Dear Chairman Dolan and Committee Members:

As bond counsel to many New Hampshire municipalities, I write to express my strong support for SB 273. With this bill's revision to RSA 31:5, I(a), New Hampshire towns that seek to issue bonds to finance broadband projects will be able to approve in a timely manner the necessary funding to establish the broadband infrastructure that will make their communities stronger.

Without such changes, if a broadband project is not ready for approval on the annual meeting cycle, voters would not be able to take the critical step of authorizing the necessary bond approval until the following year's annual meeting. Or they would have to follow the process of requesting permission from the Superior Court to hold a special emergency meeting under RSA 31:5. Instead, the revision provides towns with the limited ability to hold a special meeting to appropriate money for one purpose only and as such they will sooner be able to offer broadband for work, education, healthcare, municipal, entertainment and other purposes that are important to their residents.

AN ACT relative to broadband infrastructure funding.

#### AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill permits all towns to authorize broadband infrastructure bonds at special meetings without court approval.

#### SB 273-A - AS AMENDED BY THE SENATE

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to broadband infrastructure funding.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Powers and Duties of Towns; Special Meetings. Amend RSA 31:5, I(a) to read as follows:

I.(a) No money shall be raised or appropriated or shall any appropriation previously made 2 be reduced or rescinded at any special town meeting except by vote by ballot, nor unless the ballots 3 cast at such meeting shall be equal in number to at least 1/2 of the number of legal voters borne on 4 the checklist of the town entitled to vote at the annual or biennial election next preceding such 5 special meeting; and such checklist, corrected according to law, shall be used at any meeting upon 6 the request of 10 legal voters of the town. This section shall not apply to money to be raised for the 7 public defense or any military purpose in time of war or to money to be raised for the purpose of 8 financing broadband infrastructure bonds under RSA 33:3-g. In case an emergency arises 9 requiring an immediate expenditure of money, the selectmen may petition the superior court for 10 permission to hold a special town meeting which, if granted, shall give said meeting the same 11 authority as an annual town meeting. 12

13 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
