#### Summary of testimony presented in support:

#### Representative Torosian

- This bill ensures that New Hampshire's vote count machines will never be connected to the internet.
- He has received many emails regarding voter integrity and the concern of hacking.
- The language in this bill states that municipalities can never connect vote count devices to the internet.
- This will prevent hackers from interfering with NH elections.
- It is a small step towards bringing back confidence in
- This bill is supported by both the current Secretary of State and his predecessor.
- It amends RSA 656:42 stating that no ballot counting devices shall have access to the internet.
- A lot of towns are on the verge of buying new vote count machines with improved technology.
- Senator Birdsell commented that most of the new machines will have internet capability and asked if this would limit the number of new machines available for municipalities to purchase.
  - o Rep. Torosian replied it will not because the internet connection can be disabled on all of the new machines.
- Senator Birdsell asked if this legislation would prevent them from being online just during the voting process.
  - o Rep. Torosian replied that it would prohibit the machines from being online at all.
- Senator Perkins Kwoka asked if they considered whether future devices may want to be connected to the internet with the appropriate security software.
  - o Rep. Torosian replied that did not come up in committee but if they pass this legislation it can always be amended in the future. Currently, there is no good reason for the devices to be connected. He believes this is a common sense approach to ensure that voting integrity is preserved in the state of New Hampshire.
