STATEMENT OF INTENT

The original senate bill was requested by the Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) to examine reciprocal license requirements. The Senate amended the bill to create a broader study committee to review interactions of OPLC with all of the boards, councils and commissions within their purview; added a provision for expiration of terms for the board of foresters and proposed relocating the boxing and wrestling commission within OPLC. The house amendment expands the study proposed by the senate to add examination of funding for OPLC; deletes the boxing and wrestling commission which is more properly being dealt with in HB 1102. The legislative study calls for one senator and house members from executive departments and administration, health human services and elderly affairs and a third, which we would recommend be from ways and means. The last section creates a statutory oversight committee for OPLC. The oversight committee will begin in January, 2023 to follow through any recommendations of the legislative study committee in section 2 and more generally analyze the division of duties between administration and the boards, councils, committees, and commissions in order to promote more productive and efficient interactions and recommend legislation deemed necessary to correct issues it identifies. Rep. McGuire clarified that the non-germane amendment focused on the OPLC oversight committee. This amendment was introduced by Rep. Shuett. She explained the history of the amendment which (taking provisions from an earlier killed bill) addressed funding of OPLC, combined study committees. It also provided for an OPLC oversight committee similar to the HHS oversight committee. There were questions as to why a public member was not included, and about the repeal provisions. A second amendment concerning boxing and wrestling was mentioned.

Lindsey Courtney, ED OPLC, took no position on the bill. She questioned whether the scope of the committee was broad enough, for example, whether OPLC itself could bring issues to the oversight committee.

Re: Testimony in support of SB 330

Dear Chair McGuire:

The Office of Professional Licensure & Certification ("OPLC") writes regarding Senate Bill 330, as amended by the Senate.

Senate Bill 330 would create a legislative study committee to consider the issue of licensure portability and unnecessary licensure barriers to workforce. As the Committee is undoubtedly unaware, New Hampshire is experiencing a significant workforce shortage, particularly in healthcare. The State's licensure process or criteria may impose workforce barriers that are not necessary to protect the public. A legislative study committee would help the State identify such unnecessary barriers, if any, and make recommendations regarding changes in licensure.

The bill would also transfer the Boxing and Wrestling Commission from the Secretary of State's office to OPLC. OPLC does not take a position as to whether the Commission should be transferred; however, OPLC is ready, willing, and able to support the Commission should it be transferred to OPLC.

Third, the bill would eliminate statutory conflicts regarding the membership of the Board of Foresters. Currently, the statute prevents any member from being appointed if his or her term would expire in the same year as another member. Members are appointed to a five-year term; however, the statute provides that there shall be seven members of the board. The current prohibition on appointing a member to a term if another member's term would expire the same year has effectively prevented Governor and Council from being able to appoint more than five members to the board. The bill proposes to eliminate this statutory conflict by allowing two members to expire in the same year.

The committee shall submit an interim report of its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2022, and shall submit a final report on or before November 1, 2023.
- 3 Boxing and Wrestling Commission; Establishment of Commission; Transfer to office of Professional Licensure and Certification. Amend RSA 285:2 to read as follows:
- 285:2 Establishment of Commission. There is hereby established a boxing and wrestling commission within the office of professional licensure and certification, which shall oversee amateur and professional fighting sports in the state. [The commission shall be administratively attached to the department of state pursuant to RSA 21-G:10.]
- 4 Boxing and Wrestling Commission; Members; Removal Conflicts of Interest. Amend RSA 285:3, I to read as follows:
 - I. The commission shall consist of [3] 5 members appointed by the governor and council. Members appointed by the governor and council shall have had some experience in the fighting sports and shall be residents of the state. Members shall have no financial interest, direct or indirect, in professional fighting sports regulated by the commission.
- 5 Boxing and Wrestling Commission; Chairperson. Amend RSA 285:5 to read as follows:
- 27 285:5 [Chairperson-Treasurer] Chairperson; Quorum.
 - I. The commission shall elect one of its members to serve as [ehairperson-treasurer] chairperson.
- 30 II. [Two] A majority of members of the commission appointed by the governor and 31 council shall constitute a quorum.
- 32 6 Boxing and Wrestling Commission; Compensation. Amend RSA 285:6 to read as follows:
 - 285:6 Compensation. The members of the commission shall receive \$100 a day while performing duties for the commission, provided such activities are authorized by the office of professional licensure and certification. Members shall also receive mileage at the rate of state employees when attending meetings of the commission or performing duties for the commission.

 - 8 New Subparagraph; Office of Professional Licensure and Certification; Division of Licensing and Board Administration and Division of Enforcement. Amend RSA 310-A:1-a, I by inserting after subparagraph (ss) the following new subparagraph:
 - (tt) Boxing and wrestling commission under RSA 285.

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- 9 Board of Foresters; Members. Amend RSA 310-A:100, III to read as follows:
- III. Members shall be appointed for 5-year terms, except that no more than [ene] 2 appointed member's term may expire in any one calendar year. Appointments for terms of less than 5 years may be made in order to comply with this limitation. No appointed member shall be eligible to serve more than 2 full consecutive terms, provided that for this purpose only a period actually served which exceeds 1/2 of the 5-year term shall be deemed a full term. Upon expiration of a member's term, the member shall serve until a successor is qualified and appointed. The successor's term shall be 5 years from the date of expiration of the predecessor's appointment, regardless of the date of the successor's appointment.
