### STATEMENT OF INTENT

This bill was introduced with the title "relative to the diagnosis of post-traumatic stress disorder in state troopers." The Senate amended the bill to in its entirety for the eligibility of certain injuries or state troopers for workers' compensation coverage. An example given was a state trooper on their way to work comes across an accident scene or is the closest law enforcement to an emergency call and responds while technically off duty and is injured. Another example was an off-duty state trooper on the way to training who is injured in their cruiser in a vehicle accident. The committee felt changes needed to be made to the law allowing for coverage in these circumstances. The committee wanted the bill to better define the scope under what circumstances that the employee would be covered. The committee also felt other state employees such as Fish and Game officers, County Sheriff's officers and others should also be included. There was an attempt to amend the bill to encompass much of this but there was not consensus prior to the bill deadline. The Labor, Industrial and Rehabilitative Services Committee unanimously agreed that this bill should be Recommended for Future Legislation.

Chantell Wheeler introduced the bill on behalf of Sen. Carson. Currently workers comp does not cover the troopers while they are travelling to or from work even though they are in a state car and in uniform.

Rep. Warden: If a trooper was on his way home from work, stopped for dinner and a drink then got in an accident would they be convered?

Ms. Wheeler: Can't answer that.

Brian Ross of the NH Trooper Association testified in support of the bill. Our policies would forbid us from stopping at a restaurant an having a drink while in uniform on our way home from work. Often times while travelling to extra duty details we end up answering calls because we are closest to a scene. I am not aware of a case where any officer was not covered, but this would prevent that possibility.

Rep. Maneval: Might an officer not be in uniform while in a vehicle?

Brian Ross: Yes. Plainclothes detective

Rep. Maneval. Reading the bill it is not clear if a non-uniformed officer would be covered?

Brian Ross: They would be, because plainclothes is their uniform.

Rep. Avellani: When does duty begin?

Brian Ross: Regular duty would begin when they leave their house. Extra duty would be when they arrive at the location of the detail.

Rep. Avellani: Going to a funeral in uniform and car, would that be covered?

Brian Ross: Yes.

Rep. Avellani: How is this handled by sheriffs and local departments?

Brian Ross: Not known.

Rep. Seaworth: If called while on a detail are you covered?

Brian Ross: Yes.

Rep. Warden: Can troopers take a spouse or child in their car?

Brian Ross: Only with specific permission.

Rep. Avellani: Would you think this would cause any problem with other law enforcement?

Brian Ross: Probably not.

#### **METHODOLOGY:**

This bill expands the presumption of acute stress disorder and post-traumatic stress disorder for state troopers while operating a vehicle in their official duties. It is assumed that the intent of the added language is to either broaden or clarify the existing presumption. To the extent this bill is intended to broaden the presumptive language already in place, it is possible that there could be an indeterminable increase to workers' compensation for the state as an employer.
