# SB 383 Testimony in Support

My name is Mark Condodemetraky and I am the Government Affairs Director for the NH Land Surveyors Association. I am here to testify in favor of and offer my support for the legislation that is in front of this committee today, specifically Senate Bill 383.

Real estate is one of the main drivers of the NH economy. Surveying is an extremely important aspect, and the backbone of the real estate transaction.

Whether it is determining property boundaries and verifying title for real estate transfers, to determining areas of parcels for the levying of taxes and everything in between, surveying is a major aspect of the NH real estate economy.

This bill is incredibly important to many stakeholders in the real estate industry, from realtors, lenders, property owners and the courts. Unlicensed practice occurs often and in many cases with disastrous results that can create significant financial hardships for property owners.

This is why the violations and penalties aspect of this bill is needed. As stated previously surveying plays a significant part in the real estate economy. Due to technology and over burdening of the enforcing party, there are currently many instances where companies and individuals hold themselves out as professionals and perform or advertise work illegally. The loser in this scenario is not only the consumer and other stakeholders I mentioned, but the NH court system and budget as a whole, as it is judges that are tasked with making property and boundary decisions. As our society is becoming more confrontational, we will see our court systems overburdened with the errors of unprofessional and unlicensed work. This legislation will allow the board to hold a fair hearing and levy a monetary fine to deter this kind of work from being performed.

Several recent examples include a contractor who was setting property corners in Gilford NH. The property owner that engaged the contractor was very happy to pay a reduced price for the service. However when the neighbor thought there was an issue and hired a surveyor, the property corners, with surveying caps, were found to be set in the wrong location. The issue was resolved, however this could have created significant economic damage for both parties.

Another example is a homeowner hired a contractor to set an elevation benchmark in order to build a new home in compliance with the town floodplain ordinance. The contractor held themselves out as someone that can perform "survey quality" work. Unfortunately the elevation benchmark set was 13" lower than what was reported due to an error. The homeowners house is now out of compliance with the floodplain ordinance and there are tens of thousands of dollars in damages due to flood insurance requirements.

There are multiple companies advertising in NH on the internet stating on their website that they are "Professional Land Surveyors by state agency" When in fact they hold no licenses or credentials.

There are also multiple examples where contractors have altered existing plans that are on file in the town offices that have the potential to create major hardships.

I cannot stress how important this legislation is to the consumers and property owners of NH.

The second aspect of this legislation is the elimination of the residency requirement for initial licensure as a surveyor in NH.

As the world and our region is growing smaller, so too is the pool of candidates that are looking to enter the surveying field. There are many instances where a potential candidate for licensure may live in MA, ME or VT but practices for a firm exclusively in NH. Residency should not be a roadblock to licensure.

In fact Land Surveying is the only profession that requires residency for initial licensure. Physicians, Engineers, Attorneys, Landscape Architects and so on do not have a residency requirement.

By striking this aspect of the law we are bringing our profession in line with the other state licensing requirements and allowing the board to determine the eligibility of licensure based on experience and not residency.

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT

relative to land surveying services.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Violations and Penalties. Amend RSA 310-A:72 to read as follows:
- 310-A:72 Violations and Penalties.

- I. Any person who shall practice or offer to practice land surveying in this state for others without being licensed in accordance with this subdivision, or any person presenting or attempting to use as one's own the license or the seal of another, or any person who shall give any false or forged evidence of any kind to the board or to any board member in obtaining or attempting to obtain a license, or any person who shall falsely impersonate any other licensee of like or different name, or any person who shall attempt to use an expired or non-existent or revoked license or authorization, or any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this subdivision shall be guilty of a class B misdemeanor if a natural person, or guilty of a felony if a business organization.
- II. In addition to the criminal penalties in paragraph I, any person who practices, offers to practice, attempts to practice, or holds himself or herself out to practice as a professional land surveyor or surveyor intern without being licensed or exempt under this section shall, in addition to any other penalty provided by law, pay a civil penalty to the board in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 for each offense, as determined by the board. The civil penalty shall be assessed by the board after a hearing is held in accordance with this subdivision regarding the provision of a hearing for the discipline of a licensee. The civil penalty shall be paid within 60 days after the effective date of the order imposing the civil penalty. The order shall constitute a final judgment and may be filed and executed in the same manner as any judgment from any court of record.
  - III. The board may investigate any actual, alleged, or suspected unlicensed activity.
- 2 New Section; Nonresident Licensure. Amend RSA 310-A by inserting after section 63 the following new section:
- 310-A:63-a Nonresident Licensure. The board may, upon application and payment of the required fee, issue a license as a licensed land surveyor to any person of any state, territory, or possession of the United States or of any country provided that:
- I. The applicant is registered or licensed in another state, territory, possession or country whose requirements are equal to, or greater than, the requirements of this state, and is in good standing with the registering or licensing body, or;
  - II. The applicant has met the requirements for licensure as set forth in RSA 310-A:63, I-II.
- 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2023.
