9 **2 State Regenerative Manufacturing Workforce Development Fund; Appropriation.** The sum of
10 \$1,000,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 is hereby appropriated to the state regenerative
11 manufacturing workforce development fund established in RSA 162-T:3. This appropriation shall be
12 nonlapsing. The governor is authorized to draw a warrant for said sum out of any money in the
13 treasury not otherwise appropriated.

14 **3 Effective Date.**

15 **I.** Section 2 of this act shall take effect June 30, 2022.

16 **II.** The remainder of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

TESTIMONY

Rep. Patrick Abrami introduced the bill. He said the bill relates to the production of artificial replacement organs for humans. A bill was passed 4 years ago giving tax breaks to corporations and tuition reimbursement to individuals working for the corporations doing such research. None of the required reporting information has been given to the Senate. This bill would require such reports and also that they would go to the House Ways and Means committee. The amendment to the bill would appropriate the funds that were approved in the bill, but were never appropriated.

Rep. Cahill: Has anyone inquired as to why the money was never appropriated?

Rep. Abrami: There have been questions.

Rep. Cahill: If the money is not needed could it go elsewhere?

Rep. Abrami: Yes.

Rep. Sullivan: Is this was non-lapsing?

Rep. Abrami: Whatever money was not spent in the year it was appropriated would be carried over in to future years, but no more than the million appropriated could be spent without further appropriation.

Rep. Avellani: Should there be a sunset provision on this?

Rep. Abrami: Probably not necessary.

Rep. Avellani: Does appropriating money make this an FN bill?

Rep. Abrami: Yes.

Rep. Cahill: Are there any other industries we have favored in this way?

Rep. Abrami: No and it was a difficult process to get it approved 4 years ago.

Rep. Cahill: Is there a need to subsidize lab researchers who are high paid Phds?

Rep. Abrami: No, but later in the process is when you would need that kind of help.

Rep. Susan Almy testified that these are start-up companies with new and unique ideas merging biology with engineering. One such project is artificial lungs which have been produced and transplanted, but still need a lot more work.

Rep. Warden: Is this money to come out of the current budget?

Rep. Almy: Yes

Rep. Warden: Why not wait until next year if the money is not needed now?

Rep. Almy: Because the State has the money now, but may not next year.

Rep. Sullivan: This bill really does not belong in the Labor Committee. Should we just move it along so it can go to the Finance Committee where it belongs?

Senator Lou D'Allesandro: This was a simple bill to just push the companies to do the required reporting on the progress of this research.

AN ACT relative to the reporting requirements for the regenerative manufacturing workforce development program.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to the reporting requirements for the regenerative manufacturing workforce development program.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 1 Regenerative Manufacturing Workforce Development Program; Reporting. Amend RSA 162-
- 2 T:5 to read as follows:
- 3 162-T:5 Reporting and Approval Regarding Workforce Development Program. The business
- 4 finance authority shall undertake to design the terms, conditions, and provisions of the regenerative
- 5 manufacturing workforce development program authorized by this chapter. The authority shall
- 6 deliver to the fiscal committee of the general court, *the house ways and means committee, and*
- 7 *the senate ways and means committee*, a report on the progress of its efforts to develop such
- 8 terms, conditions, and provisions every 6-month period, *on September 1 and March 1*, following
- 9 the effective date of this chapter. Prior to taking any action to implement a final workforce program
- 10 pursuant to this chapter, the authority shall first present the program to the fiscal committee of the
- 11 general court and receive the approval of such committee.
- 12 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
