Strafford County District 17

- Representative Bixby said that last year's amendment on the soil health statute was appropriately put into chapter 4:31. He said that one of the first things in that chapter is that even though it is called "soil conditioners", there is no definition of a soil conditioner.
- Rep. Bixby said that there were issues that needed to be addressed, such as the lack of
 a definition for "soil conditioner" and the disregard for items labeled as organic. He
 described that as a clash of statutes and said that there may be other deviations from
 federal statute.
- Rep. Bixby said that fertilizers and soil conditioners would also be impacted since there
 is no indication of how HB 1168 would be paid for. He said that fines could be a
 disproportionate tax and must conform to SB 368.

•	Rep. Bixby said that he asked for a study committee on the issue of soil conditioners
	and Senator Watters brought up the possibility of a non-germane amendment which he
	was fine with.

Summary of testimony presented:

Senator Watters

- Senator Watters introduced amendment 1373s for HB 1168, establishing a committee to study the New Hampshire law relative to soil conditioners.
- The need for this came from the Oil Fund Disbursement Board which Senator Watters serves on. The fund goes towards cleaning up oil and gas leaks. There is a cap on the amount that can be used towards this. Construction of these tanks is expensive because steel prices have gone up 95 percent. The raise in the cap to 3,300 dollars is needed for the fund to continue to serve people. This is an existing fund so there is no appropriation.

Jennifer Marts, NHDES

- The amendment increases the reimbursement limit from 2,250 dollars to 3,300 dollars for low-income homeowners to replace their home heating oil tank. The reimbursement known as the Safe Tank Program is established in RSA 146:D which is the Oil Discharge and Cleanup Fund. The purpose of the program is to provide financial assistance to eligible low-income homeowners to replace their substandard home heating oil tanks which pose a significant risk of leaking into the environment. The current reimbursement limit of 2,250 dollars no longer covers the typical cost of replacing a home heating oil tank which has increased to an average cost of 3,300 dollars, the cost is often more than a homeowner can afford which prevents many homeowners from replacing their high-risk tanks before a leak occurs. This amendment will ensure that the program remains viable.
- NHDES supports the amendment because it makes a needed cost adjustment to the reimbursement limit to the program which is a critical spill prevention program. It will help the program to continue to protect New Hampshire's ground and drinking water.

Representative Pearl, Merrimack-District 26

 Representative Pearl spoke in support of the bill. He does not believe the House will have an issue with the amendment.

Dear Chairman Avard and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on the subject proposed amendment to HB 1168. This amendment would increase the reimbursement limit for the upgrade of home heating oil tanks for low-income homeowners from \$2,250 to \$3,300. RSA 146-D establishes the Oil Discharge and Disposal Cleanup Fund to provide financial resources for the prevention and cleanup of oil discharges.

RSA 146-D:6, III establishes the "Safetank" program to provide financial assistance to eligible low-income homeowners for the replacement of substandard heating oil tanks that pose a risk of release. The current \$2,250 ceiling was established in 2017, and no longer covers the typical cost for the replacement of a home heating oil tank. The average project cost is now approximately \$3,300, and recent time and materials invoices submitted by contractors have ranged as high as \$4,000. The resulting balance owed by the homeowner is often more than they can afford and may preclude them from upgrading a high-risk tank. Further, in some regions of the state it is becoming difficult for low-income homeowners to find contractors who are willing to do tank upgrades under the program. By adjusting the reimbursable limit to more closely reflect current market rates, HB 1168 will ensure that the Safetank program remains viable and continues preventing heating oil releases.

In summary, NHDES supports this amendment to HB 1168 because it makes a needed adjustment to the reimbursement rate for a critical spill prevention program. Passage of the bill will help to ensure that the Oil Discharge and Disposal Cleanup Fund continues to provide vital support for the protection of New Hampshire's groundwater and drinking water.

Thank you again for the opportunity to comment on the proposed amendment to HB 1168.
