I am writing to let you know I am against this legislation. I am from Amherst and we have Mont Vernon students attend schools with our town from 7th grade to 12th grade. Dissolving the Cooperative District would bring catastrophic financial hardships to both towns. I have been a lifelong resident of New Hampshire, and have been a student in a district with tuition agreements (Candia) and a parent in a cooperative school district (Center Harbor/Interlakes). My experience with tuition agreement schools was terrible. My classmates and I were tuitioned to Central High School in Manchester. While I gained an excellent education from some of the finest educators in the state, the physical condition of the schools was absolutely deplorable. As tuitioned students, we and our parents had no say over how funds were allocated, as our town did not have representation on the Manchester school board. Therefore, our money went to a failing school district with a terrible track record of teacher retention and building maintenance. The free market attempts at education failed miserably for me and many of my classmates. Candia has been forced to move to a different school district further away, but continues to have no say in how that school is managed.

Conversely, the Interlakes school district has been a refreshing change. Despite only having 1600 residents, our town has a seat on the school board, and we can directly influence how our tax dollars are spent. We have much more input than my parents did with Manchester, and I am much more comfortable being able to actually elect my representative to the school board. Loss of our cooperative district would be devastating, as our town cannot support its own school district, and dissolution of the board would mean we would lose our representation, but still be paying the same or more money to a different town.

I strongly encourage you to reject HB 1679 to maintain my representation along with my taxation.

Importance: Normal

I am writing in regards to HB1679 regarding repealing cooperative school districts.

Let me begin by stating that my two kids attended Timberlane Regional School District (TRSD) schools, a cooperative district composed of 4 towns. I spent six years as a School Board member and Chair and three years on the TRSD Budget Committee. I believe I have a good understanding of the education system in NH.

This bill is extremely short sighted for several reasons, and I recommend that it not be voted out of committee to the full House.

1) The bill is costly to NH towns. Now, in TRSD's case, we have the costs of one administrative office with a Superintendent, HR office, Finance office, Technology office etc being shared among the taxpayers of four towns. If HB1679 was signed into law, each town would need to duplicate this administrative office. With the number of cooperative districts in NH, that would mean ~90 additional administrative offices being created. And all this expense providing absolutely zero education benefit to the students.

2) The bill reduces "local control" of education. Presently in TRSD's case each town in the district elects School Board and Budget Committee members and each has a say in the district governance. If this bill is enacted, one town, in our case Plaistow, would "own" the middle and high schools. The other three towns would have the opportunity to tuition their kids in to these schools. But in tuitioning students in, the three towns lose all say in governance of the middle and high schools. All they do is send students and money while Plaistow has total control. That's the way Pinkerton Academy in Derry works now with districts such as Hampstead who send their students there. The only "local control" Atkinson, Danville and Sandown will have is which other district they tuition their kids into after elementary school. And they wouldn't make that decision annually since multiyear contracts would doubtless be required...

I honestly have no idea why this bill was proposed in the first place, I see nothing to be gained by it but huge costs to taxpayers. I approached one cosponsor and could not even get a reason why he sponsored it and why he thought this a good idea. I urge you to vote against moving this bill beyond your committee.

My name is Cordelia Elaine Scales, and I graduated from Hollis Brookline High School in 2019, which falls under the cooperative school district of SAU 41. I wouldn't be who I am without the cooperative school district, and I'm incredibly grateful and lucky to have attended school in SAU 41.

I vehemently oppose HB1679, and my reasoning is fourfold on the grounds of course variety and academic rigor depletion, potential cuts to extracurricular activities, the high costs foisted upon towns throughout the state, and the impacts on students.

If we were to split the middle school and high school, the level of academic rigor and available courses would suffer. It's because of the larger student body that we are able to hire more teachers and offer courses like Introduction to Engineering Design, Advanced Placement Environmental Science, Science Fiction, Guitar, Ceramics, Latin, and the list goes on. Having a larger student body and a larger variety of course selections means that students can pick courses they're passionate about and will enjoy their education.

Additionally, the amount of extracurricular activities will dwindle should the co-op be split. Clubs like FIRST Robotics will see their team enrollment halved or fade out all together. Sports team offerings will be cut as schools will have trouble fielding teams. Clubs may fade out because there just simply won't be faculty to advise them. Having fewer teachers per school means teachers are spread more thin and simply won't have the energy to devote to a club, as much as they'd love to.

A third reason I oppose this is that it will raise high costs onto towns without infrastructure to support new schools. In Brookline, this would mean building a new school building or two, which will be incredibly expensive and will raise taxes. Additionally, we'd have to hire more administrative staff - a new principal or two, new vice principals, new secretaries, new nursing

staff, new guidance counselors, and a new superintendent and school district administrative staff. We would also potentially have to hire more teachers. All of this comes at a cost of taxpayer money.

Finally, splitting up cooperative school districts will have severe psychological consequences on students. In terms of Brookline, the student body at RMMS is about 400 students and CSDA is about 300 students. The new middle school, should it be kept at grades 7 and 8, would have a student body of around 200 students, and the new high school would be about 400 students. And then students go off to college. I go to a college with a student body of 12,000, and my school within the university is about 900 students. Right now, that is about equal to the current high school student population, so I was able to adjust pretty quickly. However, if I were to jump to a school twice the size of my high school, I would have had a more difficult time. I am open about the fact that I live with an anxiety disorder, and adjusting to large crowds and new environments is difficult for me. Splitting cooperative school districts will have detrimental effects on students like me.

Those are the four practical reasons I oppose HB1679. I also oppose it because I have siblings that will be enrolled at Hollis Brookline High School at the time this bill would take effect should it become law. They will be rising Seniors. This will negatively impact them right as they start their college application processes. They will be forced into a new high school with potentially new guidance counselors who don't know them, and this will put them at a serious disadvantage.

And finally, to Representatives Lewicke, Pauer, Homola, Ammon, and McGhee, your constituents don't want the cooperative school district to be split. We took a vote on studying splitting the middle school on April 10, 2021 and it failed. To vote to split the cooperative school district would be a disservice to your constituents. You would be failing the youngest of your constituents, the ones who cannot speak up for themselves, which is why I write to you today. I urge every single one of you to vote no on this bill. Thank you for your consideration.

Beside the fact that Hancock could never support their own middle & elementary schools without an enormous increase in taxes, our regional schools offer a kind of magic for their students. We came from a town with its own school system, and it had a plethora of problems stemming from homogeny, an unequal distribution of funds between the schools, and a terrible tendency to dismiss and disserve underachieving students who did not support their almighty test scores.

My son falls into that category. With ADHD and learning disabilities, he struggles at school. However, in the last year plus since we have moved here, my son has flourished. 
I am writing in opposition to NH HB1679, a bill that would disband cooperative school districts in New Hampshire.

As I read through Bill HB1679, I find myself asking: what possible purpose can this serve?

The towns that are a part of cooperative and regional school districts have decided that it is in their best interest to join together into those districts. They have the ability to dissolve them on their own if it is no longer in the best interest of the involved towns. Why does the State of New Hampshire need to step in and put out a blanket statement requiring all of them be dissolved? Testimony on AFT NH on HB 1679

From Debrah Howes, President AFT-NH

To the New Hampshire House Education Committee:

Dear Chairman Ladd and Members of the Committee,

My name is Debrah Howes. I am the president of the American Federation of Teachers – NH. AFT-NH represents 3,500 teachers, paraeducators and school support staff, public service employees and higher education staff across New Hampshire.

AFT New Hampshire strongly opposes HB 1679. This bill is a centralized, top-down attempt to mandate the break-up of cooperative school districts that shows no respect for the local voters and taxpayers in the towns and school districts involved. Such a drastic move would arbitrarily and unfairly disrupt the education of thousands of public-school students, destroying an educational and operational model that has been successful for decades in our state.

Cooperative school districts work. They allow small towns to band together to share school buildings, teachers, staff, operating and administrative costs, and capital expenses. Cooperative school systems give students in smaller towns access to academics, sports, art, music, and other services and programs their town alone can't offer. But ignoring the common-sense, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it" rule, HB 1679 would require that cooperative school districts dissolve themselves by June 30, 2025. It gives cooperative districts less than a year to create a dissolution plan. It also bans the formation of new cooperative school districts.

The bill gives towns who are now part of cooperative districts two equally bad choices: a) Create their own school district, with all the resulting effort, cost, disruption and trauma for students, or b) pay the per-pupil tuition to send their town's students to other public school districts or private schooling (i.e., be forced to adopt a backdoor voucherization/charterization program.) Given the hefty costs this bill would inflict on districts, it would also likely raise property taxes.

Students will suffer if this bill passes. They could find themselves suddenly without the teachers, staff, schools, programs, peer friendships and social supports they've always had. Plus, ending shared services could result in students losing services such as school nurses, social workers, and enrichment programs. After everything our children have been through with the pandemic, inflicting more disruption and uncertainty on them and their families is simply cruel.

The bill's sponsors can't offer any sensible reason for creating chaos in school districts that were governing themselves just fine. In fact, the bill makes no mention of how this upheaval would improve education or help children. One straw man argument – the rare possibility that districts may want to exit cooperative agreements – is already addressed in an existing state law (NH RSA 195 26-20) which provides for a withdrawal process. HB 1679 is a sledgehammer when a scalpel would do.

This consequence of this bill, intended on not, will be more pressure to privatize public schools – forcing districts to tuition students out, forcing families into the voucher program and forcing local taxpayers to foot the bill. This is not what Granite Staters want. In a Dec. 2021 Hart Research Associates poll, New Hampshire registered voters solidly opposed spending public dollars for private schooling. They overwhelmingly said the legislature should focus on making public schools better for all kids instead of using tax money on vouchers to benefit a few.

Our children need so much right now: stability, social and emotional supports, and safe and welcoming schools so we can help them not only recover from the disruptions of the past 18 months but thrive. Please stop HB 1679 in its tracks and focus on investing in the great public schools our kids deserve.

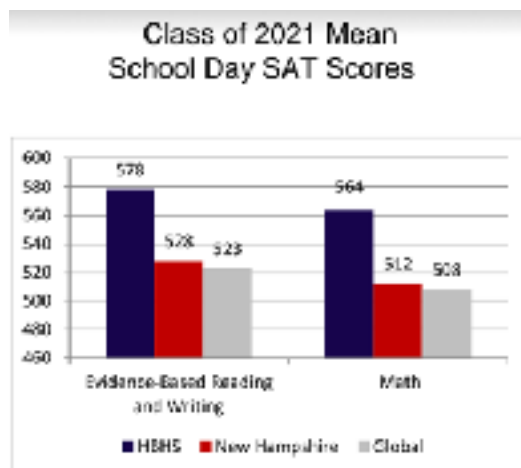
If this bill passes it would cause massive costs to smaller towns if they attempted to create their own schools or voucher/tuition-in their way into larger towns' schools (as they used to in the bad old days before cooperative school districts). These costs can't be borne by small populations. This bill will destroy New Hampshire's small towns.

The bill's sponsors may think this bill will achieve their goals of dismantling public education, but New Hampshire families will not give up on their children's future so easily. Families will continue to fund public schools because they believe in a strong and united America, and because they cannot afford the unregulated, unresponsive universe of private schools. But people living in small towns won't have competitive options without Cooperative school districts - the economies of scale that allow smaller towns to band together to create excellent schools is *inarguable*. Families with means, with ambition, with opportunities, with a willingness to sacrifice for their children, will move away from the Masons, the Wiltons, even from larger small towns like Brookline. The tax base will collapse, the economic engines of these towns will fail, and New Hampshire's small towns will be gutted.

For example, see the graph below, supplied by the College Board. It shows the performance of Hollis Brookline High School on the SAT compared to the state of NH and the nation. This high school is part of the Hollis Brookline Cooperative School District and performs in this same range of excellence year after year after year. The town of Brookline has only 2/3 the population of Hollis. Neither town could provide a public middle or high school sufficient in scope to produce such exceptional results on its own.

The families of our combined 2,400 students, regardless of their wealth or other status, are exceptional families respecting their commitment to their children's academic advantage in the open market. They will leave for the larger cities where their drive, determination, and academic ambition coupled with the economies of scale they contribute will produce exceptional public schools elsewhere. The small towns they leave will wither rather quickly as average age ratchets up and the tax base drains away.

America's history includes an agonizing parade of destroyed small towns in states where the distribution of local control is wrenched away and the even distribution of education funding is gutted. Don't kill the New Hampshire education golden goose. Vote NO on HB1679.

As a mother of four children who have attended school in a Co-operative School and as a former student myself who attended school in a Cooperative School District, I am opposed to this bill, HB1679. At no point was our local school board or our local legislative body ever asked about our position on dissolving our cooperative school district by the State Representatives who are sponsoring this bill. This bill is yet another example of State Government overreach with the State trying to seize control of a local government issue. The decision to be part of a cooperative school district is a local control issue, not a state issue.

The cost of dissolving cooperative school districts would be exponential for the small towns and taxpayers who support the cooperative districts. Does that family not deserve an education because they cannot afford private school? This letter is in opposition to HB 1679, dissolving all cooperative school districts within the State of New Hampshire and prohibiting the creation of any new cooperative school districts in the future.

Cooperative school districts play a critical role in the governance of school districts in New Hampshire, giving parents and local school boards the ability to have voice in how the cooperative school district is managed. With no cooperative school districts, families lose their voice. Yes, parents gain the option to send their child to another school district. However, for many families this “option” is not feasible due to the logistics of transportation and/or the availability of space for their children in the “desired” school district.

Cooperative school districts allow for shared and consistent planning. Schools are able to develop long-term plans including infrastructure improvement, curriculum development, and teacher training based on predicted trends within the shared district. This type of planning becomes dramatically less accurate when school enrollments cannot be predicted from year to year.

Cooperative school districts enable towns to easily share physical resources, and parents can easily interact with a single system. In a cooperative district (such as the Oyster River CSD in Durham, Lee and Madbury), students can attend elementary school in one town and middle or high school in another town. A single, integrated system creates comprehensive busing routes that allows all children in the system to easily get to school. Parents know that not only the curriculum, but also the educational infrastructure such as special education, communication with teachers, and even the process of enrolling a child in school, will be consistent from grade to grade.

Finally, Cooperative School Districts are entirely local initiatives. No town is compelled to join or remain a part of a Cooperative School District. For the State to attempt to disband and outlaw such local organizing is an enormous overreach of the State’s authority. Cooperative School Districts are an expression of the people’s Right to Assemble, to work together to achieve collective goals. For the State to attempt to disband and outlaw such associations is a violation of the Constitution of the United States and the rights of each and every citizen within those Cooperative School Districts.

HB1679 is unnecessary and harmful for New Hampshire. This bill is at best inexpedient to legislate. Cooperative school districts already have the ability to change their structures or disband should they desire.

I have a unique perspective on this subject as a resident and taxpayer in a small town (Madbury) that is part of a cooperative, but also as chair of the cooperative school board. To be clear, this letter represents only my own opinion, not an official position of the district.

Cooperative school districts SAVE money and time and create more opportunity, particularly for smaller towns like mine (Madbury, population 1918). HB1679 would require our small town to again operate its own school district and negotiate tuition with larger towns around us, effectively removing Madbury's influence on any middle or high school decision-making. Mr. Chairman and honorable members of the House Education Committee,

My name is Megan Tuttle, and I am here representing NEA-NH. We represent more than 17,000 educators across the state of New Hampshire, including many who live in and work for cooperative school districts across our state.

I am writing to express our opposition to HB 1679 which would require the dissolution of cooperative school districts. The choice of entering a cooperative school district is an important option available for students, families and taxpayers in our state. We have many towns with small populations and a cooperative or regional school district makes sense in order to most efficiently and effectively deliver a public education to those students. Our statute clearly outlines the standards by which these districts are formed. RSA 195:2, I states:

“(a) It is the purpose of this chapter to increase educational opportunities within the state by encouraging the formation of cooperative school districts which will each:

- (1) Be a natural social and economic region.
- (2) Have an adequate minimum taxable valuation.
- (3) Have a number of pupils sufficient to permit the efficient use of school facilities within the district and to provide improved instruction.”

Why would we limit our towns’ ability to achieve these standards by eliminating this option or requiring towns who have undergone the process to dissolve such arrangements? In addition, if there is an arrangements that no longer work, there is a process outlined in RSA 195 for the review, modification, and withdrawal from a cooperative school district. Ultimately, recent initiatives have been met with resounding defeat by the voters, the ones who would ultimately feel the detrimental effects that a withdrawal would mean which we feel says something about the value those communities place on maintaining their cooperation.

As I am sure many will point out to you, the effect of this legislation could mean a substantial increase in costs to localities who want to make sure their children have a high-quality public education, but for financial reasons, would find it extremely difficult to do so on its own. Should New Hampshire continue to see a further decline in its overall K-12 eligible student population, it seems to make little sense to take this option off the table completely.

Rather than taking a sledgehammer approach to cooperative school districts, we would encourage the legislature to take its time and examine this statute, and if necessary, where it could be tweaked to improve upon fulfilling the stated goals of the statute. This is a major decision that requires time and input that probably cannot be accomplished in the limited time you have to report bills this session.

For these reasons, I would strongly urge this committee to find HB 1679 Inexpedient to Legislate and we are happy to work with the legislature going forward to improve our cooperative school district statutes.

I spend significant time following bills and attending hearings in the NH Legislature. I'm not sure I've every seen a single bill that does so many earth-shaking and ludicrous things at once.

1. HB1679 totally ignores the logical decisions of communities that have over decades decided in favor of regional and cooperative school districts. We are not a home rule state, but the legislature has made at least some effort over the years to respect the rights of municipalities to make decisions for the benefit of their residents. **This bill throws out the local control New Hampshire residents treasure.**

2. It creates a complicated system of **dividing up the current school district assets** among the participating towns. In my school district's case, the little town of Sutton (pop. 1,978) would suddenly have a middle school and a high school of its own. The whole town could live in those two buildings!

3. My own town of Newbury (pop. 2,172) would have no school at all. I guess we'd have some money coming our way, as indicated in the fiscal note to the bill. [1] But we'd need new staff at the state Dept. of Education, new administrators in each town, office space. [1] Big bucks, and the taxpayer is on the hook.

4. **Tuitioning students to schools in other towns**, when a town has no school to cover certain grades, has been necessary in some towns over the years, and some of us remember the fights over how much latitude parents and towns should have in which schools are suitable for these tuitioned students. But solutions were worked out: the number of students was small, as were the number of potential receiving schools. This bill, however, would create scores of such situations. [2]

5. This bill might be seen as the capstone of attempts by the prime sponsor and his associates to **dismantle the public school system** in New Hampshire. Our public school system is ranked the fifth best in the country! [3] Do our public schools, with test scores consistently in the highest single digit percentages, [3] deserve to be destroyed? Of course not. They serve the majority of our students very well.

6. What was at first a kind of nibbling around the edges of state support to public schools (such as eliminating the school building aid programs a decade or so ago) has escalated into a full-scale attack. The prime sponsor has done all in his power to claim that parents know what is best for their own children. So he created a school voucher bill that is already \$8 million over budget, in its first year.

7. This bill, however, turns that "parents know best" on its head. It ignores what parents, as voters, have built for years—a regional system of public schools that serve them very well. Suddenly the sponsor knows better than any of them and wants to do away with that system they have worked for, volunteered for, celebrated in with their children.

To the House Education Committee, I urge you to recommend **Inexpedient To Legislate on HB1679** and to send the prime sponsor forth into Saturday's snowstorm with his bright yellow scarf tightly wound around his neck.

To the Members of the NH House Education Committee:

What is the benefit of HB1679 to the public?

- It is not in the best interests of the children.
- It will not increase local control.
- It will not lower taxes.

The best size for a high school is between 800 and 1500 students. This allows for economies of scale and breadth of program and support. However, most individual towns do not have enough children to comprise student bodies of this size. The solution is to create cooperative school districts whose student counts land in this "goldilocks zone".

The top three school districts in New Hampshire are all multi-town cooperative districts.

Requiring the dissolution of cooperative school districts will wreck the model educational facilities of our state and degrade the education of our children.

This bill requires towns which lack the required facilities after dissolution to tuition their children to other towns' schools. This places those towns at the mercy of the receiving districts. **This is the opposite of local control.** Instead of each town's district being able to make their own choices regarding the education of their children, they instead have to accept the choices of the district to which they send their children.

Long term planning isn't feasible, under these circumstances. The sending districts cannot count on there being sufficient capacity in the receiving districts to handle their children. Likewise, the receiving districts, when doing capacity planning, cannot count on the sending districts' attendance in the future, given that the sending districts can opt to send their children elsewhere. And, the costs and timescales involved, and taxpayers' reticence towards making investments (let alone the fact that public schools should not be "profit-making" enterprises), there is no reason to expect a functioning "market" to arise. The net effect will be a widening gap between the "haves" and the "have-nots", where large, rich towns can afford to provide public education, and rich parents can afford to shop around for educational opportunities for their children, while the rest of us are left to scramble for what we can get.

And, for a marginal town like mine, **the loss of the cooperative school district, and the legislative support for redirecting property tax dollars toward private school or other non-local options will result in higher taxes.** Our existing school district historically has cost less than the state average per-pupil. If we have to pay tuition for our students, especially if that amounts to vouchers for private school, there is no reason to think that the rate will be less than our current cost. And, at the same time, we'll still have our existing schools, whose costs will now be spread over fewer students (after we subtract out the now home-schooled, private-schooled, and other deductions from state-supported voucher programs). This will replace our existing, reasonably efficient public education system with one which costs our taxpayers considerably more, and which, in most cases, won't provide a better education.

So, I urge you to consign HB1679 to the dustbin where it belongs: it is a bad idea for our children, a bad idea for our pocketbooks, and antithetical to our fond New Hampshire notion of local control.

Proposal submitted by the New Hampshire School Boards Association

RSA 195:33 (new section) - Commission to Study Issues Relating to Revisions to all Sections of RSA 195

I. There is established a commission to study issues related to cooperative school districts. The membership of the commission shall be as follows:

(a) Three members from the house of representatives, 2 of whom shall serve on the education committee, and one of whom shall serve on the finance committee, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

(b) One member from the senate education committee, appointed by the senate president.

(c) The commissioner of the department of education, or designee.

(d) The commissioner of the department of revenue administration, or designee.

(e) Two school board members from cooperative school districts, appointed by the governor.

(f) Two superintendents from cooperative school districts, appointed by the governor.

Testimony on AFT NH on HB 1679

From Debrah Howes, President AFT-NH

To the New Hampshire House Education Committee:

Dear Chairman Ladd and Members of the Committee,

My name is Debrah Howes. I am the president of the American Federation of Teachers – NH.AFT-NH represents 3,500 teachers, paraeducators and school support staff, public service employees and higher education staff across New Hampshire.

AFT New Hampshire strongly opposes HB 1679. This bill is a centralized, top-down attempt to mandate the break-up of cooperative school districts that shows no respect for the local voters and taxpayers in the towns and school districts involved. Such a drastic move would arbitrarily and unfairly disrupt the education of thousands of public-school students, destroying an educational and operational model that has been successful for decades in our state.

Cooperative school districts work. They allow small towns to band together to share school buildings, teachers, staff, operating and administrative costs, and capital expenses. Cooperative school systems give students in smaller towns access to academics, sports, art, music, and other services and programs their town alone can't offer. But ignoring the common-sense, "If it ain't broke, don't fix it" rule, HB 1679 would require that cooperative school districts dissolve themselves by June 30, 2025. It gives cooperative districts less than a year to create a dissolution plan. It also bans the formation of new cooperative school districts.

The bill gives towns who are now part of cooperative districts two equally bad choices: a) Create their own school district, with all the resulting effort, cost, disruption and trauma for students, or b) pay the per-pupil tuition to send their town's students to other public school districts or private schooling (i.e., be forced to adopt a backdoor voucherization/charterization program.) Given the hefty costs this bill would inflict on districts, it would also likely raise property taxes.

Students will suffer if this bill passes. They could find themselves suddenly without the teachers, staff, schools, programs, peer friendships and social supports they've always had. Plus, ending shared services could result in students losing services such as school nurses, social workers, and enrichment programs. After everything our children have been through with the pandemic, inflicting more disruption and uncertainty on them and their families is simply cruel.

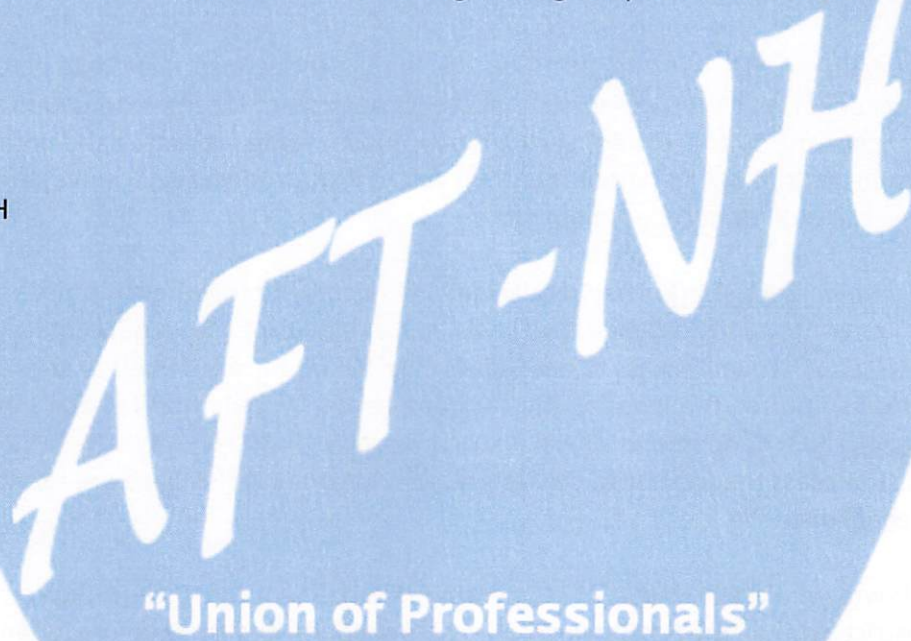
The bill's sponsors can't offer any sensible reason for creating chaos in school districts that were governing themselves just fine. In fact, the bill makes no mention of how this upheaval would improve education or help children. One straw man argument – the rare possibility that districts may want to exit cooperative agreements – is already addressed in an existing state law (NH RSA 195 26-20) which provides for a withdrawal process. HB 1679 is a sledgehammer when a scalpel would do.

This consequence of this bill, intended on not, will be more pressure to privatize public schools – forcing districts to tuition students out, forcing families into the voucher program and forcing local taxpayers to foot the bill. This is not what Granite Staters want. In a Dec. 2021 Hart Research Associates poll, New Hampshire registered voters solidly opposed spending public dollars for private schooling. They overwhelmingly said the legislature should focus on making public schools better for all kids instead of using tax money on vouchers to benefit a few.

Our children need so much right now: stability, social and emotional supports, and safe and welcoming schools so we can help them not only recover from the disruptions of the past 18 months but thrive. Please stop HB 1679 in its tracks and focus on investing in the great public schools our kids deserve.

Opposition:

I am appalled by this bill.

This country was founded (by my ancestors) with a strong value placed upon **public** education. Although I myself am a retired RN, I come from a family of teachers - from all levels. My Mom taught kindergarten for many years, including managing a private kindergarten in a town that did not have a public one. My Dad's teaching career started teaching sixth grade in Tilton, NH and ended as a highly respected member of the faculty at the University of Massachusetts. I am a product of public school education, starting in Canterbury, NH, and ending with a bachelor of science from UMass. (I would have preferred UNH, but instate tuition at UMass (where Dad was still working) was a far thriftier choice. BTW - being a member of a faculty family did not provide any additional discounts!)

My reasons for opposing this bill are:

EDUCATION

Please tell me how it would be advantageous for high school students to attend a *smaller* school, with *fewer* choices?

For example, would there be one teacher for all the sciences, instead of one to concentrate on biology, another on chemistry, another on physics, etc.? Planning curriculum takes time, and planning in numerous subjects, obviously, takes more time. Let me assure you that teachers already put large amounts of time into preparation. (By the time I was 12, I had decided that there was no way I would become a teacher. It was just too much work!)

This, obviously, applies to all fields of study... English, history, foreign languages, and subjects, such as computers, not even part of the curriculum when I was a student. It also applies to breadth and quality of extracurricular events such as sports, theater, debate team, band and orchestra ... whatever.

Education involves exposure to new things. A regional school may provide students with the opportunity to know people from different demographics. The world which they will enter as adults will be filled with people from all kinds of backgrounds. Let our kids begin to experience this.

Less is more? I don't think so.

FINANCIAL

If towns in a given regional district, for whatever reason, find that their regional school district is not working, they already have the option of reconsidering the alliance. There are people right now in Canterbury who are considering a *study* (no action at this point, just a study!) of whether being in a regional school with Belmont is really the best fit. This includes the option of building our own high school. **THUS THIS BILL IS SUPERFLUOUS.** (A waste of time and money to legislate.)

If regional schools were to be dismantled, there would undoubtedly be a large increase in property taxes. Those of us from a thrifty Yankee background object to paying more unless we get more. In this case - as I noted previously - we would be getting less.

PHILOSOPHY OF LOCAL CONTROL

Lastly, **WHAT ABOUT LOCAL CONTROL?** Those sponsoring this bill are generally in favor of more, not less, local control. Why do they feel that the state should be regulating our local schools? I might point out that the State of NH does little to fund education anyhow! As it is largely the town property taxes that pay for education, it seems that it would be only fair for the townspeople, not legislators from Concord who represent only a small number of school districts in the state, would be the ones deciding how our children are educated. None of those sponsoring this bill represent me, or my district. I do not want them dictating this level of control over MY schools.

Following the logic presented in this bill, perhaps we should consider going back to the *really* local! I am too young, by four years, to have attended a one room schoolhouse. That was two miles from my house. Where I did start first grade was five miles, and I had to ride a school bus. Horrors!

In closing, I cannot help but wonder if this is, in reality, an attempt to discredit and undermine public education. I question your actual motivation, with this so called educational bill. Were you to be honest, you would admit that you are attempting something unspeakably unpatriotic - to dismantle public education.

Mr. Chairman and honorable members of the House Education Committee,

My name is Megan Tuttle, and I am here representing NEA-NH. We represent more than 17,000 educators across the state of New Hampshire, including many who live in and work for cooperative school districts across our state.

I am writing to express our opposition to HB 1679 which would require the dissolution of cooperative school districts. The choice of entering a cooperative school district is an important option available for students, families and taxpayers in our state. We have many towns with small populations and a cooperative or regional school district makes sense in order to most efficiently and effectively deliver a public education to those students. Our statute clearly outlines the standards by which these districts are formed. RSA 195:2, I states:

“(a) It is the purpose of this chapter to increase educational opportunities within the state by encouraging the formation of cooperative school districts which will each:

- (1) Be a natural social and economic region.
- (2) Have an adequate minimum taxable valuation.
- (3) Have a number of pupils sufficient to permit the efficient use of school facilities within the district and to provide improved instruction.”

Why would we limit our towns’ ability to achieve these standards by eliminating this option or requiring towns who have undergone the process to dissolve such arrangements? In addition, if there is an arrangements that no longer work, there is a process outlined in RSA 195 for the review, modification, and withdrawal from a cooperative school district. Ultimately, recent initiatives have been met with resounding defeat by the voters, the ones who would ultimately feel the detrimental effects that a withdrawal would mean which we feel says something about the value those communities place on maintaining their cooperation.

As I am sure many will point out to you, the effect of this legislation could mean a substantial increase in costs to localities who want to make sure their children have a high-quality public education, but for financial reasons, would find it extremely difficult to do so on its own. Should New Hampshire continue to see a further decline in its overall K-12 eligible student population, it seems to make little sense to take this option off the table completely.

Rather than taking a sledgehammer approach to cooperative school districts, we would encourage the legislature to take its time and examine this statute, and if necessary, where it could be tweaked to improve upon fulfilling the stated goals of the statute. This is a major decision that requires time and input that probably cannot be accomplished in the limited time you have to report bills this session.

For these reasons, I would strongly urge this committee to find HB 1679 Inexpedient to Legislate and we are happy to work with the legislature going forward to improve our cooperative school district statutes.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill requires cooperative (and presumably regional) school districts to review and adopt dissolution plans prior to January 1, 2024, and repeals authority for all cooperative school districts on June 30, 2025. This bill also requires school boards of each cooperative (and regional) school districts shall initiate planning for the dissolution of the cooperative school district by December 31, 2022, and provides steps for the distribution/division of assets to all towns as well as providing steps for sharing the outstanding debt. The Department of Education is unable to determine this bill's potential impact on local school district revenue or expenditures, but does state there are 30 regional/cooperative school districts covering 117 towns. The Department assumes that 27 of these towns, that are part of a 2 school district, would be absorbed by their pre-existing elementary district. This would result in the net gain of 90 new school districts throughout the state. Cost for establishing new districts cannot be determined. In addition to startup cost, school districts would need to budget on an annual basis for administrative cost and district offices. The Department adds that with the addition of these new districts, programs within the Department may need to budget for new staff to provide technical support.
