Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

Licensed Nursing Assistant; Licensure by Alternate Experience. Amend RSA 326-B:21-a, I I(a) to read as follows:

3 I. A current or former military service member who has been assigned [a-military 4 occupational specialty (MOS) code of 68W (Army) or 4NOX1 (Air Force), with or without additional 5 skill identifiers, and who, as part of such member's service in the military, has utilized their MOS 6 within the last-3 years] an enlisted occupational skill in any of the Department of Defense 7 branches, including Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard, or others, qualifying the 8 member to serve as a medical assistant primarily responsible for providing emergency 9 medical treatment at the point of care, limited primary care, and health protection and 10 evacuation from a point of injury or illness, shall be deemed to have taken a board-approved nursing assistant course and may apply for a license as a nursing assistant in New Hampshire. For 11 12 purposes of this paragraph "occupational skill" shall include Army 68W, Air Force 4N0X1, 13Navy hospital corpsman HM, Coast Guard health services technician HS, or equivalents as 14 implemented by the Department of Defense. Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

A current or former military service member who has been assigned [a military 4 occupational-specialty (MOS) code of 68W (Army) or 4N0X1 (Air Force), with or without additional 5 skill-identifiers, and who, as part of such member's service in the military, has utilized their MOS 6 within the last 3 years] an enlisted occupational skill in any of the Department of Defense 7 branches, including Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard, or others, qualifying the 8 member to serve as a medical assistant primarily responsible for providing emergency 9 medical treatment at the point of care, limited primary care, and health protection and evacuation from a point of injury or illness, shall be deemed to have taken a board-approved 10 11 nursing assistant course and may apply for a license as a nursing assistant in New Hampshire. - This bill does not change any requirements but does add that experience from additional military branches is to be considered when military members apply for LNA licensure.
