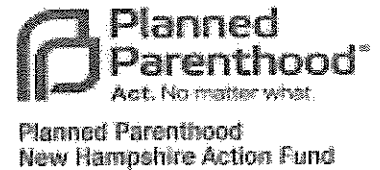
This statute was voted in by a majority last session and just hit the books. Give it a chance.

Background: On January 1, 2022 New Hampshire's first abortion ban in modern history went into effect. It bans abortion at or after 24 weeks with virtually no exceptions. There is a very narrow exception for extreme physical maternal health risks, but none for cases of rape, incest, or fatal fetal diagnoses, and it criminalizes doctors with fines and up to seven years in prison. Furthermore, it requires an ultrasound prior to all abortion care - at all stages of pregnancy. This provision isn't consistent with best medical practices and affects the ability of providers to deliver patient-centered, trauma-informed care. **Patients should be allowed to decide their own personal medical care with their health care providers, not have their options limited by politicians.**

Support HB 1673 to repeal New Hampshire's cruel abortion ban and ultrasound mandate.

Each pregnancy and each circumstance is unique. That's why one-size-fits-all laws don't work when people are making personal medical decisions. New Hampshire's current law bans abortion arbitrarily at or after 24 weeks, no matter the health of the fetus. This law is not based on science or standard medical care.

Throughout the legislative process in 2021, we heard from patients and providers who all said the same thing: arbitrarily banning abortion later in pregnancy **harms women and families who have to make decisions in complex circumstances.** Many pregnant women do not receive a serious fetal diagnosis until after the point at which current New Hampshire law makes abortion unavailable. Granite Staters in these circumstances are now not only faced with what can be a very difficult, painful decision, but they also must now have to coordinate out-of-state travel and overcome countless other hurdles in order to get the care they need.

The newly enacted law criminalizes doctors for doing their job and working with their patients to get the health care they need. **New Hampshire law threatens providers with a felony and imprisonment.** Physicians who are exercising their best medical judgment in what could be a very stressful and time-sensitive moment could face up to seven years in jail and up to \$100,000 in fines. This is an invitation for intimidation and harassment against medical professionals who treat patients later in pregnancies. The head of Dartmouth-Hitchcock OB/GYN stated that this law will make it difficult to recruit and retain qualified doctors to our state. Why is New Hampshire sending its citizens - in complex medical situations where days count - out of state to get the care that **New Hampshire doctors are trained to deliver?** People should be able to get the care they need in their communities.

We heard from public health experts that this **abortion ban will have negative impacts on the health care landscape in New Hampshire.** At an October 27 Executive Council meeting, DHHS Commissioner Shibinette, when asked about our fragile maternal-fetal health care system, replied, *"I think that it makes sense that specialty and subspecialty providers*

would typically settle in states that are more supportive and less restrictive around family planning and abortion. **The more restrictive we become, the less attractive New Hampshire becomes for those specialties.**"¹

When this new law was being debated last year, nearly 200 New Hampshire health care providers expressed their opposition to this law because "New Hampshire already struggles to retain medical professionals and we are deeply concerned that these criminal penalties will undermine the state's efforts to recruit and retain clinicians."² We must repeal this ban before its effects begin to weaken our excellent maternal and fetal health outcomes.

HB 1673 will also remove the invasive, costly, burdensome, and often medically unnecessary ultrasound requirement. Under New Hampshire law, it is **mandatory that all patients seeking an abortion, no matter at what stage of the pregnancy, must have an ultrasound.** At PPNNE, a first-trimester ultrasound is most often transvaginal. **This mandate is simply not consistent with best medical practices and affects PPNNE's ability to provide patient-centered, trauma-informed care.** But under New Hampshire law, it is mandated, regardless of clinician recommendation. Health care providers should decide this personal medical care with their patients, not politicians. These costly and invasive tests create another barrier to abortion access, especially for uninsured people and people struggling financially.

Unfortunately, it is not always possible for a person to get an abortion as soon as they decide to. This is in part because politicians have passed laws that put care out of reach or, especially right now, because rapidly changing pandemic protocols may delay care for hospital patients. With so many variables to consider, it is critical that patients and doctors have every medical option available based on their own unique situation. People seeking medical care later in pregnancy deserve our compassion and support — not judgment, and certainly not politicians telling them what to do.

We trust a patient and their doctor. Period. Making a decision to continue or end a pregnancy can be a complex medical and personal decision. Throughout their pregnancy, a person must be able to make health care decisions that are best for their circumstances, including whether to end a pregnancy. Doctors must be able to provide the best health care for each individual patient. Unfortunately, the state of New Hampshire is now standing in the way of a patient making their own choices about their health.

Every Granite Stater must have the freedom and privacy to make decisions about their pregnancy in consultation with their doctors. We urge a vote of "OUGHT TO PASS" on HB 1673 to reverse this cruel abortion ban.

Catherine Peternel Testimony on HB 1673-FN (Repeal of the Fetal Life Protection Act)

Good afternoon. Thank you for hearing my testimony. I'm here today to ask you to please vote against HB 1673-FN.

I am Catherine Peternel. I have lived in Wolfboro with my husband, a practicing physician, for 26 years. We have four daughters. I hold a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

It seems since birth, my life has been entwined with the issue of life – my own birth, dealing with an unplanned pregnancy, and facing a serious medical emergency while pregnant.

When I was born in 1968, five years before Roe v. Wade, it was against the wishes of my maternal grandmother, who pressured my mother to get an abortion. Fortunately, my mother refused and instead released me for adoption. I truly believe if I had been conceived five years later, my mother would have found it more difficult to justify bringing me to term.

When I was twenty-one and single, I faced my own unplanned pregnancy. I ignored it for as long as I could until one day I felt the baby move. Fortunately, I found a pregnancy center that supported me and referred me to a doctor who could help me deliver the child and put her up for adoption. There are days I regret not raising her but she's living a full life. Now 32, she is a social worker and married with three children. Any inconvenience or embarrassment over that pregnancy seems minor when I look at all she has brought to the world.

My husband and I have been through six pregnancies together, including four successful births and one miscarriage. Our sixth pregnancy put my life at significant risk. I developed a condition called placenta percreta. My placenta was growing unchecked, growing through the uterine wall and threatening my internal organs. After much prayer, I delivered my premature baby at 23 weeks through an emergency C-section. Samuel was miraculously born alive, but only lived a short time. In that time my beautiful son was cherished, lovingly held by family and close friends, as he peacefully passed away. I can't imagine choosing to abort him and never having the chance to see and hold him.

So as you deliberate on repealing the Fetal Life Protection Act and stripping away any safeguards for preborn children, think of individuals like me and my daughter who were given the opportunity to be born and live our lives. Think of babies like Samuel who, despite their short time with us, were honored and loved. Please vote to reject HB 1673-FN.

In Support of HB 1673 - Repealing the fetal health protection act

I'm reading this on behalf of Josie Pinto of the Reproductive Freedom Fund of New Hampshire to express her strong support for HB 1673.

The abortion ban and ultrasound mandate that went into effect on January 1st have already had very harmful consequences for the organization I run. As an abortion fund that helps patients access critical care at all points in pregnancy, and supports patients who are in financial duress, the abortion ban means patients will have to travel further for care and endure higher costs. This places a major burden not just on these patients, but on our organization's ability to meet the needs of these patients.

To focus in on the ultrasound mandate, which I believe to be cruel and medically unnecessary, I'd like to give a brief overview of the current landscape of abortion care. As of right now, patients are able to receive abortion care through a wider variety of means than ever before. Since the year 2000, patients have been able to end pregnancy using a combination of Mifepristone and Misoprostol - 5 easy pills that induce a miscarriage. Because of COVID restricting patients' access to in-person care, the FDA has approved this medication for telemedicine prescription and administration. This means that patients can access providers via telehealth, go through a verbal intake process with their provider, and receive their abortion pills by mail, with some services costing patients only \$150. This allows them to administer their abortion in the safety and comfort of their own home, surrounded by their chosen support systems, and safe from a deadly virus. Abortion pills are 95% effective and have a lower complication rate than Tylenol. Not only that, but with a provider shortage patients often have to wait several weeks to find an available appointment with an in-person provider. Here in New Hampshire, that means rural patients sometimes drive 2 to 4 hours to a clinic, taking time off work, finding childcare, paying for gas, and other expenses involved with accessing in-clinic care. These are massive barriers that we see patients struggle with every single day.

Telehealth is the future of abortion care. During the Covid-19 pandemic, even clinics have innovated the way in which they provide abortion care, and have shown how abortion can successfully occur without a patient needing to set foot into a clinic - reducing a huge barrier to access. Many people prefer to have their abortions from the comfort and safety of their own home. The bottom line is: every patient deserves the full breadth of options available to them. Of course, there will still be plenty of patients who prefer in-clinic care, and they must also be able to access that care without mandatory, invasive, and medically unnecessary ultrasounds.

The FDA has approved the use of medication abortion without ultrasound. Most other states allow for it as well. Why should New Hampshire be behind and stand alone in opposing modern medical standards that increase our bodily freedom and our right to choose how we access medicine? I strongly urge you to support repealing the Fetal Health Protection Act today. Thank you for your time.

When I discovered I was pregnant at 22 and unmarried I immediately set a date for an abortion (at the recommendation of my doctor). The insurance at my job at the time would even cover all expenses. After a few days of wrestling with my decision I decided to cancel the appointment and moved instead in the direction of adoption. My daughter was born in May of 1982, and she became the sheer joy of a couple who were unable to conceive.

Three years later my husband and I discovered we were pregnant with a baby boy and we were overjoyed, however, after some testing and an amniocentesis it was determined that "the possibility of fetal anomalies is significant. Impending intrauterine fetal demise or severe intrauterine growth retardation are also possibilities.... Another possibility is congenital nephrosis.... Although some infants can survive for a short time, it appears that congenital nephrosis is invariably fatal..... this fetus is at extremely high risk for having some other type of fetal abnormality or impending fetal demise. If the pregnancy continues to viability" etc. As you can imagine we were devastated at this news but rejected the recommendation of the doctor to end the life of our baby boy in the womb rather than chose life.

Adam Wesley was born in June of 1985 and was whisked away from us immediately upon delivery to be inspected for any abnormalities. He was brought back to us a short time later and told, "You have a perfectly healthy baby boy".

20 years and 10 months later during the Mother's Day floods here in NH in 2006 his life did come to an end when his car veered off the road and he was killed instantly while driving home from Liberty University trying to make it home to surprise me on Mother's Day morning.

Little did I know 24 years before this, it would be the daughter I had given up for adoption who would be the balm my broken heart needed while grieving the death of my second child. She had come to find us just 20 months before Adam's death. She calls me "mom", she phones me at least once a day and it is as if we were never separated. I often think of the loss I would have faced if I had decided on abortion for either of these people. I would have missed out on 21 years of my son's life and now to have both my daughters to help bear the burden of losing him has been healing. He filled my empty arms when I chose adoption, and she has helped me to mend my broken heart after his death.

I would ask this committee to consider the rights of the people in the womb as well as the mothers. We don't know what the future holds for us but we, as mothers, do hold the future of our children in our hands. Fetal life is a life that should be protected so I ask you to help protect the beating heart of these children and oppose this bill.

My name is Dr. Ilana Cass, I am the Chair of Ob Gyn at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center, the only Obstetrics and Gynecology training program in the Granite State. I am here today as the voice for the women of New Hampshire and their obstetrics care providers. I know you are here today motivated by the desire to better serve your constituency. The Fetal Health Protection Act passed last year does not achieve that noble goal, rather, it imperils the lives, and equal access to excellent healthcare, that the women and families of New Hampshire deserve.

A woman and her partner seek a termination late in pregnancy under great duress and for truly dire circumstances. When a pregnancy threatens the mental or physical health of the woman, or the fetus has significant congenital anomalies, a woman and her partner turn to the expertise of highly trained Obstetrics and Neonatal doctors. These women's stories are truly heart-wrenching as they face this agonizing decision about how to proceed. As of January 1, 2022 many of these women will be turned away from care that we are fully capable of providing here in New Hampshire. They will be forced to travel great distances away from the support of their communities and families, incur additional expense thereby compounding the inequity of care for our most marginalized women.

Moreover, we have incontrovertible data that shows women who sought a late termination of pregnancy and were turned away, were at significantly higher risk for economic hardship and poorer health for themselves, and their existing children. These women who were turned away were more likely to remain in relationships with abusive partners, had higher drop-out rates from high school and college, and had higher risks of serious complications, including death, as a result of that pregnancy.

Today the law of the land in New Hampshire does not recognize that congenital anomalies, incest or rape are indications for a woman to seek termination late in pregnancy. Additionally, the law demands unnecessary and costly testing, and sends a doctor to jail for providing this procedure. The law of the land substitutes the medical judgement and authority of legislators for that of highly trained Obstetricians and Neonatologists. Left unchanged, I believe the Fetal Health Protection Act will steadily erode access to high quality health care for the women and families of New Hampshire by deterring the brightest Obstetrician and Neonatal providers from practicing in our great state. As the person with responsibility for most of the pregnancies and Obstetrical providers in our state, I implore you to correct course.

Thank you for I am a mom of seven children, including a daughter, Kayla Ryan, that I lost 16 years ago after having a medical termination in NH at 22 weeks. When I became pregnant with Kayla, my first child was two years old. I could not have been more excited for her to be a big sister and our family to grow! We didn't have any testing through our pregnancy other than our first routine ultrasound when I was 21 weeks along.

During the ultrasound I almost immediately knew something was wrong. The tech continually went from Kayla's head to her heart, back and forth. I finally asked, "is something wrong?". Our doctor told us she couldn't explain the findings, but she needed to immediately send us to a specialist for further evaluation. Two days later we went for our appointment with Dr. Kaufman at the Elliot Hospital.

Upon performing a higher level ultrasound Dr. Kaufman explained that our baby had only three chambers in her heart, minimal brain tissue, and she had severe hydrocephalus. My heart was crushed. He asked if we would like to do an amniocentesis and I thought immediately, I don't want to lose my baby, I can't risk it. I had been thinking for two days no matter what was wrong we could get through it and we would do whatever we could for our child. I asked him what our child's chance of survival was and he replied, "unfortunately your baby has no chance to survive outside of your womb." He explained she would need an immediate heart transplant and because of her brain they would not be able to give her a new heart. This was not just a disability or a situation of around the clock care for our daughter. She didn't have the slightest chance of living outside of me.

After our ultrasound we sat with Dr. Kaufman in his office. He explained that due to the measurements of Kayla's head we needed to make an immediate decision. She was measuring 22 weeks and the current situation in NH allowed no time to decide. The available providers for a late term abortion and their own regulations were the time limiting factor. He advised us of our options, including waiting for our baby to die in utero, going through a D & E, or being induced to go through labor and delivery. As a mother I knew there was no way I could continue to carry Kayla knowing she was going to die inside of me and knowing that my little girl would only grow closer to her soon to be sister. Going to work every day and having people congratulating me, asking details about when my baby was due and what gender we were expecting, all the while knowing we were just waiting for Kayla to die. We chose to have a medical termination by labor and delivery. We were scheduled that Friday for the cardiac injection and Saturday I would be induced.

We met the physician that Friday and she performed a third ultrasound to confirm Kayla's fatal anomaly. She emphasized that she only performed terminations for fatal anomalies.

Kayla was born still on December 10th, 2005. I went through labor with no medication. I wanted to feel the pain I knew she would never have the chance to feel. We held her for several hours and

had her baptized. She was 12 inches long and weighed 14 ounces. Her fingers and toes were perfect and her little feet and hands were imprinted and hang on my wall today. It was the hardest day of my life leaving her behind when I left the hospital the next day.

A month afterwards we found out Kayla had a large deletion in her 15th chromosome. If we had waited for those results to determine our decision it would have been beyond the 24 weeks.

When you think of why this exception is important to this bill, I hope you think of Kayla. I hope you too believe that she has a purpose in all of our lives. I hope you see that allowing a loving mother to make the decision to let her child go from a body that will not sustain her outside of her mothers womb is the right thing to do. I hope you see it is a decision made from true love, nothing more and nothing less.

My name is Jessica Aviles and I live in Campton, NH. I would like to testify in opposition to HB1673. Eight years ago, I was pregnant with our fourth child. Because I was 39, I was considered “advanced maternal age,” therefore various tests were run to check for common issues with the baby when the mother is older. Two different tests came back positive for Down's Syndrome. I was immediately ushered into a different room to wait, where a nurse came in with paperwork for me to sign. I asked her what I was signing, and she indicated that it was to have an abortion. I was in absolute shock that it was assumed I was willing to kill my baby just because he wouldn't be born perfect according to medical standards. I told the nurse that under no circumstances would I abort my baby, whether he had Down's Syndrome, no limbs, or three eyes. She let me know that 96% of women who receive the news I just received choose to abort their babies, therefore it is just assumed that is what the next step is. It then dawned on me why I rarely see children with Down's Syndrome anymore; they are all being killed before they even have a fighting chance. Fast forward to the labor and delivery of my fourth child, Gabe, who WAS NOT born with Down's Syndrome. I held my tiny, sweet, son, sobbing, wondering how many perfectly healthy babies had been killed when the mother received a false positive for Down's Syndrome. For that matter, how many Down's Syndrome babies have been killed before they ever had the chance to bring their special joy into our world. Hello, my name is Emese Nemeth and I stand for women's rights and health equality. The views in this testimony are my own. I am a master's prepared registered nurse from Johns Hopkins School of Nursing, and I served as a United States Peace Corps Volunteer. I am a community health nurse at Amoskeag Health, a federally funded health center, in Manchester, New Hampshire. Majority of our patients are vulnerable or of disadvantage backgrounds, are refugees, are on Medicaid or are uninsured. This written testimony is for my female patients who do not have a voice in New Hampshire. I am writing to urge the Senate Judiciary Committee to pass HB 1673 and HB1674 to protect the rights of women.

New Hampshire has a long history of supporting a women's right to an abortion as that state leaned toward supporting individual's right to privacy. However, with the polarizing of political parties, a women's freedom to make decisions about her reproductive health is under attack. The current abortion law is clearly a violation on women's right to choose. The current law creates unnecessary financial hardship for women by mandating ultrasounds, it will cost the state money, time, and resources to investigate and prosecute healthcare providers, and it does not make any exception for rape, incest, or fetal health problems. We must repeal the Fetal Protection Act and pass the Access to Abortion Care Act.

The current state law is not founded in medical science and causes unnecessary financial hardship to a population that is more likely to be in poverty. Ultrasounds can cost up \$500 and to patients without insurance or on Medicaid, this is enormous burden. NH Medicaid will not cover cost related to abortion, another insult to vulnerable women. Ultrasounds for all abortions goes against medical practice as the FDA recently approved medication abortions by mail as a safe option for pregnancy up to 10 weeks gestation.

If the patient wants to terminate a pregnancy after the 24 weeks, healthcare providers, including nurse practitioners, now face criminal charges and possible jail time. It is not the state of New Hampshire's place to tell a Medical Doctor or Nurse Practitioner what is right for a patient. That decision lies between the provider, the patient, and the medical community.

There is indisputable evidence that abortions are safe and uncomplicated procedures. A landmark study by the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine dispels any arguments over safety and efficacy (NPR, 2018). In fact, abortions are safer than giving birth as the United States, as we have the highest maternal mortality rate among developed countries (CDC, 2019). A black woman is 2-4x more likely to die in childbirth compared to a white woman (CDC, 2019). It is also well documented that women obtaining illegal abortions can lead to serious injury and death.

Laws that infringe on abortion violate a nurse's code of ethics. The American Nurses Association has stated that for reproductive health, "Healthcare clients have the right to privacy and the right to make decisions about personal health care based on full information and without coercion" (ANA, 2010). The ANA Code of Ethics further states all persons have the right to bodily autonomy (ANA, 2015). The current abortion law violates these ethical principles. We must give female patient's the right to make informed decisions about their health and pass these bills.

Restricting access to abortion is a social justice and human rights issue. Restricting access to abortions targets vulnerable women, such as women without insurance, on Medicaid, and women in poverty or of racial or ethnic minorities. Due to social determinants of health and institutional biases, their access to reproductive health has been limited. Therefore, restricting access to abortion further perpetuates harm to

a vulnerable population. It is no secret that regardless of the law, if women in New Hampshire have financial resources, they can travel to a neighboring state and obtain an abortion. However, of the patients seeking abortions, most cannot afford to do so. According to the Guttmacher Institute (2021), a research non-profit, “three-fourths of abortion patients were low income—49% living at less than the federal poverty level, and 26% living at 100–199% of the poverty level.” And “The majority of patients (53%) paid for their abortion out of pocket; Medicaid was the second-most-common method of payment, used by 24% of patients.” Note that NH state Medicaid does not pay for services related to abortion.

By restricting access to abortion, we are forcing women with already limited resources and limited agency to advocate for themselves, to carry an unwanted pregnancy to term. New Hampshire has also repeatedly denied funding to family planning centers in the state which provide contraceptives. New Hampshire Medicaid also will not cover long-acting contraceptives (LARC) unless it is the postpartum period. However, the Health Resources Service Agency (2020) has reported abnormally low usage of this benefit in New Hampshire due to issues with state’s Medicaid billing and reimbursement. The state is consistently removing options for women to have control over their reproductive health.

As majority of women seeking an abortion are of low socioeconomic status, limiting and refusing them the right to an abortion has long term consequences. It is well documented that children born from families of low economic status are at a higher risk of experiencing adverse child experiences (ACEs) that create permanent psychological and physical harm on children (CDC, 2021). Furthermore, New Hampshire is not a family friendly state. New Hampshire does not have systems in place to support mothers and children. We do not have a paid FMLA law for maternity leave like other neighboring states, the legislature recently struck down a law to protect mothers breastfeeding in the workplace and is limited affordable childcare options. New Hampshire is also one of the few states in the U.S. that has no state funding for universal early childhood education. And there is no public health effort to prevent ACEs.

We cannot afford to further restrict reproductive rights and create more barriers of women of New Hampshire. I strongly urge the legislature of New Hampshire to repeal the Fetal Health Protection Bill, pass the Access to Abortion Care Act and put the state back on par with our neighboring New England states.

Dear Chair Gordon and Members of the Committee,

The New Hampshire High School Democrats affirm our support for CACR 18, providing that the state shall not infringe or unduly inconvenience the right of medical reproductive decisions, HB 1673, relative to women’s health privacy and repealing the fetal health protection act, and HB 1674, relative to reproductive rights, and ask that you recommend them “Ought to Pass.” Further, we ask that you find any bills restricting or limiting the right to an abortion “Inexpedient to Legislate.”

First, restricting abortion violates the right to self-determination. A pregnant person has the right to terminate a pregnancy for any reason, as an unwanted pregnancy can cause drastic lifestyle alterations. A study published by the University of California San Francisco found that pregnant people who were denied an abortion and went on to give birth experienced “an increase in household poverty lasting at least four years relative to those who received an abortion.”

Being denied abortion access contributes to higher rates of domestic violence, evictions, bankruptcy cases, and is associated with more health issues. Forcing a pregnant person to carry a pregnancy to term, or creating unreasonable barriers in obtaining an abortion, is a clear infringement of the individual’s right to influence decisions regarding their own destiny.

Unwanted pregnancies have historically been linked to deficits in the child’s “cognitive, emotional, and social processes.” In addition, stressors during unwanted pregnancy contribute to abnormalities after birth including “lower birth weight infants with consequences for infant development” and “adverse implications for fetal neurodevelopment and child outcomes.” Criminalizing abortion only contributes to the problems already present in pregnancy and does not lead to better outcomes for parents or their children.

In conclusion, the New Hampshire High School Democrats support CACR 18, HB 1673, and HB 1674, and ask that you recommend them “Ought to Pass.” In continuance of our support of the right to access an abortion, we ask that you find any legislation restricting this right “Inexpedient to Legislate.”

Dear Chairman Gordon and Members of the House Judiciary Committee:

Bi-State Primary Care Association and our members respectfully request HB 1673, repealing the fetal health protection act, be recommended ought to pass. Bi-State staff and our members will not attend legislative hearings due to the risk of COVID-19, and we thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony to your committee electronically. Bi-State and our members write to you in strong support of HB 1673.

Bi-State Primary Care Association (Bi-State) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, formed by two health and social service leaders in 1986 to advance access to comprehensive primary care and preventive services for all, with special emphasis on those most in need in New Hampshire and Vermont. Today, Bi-State represents 28 member organizations across both states that provide comprehensive primary care services to over 300,000 patients at 146 locations. Our members include community health centers, federally qualified health centers, area health education center programs, and Planned Parenthood of Northern New England. New Hampshire's 13 health centers serve approximately 112,000 patients at locations across the state, including in those districts represented by members of this esteemed committee.

Bi-State and our members strongly opposed the abortion ban included in the state budget last session. As you know, RSA §§329:43 – 329:50 ban abortion at or after 24 weeks with virtually no exceptions: The only exception included was for the physical health of the mother, but there were no exceptions for cases of rape, incest, or fatal fetal diagnoses.¹ The abortion ban also criminalized the services of doctors and included fines of up to \$100,000 and up to seven years in prison for simply providing care to their patients.² Statute now also requires that patients undergo an obstetric ultrasound prior to receiving abortion care, regardless of whether the

pregnancy was the result of rape or incest or the stage of the pregnancy.³ This is inconsistent with best medical practices and affects the ability of clinicians to deliver patient-centered, trauma-informed care.

Bi-State Primary Care Association and our members strongly believe patients have the right to make their own personal medical decisions in consultation with their health care providers. A patient and their provider know the real-life complexities that exist in the patient's life. It is impossible for statutes to consider and accommodate the difficult and unfortunate circumstances families find themselves in, and HB 1673 acknowledges this. Pregnant patients deserve our compassion and support; they do not deserve intrusion or interference in the patient-provider relationship, or the determination of a family's circumstances that people outside of this relationship cannot understand.

Requiring patients to receive an ultrasound prior to accessing abortion care creates an unnecessary barrier to care. Ultrasounds cost money. While some patients can access ultrasounds at a reduced cost, they are not readily available or easily accessible for all. New Hampshire statutes now force a pregnant patient to endure a medical procedure that may not be necessary. This requirement eliminates the ability of clinicians to deliver trauma-informed care and instead shames patients and adds a barrier to abortion access.

The highly trained clinicians who treat complex pregnancies do not need or deserve the threat of criminal penalties and fines hanging over their heads while trying to do their jobs. Pregnancies are complex, and unfortunately sometimes result in serious complications later in pregnancy. Achieving the best possible health outcomes is paramount and depends on the skills and efforts of these trained clinicians. The abortion ban now in New Hampshire statute interferes with the patient-provider relationship and the ability of these clinicians to do their jobs.

For these reasons and more, we ask for your support of HB 1673. We trust pregnant patients and their clinicians to know what is best for those pregnant patients. We ask you to do the same by supporting HB 1673.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to certain provisions of the fetal life protection act requiring an ultrasound examination.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Fetal Life Protection Act; Prohibitions; Ultrasound Examination Requirement. Amend RSA
2 329:44, I to read as follows:

3 I. Except in the case of a medical emergency as specifically defined in paragraph III, no
4 abortion shall be performed, induced, or attempted by any health care provider unless a health care
5 provider has first made a determination of the probable gestational age of the fetus. In making such
6 a determination, the health care provider shall make such inquiries of the pregnant woman and
7 perform or cause to be performed all such medical examinations, imaging studies, and tests as a
8 reasonably prudent health care provider in the community, knowledgeable about the medical facts
9 and conditions of both the woman and the fetus involved, would consider necessary to perform and
10 consider in making an accurate diagnosis with respect to gestational age, provided, however, that
11 the health care provider shall conduct an obstetric ultrasound examination of the patient for the
12 purpose of making the determination. ***This subdivision shall be construed to require the***
13 ***performance of an ultrasound only if the provider either knows that the fetus has a***
14 ***gestational age of at least 24 weeks or is conscious of a substantial risk that the fetus has a***
15 ***gestational age of at least 24 weeks.***

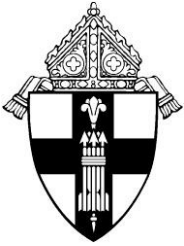

Dear Mr. Chair and Members of the Committee:

As the Director of the Office of Public Policy of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Manchester, and on behalf of Bishop Peter Libasci, I write to respectfully register our opposition to HB 1673.

Prior to the enactment of the Fetal Life Protection Act, which restricts abortions after 24 weeks, New Hampshire law permitted abortions to take place essentially at any point up to birth. Thus, by repealing the new law, the legislature would be reinstating a system which failed to recognize the interests of children who have reached the stage of viability. It is worth remembering that in this regard the prior law went even farther than *Roe v. Wade* had, given that in *Roe* the Supreme Court recognized “the State's important and legitimate interest in potential life” and determined that “[i]f the State is interested in protecting fetal life after viability, it may go so far as to proscribe abortion during that period, except when it is necessary to preserve the life or health of the mother.”

As you consider whether to reinstate a system that would remove protections for unborn children after 24 weeks, I hope that you will think about HB 1673 in the context of the way we want society to treat those who are in any way voiceless. As Pope Francis put it in *Laudato Si*, his 2015 encyclical letter on the environment (or, as he subtitled it “Care for our Common Home”):

Since everything is interrelated, concern for the protection of nature is also incompatible with the justification of abortion . . . ‘If personal and social sensitivity towards the acceptance of the new life is lost, then other forms of acceptance that are valuable for society also wither away.’ (Laudato Si, 120).



HB1673: relative to women's health privacy and repealing the fetal health protection act

Background: On January 1, 2022 New Hampshire's first abortion ban in modern history went into effect. It bans abortion at or after 24 weeks with virtually no exceptions. There is a very narrow exception for extreme physical maternal health risks, but none for cases of rape, incest, or fatal fetal diagnoses, and it criminalizes doctors with fines and up to seven years in prison. Furthermore, it requires an ultrasound prior to all abortion care - at all stages of pregnancy. This provision isn't consistent with best medical practices and affects the ability of providers to deliver patient-centered, trauma-informed care. **Patients should be allowed to decide their own personal medical care with their health care providers, not have their options limited by politicians.**

Support HB 1673 to repeal New Hampshire's cruel abortion ban and ultrasound mandate.

Each pregnancy and each circumstance is unique. That's why one-size-fits-all laws don't work when people are making personal medical decisions. New Hampshire's current law bans abortion arbitrarily at or after 24 weeks, no matter the health of the fetus. This law is not based on science or standard medical care.

Throughout the legislative process in 2021, we heard from patients and providers who all said the same thing: arbitrarily banning abortion later in pregnancy **harms women and families who have to make decisions in complex circumstances.** Many pregnant women do not receive a serious fetal diagnosis until after the point at which current New Hampshire law makes abortion unavailable. Granite Staters in these circumstances are now not only faced with what can be a very difficult, painful decision, but they also must now have to coordinate out-of-state travel and overcome countless other hurdles in order to get the care they need.

The newly enacted law criminalizes doctors for doing their job and working with their patients to get the health care they need. **New Hampshire law threatens providers with a felony and imprisonment.** Physicians who are exercising their best medical judgment in what could be a very stressful and time-sensitive moment could face up to seven years in jail and up to \$100,000 in fines. This is an invitation for intimidation and harassment against medical professionals who treat patients later in pregnancies. The head of Dartmouth-Hitchcock OB/GYN stated that this law will make it difficult to recruit and retain qualified doctors to our state. Why is New Hampshire sending its citizens - in complex medical situations where days count - out of state to get the care that **New Hampshire doctors are trained to deliver?** People should be able to get the care they need in their communities.

We heard from public health experts that this **abortion ban will have negative impacts on the health care landscape in New Hampshire.** At an October 27 Executive Council meeting, DHHS Commissioner Shibinette, when asked about our fragile maternal-fetal health care system, replied, *"I think that it makes sense that specialty and subspecialty providers*

would typically settle in states that are more supportive and less restrictive around family planning and abortion. **The more restrictive we become, the less attractive New Hampshire becomes for those specialties.**"¹

When this new law was being debated last year, nearly 200 New Hampshire health care providers expressed their opposition to this law because *"New Hampshire already struggles to retain medical professionals and we are deeply concerned that these criminal penalties will undermine the state's efforts to recruit and retain clinicians."*² We must repeal this ban before its effects begin to weaken our excellent maternal and fetal health outcomes.

HB 1673 will also remove the invasive, costly, burdensome, and often medically unnecessary ultrasound requirement. Under New Hampshire law, **it is mandatory that all patients seeking an abortion, no matter at what stage of the pregnancy, must have an ultrasound.** At PPNNE, a first-trimester ultrasound is most often transvaginal. **This mandate is simply not consistent with best medical practices and affects PPNNE's ability to provide patient-centered, trauma-informed care.** But under New Hampshire law, it is mandated, regardless of clinician recommendation. Health care providers should decide this personal medical care with their patients, not politicians. These costly and invasive tests create another barrier to abortion access, especially for uninsured people and people struggling financially.

Unfortunately, it is not always possible for a person to get an abortion as soon as they decide to. This is in part because politicians have passed laws that put care out of reach or, especially right now, because rapidly changing pandemic protocols may delay care for hospital patients. With so many variables to consider, it is critical that patients and doctors have every medical option available based on their own unique situation. People seeking medical care later in pregnancy deserve our compassion and support — not judgment, and certainly not politicians telling them what to do.

We trust a patient and their doctor. Period. Making a decision to continue or end a pregnancy can be a complex medical and personal decision. Throughout their pregnancy, a person must be able to make health care decisions that are best for their circumstances, including whether to end a pregnancy. Doctors must be able to provide the best health care for each individual patient. Unfortunately, the state of New Hampshire is now standing in the way of a patient making their own choices about their health.

Every Granite Stater must have the freedom and privacy to make decisions about their pregnancy in consultation with their doctors. We urge a vote of "OUGHT TO PASS" on HB 1673 to reverse this cruel abortion ban.

I am opposed to HB 1673-FN Relative to women's health privacy and repealing the Fetal Life Protection Act. This Bill seeks to nullify The Fetal Life Protection Act based on **fear of financial burden placed on the State of NH for a crime that has not been committed by an unidentified person with no proven existence.**

Why is there is no attempt in this piece of legislation to address the financial impact of the Fetal Life Protection Act on maternal health care costs for poor and low income women during weeks 24-birth, postpartum care, parenting classes, counseling, legal process for paternal support, life coach mentoring and more? Additionally, why no attempt to address possible NICU financial impact, early childhood intervention and/or therapeutics costs for premature birth children? Why no attempt to address a potential impact to adoption track expenses such as foster care, legal and social services, family court expenses?

Bottom Line: No statistical basis is available to predict financial impact resulting from the Fetal Life Protection Act. To date, NH does not require mandatory abortion statistic reporting to CDC.

I wanted to my share testimony in OPPOSITION.

In the fall of 2006, I was a sophomore at the University of Notre Dame when my girlfriend found out she was pregnant. As a young 19 year-old, we had to make the biggest decision of our lives to that point whether to keep or abort the baby. With full knowledge of what it would mean, we chose to make the convenient and hidden decision to abort.

The process was quick, yet painful for her. But neither of us were prepared for what would follow. In the coming years, we both experienced the weight of shame, embarrassment, and the constant questioning of whether or not we made the right decision. One of the side-effects emotionally and psychologically for a father is that you shut down emotionally because you can't comprehend when you just did. You move into a place of no longer being able to feel emotionally. This is quite common for fathers who are involved in the decision to abort a baby.

Coleman, Rue & Spence (2007a) reported:

1. men tend to exert greater control over the expression of painful emotions, intellectualize grief, and cope alone;
2. men were more likely to experience feelings of despair long after the abortion and
3. men are more at risk for experiencing chronic grief.

Male responses to a partner's abortion include grief, guilt, depression, anxiety, feelings of repressed emotions, helplessness/voicelessness/powerlessness, post-traumatic stress, anger and relationship problems (Coyle, 2007).

Preliminary findings in a new study found four out of ten men experienced chronic post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) symptoms, occurring on average 15 years after the abortion.

As a father now to three incredible children, I know part of my role in their lives is to provide, promote and protect them. When I aborted my child, I failed to fulfill my God-given responsibility in the life of my child and today, I want to use my voice to ensure

other fathers and mothers don't have to go through the years of emotional and psychological trauma associated with a decision like this.

Dear Chairman Gordon, VChairman McLean, and members of the Committee:

The New Hampshire Section of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) is our state's leading group of physician experts in obstetric and gynecologic care. Our members dedicate their careers and lives to providing evidence-based care, delivered with quality, safety, integrity, and compassion. As such, ACOG New Hampshire strongly supports HB 1673, which would repeal a dangerous law that prevents physicians and their patients from determining the best course of treatment.

As with all health policy, policy related to abortion care, including abortion later in pregnancy, must be based on science and clinical facts. It must ensure that patients, in consultation with their physicians, can evaluate all appropriate treatments and make informed choices about what's best for their health and their pregnancies. To that end, we urge this committee to repeal current law that undermines quality care and interferes in the patient-physician relationship by passing HB 1673.

The need for an abortion later in pregnancy could arise for a number of reasons, including pregnancy complications that can compromise a patient's health. These conditions may also reduce the possibility of fetal survival. Patients in these circumstances may risk extensive blood loss, stroke, and septic shock. Physicians cannot always predict what course medical conditions or complications will take or how quickly they may progress to severe injury or even death. Trained health care professionals must never be put in the untenable position of waiting for a medical condition to worsen and become life-threatening before being able to provide evidence-based care to their patients. Current law woefully ignores situations such as high-risk pregnancies where a medical condition poses health risks and it is imperative that a treatment approach be determined between the patient and their health care provider, not the legislature.

Sound health policy must be based on scientific facts and evidence-based medicine. The best health care is provided free from political interference in the patient-physician relationship. Patients should be able to trust that their doctor can give them options for their health care that is based on their medical expertise, not the confines of a law. We urge you to affirm these tenets of medically appropriate, compassionate care and pass HB 1673.

A. COVERAGE OVERVIEW

1. Coverage includes only the items stated as covered, excluding all others and is subject to the limitations, exclusions and provisions stated in this contract. For your specific coverage and selections see your Contract Agreement pages, which are incorporated into this contract by reference. Please read your contract carefully.

2. Coverage under this contract includes normal wear and tear malfunctions during the contract term (as defined in Section B). Coverage under this contract also includes malfunctions of covered items which occur during the contract term resulting from the following situations prior to and during the contract term:

- a. Insufficient maintenance, rust, corrosion, or sediment;
 - b. Improper installations, repairs, or modifications; except as set forth in section G;
 - c. Mismatched systems where the indoor and outdoor units were not properly matched to each other in capacity or efficiency for proper operation; and
 - d. Undetectable pre-existing conditions which are defects or mechanical failures that could not have been detected by a visual inspection and/or simple mechanical test. A visual inspection of the covered item verifies that it appears structurally intact and without damage or missing parts that would indicate inoperability. A simple mechanical test is defined as turning the item on and off to ensure that it is operational. While turned on, the item should operate without causing damage, irregular sounds, smoke, or other abnormal outcomes.
- When completing an American Home Shield (AHS) approved repair or replacement, AHS will pay the cost to:
- e. Dismantle and remove defective equipment; and
 - f. Recapture, reclaim and dispose of refrigerant.

3. The covered items must be:

- a. Installed for diagnosis within the confines of the main foundation of the home or attached or detached garage with the exception of (if selected): air conditioning, heating, electrical panel, water heater, pressure regulator, exterior well pump, septic tank and related sewage ejector pump, or pool and/or spa equipment. These exceptions must be installed for diagnosis and must be manufactured for outside use or be located in a structure which fully protects items from the elements.
- b. Domestic grade or commercial grade items that are specified by the manufacturer for use in a residential application.

4. For covered malfunctions, unless otherwise specified in this contract, AHS will repair or replace the covered item. AHS has the sole right to determine, according to the terms of this contract, whether a covered item will be repaired or replaced. When making repairs, AHS reserves the right to rebuild existing parts or components and/or to install rebuilt parts or components. When making replacements, AHS is responsible for installing replacement equipment and parts of similar features, capacity, and efficiency, but not for matching dimensions, brand or color. AHS is not responsible for matching any features of an existing item that does not contribute to the primary function of that item.

5. AHS's cash payment policies and procedures:

- a. In instances where the combined cost of diagnosis and repair or replacement is estimated to exceed a stated contract dollar limit, AHS will not provide repair or replacement services but will instead pay an amount equal to the contract dollar limit minus the cost incurred to diagnose the malfunction.
- b. Instances beyond AHS's control may prevent AHS from providing repair or replacement of a covered item. In these instances, AHS will provide you cash-in-lieu of the repair or replacement services. The amount will be based on what a consumer without this contract would pay after negotiating the best price for such services in your area. These instances are when:
 - (i) Following a response to a covered malfunction, an item would remain non-compliant with laws, regulations or code requirements;
 - (ii) An item has a covered malfunction unrelated to a manufacturer's recall on that item; or
 - (iii) An item is not repairable and a replacement item is no longer available.

If you request a second opinion, you will be responsible for the payment of an additional Trade Service Call Fee only if the outcome of the second opinion is the same as the initial opinion.

3. In the event AHS authorizes or requests you to contact an independent service contractor to perform a covered service, AHS will provide reimbursement for an authorized amount of the cost you incur for the repair or replacement services. Acceptable proof of the repair and your actual itemized costs must be provided to and approved by AHS before any reimbursement will be paid.

D. TRADE SERVICE CALL FEE

NOTE: The amount of your Trade Service Call Fee is listed on your Contract Agreement pages.

1. You are required to pay a Trade Service Call Fee for each trade service request you submit to AHS.

2. If a particular repair or replacement fails within 30 days, AHS will send a Service Contractor to repair the failure and you will not be charged an additional Trade Service Call Fee.

E. SHIELDSILVER

NOT COVERED: Outside or underground piping, well pump, and well pump components for geothermal and/or water source heat pump – Fuel storage tanks – Portable units – Fireplace, grain, pellet, or wood heating units (even if only source of heating) – Legally mandated diagnostic testing when replacing heating or cooling equipment.

1. COVERAGE BOOSTS

AHS will pay up to:

- One thousand dollars (\$1,000) per contract term to make necessary duct, plenum, electrical, and plumbing modifications, including necessary relocation of covered equipment and/or the correction of code violations and required permits to effect a covered repair/replacement,
- Six thousand dollars (\$6,000) per Covered Item malfunction during the contract term for access, diagnosis, and repair/replacement of any covered Appliance outlined in Section F and
- All costs for refrigerant for covered Air Conditioning or Heating units outlined in Section E (if ShieldPlatinum is purchased, refrigerant limit noted in Sections E.1 and E.2 do not apply).

2. ROOF LEAK REPAIR

NOTE: AHS will pay up to three thousand dollars (\$3,000) total per Agreement Term for access, diagnosis, and repair/replacement of pool equipment including, but not limited to, pool heaters.

3. WELL PUMP

COVERED: All components and parts of a well pump used as a source of water to the home, except:

NOT COVERED: Above or underground piping, cable or electrical lines leading to or from the well pump, including those that are located within the well casing – Well casings – Pressure switches not located on the pump – Holding, storage or pressure tanks – Booster pumps – Redrilling of wells – Well pump and all well pump components for geothermal and/or water source heat pumps.

NOTE: AHS will pay up to \$1,500 per contract term for access, diagnosis and repair or replacement. Customer is responsible for payment of any costs in excess of \$1,500.

4. SEPTIC SYSTEM PUMPING & SEPTIC SEWAGE EJECTOR PUMP

COVERED: Mainline stoppages that can be cleared through an existing access or clean out without excavation – The septic tank will be pumped once during the contract coverage term if the stoppage is due to septic back up – Sewage ejector pump for septic system only.

- g. System or appliance upgrades, or repairs or replacements required:
 - (i) when the malfunction is due to missing components, parts, or equipment;
 - (ii) when the malfunction is due to lack of capacity in the existing system or appliance;
 - (iii) when the malfunction is due to under or oversized systems in relation to the square footage of the area being heated or cooled; or
 - (iv) to comply with any federal, state, or local laws, regulations or ordinances, utility regulations, or building or zoning code requirements, except as otherwise specified in this contract.

2. AHS is not responsible or liable for performing service, or paying remediation costs, involving hazardous or toxic materials.

3. In regard to mold, mildew, bio-organic growth, rot, fungus, or pest damage, AHS is not responsible or liable for:

- a. Damages from such causes;
- b. Diagnosis, removal or remediation of such conditions; or
- c. Repairs or replacements necessitated by such causes.

Partial Exclusions from Coverage and Certain Additional Fees

4. Except as otherwise specified in this contract, AHS is not responsible or liable for:

- a. Providing or closing access to covered items;
- b. Costs of construction, carpentry, or other modifications necessary to remove, relocate, or install equipment; or
- c. Restoration of any wall or floor coverings, cabinets, counter tops, tiling, paint, or the like.

5. You may be charged an additional fee by the Service Contractor if cranes or lifting equipment are needed to install or remove any equipment.

Coverage Exceptions Applicable to Certain Breakdowns

6. AHS is not responsible or liable for repairs or replacements when the malfunction is due to:

- a. Misuse, abuse, or mistreatment, including but not limited to, removal of parts and damage by people, pests, or pets;

- b. Accidents, fire, freezing (except roof leaks), water damage, electrical failure or surge, or excessive or inadequate water pressure;
- c. Lightning, mud, earthquake, soil movement, storms, or acts of God; or
- d. A manufacturer's improper design, improper materials or formulations, a defective manufacturing process, or other manufacturing defects.

General Limitations of Liability

- 7. AHS will not be liable for any violations of federal, state and local laws, regulations or guidelines prior to the beginning of the contract term and will not perform repairs or replacements that violate any current federal, state and local laws, regulations or guidelines.
- 8. AHS is not responsible or liable for secondary, incidental, and/or consequential loss or damage resulting from the malfunction of any covered item, or a Service Contractor's neglect or delay in providing, or failure to provide, repair or replacement of such item, including, but not limited to, food spoilage, loss of income, utility bills, additional living expenses, personal and/or property damage.
- 9. AHS is not responsible or liable for any delay in service or failure to provide service caused by conditions beyond AHS's control.
- 10. In the event you threaten to harm or actually harm the safety or well-being of: (i) AHS; (ii) any employee of AHS; (iii) a Service Contractor; or (iv) any property of AHS or the Service Contractor, you will be in breach of this contract. In the event you breach this or any other obligation under this contract, AHS may refuse to provide service to you and may cancel this contract.

J. SHARED SYSTEMS AND APPLIANCES

- 1. If this contract is for a duplex, triplex, or fourplex dwelling, then all units within the dwelling must be covered by one AHS contract for coverage to apply to shared systems and appliances.
- 2. If this contract is for a multi-unit dwelling other than those specified in Section J.1, then only items contained within the confines of each individual unit are covered. Shared systems and appliances are not covered.

L. CANCELLATION

This contract may be cancelled by AHS for the following reasons: (a) nonpayment of contract fees or other breach of this contract by the customer; (b) fraud or misrepresentation by the customer and/or customer representative of facts material to AHS's issuance of this contract; or (c) a change in laws or regulations that has a material effect on the business of AHS or AHS's ability to fulfill its obligations under this contract.
- 2. The customer may cancel this contract at any time and for any reason.
- 3. If the customer or AHS cancels the contract within the first 30 days following the beginning of the contract term:
 - a. if AHS has not provided any services, the customer will receive a full refund of all contract fees paid;
 - b. if AHS has provided services and the amount of the service costs incurred by AHS is less than the contract fees paid, the customer will receive a refund of the contract fees paid, less the service costs incurred by AHS;
 - c. If AHS has provided services and the amount of the service costs incurred by AHS is greater than the contract fees paid, the customer shall pay AHS the lesser of (i) the amount by which the service costs incurred by AHS exceeds the contract fees paid; or (ii) the amount by which the annual rate listed on the Contract Agreement pages exceeds the contract fees paid.
- 4. If the customer or AHS cancels the contract after the 30th day following the beginning of the contract term:
 - a. if AHS has not provided any services, the customer will receive a pro rata refund of the contract fees paid for the unexpired term;
 - b. if AHS has provided services and the amount of the service costs incurred by AHS is less than the contract fees paid, the customer will receive a pro rata refund of the contract fees paid for the unexpired term, less the service costs incurred by AHS;
 - c. If AHS has provided services and the amount of the service costs incurred by AHS is greater than the contract fees paid, the customer shall pay AHS the lesser of (i) the amount by which the service costs incurred by AHS exceeds the contract fees paid; or (ii) the amount by which the annual rate listed on the Contract Agreement pages exceeds the contract fees paid; and
 - d. Additionally, customer shall be responsible for an administrative fee of the lesser of (i) your Plan Fee for one month of coverage under this contract or (ii) such amount as is permitted by law.

Louisiana residents only:

A. The standard cancellation rules shall apply, except that in Louisiana the contract holder may return this contract within 20 days of the time this contract is mailed or within 10 days of delivery if this contract is delivered to the contract holder at the time of sale (escrow). If no claim has been made, this contract is deemed void and AHS shall refund to the contract holder, or credit the account of the contract holder, the full purchase price of this contract. The right to void this contract is not transferable and shall only apply to the original contract holder and only if no claim has been made prior to its return to AHS. A ten percent penalty shall be added to a refund that is not paid or credited within 45 days after return of this contract to AHS.

B. If the contract fees are billed through a mortgage loan that is later sold or paid in full, then uninterrupted coverage can be arranged by immediately calling (800) 247-4749 to establish an alternate payment method. This contract will be deemed cancelled if the contract holder fails to initiate such payment arrangements within 30 days.

C. In the event the contract is cancelled by AHS, AHS shall provide the contract holder written notice of the cancellation at the last known address of the service contract holder at least 15 days prior to cancellation by AHS, unless the reason for cancellation is nonpayment of contract fees, fraud or misrepresentation of facts material to the issuance of this contract or a substantial breach of duties of the contract holder relating to a covered item or its use. The notice shall state the date of cancellation and the reason for the cancellation.

Testimony of Julie A. Jenkins, MSN, APRN, WHNP-BC

HB 1673- Ought To Pass

Relative to women's health privacy and repealing the fetal health protection act.

Judiciary Committee

February 10, 2022

Chairman Gordon and distinguished members of the Judiciary Committee: My name is Julie Jenkins. I am a Women's Health Nurse Practitioner and an abortion provider. I can't be in person at the hearing because of the Public Health Emergency. Please include the following as a part of the public record.

I submit this testimony in support of HB 1673, which would allow me to meet patients' needs, and fulfill my own professional responsibilities and deeply held values, by providing abortion services without the requirement of an ultrasound in New Hampshire.

I have spent over 30 years working in women's health, including 17 years as a board-certified Women's Health Nurse Practitioner (WHNP-BC). I received my Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Southern Maine in 2003, my Certificate in Women's Health Care from Harbor Medical Center-University of California at Los Angeles in 2005, and my Master of Science in Nursing from California State University at Long Beach in 2007. I am currently enrolled in a doctoral program at Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing. I am also a nursing instructor with a Graduate Faculty appointment at the University of Maine Orono School of Nursing and I hold a lecturer position at the MGH Institute of Health Professions in Boston.

New Hampshire is one of the most rural states in the country, and the ultrasound mandate and the 24-week abortion ban severely restricts where and when patients can obtain an abortion. Medication abortion can often be safely provided by telehealth provision in early pregnancy, but the ultrasound mandate makes telehealth impossible, and patients may have to needlessly travel for hours—and pay for transportation, childcare, and time off work that many low-income people simply cannot afford—rather than getting care in their own communities, often forcing them to delay that care. While abortion is extremely safe, delaying care can increase risks. The State simply has no justification for harming New Hampshire patients in this way.

I have provided telehealth services in abortion care since 2015 while working in rural Maine. Since that time the safety and efficacy of medication abortion without ultrasound has been demonstrated repeatedly, and telehealth services allow for patients to have an abortion in their own community and without delay with the support of a provider. I recently co-authored a peer-reviewed article published in the Journal of Midwifery & Women's Health on this very topic



showing that “evidence supports that in-clinic testing is largely unnecessary for safe and effective administration of medications for an abortion. . . ACOG consider[s] no-test medication abortion guidelines [without ultrasound] a safe option for appropriately screened people. No-test medication abortion is safe and efficacious and is associated with high patient satisfaction.”¹

I care about this issue dearly. Time and again, my life experiences have affirmed for me that people need to be able to make their own decisions about pregnancy and parenting—and have access to health care to see those decisions through. My own journey to parenthood was a difficult one that included multiple rounds of IVF, miscarriages, and more anxious and sleepless nights than I can count. That experience only strengthened my resolve that people should be able to control their reproductive destinies, no matter what decisions we make.

I urge members of this Committee to vote Ought To Pass on HB 1673. Whether a patient decides to become pregnant, to continue a pregnancy, or to seek abortion care, they should have access to quality, sensitive care in their own community, and in the way that best fits their needs.

It is only a matter of time before we have NH survivors courageous enough to come forward...and their stories will be a direct reflection on what today's legislature did (or did not do) to protect them as human beings with human rights.

Third trimester abortion also takes a toll on medical support staff. Jill Stanek of Chicago and other nurses from all over the US have united to tell their stories of being forced to participate in “live birth” abortions. They tell of babies born alive during abortions, drowned in the same little plastic tubs used for wanted babies' first baths... and the trauma of forced participation in such heinous acts.

Lastly, the American Association of Pro-Life Obstetricians and Gynecologists, a group of board-certified professional medical experts, have testified repeatedly that there is no medical reason why abortion is necessary when the baby is gestationally old enough to survive outside the womb. There are other means to save both mother and child.

I am left wondering why some members of our NH Judiciary committee refuse to acknowledge these facts? I sincerely hope that today's hearing does not repeat recent past missteps by this committee...

I was at the statehouse on Jan 29, 2020 to witness when (then chairwoman of the Judiciary committee) Rep. Marjorie Smith accepted testimony from ONE Dartmouth Hitchcock neonatologist that “there's no such thing” as abortion survivors. Rep. Smith then proceeded to dismiss other pro-life testimony (Rep. Walter Stapleton) on the grounds that this ONE DH doctor's testimony (not even an abortion provider) somehow stood as testimony for ALL hospitals and abortion centers in ALL of NH and made a public statement that babies do not survive abortions in NH: “It doesn't happen here.” I was astonished that no one else on the Judiciary committee called a point of order! Had I not already testified, I would have spoken directly to the matter.

I have since learned that NH has not enforced DHHS annual audits of Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers as required, nor does it collect statistics on abortion in NH, nor does it require any medical credentials from abortion providers. (<https://www.nhcornerstone.org/op-ed/nh-the-most-abortion-friendly-state/>) All of this shows how scandalously negligent our state has become in protecting the lives of women in crisis and their babies. This is all evidence that abortion is not about “saving women” – it has become a sacred cow in our state, worshipped for the money it brings in. If we were about “saving women,” we would be providing alternatives for them to choose life with all of that money instead of paying off abortion providers.

The Judicial committee has broken trust with the people of NH. Please restore it by voting NO on HB 1673.

Support HB 1673 - Prevent the Government from Controlling Private Healthcare Decisions

Bill Summary: HB 1673 would repeal RSA 329:43 through 329:50 – the so-called “fetal health protection act.” Under RSA 329:43 through 329:50:

- Abortions are banned at or after 24 weeks, with limited exceptions for the life of the pregnant person or serious risk of substantial and irreversible impairment of a major bodily function.
- An ultrasound is required prior to all abortion care - at all stages of pregnancy.
- Abortion providers can face both criminal and civil liability for providing abortion care to their patients.

No one should be forced to carry a pregnancy against their will. Current New Hampshire law denies Granite Staters their right to decide for themselves whether or not to end a pregnancy. When it comes to the most personal decisions in life — such as preventing or ending a pregnancy or having a child — it should be up to the pregnant person, free from punishment, judgment, or political interference.

Current law deputizes people unconnected with an abortion to sue health care providers. The civil remedies section of the abortion ban allows the spouse or parent(s) of a person who has an abortion outside of the ban to sue the health care provider who performed the abortion for civil damages. In reality, this means that an abusive spouse or estranged parents have legal standing to sue a medical provider.

This legislation places both medical providers and their patients at risk. It imposes potential sanctions on abortion-providing doctors unless the procedure is intended to prevent death or serious risk of substantial and irreversible impairment of a major bodily function. Because there is no clear, universal definition of the point at which a pregnant person’s life becomes endangered, even when a physician is certain that an abortion or another intervention which poses a threat to a pregnancy is in the patient’s best interest, the risk of prosecution will incentivize waiting to act until the patient’s symptoms become demonstrably life-threatening. The threat of criminal and/or civil liability directly conflicts with a doctor’s ability to effectively treat a patient needing medical care.

The vast majority of Granite Staters support safe, legal abortion. Sixty-six percent of Granite Staters support keeping abortion legal in all/most cases, rejecting the idea that bodies are public property to be regulated by government officials.ⁱ In fact, only three states have a higher percentage of residents who support safe, legal abortion access.ⁱⁱ As this polling makes clear, Granite Staters don’t appreciate government intervention into their private health care decisions.

The New Hampshire Legislature should focus on the pressing health care needs of Granite Staters. Over two thousand Granite Staters have died from COVID-19.ⁱⁱⁱ Over 285,000 Granite Staters have had COVID-19.^{iv} At least 181 people are currently hospitalized in New Hampshire with COVID-19.^v New Hampshire has 13 percent remaining capacity in their ICUs.^{vi} Nearly one in four New Hampshire hospitals are experiencing a critical staffing shortage.^{vii} Instead of expanding the government’s control of private health care decisions, legislators should be focused on the acute needs of medical providers in New Hampshire to combat COVID-19.

To the members of the Committee:

Today is Day 41 for the Fetal Life Protection Act. Though on the books less than six weeks, already there have been attempts not to tweak it or fine-tune it or clarify it, but to repeal it.

A bill to clarify it hasn't even gone to the floor for a vote yet.

Repealing this statute would allow abortion without restriction throughout pregnancy.

This is 2022. Things are much different from 1973, when Roe v. Wade was decided. Ultrasound has given us an incredibly accurate window to the womb. We understand that unborn children are capable of feeling pain. Pre-natal surgery is better. There were no pregnancy care centers in 1973, now there are thousands, including multiple ones in New Hampshire.

The common reasons given for allowing abortion after 24 weeks are that it is rare and usually involves a fetal anomaly or a risk to the mother. Last month, I sat through a morning of testimony from mothers who, though given a discouraging diagnosis, gave birth to healthy children. I sat behind a young woman who was born at 24 weeks gestation and listened as she read us her testimony.

We have almost 50 years worth of technological and medical advances available now that weren't available in 1973. Why are we trying to take our abortion law back to 1973? When presented with these hard cases, we have a choice before us – we can treat the two patients involved, trying the best to save both, or we can disregard the living, kicking, pain-capable patient in the womb who is destroyed in a late-term abortion.

This statute was voted in by a majority last session and just hit the books. Give it a chance.

The New Hampshire Women's Foundation invests in equality and opportunity for New Hampshire women and girls through research, education, advocacy, and grantmaking.

We believe HB1673 Ought to Pass because an 24-week abortion ban and ultrasound mandate impose inequitable barriers to accessing abortion and create a culture of shame and stigma for those seeking reproductive health care.

24 Week Abortion Ban Creates Inequitable Access to Care

A 24-week abortion ban places an inequitable burden on some people who will be forced to seek abortion in another state who may not have the means to do so. This would include low-income women, women living in rural areas, survivors of domestic violence and control who are limited in their movement and travel, and those without access to transportation. A 24-week abortion ban in New Hampshire targets women who need local, compassionate, reliable, and affordable care the most.

Ultrasound Mandate Creates Culture of Shame and Stigma

The ultrasound mandate, when applied to people who would not medically need or personally want an ultrasound, sometimes very early on in a pregnancy, contributes to a culture of shaming women. We believe this medically unnecessary requirement exists for one reason only: to add an additional barrier to a person seeking reproductive healthcare. In so doing, it is clear that the intent is to disempower women and individuals seeking an abortion.

Conclusion

We believe women and people who can become pregnant should have access to the full range of reproductive health care, including abortion, free from shame and stigma. We urge the Committee to recommend HB1673 Ought to Pass.

Testimony in Support of HB1673

Good afternoon, my name is Amanda Elizabeth Toll and I represent the City of Keene at large. I am writing today in support of HB1673. Freedom, independence and privacy. Constitutionally protected rights outlined in Article 1, Article 2 and article 2b.

Except when pregnant. When pregnant, the state legislature has a seat at your table. While you make decisions about your medical care during pregnancy, legislators in New Hampshire have already decided you are incapable of making medical decisions for your own health.

This is an egregious infringement on the autonomy of a pregnant person's rights.

We heard from providers that there are a very limited number of OBs who can deliver late term fetal abnormality abortion care, and this bill criminalizes them for doing their job. Leaving this legislation in place makes recruiting and training providers in our state much more difficult. Why would a doctor looking to practice gynecology and obstetrics want to practice in a state where the state has made a hostile environment for practicing reproductive medicine?

Repealing this ban is critical for providers whose patients are going through potentially incredibly complex situations. They risk facing criminal charges for delivering critical care and patients who are already in a stressful situation to leave their home state to get care.

The attacks on bodily autonomy are relentless and they are about power and control. Who is a fully recognized and whole person able to make their own decisions about their reproductive health. The legislature has inserted itself into the very personal and private medical decisions of pregnant women. Not just metaphorically but literally as women are forced to endure ultrasounds to

access abortion healthcare. It boggles the mind as to why the state insists on a vaginal ultrasound so that a woman can access the oral abortion healthcare, mifepristone and misoprostol, which can be safely used up to the first 70 days (10 weeks) of pregnancy. But first, the state insists you endure an ultrasound. Who is in control in that situation? Who is exercising power? It's not the pregnant woman.

It should not matter if a pregnancy is the result of failed birth control, sexual assault, incest, or decision that best serves the person whose body is actually pregnant. A pregnancy is not an invitation for the state to jump in with medical advice. It's no one's business but the person who is pregnant. It's their body and no one here should have any claim on what their very personal reproductive healthcare options are. Unless the underlying desire is for power and control.

I strongly urge the committee to repeal the fetal protection act that more accurately should be named the power and control over pregnant women act. Trust New Hampshire women with their pregnancy healthcare decisions, trust doctors to deliver critical care to women without threat of criminal penalty.

Please vote Ought To Pass on HB 1673.

OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY

My name is Dr. Ilana Cass, I am the Chair of Ob Gyn at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center, the only Obstetrics and Gynecology training program in the Granite State. I am here today as the voice for the women of New Hampshire and their obstetrics care providers. I know you are here today motivated by the desire to better serve your constituency. The Fetal Health Protection Act passed last year does not achieve that noble goal, rather, it imperils the lives, and equal access to excellent healthcare, that the women and families of New Hampshire deserve.

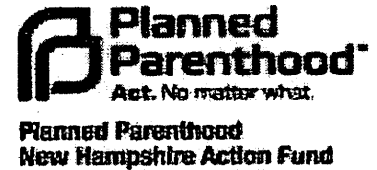
A woman and her partner seek a termination late in pregnancy under great duress and for truly dire circumstances. When a pregnancy threatens the mental or physical health of the woman, or the fetus has significant congenital anomalies, a woman and her partner turn to the expertise of highly trained Obstetrics and Neonatal doctors. These women's stories are truly heart-wrenching as they face this agonizing decision about how to proceed. As of January 1, 2022 many of these women will be turned away from care that we are fully capable of providing here in New Hampshire. They will be forced to travel great distances away from the support of their communities and families, incur additional expense thereby compounding the inequity of care for our most marginalized women.

Moreover, we have incontrovertible data that shows women who sought a late termination of pregnancy and were turned away, were at significantly higher risk for economic hardship and poorer health for themselves, and their existing children. These women who were turned away were more likely to remain in relationships with abusive partners, had higher drop-out rates from high school and college, and had higher risks of serious complications, including death, as a result of that pregnancy.

Today the law of the land in New Hampshire does not recognize that congenital anomalies, incest or rape are indications for a woman to seek termination late in pregnancy. Additionally, the law demands unnecessary and costly testing, and sends a doctor to jail for providing this procedure. The law of the land substitutes the medical judgement and authority of legislators for that of highly trained Obstetricians and Neonatologists. Left unchanged, I believe the Fetal Health Protection Act will steadily erode access to high quality health care for the women and families of New Hampshire by deterring the brightest Obstetrician and Neonatal providers from practicing in our great state. As the person with responsibility for most of the pregnancies and Obstetrical providers in our state, I implore you to correct course.

HB1673: relative to women's health privacy and repealing the fetal health protection act

Committee: House Judiciary

Date: February 10, 2022

Position: Support

Background: On January 1, 2022 New Hampshire's first abortion ban in modern history went into effect. It bans abortion at or after 24 weeks with virtually no exceptions. There is a very narrow exception for extreme physical maternal health risks, but none for cases of rape, incest, or fatal fetal diagnoses, and it criminalizes doctors with fines and up to seven years in prison. Furthermore, it requires an ultrasound prior to all abortion care - at all stages of pregnancy. This provision isn't consistent with best medical practices and affects the ability of providers to deliver patient-centered, trauma-informed care. **Patients should be allowed to decide their own personal medical care with their health care providers, not have their options limited by politicians.**

Support HB 1673 to repeal New Hampshire's cruel abortion ban and ultrasound mandate.

Each pregnancy and each circumstance is unique. That's why one-size-fits-all laws don't work when people are making personal medical decisions. New Hampshire's current law bans abortion arbitrarily at or after 24 weeks, no matter the health of the fetus. This law is not based on science or standard medical care.

Throughout the legislative process in 2021, we heard from patients and providers who all said the same thing: **arbitrarily banning abortion later in pregnancy harms women and families who have to make decisions in complex circumstances.** Many pregnant women do not receive a serious fetal diagnosis until after the point at which current New Hampshire law makes abortion unavailable. Granite Staters in these circumstances are now not only faced with what can be a very difficult, painful decision, but they also must now have to coordinate out-of-state travel and overcome countless other hurdles in order to get the care they need.

The newly enacted law criminalizes doctors for doing their job and working with their patients to get the health care they need. New Hampshire law threatens providers with a felony and imprisonment. Physicians who are exercising their best medical judgment in what could be a very stressful and time-sensitive moment could face up to seven years in jail and up to \$100,000 in fines. This is an invitation for intimidation and harassment against medical professionals who treat patients later in pregnancies. The head of Dartmouth-Hitchcock OB/GYN stated that this law will make it difficult to recruit and retain qualified doctors to our state. Why is New Hampshire sending its citizens - in complex medical situations where days count - out of state to get the care that **New Hampshire doctors are trained to deliver?** People should be able to get the care they need in their communities.

We heard from public health experts that **this abortion ban will have negative impacts on the health care landscape in New Hampshire.** At an October 27 Executive Council meeting, DHHS Commissioner Shibinette, when asked about our fragile maternal-fetal health care system, replied, *"I think that it makes sense that specialty and subspecialty providers*

would typically settle in states that are more supportive and less restrictive around family planning and abortion. **The more restrictive we become, the less attractive New Hampshire becomes for those specialties.**"¹

When this new law was being debated last year, nearly 200 New Hampshire health care providers expressed their opposition to this law because *"New Hampshire already struggles to retain medical professionals and we are deeply concerned that these criminal penalties will undermine the state's efforts to recruit and retain clinicians."*² We must repeal this ban before its effects begin to weaken our excellent maternal and fetal health outcomes.

HB 1673 will also remove the invasive, costly, burdensome, and often medically unnecessary ultrasound requirement. Under New Hampshire law, it is mandatory that all patients seeking an abortion, *no matter at what stage of the pregnancy, must have an ultrasound.* At PPNNE, a first-trimester ultrasound is most often transvaginal. This mandate is simply not consistent with best medical practices and affects PPNNE's ability to provide patient-centered, trauma-informed care. But under New Hampshire law, it is mandated, regardless of clinician recommendation. Health care providers should decide this personal medical care with their patients, not politicians. These costly and invasive tests create another barrier to abortion access, especially for uninsured people and people struggling financially.

Unfortunately, it is not always possible for a person to get an abortion as soon as they decide to. This is in part because politicians have passed laws that put care out of reach or, especially right now, because rapidly changing pandemic protocols may delay care for hospital patients. With so many variables to consider, it is critical that patients and doctors have every medical option available based on their own unique situation. People seeking medical care later in pregnancy deserve our compassion and support — not judgment, and certainly not politicians telling them what to do.

We trust a patient and their doctor. Period. Making a decision to continue or end a pregnancy can be a complex medical and personal decision. Throughout their pregnancy, a person must be able to make health care decisions that are best for their circumstances, including whether to end a pregnancy. Doctors must be able to provide the best health care for each individual patient. Unfortunately, the state of New Hampshire is now standing in the way of a patient making their own choices about their health.

Every Granite Stater must have the freedom and privacy to make decisions about their pregnancy in consultation with their doctors. We urge a vote of "OUGHT TO PASS" on HB 1673 to reverse this cruel abortion ban.

Catherine Peternel Testimony on HB 1673-FN (Repeal of the Fetal Life Protection Act)

Good afternoon. Thank you for hearing my testimony. I'm here today to ask you to please vote against HB 1673-FN.

I am Catherine Peternel. I have lived in Wolfeboro with my husband, a practicing physician, for 26 years. We have four daughters. I hold a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

It seems since birth, my life has been entwined with the issue of life – my own birth, dealing with an unplanned pregnancy, and facing a serious medical emergency while pregnant.

When I was born in 1968, five years before Roe v. Wade, it was against the wishes of my maternal grandmother, who pressured my mother to get an abortion. Fortunately, my mother refused and instead released me for adoption. I truly believe if I had been conceived five years later, my mother would have found it more difficult to justify bringing me to term.

When I was twenty-one and single, I faced my own unplanned pregnancy. I ignored it for as long as I could until one day I felt the baby move. Fortunately, I found a pregnancy center that supported me and referred me to a doctor who could help me deliver the child and put her up for adoption. There are days I regret not raising her but she's living a full life. Now 32, she is a social worker and married with three children. Any inconvenience or embarrassment over that pregnancy seems minor when I look at all she has brought to the world.

My husband and I have been through six pregnancies together, including four successful births and one miscarriage. Our sixth pregnancy put my life at significant risk. I developed a condition called placenta percreta. My placenta was growing unchecked, growing through the uterine wall and threatening my internal organs. After much prayer, I delivered my premature baby at 23 weeks through an emergency C-section. Samuel was miraculously born alive, but only lived a short time. In that time my beautiful son was cherished, lovingly held by family and close friends, as he peacefully passed away. I can't imagine choosing to abort him and never having the chance to see and hold him.

So as you deliberate on repealing the Fetal Life Protection Act and stripping away any safeguards for preborn children, think of individuals like me and my daughter who were given the opportunity to be born and live our lives. Think of babies like Samuel who, despite their short time with us, were honored and loved. Please vote to reject HB 1673-FN.

In Support of HB 1673 - Repealing the fetal health protection act

I'm reading this on behalf of Josie Pinto of the Reproductive Freedom Fund of New Hampshire to express her strong support for HB 1673.

The abortion ban and ultrasound mandate that went into effect on January 1st have already had very harmful consequences for the organization I run. As an abortion fund that helps patients access critical care at all points in pregnancy, and supports patients who are in financial duress, the abortion ban means patients will have to travel further for care and endure higher costs. This places a major burden not just on these patients, but on our organization's ability to meet the needs of these patients.

To focus in on the ultrasound mandate, which I believe to be cruel and medically unnecessary, I'd like to give a brief overview of the current landscape of abortion care. As of right now, patients are able to receive abortion care through a wider variety of means than ever before. Since the year 2000, patients have been able to end pregnancy using a combination of Mifepristone and Misoprostol - 5 easy pills that induce a miscarriage. Because of COVID restricting patients' access to in-person care, the FDA has approved this medication for telemedicine prescription and administration. This means that patients can access providers via telehealth, go through a verbal intake process with their provider, and receive their abortion pills by mail, with some services costing patients only \$150. This allows them to administer their abortion in the safety and comfort of their own home, surrounded by their chosen support systems, and safe from a deadly virus. Abortion pills are 95% effective and have a lower complication rate than Tylenol. Not only that, but with a provider shortage patients often have to wait several weeks to find an available appointment with an in-person provider. Here in New Hampshire, that means rural patients sometimes drive 2 to 4 hours to a clinic, taking time off work, finding childcare, paying for gas, and other expenses involved with accessing in-clinic care. These are massive barriers that we see patients struggle with every single day.

Telehealth is the future of abortion care. During the Covid-19 pandemic, even clinics have innovated the way in which they provide abortion care, and have shown how abortion can successfully occur without a patient needing to set foot into a clinic - reducing a huge barrier to access. Many people prefer to have their abortions from the comfort and safety of their own home. The bottom line is: every patient deserves the full breadth of options available to them. Of course, there will still be plenty of patients who prefer in-clinic care, and they must also be able to access that care without mandatory, invasive, and medically unnecessary ultrasounds.

The FDA has approved the use of medication abortion without ultrasound. Most other states allow for it as well. Why should New Hampshire be behind and stand alone in opposing modern medical standards that increase our bodily freedom and our right to choose how we access medicine? I strongly urge you to support repealing the Fetal Health Protection Act today. Thank you for your time.

When I discovered I was pregnant at 22 and unmarried I immediately set a date for an abortion (at the recommendation of my doctor). The insurance at my job at the time would even cover all expenses. After a few days of wrestling with my decision I decided to cancel the appointment and moved instead in the direction of adoption. My daughter was born in May of 1982, and she became the sheer joy of a couple who were unable to conceive.

Three years later my husband and I discovered we were pregnant with a baby boy and we were overjoyed, however, after some testing and an amniocentesis it was determined that "the possibility of fetal anomalies is significant. Impending intrauterine fetal demise or severe intrauterine growth retardation are also possibilities.... Another possibility is congenital nephrosis.... Although some infants can survive for a short time, it appears that congenital nephrosis is invariably fatal..... this fetus is at extremely high risk for having some other type of fetal abnormality or impending fetal demise. If the pregnancy continues to viability" etc. As you can imagine we were devastated at this news but rejected the recommendation of the doctor to end the life of our baby boy in the womb rather than chose life.

Adam Wesley was born in June of 1985 and was whisked away from us immediately upon delivery to be inspected for any abnormalities. He was brought back to us a short time later and told, "You have a perfectly healthy baby boy".

20 years and 10 months later during the Mother's Day floods here in NH in 2006 his life did come to an end when his car veered off the road and he was killed instantly while driving home from Liberty University trying to make it home to surprise me on Mother's Day morning.

Little did I know 24 years before this, it would be the daughter I had given up for adoption who would be the balm my broken heart needed while grieving the death of my second child. She had come to find us just 20 months before Adam's death. She calls me "mom", she phones me at least once a day and it is as if we were never separated. I often think of the loss I would have faced if I had decided on abortion for either of these people. I would have missed out on 21 years of my son's life and now to have both my daughters to help bear the burden of losing him has been healing. He filled my empty arms when I chose adoption, and she has helped me to mend my broken heart after his death.

I would ask this committee to consider the rights of the people in the womb as well as the mothers. We don't know what the future holds for us but we, as mothers, do hold the future of our children in our hands. Fetal life is a life that should be protected so I ask you to help protect the beating heart of these children and oppose this bill.

My name is Dr. Ilana Cass, I am the Chair of Ob Gyn at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center, the only Obstetrics and Gynecology training program in the Granite State. I am here today as the voice for the women of New Hampshire and their obstetrics care providers. I know you are here today motivated by the desire to better serve your constituency. The Fetal Health Protection Act passed last year does not achieve that noble goal, rather, it imperils the lives, and equal access to excellent healthcare, that the women and families of New Hampshire deserve.

A woman and her partner seek a termination late in pregnancy under great duress and for truly dire circumstances. When a pregnancy threatens the mental or physical health of the woman, or the fetus has significant congenital anomalies, a woman and her partner turn to the expertise of highly trained Obstetrics and Neonatal doctors. These women's stories are truly heart-wrenching as they face this agonizing decision about how to proceed. As of January 1, 2022 many of these women will be turned away from care that we are fully capable of providing here in New Hampshire. They will be forced to travel great distances away from the support of their communities and families, incur additional expense thereby compounding the inequity of care for our most marginalized women.

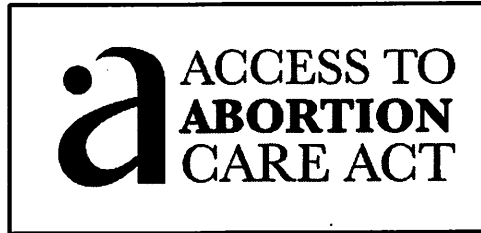
Moreover, we have incontrovertible data that shows women who sought a late termination of pregnancy and were turned away, were at significantly higher risk for economic hardship and poorer health for themselves, and their existing children. These women who were turned away were more likely to remain in relationships with abusive partners, had higher drop-out rates from high school and college, and had higher risks of serious complications, including death, as a result of that pregnancy.

Today the law of the land in New Hampshire does not recognize that congenital anomalies, incest or rape are indications for a woman to seek termination late in pregnancy. Additionally, the law demands unnecessary and costly testing, and sends a doctor to jail for providing this procedure. The law of the land substitutes the medical judgement and authority of legislators for that of highly trained Obstetricians and Neonatologists. Left unchanged, I believe the Fetal Health Protection Act will steadily erode access to high quality health care for the women and families of New Hampshire by deterring the brightest Obstetrician and Neonatal providers from practicing in our great state. As the person with responsibility for most of the pregnancies and Obstetrical providers in our state, I implore you to correct course.

New Futures appreciates the opportunity to testify in support of HB 1674 (relative to reproductive rights) and HB 1673 (relative to women's health privacy and repealing the fetal health protection act). New Futures is a nonpartisan, nonprofit health policy and advocacy organization that advocates, educates, and collaborates to improve the health and wellness of all New Hampshire residents. In this role, we work extensively with policy makers, health care providers and families to increase access to quality, affordable health care and to improve health equity across the Granite State.

New Futures stands in strong support of both HB 1674 and HB 1673, as each bill would increase access to critical reproductive care for individuals and families in need. In New Hampshire and across the country, reproductive care, including abortion, is a critical element of overall health care. Data is clear that restrictions on abortion, like those currently written in state law, have significant impacts on the health and wellness of women, children and families.

Research from [The Turnaway Study](#) out of the University of California San Francisco shows that:

- Years after an abortion denial, women were more likely to not have enough money to cover basic living expenses like food, housing and transportation.
- Women who were denied an abortion and gave birth reported more life-threatening complications like eclampsia and postpartum hemorrhage compared to those who received wanted abortions.
- Women who were denied an abortion and gave birth instead reported more chronic headaches or migraines, joint pain, and gestational hypertension compared to those who had an abortion.
- Children born as a result of abortion denial are more likely to live below the federal poverty level than children born from a subsequent pregnancy to women who received the abortion.

These impacts, among many others, are shown to disproportionately affect those already facing the greatest barriers to care, including those with lower incomes, residents of rural areas, people of color, women, LGBTQ+ individuals, people with disabilities and others.

By repealing New Hampshire's 24-week abortion ban and prohibiting similar bans into the future, HB 1674 and HB 1673 would increase access to these vital healthcare services for women and families, and they would support the health and wellness of our state. For these reasons, we ask that you support both of these bills and vote them Ought to Pass.

My name is Amanda Elizabeth Toll, and I represent Cheshire 16 which encompasses the city of Keene at large. I ran for office and got elected on a distinctly progressive feminist platform. This platform was focused on reproductive justice, meaning that all people, regardless of race, class, or gender, have the right to make autonomous reproductive decisions, and should have the resources and support to do so. In line with this, I represent my constituents by supporting all legislative proposals that affirm reproductive justice and strongly oppose all bills that interfere with reproductive freedom.

I am writing today in support of The Access to Abortion-care Act HB1674. In New Hampshire, there are currently no safeguards in place for abortion rights. This legislative proposal will put into law that the state cannot further interfere in the right to access abortion care. The New Hampshire Women's Foundation invests in equality and opportunity for New Hampshire women and girls through research, education, advocacy, and grantmaking.

We believe HB1674 Ought to Pass because the full range of reproductive health care, including abortion, is crucial to women's health, economic security, and long-term impacts on women and their families.

Reproductive Health Care is Crucial to Women's Health

We support HB1674 because we believe that women, and all people who can become pregnant, should have access to the full range of reproductive choices, including abortion, here in New Hampshire, regardless of what happens at the federal level. We believe women have the right to make decisions about their bodies, their families, and their lives. Not only is the choice to end a pregnancy a right, but it is, for some, a means to economic prosperity, safety and the ability to flee violence, and the opportunity to pursue dreams and develop thriving communities. In New Hampshire, women are more likely to live in poverty, with a gendered wage gap that increases by race, ethnicity, and county, and more likely to have been impacted by interpersonal and/or sexual violence. These indicators of well-being are all significantly impacted by the ability to make reproductive decisions, including abortion, for oneself. We must protect the right to abortion to continue to support women's autonomy, health, wellness, economic security, and ability to support thriving families and communities in our state.

Economic Impacts of Limiting Access

While the most important implication of HB1674 is the autonomy of women and people who can become pregnant to make decisions about their reproductive health, improvements in abortion access will also impact economic outcomes for women and their families. Deciding whether and when to have a child is the most consequential decision relative to a woman's lifetime economic well-being, so it is important that all choices, including abortion, are available to those who face unintended pregnancy. Women who are denied an abortion go on to experience economic hardship and economic insecurity lasting for years and impacting the next generation. Providing access to all reproductive healthcare including abortion will promote greater economic security for New Hampshire women and families in three key areas:

- 1) **Long Term Economic Security** – Control over their reproductive health allow women to invest more heavily in their potential including increased schooling and job training

which contribute to greater long-term economic security. Women who have access to abortion have higher rates of high school and college graduation.¹

- 2) **Labor Force Participation** – It takes 4-years on average for a woman to return full-time to the workforce after childbirth following abortion denial.²
- 3) **Multi-Generational impact** –Abortion access not only has economic benefits for the pregnant person, but also benefits other children (born previous or subsequent) in her household: lower rates of poverty and increase in high school graduation and college attendance.³ Access to abortion contributes to the economic mobility of women and is critical to disrupt the cycle of poverty between generations. When women are healthy and prosperous, their families succeed and our communities grow stronger.

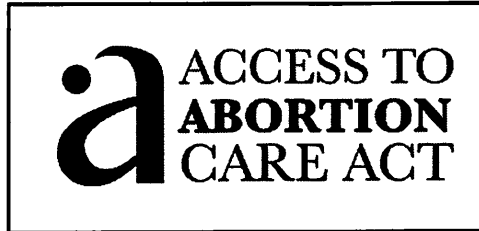
Conclusion

ANALYSIS

This bill repeals the fetal health protection act, which prohibits a health care provider from performing an abortion after 24 weeks except in the case of a medical emergency.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill repeals RSA 329:43 through 329:50, relative to the fetal health protection act. Since the bill removes a felony offense from statute, it may decrease costs for the judicial and correctional systems. There is no method to determine how many fewer charges may be brought as a result of the changes contained in the bill. However, the entities impacted have provided the costs associated with felony cases below.

It should be noted that a person needs to be found indigent and have the potential of being incarcerated to be eligible for indigent defense services. Historically, approximately 85% of the indigent defense caseload has been handled by the public defender program, with the remaining cases going to contract attorneys (14%) or assigned counsel (1%). Beginning in March of 2021, the public defender program has had to close intake to new cases due to excessive caseloads. Due to these closures, the contract and assigned counsel program have had to absorb significantly more cases. The system is experiencing significant delays in

appointing counsel and the costs of representation have increased due to travel time and multiple appointments.

With respect to the Judicial Branch, the fiscal impact is indeterminable. In the past the Judicial Branch has used averaged caseload data based on time studies to estimate the fiscal impact of proposed legislation. The per case data on costs for routine criminal cases currently available to the Judicial Branch are based on studies of judicial and clerical weighted caseload times for processing average routine criminal cases that are more than fifteen years old so the data does not have current validity. A new case study is being conducted and updated estimates will be available in the future.
