**Summary of testimony presented:**

Representative Gallagher, Merrimack-District 15

- This bill ensures that in the event of a disaster, people's pets will be rescued in a satisfactory fashion. The Pet Evacuation and Transportation Safety Act was passed in the wake of Hurricane Katrina. There were a few gaps in that bill that this bill aims to correct. DHHS has the Disaster Animal Response Team which is supposed to be responsible for pet evacuations. Currently, they need their volunteers to be considered emergency workers so they may rescue pets effectively without having to worry about liability.
- Originally, the bill intended to keep pets and owners together, but the House Committee decided that that would not be appropriate in some situations such as shelters in a school during a disaster. Instead, the committee amended the bill so that disaster shelters must accept Disaster Animal Response Team Trailers so that pets can be kept nearby.

- The bill passed the House on consent and asked the committee to support the bill.

#### Representative Pearl, Merrimack-District 26

- Representative Pearl spoke in favor of the bill.
- Allowing the animal response trailers and protecting the volunteers by considering them emergency workers under RSA 21:P-41 is important..
- The House Environment and Agriculture Committee passed the bill unanimously.

#### Stacey Ober, American Kennel Club

- This bill would require any hotel or community shelter that shelters evacuated people during a declared state of emergency to allow disaster animal response team trailers or other reasonable accommodations on site. These will accommodate any companion animals belonging to evacuated people. Hurricane Katrina showed that people who are ordered to evacuate during an emergency sometimes refuse to do so if it means leaving their pets behind. New Hampshire has 4 trailers that are available in the event of an emergency.
- The bill also classifies people who volunteer to assist during an evacuation order with transporting people with their companion animals as emergency workers. This is needed because it is difficult to find volunteers because they would not be covered if they were injured while volunteering. This would ensure that those volunteers are covered.
- Senator Avard asked if hotels are already allowed to do this. Mrs. Ober stated that she believes there is a process where an agency does community outreach to find who would be interested in participating. They want to ensure that those who sign up understand that they would be expected to provide a place for the trailers on site. New Hampshire has a state plan in case of an emergency and DHHS handles the companion animal aspect. This bill slightly changes the existing statute so that volunteers will be considered emergency workers.

**RE: American Kennel Club Supports HB 1118, As Amended, Relative to Companion Animals During a Declared State of Emergency**

Dear Chair Avard and Members of the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources:

Founded in 1884, the American Kennel Club (AKC) is a recognized and trusted expert in canine health, breeding, and training. We represent over 5,000 dog clubs nationally, including 14 in New Hampshire, which represent thousands of dog owners. We advocate for the purebred dog as a family companion, advance canine health and well-being, protect the rights of dog owners, and promote the ideals of responsible dog ownership.

HB 1186 would require any hotel or community shelter that shelters evacuated persons during a declared state of emergency to allow disaster animal response trailers, or other reasonable accommodations, on site to accommodate any companion animal belonging to evacuated persons. It also recognizes any volunteer who assists in the relocation of people and their pets as an emergency worker so the Department of Health and Human Services can adequately recruit volunteers for this purpose. Currently, New Hampshire's plans in addressing the needs of evacuees *with household pets appears to be lacking*. AKC supports Representative Gallagher's initiative in raising this safety issue and understands that New Hampshire already owns four trailers capable of being deployed in these circumstances.

AKC Reunite, working in conjunction with AKC clubs, raises funds to help supply stocked mobile AKC Pet Disaster Relief Trailers, which deliver essential, nonperishable necessities to local emergency management agencies to assist in sheltering pets when and where needed. The trailers provide animal care services during the first critical hours following a disaster, before FEMA support and services are deployed. To date, 95 trailers have been deployed across the country and 12 more are on the way (according to [this map](#)).

Past experience indicates that pet owners will refuse to evacuate if leaving their companion animals in danger is their only option. After Hurricane Katrina, the United States Congress passed the "Pets Evacuation and Transportation Standards Act of 2006," which requires State and local emergency preparedness operational plans take into account the needs of individuals with household pets and service animals prior to, during, and following a major disaster or

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

emergency. In 2006, New Hampshire law required emergency shelters to also shelter service animals in accordance with RSA 21-P:37-a.

AKC encourages the committee to favorably advance HB 1186, as amended.
