AN ACT

relative to chartered public school fees and enrollment policies.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Chartered Public Schools; Admission. Amend RSA 194-B:2, III to read as follows:
- III. There shall be no application fee for pupil admission to any chartered public school, and any non-application fees to be charged to students shall not be assessed as a condition for enrollment.
- 2 New Subparagraph; Charted Public Schools; Enrollment. Amend RSA 194-B:9, I(c) by inserting after subparagraph (3) the following new subparagraph:
- (4) If a chartered public school accepts out-of-state students, preference shall be given to in-state students in determination of the chartered public school's maximum published enrollment prior to any lottery selection pursuant to this subparagraph.
 - 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Summary of testimony presented:

Representative Glenn Cordelli - Carroll, District 4

- Representative Cordelli introduced HB 1193.
- This bill is the result of working with DOE.
- The department received several, but isolated, complaints around this issue, this bill works to address those complaints.
- Complaints surrounded non-application fees being charged to students and families who wanted to enroll into a charter school.
- These fees prevented them from having the means to enroll into the charter school.
- Non-application fees to be charged to students cannot be assessed as a condition for enrollment. They do not want fees charged to folks enrolling in a

- public charter school.
- The second complaint received by DOE was for charter schools on borders of the state with neighboring states.
- Charter schools can accept out of state students.
- The issue arose due to border charter schools charging higher tuition for enrollment.
- We need to make sure there is preference given to in-state students enrolling in a charter school.
- While there is a max number of students per charter per the state, we must make sure in-state students have seats. Then, take a look at out-of-state students.
- This is about fees not being assessed as a condition of enrollment and giving preference to in-state students enrolling in a charter school.
- Senator Kahn asked Representative Cordelli about the definition of nonapplication fees.
 - o Representative Cordelli said DOE may have a better answer, he is not aware of anything already in statute related to a definition.
- Senator Kahn asked Representative Cordelli about not stating it in the affirmative as it leads to questions about what it is and what schools might find necessary for their operation.
 - o Representative Cordelli said people felt they were excessive fees, looked at as a tuition to get into a school. Those fees were not considered to be application fees, but curricular activities fees assessed to parents which prevented them from enrolling.
- Senator Kahn asked Representative Cordelli if we should be asking others about affirmative definition of what this is so we can add a definition to non-application.
 - o Representative Cordelli said DOE probably has more information on a definition.

Nate Green –Administrator, Bureau of Educational Opportunities, NH Department of Education

- Made himself available for questions.
- Senator Kahn asked Mr. Green if there is an affirmative definition of an application fee and what fees this bill is attempting to cover beyond an application fee.
 - o Mr. Green said charter schools are prohibited from charging an application fee, i.e. a fee contingent upon enrollment/to gain entrance into a charter school.
 - o Materials and supplies fees have been charged up front by charter

schools. In some cases, schools were charging this fee as a condition for enrollment, which is prohibited. This is a loophole we want to fix. We need stronger language.

- Charter schools cannot charge any fees as a condition of enrollment.
- There are fees charged on occasion by traditional public schools and chartered public schools. For example, there is no charge for a student to take an AP course at school and their grade will be placed on their transcript, however, there is a fee associated with the AP exam itself. Sometimes schools pay that fee or the student's family can. Overall, students are able to access this educational opportunity.
- It would be difficult to have a single definition for an application fee. When there is a definition, it tends to become limiting as one cannot think through all possible scenarios.
- Senator Hennessey asked Mr. Green if these fees were charged to all students or select groups.
 - o Mr. Green said the fees were charged across the board, they saw anywhere from \$800-\$1,000 in fees. They were creeping up there and becoming onerous.
 - o Some schools offered a means for parents to cover such fees through community service work, however, tying those things to enrollment gets closer to an application fee scenario.
 - O Another reason why stronger language in statute is needed is because we have federal charter school grants right now. For charter schools to access such federal money, they must show that they are not charging application fees.
 - o DOE has worked with charter schools to write internal policies to show that they don't have application fees.
- Senator Hennessey asked Mr. Green if there is a definition of non-application fee in the federal grant language that the Committee could use in this bill.
 - o Mr. Green said he does not know off the top of his head, he will look into it.
- Senator Kahn asked Mr. Green if we know what the impact of prohibiting these fees will be.
 - o Mr. Green said for the most part, DOE has been able to work with schools to create internal policies on such fees. Many schools have wanted to take advantage of federal dollars, so they chose to be better about the fees and stopped charging.
 - o DOE wants to make sure that if this incentive, i.e. federal grant dollars, goes away, the state has teeth in statute.
