Bill Analysis: This bill clarifies that the executive director of the office of professional licensure and certification shall issue licenses pursuant to RSA 541-A:29-a only if applications for such licenses otherwise meet the requirements for licensure.

Summary of testimony presented in support: Rep. McGuire:

- Rep. McGuire explained that this bill clarifies an omission in current statute.
- Currently, if an application is not acted upon by the board by the deadline, the Executive Director shall issue the license. This is great if the applicant is worthy, but the Executive Director found that some applicants were unqualified.
- This bill states that the Executive Director shall look at the application and approve it if the qualifications are met.
- The House opposition to the bill included the idea that if the boards cannot meet in time, there will be no licensing in that profession.

Senator Carson asked if a bill heard earlier today regarding recreational therapists will help with the issues raised in this bill.

Rep. McGuire stated this will help all boards that can't or don't meet.

Joe Shoemaker, Office of Professional Licensure and Certification

- Offered a scenario where some boards only meet quarterly by statute. The 60 day window requirement resulted in the unintended consequences.
- This bill closes this loophole for unqualified applicants.

Dear Hon. Chair Carson:

The Office of Professional Licensure & Certification ("OPLC") wishes to express its support of HB 1059, clarifying that OPLC is not statutorily required to issue licenses under RSA 541-A:29-a to those applicants who do not meet the requirements for licensure.

At present, several OPLC boards currently lack a quorum, despite extensive efforts to find qualified individuals to serve. Many of these boards have not delegated to OPLC the authority to issue licenses to those who qualify for such licenses. Additionally, OPLC is not permitted to deny a license to any individual. The only statutory authority for OPLC to issue licenses to individuals applying for licensure to a board that lacks a quorum is RSA 541-A:29-a.

There are certain time limits a board must adhere to in processing license applications. RSA 541-A:29, Agency Action on Applications, requires an agency to respond to an application within 30 days of receiving the application and notify the applicant "of any apparent errors or omissions, request any additional information," if applicable. Within 60 days of receiving the applicant's response to a request for information, the agency shall act on the application. Under RSA 541-A:29-a, if the board fails to take action on the application, "the application . . . shall be deemed approved . . ."

Accordingly, when a board lacks a quorum and an individual files an application with the board, licenses may not be issued until 60 days have passed, at which point license applications are deemed granted automatically by operation of law. This is true, regardless of whether the applicant meets the requirements for licensure.

As an example, current respiratory care applicants applying for licensure must wait 60 days to be approved, as the board lacks a quorum. As OPLC does not have statutory authority to deny applications for licensure, licenses are issued to individuals after 60 days by operation of law, without regard to application requirements. OPLC has grave concerns that this scenario harms the public in two ways: 1) First, 60 days is too long to adjudicate an application, particularly for those professionals that are desperately needed to meet the State's healthcare workforce needs; and 2) an unqualified individual could harm the public by performing services he or she is not qualified to perform.

HB 1059 proposes to permit the OPLC to deny a licensure application that would otherwise be granted by operation of law, if the applicant is not qualified according to the requirements established in statute or rule.

This bill closes the loop-hole that allows potentially unqualified applicants from becoming licensed by default if the licensing board is unable to meet and review the application.
