## AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill modifies the definition of domicile for voting purposes, modifies forms and procedures used for voter registration, and removes the requirement that the secretary of state conduct postelection voter registration inquiries.

## In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT relative to domicile residency, voter registration, and investigation of voter verification letters.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Voters; Temporary Absence. RSA 654:2 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
654:2 Temporary Absence.
I. A domicile for voting purposes acquired by any person in any town shall not be interrupted or lost by a temporary absence therefrom with the intention of returning thereto as his or her domicile. Domicile for the purpose of voting as defined in RSA 654:1, once existing, continues to exist until another such domicile is gained. Domicile for purposes of voting is a question of fact and intention. A voter can have only one domicile for these purposes. No person shall be deemed to have lost a domicile by reason of his or her presence or absence while the voter or his or her spouse is employed in the service of the United States; nor while engaged in the navigation of the waters of the United States or of the high seas; nor while a teacher in or student of any seminary of learning; nor while confined in any public prison or other penal institution;-nor while a patient or confined for any reason in any nursing, convalescent home or hospital, old folks or old age home, or like institution or private facility.
II.(a) A person present in New Hampshire for temporary purposes shall not gain a domicile for voting purposes. A person who maintains a voting domicile where he or she came from, to which he or she intends to return to as his or her voting domicile after a temporary presence in New Hampshire, does not gain a domicile in New Hampshire regardless of the duration of his or her presence in New Hampshire.
(b) A person who has been present and residing in one town or ward in New Hampshire for 30 or fewer days is presumed to be present for temporary purposes unless that person has the intention of making the place in which the person resides his or her one place, more than any other, from which he or she engages in the domestic, social, and civil activities of participating in democratic self-government including voting, and has acted to carry out that intent.
(c) For the purposes of this chapter, temporary purposes shall include, but are not limited to, being present in New Hampshire for 30 or fewer days for the purposes of tourism, visiting family or friends, performing short-term work, or volunteering or working to influence voters in an upcoming election.

2 General Voter Registration; Voter Registration Form. Amend RSA 654:7, IV to read as follows:
IV.(a) Standard registration application forms shall be used throughout the state. The

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registration forms shall be no larger than $81 / 2$ inches by 11 inches.

- (b) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the voter registration form to be used for voter registrations, transfers, or updates other than those used within 30 days of an election or at the polling place on election day, which shall be in substantially the following form:

__ TRANSFER I am registered to vote in New Hampshire and have moved my voting domicile to a new town or ward in New Hampshire

(a) CITIZENSHIP. The supervisors of the checklist, or the town or city clerk, shall accept from the applicant any one of the following as proof of citizenship: the applicant's birth certificate, passport, naturalization papers if the applicant is a naturalized citizen, a qualified voter affidavit, a sworn statement on the voter registration form used starting 30 days before an election and on election day, or any other reasonable documentation which indicates the applicant is a United States citizen. The qualified voter affidavit shall be in the following form, and shall be retained in accordance with RSA 33-A:3-a:

Any reasonable documentation indicating the applicant will be 18 years of age or older at the next election, or, if the applicant does not have reasonable documentation in his or her possession at the place and time of voter registration, a qualified voter affidavit, which shall bè retained in accordance with RSA 33-A:3-a, or a sworn statement on the voter registration form used starting 30 days before an election and on election day.
(c) DOMICILE.

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(1) Registering more than 30 days in advance of an election.
(A) A person who possesses one of the following qualified documents identifying the applicant's name and the address claimed as domicile must present that document when applying for registration prior to election day: (i) New Hampshire driver's license or identification card issued under RSA 260:21, RSA 260:21-a, or RSA 260:21-b; (ii) New Hampshire resident vehicle registration; (iii) a picture identification issued by the United States government that contains a current address; (iv) government issued check, benefit statement, or tax document. [A persen whe poscesses such a-document, but-failed to bring it-with-the person-when seeking to-register to-vote thall be-required-to return-when-he or she-can-present one-of these-documents-or to-bring the document and register-on election-day.]
(B) A person who does not have the specific documentation as outlined in subparagraph (A) shall be entitled to present other reasonably similar documentation that would establish a domicile to include, but necessarily be limited to, documentary evidence such as an invoice or canceled mail. [-atests under penalty of woter fraud-that heor-she does-net possess any-of the qualified-douments listed-in subparagraph (A) may present Any reasenable documentation of having established a-physical presence at the-place-claimed as-domicile, having-an intent to-make that place-his-or her domicile-and having-taken a verifiable-act to carry-out that intent. The doeumentation must-establish that it is more likely than not that the applieant has a domicile and-intends to maintain that domieile, as defined in this chapter, at least until election-day in the town or ward in-which he-or-she-desires to vote. Reasonable-documentation may-include, but is not limited to evidence of:
(i)-Residency,-as-set forth in-RSA-654:1, I a, at-an-institution-of-learning at that place;
(ii)-Renting or-leasing an abode-at that place-for a-peried-of-more than-30 days, to include time directly prior to an olection-day;
(iii) Purehasing an-abode at that place;
(iv) Farolling the-applicant's-dependent-minor-child in-a-publicly-ftuded elementary or secondary sehool-whieh serves the town or ward of that place, using the address-where the registrant-resides;
(v) Listing that place-as the-persen's-physical-residence-address-on-state-0r federal tax-forms, other-government identifieation-showing the address, or-other government-forms showing the-address;
(vi) Providing the address-of that place-to the United States Post Office as the person's permanent address, provided it is not-a-postal-service-or commercial post-office box;
(vii)-Obtaining public-utility services for an indefinite period-at-that place; or
(viii) Arranging for a homeless-shelter-or-similar service-provider located in the town or ward to receive United States mail-on behalf of the individual.

(C) A person who attests under penalty of voter fraud that he or she does not possess any qualifying documentation of domicile and will not ever be able to possess any qualifying documents of domicile shall complete the domicile affidavit.
(2) [Registering within-30 days before-an election-and on election-day:]
(A) [When registering-within 30 -days-before-an-election-or on-election-day-as provided in RSA-654:7-a, if the applicant does not have in his or her possession at the polls one-of the qualified-doeuments listed-in-subparagxaph (1) or other-reasonable-documentation which-establishes that it is more likely than not that the applieant has a domieile at the addres claimed-in the town or ward in-which he or she-desires-to vete, he-or-she may-execute] If the applicant does not have reasonable documentation in his or her possession at the place and time of voter registration, a sworn statement on the general election day voter registration form, or a sworn statement on the domicile affidavit form. (B) A person registering within 30 days before an election or on election day who does not possess reasonable documentation of establishing domicile and has taken no verifiable action to carry out his or her intent to establish domicile at the address claimed on the voter registration application may nonetheless register to vote by initialing the paragraph on the registration form acknowledging that domicile may be verified. The supervisors of the checklist shall, as soon as practical following an election at which the person initials such paragraph to register and vote, attempt to verify that the person was domiciled at the address claimed on election day by means including, but not limited to:

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(i) Examining public records held by the town or city clerk, municipal assessing and planning offices, tax collector, or other municipal office that may house public records containing domicile confirmation; or
((ii) Requesting 2 or mere municipal-offieers or their agents or state tection officers-or their-agents to visit the-addrese-and-verify-that the individuat-was-domiciled-there-on election-day. In-unincorporated places that have not-organized-for the purposes of condueting elections, county officers-may be-asked to perform this function;or]
[fiii)] (ii) Referring the registrant's information to the secretary of state, who shall cause such further investigation as is warranted.
(C) Any case where supervisors are unable to verify the applicant's domicile or where evidence exists of voting fraud shall be promptly reported to the secretary of state and to the attorney general, who shall cause such further investigation as is warranted.

4 Voter Checklists; Right to Know Exemption. Amend RSA 654:31-a to read as follows:
654:31-a Right to Know Exemption. The information contained on the checklist of a town or city, specifically, the name, domicile address, mailing address, town or city, and party affiliation, if any, of registered voters, except as otherwise provided by statute, is public information subject to RSA 91-A. All other information on the voter registration form, absentee registration affidavit, qualified voter affidavits, domicile affidavits, affidavit of religious exemption, application for absentee ballot, and contact information, including but not limited to a phone number and email address, provided to the secretary of state or other election officials for the purpose of receiving information about elections shall be treated as confidential information and the records containing this information shall be exempt from the public disclosure provisions of RSA 91-A, except as provided by statutes other than RSA 91-A. Notwithstanding the foregoing, qualified voter and domicile affidavits are public records subject to RSA 91-A for the sole purpose of challenging an individual registering to vote or voting, challenging ballots to be recounted, to the extent that such ballot challenges are specifically authorized by law, or determining the accuracy of any qualified voter or domicile affidavit. Election officials and law enforcement personnel in furtherance of their official duties may access and may disclose information from the voter registration form, qualified voter and domicile affidavits, affidavits of religious exemption, absentee registration affidavits, and applications for absentee ballots, if necessary to resolve a challenge to an individual registering to vote or voting, or if necessary to investigate or prosecute election law violations or any crime. Law enforcement access and use of such records for the investigation or prosecution of crimes unrelated to election law violations shall be limited to the records of the specific individuals who are the

subject of the investigation or prosecution.
5 Election Procedure; Challenges; Affidavit. Amend RSA 659:30 to read as follows:
659:30 Affidavit. The affidavit of a challenged voter, an asserting a challenge form, a qualified voter affidavit, a voter domicile affidavit, or any other affidavit required by the election statutes may be sworn before any person authorized by law to administer oaths or before any election officer.

6 Wrongful Voting; Penalties for Voter Fraud. Amend RSA 659:34, I(a) to read as follows:
(a) When registering to vote; when obtaining an official ballot; when casting a vote by official ballot; or when applying for a photo identification card for voting purposes, purposely or knowingly makes a false material statement regarding his or her qualifications as a voter to an election officer or submits a voter registration form, an election day registration affidavit, a qualified voter affidavit, a domicile affidavit, a challenged voter affidavit, an affidavit of religious exemption, an identification card voucher, or an absentee registration affidavit containing false material information regarding his or her qualifications as a voter;

7 Repeal. The following are repealed:
I. RSA 659:34, $\mathrm{I}(\mathrm{h})$-(i), relative to penalties for voter fraud.
II. RSA 654:7, V, relative to the "verifiable action of domicile" addendum to the voter registration form.
III. 2016, 175:2, relative to Interstate Voter Registration Crosscheck Program.

8 Preservation of Absentee Voting Materials [and] Election Day Affidavits. Amend RSA 659:101 to read as follows:

659:101 Preservation of Absentee Voting Materials, [and] Election Day Affidavits, and Domicile Affidavits. The absentee ballot affidavits and application forms processed by the moderator as provided in RSA 659:50, the absentee ballots challenged and rejected as provided in RSA 659:51 and RSA 659:53, and the qualified voter affidavits and domicile affidavits as provided in RSA 654:12 and any other documentary proof of qualifications retained by the town or city clerk, the supervisors of the checklist, or other election official shall be preserved in accordance with RSA 33-A:3-a. ## METHODOLOGY:

The bill removes legislation relative to domicile requirements for elections, which was considered unconstitutional by the Supreme Count. The Department of State indicates to the extent the voter registration related forms have not already been changed to accommodate the ruling, and are required by this legislation, the Department could absorb the costs into their budget. This bill also authorizes the Department of State to join other states, the District of Columbia and U.S. territories to exchange voter registration data to keep the voter checklist up to date. The Department of State notes the estimated base cost of joining the program would be between $\$ 25,000$ and $\$ 50,000$ in Federal Help America Vote Act funds, as stated in the bill.

It is assumed any fiscal impact from this bill will not occur until FY 2023.

1 Voters; Temporary Absence. RSA 654:2 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows: 654:2 Temporary Absence.
I. A domicile for voting purposes acquired by any person in any town shall not be interrupted or lost by a temporary absence therefrom with the intention of returning thereto as his or her domicile. Domicile for the purpose of voting as defined in RSA 654:1, once existing, continues to exist until another such domicile is gained. Domicile for purposes of voting is a question of fact and intention. A voter can have only one domicile for these purposes. No person shall be deemed to have lost a domicile by reason of his or her presence or absence while the voter or his or her spouse is employed in the service of the United States; nor while engaged in the navigation of the waters of the United States or of the high seas; nor while a teacher in or student of any seminary of learning; nor while confined in any public prison or other penal institution; nor while a patient or confined for any reason in any nursing, convalescent home or hospital, old folks or old age home, or like institution or private facility.
II.(a) A person present in New Hampshire for temporary purposes shall not gain a domicile for voting purposes. A person who maintains a voting domicile where he or she came from, to which he or she intends to return to as his or her voting domicile after a temporary presence in New Hampshire, does not gain a domicile in New Hampshire regardless of the duration of his or her presence in New Hampshire.
(b) A person who has been present and residing in one town or ward in New Hampshire for 30 or fewer days is presumed to be present for temporary purposes unless that person has the intention of making the place in which the person resides his or her one place, more than any other, from which he or she engages in the domestic, social, and civil activities of participating in democratic self-government including voting, and has acted to carry out that intent.
(c) For the purposes of this chapter, temporary purposes shall include, but are not limited to, being present in New Hampshire for 30 or fewer days for the purposes of tourism, visiting family or friends, performing short-term work, or volunteering or working to influence voters in an upcoming election.

2 Voter Registration; Voter Registration Form. Amend RSA 654:7 to read as follows:
654:7 Voter Registration; Voter Registration Form.
I. Any person registering to vote shall be:

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(a) At least 18 years of age on the day of the next election; and
(b) A United States citizen; and

If an applicant is registering at the polling place on election day and is unable to provide the proof of qualifieations as required in RSA 654:12, he or she may register by completing the form in gubparagraph $I V(c)$ under oath, whieh $0 a t h$ may be witnegged by an election official or any other person, working in eonjunction with the supervisori of the checklist, who is authorized by law to administer oaths, including, but not limited to, any-justice-of the-peace or notary public; should the applicant not-otherwise have-proof of identity-and-therefore be relying-upon the-form for proof-of-identity, the-act-of-swearing-to-the-form shall constitute suffieient proof of identity-for-the-purposes of-any person administering the oath, notwithotanding any language to the contraxy-in-any laws relating to the administering of oaths for other purpeses].
IV.(a) Standard registration application forms shall be used throughout the state. The registration forms shall be no larger than $81 / 2$ inches by 11 inches. Amendments to the voter registration form may be additional pages attached to or printed on the back of the registration form.
(b) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the voter registration form to be used for voter registrations, transfers, or updates [other than those used within 30 days of an election or at the pelling place on eleetion day,] which shall be in substantially the following form:

[(viii)] (H) Arranging for a homeless shelter or similar service provider located in the town or ward to receive United States mail on behalf of the individual.

An applicant whose domicile is at an abode of another and whose name is not listed on the document offered as proof of domicile may provide a written statement from a person who is listed as owner, property manager, or tenant on the document that the applicant resides at that address, signed by that person [under penalty-of-voting fraudif false information is provided];
(I) A qualified voter affidavit, or any other reasonable documentation which indicates the applicant meets the domicile requirements.

## [(2) Registering within 30 days before an election and on election day.

(A) When registering within 30 day before an-election-or-on-eleetion day as provided in RSA 654:7-a, if the-applicant-does not have in his or her possession at the polls one-of-the qualified documents listed in subparagraph (1) or-other reaconable documentation which establishes that it is more likely than not that the applieant has-a-domieile at the addrea elaimed in the town-a ward in which he or-she desires to vote, he or she-may-execute a sworn statement on the-veter registration form used-starting 30 -days before an-election and on clection day and initial- the acknowledgment-of-domicile-avidence obligation. If-the-applicant identifies on his or her application action taken to-establish his-or her domicile, which he or she-has documentation of, he or she must agree to mail a copy of or present the doeument in person to the city or-town-clerk within 10 days, or where the town elerk's offiee is open fewer-than- 20 -hours-weelly, within 30-days. Copieg-of doeuments provided in complianee-with this subparagraph-are-exempt from-the-publie diselogure

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required by RSA 91 A. The-clerk shall-decument receipt of a copy or completion of verifieation-of $a$ document-presented-in-person and-forward-verifieation to the-supervisorg-of the ehecklist. An applicant whose voter registration is approved based on an acknowledgment- of a domicile-evidence obligation who knowingly or purposely fails-to-provide- a document-to the-city or town clerk as required by this paragraph shall be subject to the penalties of wrongful voting as established in RSA 659:34. The-supervisors of the-cheeklist shall initiate removing the-name from the-ehecklist-of any sueh person who-fails to provide proof of domieile by the-deadline by sending the person the notice required by RSA 654:44:
(B) A person registering-within 30 days-before an election-or-on election-day-whe does not possess reasonable documentation-of-establishing domicile and has-taken no-verifiable action-to-earry out his or-her intent to establish domicile at-the-addresg claimed-on the voter registration applieation may nonethelegg registex to vote by-initialing the paragraph on the registration-form acknowledging that domicile-may be verified. The supervisors-of-the checklist shall, as soon as practical following an election at which-the person initials-such paragraph to register and vote, attempt to verify that the-person was domiciled at the address claimed on-election day by means ineluding, but net limited-to:
(i) Examining publie records-held by the town-or eity clerk, mumieipal assessing and planning offices, tax-collector, or other munieipal offiee that may house public records containing domicile confirmation; or
(ii) Requesting 2 or more municipal officers-or-their agents-or-state election officerg-or their agents to-visit the address-and-verify that the-individual was-domieiled there-on election day. In unincorporated places-that have not-organized for the purpose of conducting elections, county-officers may be-asked to perform this-function; or
(iii) Referring the registrantl information to the secretary of state--whe shall cause such-further invectigation as is warranted:
(G) Any-ease where oupervisorg are unable-to verify the applieant's demieile-or where-evidence exists of-veting fraud shall-be promptly reported to the seeretary of state and-to the attorney general, who shall cause such further investigation as is warranted.]
II. The supervisors may refuse to add the name of an applicant to the checklist if he or she fails to present the evidence or an affidavit as required by this section. Without limiting the acceptance of other forms of proof of domicile or identity deemed reasonable by the supervisors:
(a) Any one of the following documents is presumptive evidence that the individual seeking to vote meets the domicile requirement, provided the document is currently valid, was issued to or in the name of the applicant, and shows the address the applicant claims as a domicile:
(1) New Hampshire driver's license.
(2) New Hampshire vehicle registration.

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(3) Armed services identification, or other photo identification issued by the United States government.
(b) Any one of the following is presumptive evidence of the identity of an applicant sufficient to satisfy the identity requirement for an official authorized by RSA 659:30 to take the oath of an applicant swearing to a qualified voter, domicile, or election day affidavit [or a sworn statement on the-voter registration form used starting 30 -days before an election and on clection day]:
(1) Photo driver's license issued by any state or the federal government.
(2) United States passport, armed services identification, or other photo identification issued by the United States government.
(3) Photo identification issued by local or state government.
(c) The presumptions established in this paragraph may be defeated by evidence establishing that it is more likely than not that the applicant is not qualified as a voter.
III. To prove the qualifications set forth in paragraphs I and II, an applicant for registration as a voter must prove his or her identity to establish that the evidence used to prove age, citizenship, and domicile relate to the applicant. A person who has in his or her immediate possession a photo identification approved for use by paragraph II must present that identification when applying for registration. A person who does not have an approved photo identification with him or her may establish identity through completion of the qualified voter affidavit, which shall be retained in accordance with RSA 33-A:3-a[, or asworn-statement on the-veter registration-form used starting 30 days before-an-election and on election day]. Residents of a nursing home or similar facility may prove their identity through verification of identity by the administrator of the facility or by his or her designee. For the purposes of this section, the application of a person whose identity has been verified by an official of a nursing home or similar facility shall be treated in the same manner as the application of a person who proved his or her identity with a photo identification.

II- a . The supervisors of the checklist and the town or city clerks may use the nonpublic information contained in the centralized voter registration database and other records, that they have access to, held by the state of New Hampshire, the town or city clerk, municipal assessing and planning offices, tax collector, or other municipal office records that contain records that confirm the identity, citizenship, age, or domicile information provided by the applicant.

III-b. The supervisors of the checklist, town or city clerk, or election day official shall take a photograph of any person who registers using a qualified voter affidavit or sworn statement on the general election day registration form. Such photograph shall be retained in the same manner as qualified voter affidavits pursuant to RSA 33-A:3-a, CXLI(e). The photograph may be used for purposes of RSA 659:13, I(c).

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IV. Any person who is applying for registration as a voter and who is currently or was previously registered to vote in a different town or ward in New Hampshire shall complete the voter registration form provided for in RSA 654:7. If the election official receiving the application confirms through the centralized voter registration database required by RSA 654:45 that the applicant is currently or was previously registered to vote in New Hampshire, the applicant shall prove identity and domicile, but shall not be required to prove his or her age or citizenship.
V.(a) The election official approving the application for registration as voter of a person who does not present an approved form of photo identification as proof of identity when registering, shall mark the voter registration form to indicate that no photo identification was presented and shall inform the person that, if he or she is a first-time election day registrant in New Hampshire, he or she will receive a letter of identity verification. The person entering the voter information into the centralized voter registration database shall determine if the person is listed in the system as having been previously registered in the town or ward reported by the applicant on the voter registration form. If the person is a new registrant who has not been previously registered anywhere in New Hampshire or if the centralized voter registration database does not confirm a previous registration claimed on the voter registration form, the election official shall cause the record created in the centralized voter registration database to indicate that the person is a new applicant in New Hampshire and that no photo identification was presented. When municipalities enter information on people who register on election day into the centralized voter registration database, to the extent practical applicants who are registering for the first time in New Hampshire and who also register without presenting an approved photo identification shall be entered first. [The-person entering the water information of election day residents into-the-centralized woter regiotration database shall eause the records to indicate-if the voter executed a sworn statement on the voter registration form used starting 30 -day-before an election and on election day.]
(b) The secretary of state shall cause a letter of identity verification to be mailed by first class mail to each voter identified at any election as a first-time election day registrant in New Hampshire who also did not verify his or her identity with an approved photo identification. The letter shall be mailed by January 10 in every odd-numbered year in the case of persons registering at a state primary or general election, or within 90 days after any other election. The secretary of state shall mark the envelope with instructions to the United States Post Office not to forward the letter and to provide address correction information. The letter shall notify the person that a person who was unable to present photo identification registered or registered and voted using his or her name and address and instruct the person to return the letter within 45 days with a written confirmation that the person registered and voted or to contact the attorney general immediately if he or she did not register and vote. Any voter under a protective order pursuant to RSA 173-B, and whose name does not appear on the checklist as provided under RSA 654:25, shall not be subject to the provisions of paragraph V. The secretary of state may establish and implement a process for the voter

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## to respond to the letter of identity verification by an electronic communication such as an email message or a text message.

(c) The secretary of state shall conduct an inquiry regarding any letters mailed pursuant to subparagraph (b) that are returned as undeliverable by the United States Post Office and those persons who were mailed letters under subparagraph (b) and have not confirmed their registration. The inquiry may include consulting with, and examining public records held by, municipal officials, which contain information relevant to a person's qualifications to vote in New Hampshire, and interviewing persons living at the address listed on the voter registration form. After such inquiry, the secretary of state shall prepare and forward to the attorney general for investigation a list of those people whose identity or eligibility to vote could not be confirmed. Upon receipt of notice from a person who receives a letter of identity verification that the person did not register and vote, or upon receipt of a referral from the secretary of state, the attorney general shall cause an investigation to be made to determine whether fraudulent registration or voting occurred.
(d) Within 90 days of each-clection, the secretary of state-shall cause a list of persons executing-sworn statements on the voter-registration form used starting 30 -days before an election and on clection-day sinee the prior election-to-be-forwarded to the attorney-general-and the division of motor vehieles. The secretary of state shall send-a-letter to each sueh person-informing him or her of a-driver' obligation-to-obtain a New Hampshire-driver's lieenoe-within 60 dayo-of-beeoming a New Hampshire resident. The-letter shall be mailed-within-60-days-after the election-except-that-if-the election is a state primaxy-election, the letter shall be-mailed-60-days after the general election,-and if the-election is a regulaxly-seheduled-munieipal election, the letter-shall be mailed by the July 1 or Jantary 1 -next following the election. The-seeretary of state-shall-mark the-envelope-with instructions to the United-States Post-Office not-to-forward-the letter and-to-provide-address correction information.
(e) The seeretary-of-state ohall conduet an inquiry regarding any letterg mailed purguant to subparagraph (d) that are returned-as-undeliverable by the-United-States Post Offiee. The inquiry-may include conoulting with, and-examining publie records-held-by, munieipal offieials, which contain information relevant to a person's-qualifications to vote in New Hampshire, and intexviewing persons-living at the addrese-listed-on-the-letters-After such inquiry, the-secretary-of state-shall prepare-and-forward to the attorney general-for-investigation a list of those people-whose eligibility to vote-could not be confirmed. The-attorney-general-shall eauce an inventigation-to be made to determine whether fiaudulent-registration-or-voting-ocurred.
(£] Upon completion of any investigation authorized under RSA 654:12, the secretary of state and the attorney general shall forward a report summarizing the results of the inquiry and investigation, respectively, to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, and the chairpersons of the appropriate house and senate standing committees with jurisdiction over election law.

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4 Voting Procedures; Obtaining a Ballot. RSA 659:13, I(c) is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
(c)(1) If the voter does not have a valid photo identification, the ballot clerk shall direct the voter to see the supervisor of the checklist.
(2) The supervisor of the checklist shall review the voter's qualifications and determine if the voter's identity can be verified. This review may include verification by the voter of nonpublic data contained in the centralized voter registration database or verification by a moderator or supervisor of the checklist, or the clerk of a town, ward, or city, or by a registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation. Other than an authorized election official, no registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation shall verify the identity of more than 2 voters in each election. Verification of identity shall be documented on a form provided by the secretary of state.
(3) If the supervisor of the checklist cannot verify the voter's identity, the supervisor of the checklist shall inform the voter that he or she may execute a challenged voter affidavit. The voter shall receive an explanatory document prepared by the secretary of state explaining the proof of identity requirements. If the voter executes a challenged voter affidavit, the ballot clerk shall mark the checklist in accordance with uniform procedures developed by the secretary of state.
(4) The person entering voter information into the centralized voter registration database shall cause the records to indicate when a voter has not presented a valid photo identification and has executed a challenged voter affidavit.

5 Voting Procedure; Obtaining a Ballot. Amend RSA 659:13, H(b) to read as follows:
(b) In addition to the forms of photo identification authorized in subparagraph (a), the identification requirements of paragraph I may be satisfied by verification of the person's identity by a moderator or supervisor of the checklist or the clerk of a town, ward, or city, or by a registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation, provided that if any person authorized to challenge a voter under RSA 659:27 objects to such verification, identifies the reason for the objection in writing, and states the specific source of the information or personal knowledge upon which the challenge of the photo identification is based, the voter shall be required to execute a challenged voter affidavit as if no verification was made. Other than an authorized election official, no registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation shall verify the identity of more than 2 voters in each election.

Amend the bill by replacing all after the enacting clause with the following:

1 Voters; Temporary Absence. RSA 654:2 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
654:2 Temporary Absence.
I. A domicile for voting purposes acquired by any person in any town shall not be interrupted or lost by a temporary absence therefrom with the intention of returning thereto as his or her domicile. Domicile for the purpose of voting as defined in RSA 654:1, once existing, continues to exist until another such domicile is gained. Domicile for purposes of voting is a question of fact and intention. A voter can have only one domicile for these purposes. No person shall be deemed to have lost a domicile by reason of his or her'presence or absence while the voter or his or her spouse is employed in the service of the United States; nor while engaged in the navigation of the waters of the United States or of the high seas; nor while a teacher in or student of any seminary of learning; nor while confined in any public prison or other penal institution; nor while a patient or confined for any reason in any nursing, convalescent home or hospital, old folks or old age home, or like institution or private facility.
II.(a) A person present in New Hampshire for temporary purposes shall not gain a domicile for voting purposes. A person who maintains a voting domicile where he or she came from, to which he or she intends to return to as his or her voting domicile after a temporary presence in New Hampshire, does not gain a domicile in New Hampshire regardless of the duration of his or her presence in Néw Hampshire.
$\therefore \quad$ ' (b) A person who has been present and residing in one town or ward in New Hampshire for 30 or fewer days is presumed to be present for temporary purposes unless that person has the intention of making the place in which the person resides his or her one place, more than any other, from which he or she engages in the domestic, social, and civil activities of participating in democratic self-government including voting, and has acted to carry out that intent.
(c) For the purposes of this chapter, temporary purposes shall include, but are not limited to, being present in New Hampshire for 30 or fewer days for the purposes of tourism, visiting family or friends, performing short-term work, or volunteering or working to influence voters in an

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upcoming election.
2 Voter Registration; Voter Registration Form. Amend RSA 654:7 to read as follows:
654:7 Voter Registration; Voter Registration Form.
I. Any person registering to vote shall be:
(a) At least 18 years of age on the day of the next election; and
(b) A United States citizen; and
(c) Domiciled in the town or city in which the applicant is registering to vote and not otherwise disqualified to vote.
II. The applicant shall be required to produce appropriate proof of qualifications as provided in RSA 654:12 and fill out the form as prescribed in paragraph IV.
III. If an applicant is unable to provide the proof of qualifications as required in RSA 654:12, he or she may register by completing the necessary affidavits, pursuant to RSA 654:12[, and eompleting the form in subparagraph IV(b), unless the porson is registering within 30 days before an election or-at the polling place on election day. If an applicant is registering at the polling placeon election day and is unable to provide the proof of qualifieations as required in PSA $654: 12$, he or she may register by eompleting the form in subparagraph IV(e) under ath, which oath may be witneosed by an-election official or any other-person, working in eonjunction with the supervisors-of the eheeklist, who is authorized by law to adminioter atho, induding, but not limited to, any justiee of the peae or notary public; should the applieant not therwise have proof of identity and therefore be relying upon the form for proof of identity, the aet of-owearing to the form shall-eonstitute suffieient proof of identity for the purposes of any, persen-administering the oath, notwithstanding any language to the contrary in any laws relating to the-adminitering of aths for other purposes].
IV.(a) Standard registration application forms shall be used throughout the state. The registration forms shall be no larger than $81 / 2$ inches by 11 inches. Amendments to the voter registration form may be additional pages attached to or printed on the back of the registration form.
(b) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the voter registration form to be used for voter registrations, transfers, or updates [0ther than those used-within 30-days of an election or polling place on day, which shall be in substantially the following form:

In-aceordance-with-RSA-659:34-a voting in-more than one state in the same election is a class B felony with a maximum sentence of imprisenment not to exeeed 7 years-and a fine not to exeed $\$ 4,000$.
V. The seeretary of state shall prepare and distribute-an-addendum to the voter registration form used under subparagraph IV(e) to be-distributed to these registrants whe register within 30 days before the election-or-on election day and who do-not provide-proof-of domicile-or-a-verifiable action to demonstrate-domicile. The secretary of state shall prescribe an amendment to the voter registration based on the following:
(1) The secretary state may collect additional voluntary information to assist in the location of the voter after the election, if necessary. Such additional information may include, but is not limited to: phone numbers, email addresses, employer information, social service agency information, vehicle license plate number, and state of registration, social media account information, or a relative or friend's name and address.

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(2) Document voter verification by an authorized election official or by a registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and has valid identification documentation.

3 General Voter Registration; Determining Qualifications of Applicant. Amend RSA 654:12 to read as follows:

654:12 Determining Qualifications of Applicant.
I. [When determining the qualifieations of-an-applieant] After the applicant has proven his or her identity as required in paragraph III of this section, the supervisors of the checklist, or the town or city clerk, shall require the applicant to present proof of citizenship, age, and domicile, as provided in the following categories:

An applieant-whose-veter-registration is approved based on an acknowledgment of a domieile evidenee obligation whe knowingly-or purposely fails-to-provide-a-doument to the-city-or town elerk-as required by this paragraph shall be subject to the penalties of wrongful voting as established in RSA 659:34. The supervisors of the checklist shall initiate removing the name from the checklist of any such person who fails to provide proof of domieile by the deadline by sending the person the notiee required-by RSA-654:44.
(B) A person registering within 30 days before an election-or-on election day-whe does-net-possesg-reasonable doeumentation of establishing domieile and has taken no verifiable action to carry out his or her intent to establish domieile at the address elaimed on the veter regictration application may nonetheless register to vote by initialing the paragraph on the registration-form-acknowledging that-domieile-may-be-verified. - II. The supervisors may refuse to add the name of an applicant to the checklist if he or she fails to present the evidence or an affidavit as required by this section. Without limiting the acceptance of other forms of proof of domicile or identity deemed reasonable by the supervisors:
(a) Any one of the following documents is presumptive evidence that the individual seeking to vote meets the domicile requirement, provided the document is currently valid, was issued to or in the name of the applicant, and shows the address the applicant claims as a domicile:
(1) New Hampshire driver's license.


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(2) New Hampshire vehicle registration.
(3) Armed services identification, or other photo identification issued by the United States government.
(b) Any one of the following is presumptive evidence of the identity of an applicant sufficient to satisfy the identity requirement for an official authorized by RSA 659:30 to take the oath of an applicant swearing to a qualified voter, domicile, or election day affidavit [er a sworn statement on the voter registration form used starting 30 -days-before-an-eleetion and on eleetion day]:
(1) Photo driver's license issued by any state or the federal government.

(3) Photo identification issued by local or state government.
(c) The presumptions established in this paragraph may be defeated by evidence establishing that it is more likely than not that the applicant is not qualified as a voter.
III. To prove the qualifications set forth in paragraphs I and II, an applicant for registration as a voter must prove his or her identity to establish that the evidence used to prove age, citizenship, and domicile relate to the applicant. A person who has in his or her immediate possession a photo identification approved for use by paragraph II-must present that identification when applying for registration. A person who does not have an approved photo identification with him or her may establish identity through completion of the qualified voter affidavit, which shall be retained in accordance with RSA 33-A:3-a[-or a oworn statement on the veter registration-form used starting 30 days before-an-election and on election day]. Residents of a nursing home or similar facility may prove their identity through verification of identity by the administrator of the facility or by his or her designee. For the purposes of this section, the application of a person whose identity has been verified by an official of a nursing home or similar facility shall be treated in the same manner as the application of a person who proved his or her identity with a photo identification.

The supervisors of the checklist and the town or city clerks may use the noṇ̂ublic information contained in the centralized voter registration database and other ', records, that they have access to, held by the state of New Hampshire, the town or city clerk, municipàl assessing and planning offices, tax collector, or other municipal office records that contain records that confirm the identity, citizenship, age, or domicile information provided by the applicant.

III-b. The supervisors of the checklist, town or city clerk, or election day official shall take a photograph of any person who registers using a qualified voter affidavit or sworn statement on the general election day registration form. Such photograph shall be retained in the same manner as qualified voter affidavits pursuant to RSA 33-A:3-a, $\operatorname{CXLI}(e)$. The photograph may be used for purposes of RSA 659:13, I(c).

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IV. Any person who is applying for registration as a voter and who is currently or was previously registered to vote in a different town or ward in New Hampshire shall complete the voter registration form provided for in RSA 654:7. If the election official receiving the application confirms through the centralized voter registration database required by RSA 654:45 that the applicant is currently or was previously registered to vote in New Hampshire, the applicant shall prove identity and domicile, but shall not be required to prove his or her age or citizenship.
V.(a) The election official approving the application for registration as voter of a person who does not present an approved form of photo identification as proof of identity when registering, shall mark the voter registration form to indicate that no photo identification was presented and shall inform the person that, if he or she is a first-time election day registrant in New Hampshire, he or she will receive a letter of identity verification. The person entering the voter information into the centralized voter registration database shall determine if the person is listed in the system as having been previously registered in the town or ward reported by the applicant on the voter registration form. If the person is a new registrant who has not been previously registered anywhere in New Hampshire or if the centralized voter registration database does not confirm a previous registration claimed on the voter registration form, the election official shall cause the record created in the centralized voter registration database to indicate that the person is a new applicant in New Hampshire and that no photo identification was presented. When municipalities enter information on people who register on election day into the centralized voter registration database, to the extent practical applicants who are registering for the first time in New Hampshire and who also register without presenting an approved photo identification shall be entered first. [The person entering the voter information of election day-residents-into the centralized voter registration database shalt eause the reeords to indicate if the voter executed a sworn statement on the-voter-registration-form used-starting 30 days before an eleetion-and-on-eleetion day.]
(b): The secretary of state shall cause a letter of identity verification to be mailed by first class mail to each voter identified at any election as a first-time election day registrant in New Hampshire who also did not verify his or her identity with an approved photo identification. The letter, shall be mailed by January 10 in every odd-numbered year in the case of persons registering at a state primary or general election, or within 90 days after any other election. The secretary of state shall mark the envelope with instructions to the United States Post Office not to forward the letter and to provide address correction information. The letter shall notify the person that a person who was unable to present photo identification registered or registered and voted using his or her name and address and instruct the person to return the letter within 45 days with a written confirmation that the person registered and voted or to contact the attorney general immediately if he or she did not register and vote. Any voter under a protective order pursuant to RSA 173-B, and whose name does not appear on the checklist as provided under RSA 654:25, shall not be subject to the provisions of paragraph V. The secretary of state may establish and implement a process for the voter

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to respond to the letter of identity verification by an electronic communication such as an email message or a text message.
(c) The secretary of state shall conduct an inquiry regarding any letters mailed pursuant to subparagraph (b) that are returned as undeliverable by the United States Post Office and those persons who were mailed letters under subparagraph (b) and have not confirmed their registration. The inquiry may include consulting with, and examining public records held by, municipal officials, which contain information relevant to a person's qualifications to vote in New Hampshire, and interviewing persons living at the address listed on the voter registration form. After such inquiry, the secretary of state shall prepare and forward to the attorney general for investigation a list of those people whose identity or eligibility to vote could not be confirmed. Upon receipt of notice from a person who receives a letter of identity verification that the person did not register and vote, or upon receipt of a referral from the secretary of state, the attorney general shall cause an investigation to be made to determine whether fraudulent registration or voting occurred.
(d) [Within 90 -days of each election, the secretary-of-state-shall eause a list of persons executing sworn statements-on the voter registration form used starting 30 days-before-an eleetion and on election day since the prior-election to be forwarded to the attorney general and the division of motor-vehieles. The-secretary of state shall send a letter to each-sueh persen-informing him or her of a driver's-obligation to-obtain a New Hampshire driver's lieense within 60 days-of beeoming a New Hampshire resident. The letter shall be mailed within-60-days-after the election, exeept that if the election-is-a-state primary election, the letter shall be mailed 60 days after the general eleetion, and if the election is a regularly seheduled municipal election, the letter shall be mailed by the July 1 or January 1 next following the election. The seeretary of state-shall-mark the envelope-with instructions-to the United States Post Office not to forward the letter and to-provide-address eorrection information. .
(e) The seeretary of state shall conduct an inquiry regarding any letters mailed-pursuant to subparagraph (d) that are returned as undeliverable by the United States Post Office. The inquiry may include-consulting with, and examining public-recordo-held-by,-municipal offieials, whioh, contain information relevant to-a person's qualifieations to vote in New Hampshire, and interviewing perisons living at the addres listed on the letters. After-such-inquiry, the-secretary of state-shalliprepare and forward to the attorney general for investigation a list of those people-whose eligibility to vote could not be confirmed. The-attorney general shall cause an investigation to be made to determine whether fraudulent registration or voting-oeeurred.
( $\ddagger$ ] Upon completion of any investigation authorized under RSA 654:12, the secretary of state and the attorney general shall forward a report summarizing the results of the inquiry and investigation, respectively, to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, and the chairpersons of the appropriate house and senate standing committees with jurisdiction over election law.


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4 Voting Procedures; Obtaining a Ballot. RSA 659:13, I(c) is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
(c)(1) If the voter does not have a valid photo identification, the ballot clerk shall direct the voter to see the supervisor of the checklist.
(2) The supervisor of the checklist shall review the voter's qualifications and determine if the voter's identity can be verified. This review may include verification by the voter of nonpublic data contained in the centralized voter registration database or verification by a moderator or supervisor of the checklist, or the clerk of a town, ward, or city, or by a registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation. Other than an authorized election official, no registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation shall verify the identity of more than 2 voters in each election. Verification of identity shall be documented on a form provided by the secretary of state.
(3) If the supervisor of the checklist cannot verify the voter's identity, the supervisor of the checklist shall inform the voter that he or she may execute a challenged voter affidavit. The voter shall receive an explanatory document prepared by the secretary of state explaining the proof of identity requirements. If the voter executes a challenged voter affidavit, the ballot clerk shall mark the checklist in accordance with uniform procedures developed by the secretary of state.
(4) The person entering voter information into the centralized voter registration database shall cause the records to indicate when a voter has not presented a valid photo identification and has executêd a c̀hallenged voter affidavit.

5 Voting Procedure; Obtaining a Ballot. Amend RSA 659:13, II(b) to read as follows:
(b) In addition to the forms of photo identification authorized in subparagraph (a), the identification requirements of paragraph I may be satisfied by verification of the person's identity by a moderator or supervisor of the checklist or the clerk of a town, ward, or city, or by a registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation, provided that if any person authorized to challenge a voter under RSA 659:27 objects to such verification, identifies the reason for the objection in writing, and states the specific source of the information or personal knowledge upon which the challenge of the photo identification is based, the voter shall be required to execute a challenged voter affidavit as if no verification was made. Other than an authorized election official, no registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation shall verify the identity of more than 2 voters in each election.

6 Repeals. The following are repealed:
I. RSA 33-A:3-a, CXLI(f), relative to retention of municipal records of verifiable action of domicile.

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II. RSA 659:34, $\mathrm{I}(\mathrm{h})$ - (i), relative to certain penalties for voter fraud.
III. 2016, 175:2, relative to Interstate Voter Registration Crosscheck Program.

7 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

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## AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill amends the procedures for determining voter qualifications and voter registration, and allows an authorized election official to use nonpublic information contained in the centralized voter registration database to verify a voter's identity.

Amendment to HB 1203-FN

Amend the title of the bill by replacing it with the following:

AN ACT relative to voter registration and verification of voter identity.

Amend the bill by replacing all after the enacting clause with the following:

1 Voters; Temporary Absence. RSA 654:2 is repealed and reenacted to read as follows: 654:2 Temporary Absence.
I. A domicile for voting purposes acquired by any person in any town shall not be interrupted or lost by a temporary absence therefrom with the intention of returning thereto as his or her domicile. Domicile for the purpose of voting as defined in RSA 654:1, once existing, continues to exist until another such domicile is gained. Domicile for purposes of voting is a question of fact and intention. A voter can have only one domicile for these purposes. No person shall be deemed to have lost a domicile by reason of his or her presence or absence while the voter or his or her spouse is employed in the service of the United States; nor while engaged in the navigation of the waters of the United States or of the high seas; nor while a teacher in or student of any seminary of learning: nór while confined in any public prison or other penal institution; nor while a patient or confined for any reason in any nursing, convalescent home or hospital, old folks or old age home, or like institution or private facility.
II.(a) A person present in New Hampshire for temporary purposes shall not gain a domicile for voting purposes. A person who maintains a voting domicile where he or she came from, to which he or she intends to return to as his or her voting domicile after a temporary presence in New Hampshire, does not gain a domicile in New Hampshire regardless of the duration of his or her presence in New Hampshire.

To prove the qualifications set forth in paragraphs I and II, an applicant for registration as a voter must prove his or her identity to establish that the evidence used to prove age, citizenship. and domicile relate to the applicant. A person who has in his or her immediate possession a photo identification approved for use by paragraph II must present that identification when applying for registration. A person who does not have an approved photo identification with him or her may establish identity through completion of the qualified voter affidavit, which shall be retained in accordance with RSA 33-A:3-a[-or-a-sworn statement on the voter registration form used starting 30 days-before-an-election-and on election day]. Residents of a nursing home or similar facility may prove their identity through verification of identity by the administrator of the facility or by his or her designee. For the purposes of this section, the application of a person whose identity has been verified by an official of a nursing home or similar facility shall be treated in the same manner as the application of a person who proved his or her identity with a photo identification.

III-a. The supervisors of the checklist and the town or city clerks may use the nonpublic information contained in the centralized voter registration database and other records, that they have access to, held by the state of New Hampshire, the town or city clerk, municipal assessing and planning offices, tax collector, or other municipal office records that contain records that confirm the identity, citizenship, age, or domicile information provided by the applicant.
$I I I-b$. The supervisors of the checklist, town or city clerk, or election day official shall take a photograph of any person who registers using a qualified voter affidavit or sworn statement on the general election day registration form. Such photograph shall be retained in the same manner as qualified voter affidavits pursuant to RSA 33-A:3-a, CXLI(e). The photograph may be used for purposes of RSA 659:13, I(c).
IV. Any person who is applying for registration as a voter and who is currentiy or was previously registered to vote in a different town or ward in New Hampshire shall complete the voter registration form provided for in RSA 654:7. If the election official receiving the application confirms through the centralized voter registration database required by RSA 654:45 that the applicant is currently or was previously registered to vote in New Hampshire, the applicant shall prove identity and domicile, but shall not be required to prove his or her age or citizenship.
V.(a) The election official approving the application for registration as voter of a person who does not present an approved form of photo identification as proof of identity when registering, shall mark the voter registration form to indicate that no photo identification was presented and shall inform the person that, if he or she is a first-time election day registrant in New Hampshire, he or she will receive a letter of identity verification. The person entering the voter information into the centralized voter registration database shall determine if the person is listed in the system as having been previously registered in the town or ward reported by the applicant on the voter registration form. If the person is a new registrant who has not been previously registered anywhere in New Hampshire or if the centralized voter registration database does not confirm a previous registration claimed on the voter registration form, the election official shall cause the record created in the centralized voter registration database to indicate that the person is a new applicant in New Hampshire and that no photo identification was presented. When municipalities enter information on people who register on election day into the centralized voter registration database, to the extent practical applicants who are registering for the first time in New Hampshire and who also register without presenting an approved photo identification shall be entered first. [The-person-entering the voter-information-of-election-day residents-into-the-centralized-veter registration database-shall cause the records to indicate if the voter evecuted a sworn statement on the-voter-registration-form used starting 30 days before-an-election and-on-election-day.]
(b) The secretary of state shall cause a letter of identity verification to be mailed by first class mail to each voter identified at any election as a first-time election day registrant in New Hampshire who also did not verify his or her identity with an approved photo identification. The letter shall be mailed by January 10 in every odd-numbered year in the case of persons registering at a state primary or general election, or within 90 days after any other election. The secretary of state shall mark the envelope with instructions to the United States Post Office not to forward the letter and to provide address correction information. The letter shall notify the person that a person who was unable to present photo identification registered or registered and voted using his or her name and address and instruct the person to return the letter within 45 days with a written confirmation that the person registered and voted or to contact the attorney general immediately if he or she did not register and vote. Any voter under a protective order pursuant to RSA 173-B, and whose name does not appear on the checklist as provided under RSA 654:25, shall not be subject to the provisions of paragraph V. The secretary of state may establish and implement a process for the voter
to respond to the letter of identity verification by an electronic communication such as an email message or a text message.
(c) The secretary of state shall conduct an inquiry regarding any letters mailed pursuant to subparagraph (b) that are returned as undeliverable by the United States Post Office and those persons who were mailed letters under subparagraph (b) and have not confirmed their registration. The inquiry may include consulting with, and examining public records held by, municipal officials, which contain information relevant to a person's qualifications to vote in New Hampshire, and interviewing persons living at the address listed on the voter registration form. After such inquiry, the secretary of state shall prepare and forward to the attorney general for investigation a list of those people whose identity or eligibility to vote could not be confirmed. Upon receipt of notice from a person who receives a letter of identity verification that the person did not register and vote, or upon receipt of a referral from the secretary of state, the attorney general shall cause an investigation to be made to determine whether fraudulent registration or voting occurred.
(d) [Within 90 -days of-each-election, the secretary of state shall cause a-list-of-persons executing sworn statements-on the-vater-registration form-used-starting 30 days before-an-election and on election day since the prior election to be forwarded to the attorney-general-and the-division of motor vehicles. The secretary of state chall send a letter to each-such-person-informing-him-or her of-a-driver's obligation to obtain a New Hampshire-driver's license within-60-days-of becoming a New Hampshire-resident.-The-letter-shall-be-mailed-within-60-days-after-the election, exeept that if the election-is a-state primary-election, the letter-shall be mailed-60-days-after-the-general election-and if the-election-is-a-regularly-scheduled-municipal-election,-the-letter-shall-be-mailed by the duly 1 or Jantary 1 next following the election. The seeretary of state shall mark the envelope-with instructions to the United-States-Post-Office-not-to-forward-the letter and to provide-address eorrection information.
(e) The-secretary-of-state-shall-conduct an-inquiry-regarding any letters-mailed purstant to subparagraph (d) that are returned as undeliverable by the United-States-Post-Office.-The inquiry-may-include-consulting-with-and-examining-public-records-held-by, municipal-officials, which contain information relevant to a percon's qualifications to vote-in Now-Hampshire,-and interviewing persons living at the address listed on the-letters. After-such inquiry, the-secretary of state-shall prepare-and-forward-to the-attorney-general for investigation-a list of these people-whose eligibility to rote could not be confirmed. The attorney-general-shall-cause-an-investigation-to be made to determine whether-fraudulent registration or voting oceurred.
$(f)]$ Upon completion of any investigation authorized under RSA 654:12, the secretary of state and the attorney general shall forward a report summarizing the results of the inquiry and investigation, respectively, to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, and the chairpersons of the appropriate house and senate standing committees with jurisdiction over election law.

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4 Voting Procedures; Obtaining a Ballot. RSA 659:13, I(c) is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
(c)(1) If the voter does not have a valid photo identification, the ballot clerk shall direct the voter to see the supervisor of the checklist.
(2) The supervisor of the checklist shall review the voter's qualifications and determine if the voter's identity can be verified. This review may include verification by the voter of nonpublic data contained in the centralized voter registration database or verification by a moderator or supervisor of the checklist, or the clerk of a town, ward, or city, or by a registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation. Other than an authorized election official, no registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation shall verify the identity of more than 2 voters in each election. Verification of identity shall be documented on a form provided by the secretary of state.
(3) If the supervisor of the checklist cannot verify the voter's identity, the supervisor of the checklist shall inform the voter that he or she may execute a challenged voter affidavit. The voter shall receive an explanatory document prepared by the secretary of state explaining the proof of identity requirements. If the voter executes a challenged voter affidavit, the ballot clerk shall mark the checklist in accordance with uniform procedures developed by the secretary of state.
(4) The person entering voter information into the centralized voter registration database shall cause the records to indicate when a voter has not presented a valid photo identification and has executed a challenged voter affidavit.

5 Voting Procedure; Obtaining a Ballot. Amend RSA 659:13, II(b) to read as follows:
(b) In addition to the forms of photo identification authorized in subparagraph (a), the identification requirements of paragraph I may be satisfied by verification of the person's identity by a moderator or supervisor of the checklist or the clerk of a town, ward, or city, or by a registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation, provided that if any person authorized to challenge a voter under RSA 659:27 objects to such verification, identifies the reason for the objection in writing, and states the specific source of the information or personal knowledge upon which the challenge of the photo identification is based, the voter shall be required to execute a challenged voter affidavit as if no verification was made. Other than an authorized election official, no registered voter whose name was on the checklist at the opening of the polls and who possesses valid identification documentation shall verify the identity of more than 2 voters in each election.

6 Repeals. The following are repealed:
I. RSA 33-A:3-a, CXLI(f), relative to retention of municipal records of verifiable action of domicile.

## Summary of testimony presented in support:

## Representative Barbara Griffin

- This bill was presented to them as taking SB 3 provisions out of the law and putting the statutes back to the way they were before it.
- The need to do that had become apparent as they heard testimony in committee.
- There were places in statute that SB 3 had not been rescinded which caused confusion.
- The majority of the House Election Law Committee believed that the original bill did more than just removing the SB 3 provisions.
- It added language like "indefinite future,"
- It added a new provision stating that "a person's domicile for voting purposes shall not be conclusive of a person's residence for any other legal purpose."
- This was far outside the bounds of what was SB 3 and contrary to the Supreme Court's advisory opinion in what was HB 1264.
- There were provisions in the original bill regarding the interstate voter crosscheck program.
- There were many provisions throughout the bill that were not related to SB 3.
- In recognition of the fact that SB 3 language needs to come out of the books and that HB 1264 is now codified they drafted an amendment.
- The amendment eliminates the domicile voter affidavit which was the 1203 form.
- It kept some provisions of 1203 in that it has a form to use 30 days before the election.
- When you register you need to bring proofs of domicile, it you don't have those proofs you are asked to go get them.
- When it is closer to the election the affidavit form can be used to prove domicile.
- Senator Perkins Kwoka asked if she is anticipating any further changes to this version. On page nine, lines 6 , and 7 it references that a person "will not ever be able to provide proof."
- Rep. Griffin replied that was to address the issue of someone who does not have a permanent domicile, for instance, someone who lives in a homeless shelter.
- Senator Soucy asked why it says "will not ever" because they may someday.
- Rep. Griffin replied that it only refers to that address during that election.
- Senator Gray commented that there was an amendment drafted to SB 418 that dealt with a lot of these issues and asked if she and some others could take a look at that amendment and see if it could be incorporated here.
- Rep. Griffin replied that she would be happy to.


## David Scanlan - Secretary of State

- He agrees with the amended version of HB 1203 which removes the language of SB 3, which the court found unconstitutional, from statutes.


## Summary of testimony presented in opposition:

## Representative Paul Bergeron

- He agrees that the language on page 9 , lines $5-7$ is problematic.
- He gave a story about a woman who moved in with her new husband in Nashua and all the bills were in his name.
- She had no proof of domicile yet when she came to register to vote.
- They were able to register her because they had just issued her marriage license and the Nashua address was on it.
- With the language on page 9 of this bill, they would not have been able to register her because she could not swear that she would not ever have any proof of domicile.
- He also has concerns about the two tiered registration system that exists in HB 1203 as amended.
- The supreme court stated that there was no need for the two tiered registration system.
- There is one form for someone who is registering more than 30 days from the election and one form that is for someone registering within 30 days of the election.
- On the first form (more than 30 days) page 3 , line 18 of the form, it says "if registering on election day" but this form cannot be use on election day.
- On the form to be used within 30 days, page 5, lines 5-7, this language makes it hard to register. a homeless person or a person in a nursing home that would have to sign to say that they will be at that address forever.
- Someone should not be forced to sign a statement saying that they intend to stay there indefinitely.
- Senator Gray stated that RSA 654:1 is the paragraph that they look at for domicile and it does have words that say your domicile is that place more than any other that you intend to stay and asked how does that language differ from what he sees in this bill.
- Rep. Bergeron replied that he would suggest using the words that are in the statute and not add new ones that cause confusion. For consistencies sake use "more than any other."


## Alvin See

- Any person should have their domicile be for all purposes of life.
- There should not be a distinction between voting and any other purposes.
- That is not to stop anyone from changing their domicile whenever they need to.


## Michael O’Brien - America Votes

- He agrees with the concerns that Representative Bergeron raised.
- He believes that if they can fix the words in those two sections it would alleviate some of the problems.
- Senator Soucy asked if he would agree that using the existing language in $654: 1$ might clarify and be more consistent.
- Mr. O'Brien replied that yes that is a good suggestion to keep it consistent and less confusing for voters.

# Testimony Against HB 1203 (as Amended by the House) 

Rep. Timothy Horrigan (Strafford 6); April 4, 2022

Amendment \#2022-0962h to HB 1203 is so poorly drafted, it is hard to tell exactly what it does- even though I have re-read its convoluted language many times. But I was still able to discern that it does nothing that the underlying bill was intended to do. In fact, in fact it does pretty much the exact opposite of what $I$ and the other sponsors intended.

The original version of HB 1203 was an exact repeat, aside from the effective date, of HB 538 (2021) which was one of many 2021 bills which were voted Inexpedient to Legislate in committee but never made it to the floor. HB 538 (2021) was in turn a combination of HB 105 (2019) and HB 106 (2019) which were both vetoed by Governor Sununu in 2019.

The basic aim of my bill as introduced was to put the voter-registration law back the way it was before 2017. It would have undone HB 1264 (2018) and, more importantly, it would have undone SB 3 (2017). SB 3 created an entirely new set of voter-registration forms which were complicated and contradictory. Moreover, after several years of both state and federal litigation, SB 3 was overturned by the NH Supreme Court in 2021, on the grounds that it interfered with citizens' right to vote.

SB 3 didn't just effect students' right to vote, but student voting is of special concern to me because I live in Durham, which is a college town. I think student voting is a good thing, but the controversy over student voting isn't about me. It's about the right to vote: everyone's right to vote. The federal and state constitutions both clearly state, as does federal voting law, that US citizens have the right to vote where they live.

If you are over the age of 18 , and if you are a US citizen, then you have the right to vote in the community where you live. It doesn't matter why you moved there. It doesn't matter how long ago you moved there. And it certainly doesn't matter where your parents live or vote. This is true even if you recently moved to New Hampshire and still have family living somewhere else.

Article 11 Part 1 of our state constitution states (in part):
All elections are to be free, and every inhabitant of the state of 18 years of age and upwards shall have an equal right to vote in any election. Every person shall be considered an inhabitant for the purposes of voting in the town, ward, or unincorporated place where he has his domicile.

That means, if you live here, you can vote here. Period.
HB 1203 as introduced protects your right to vote. As amended by the NH House, it does not. Please restore HB 1203 to its original form, or failing that, please kill it altogether.

## Granite State Taxpayers Opposes HB 1203

This bill modifies the definition of domicile for voting purposes and restores language removed from the law in 2018, 370 (HB 1264).

HB1203 has the intent to authorize voting in NH by out of state residents.
HB 203 is a reprise of previous efforts (HB 538, HB 106, HB 1279, HB 1653) to repeal HB 1264 and award voting rights in New Hampshire to residents of other states.

New Hampshire was unique in the country in allowing people to vote who are residents of other states. HB 1264 defined residency to close a loophole allowing residents of other states to vote here. GST supported HB1264, so we obviously oppose HB 1203, as we did its predecessors.

The Secretary of State reported that, in 2016, 6,540 people used an out of state driver's license to register to vote in New Hampshire. Of that total, 491 used an out of state driver's license to change registration from one town to another town within New Hampshire While an out of state driver's license provides proof of identity, it also proves residency in another state.

HB1264 complied with the United States Supreme Court decision in DUNN v.BLUMSTEIN, March 21, 1972, which stated: "We have in the past noted approvingly that the States have the power to require that voters be bona fide residents of the relevant political subdivision."

On July 12, 2018, a NH Supreme Court Opinion on whether New Hampshire should continue to allow residents of other states to vote in New Hampshire, stated "not only does New Hampshire have no such constitutional obligation but, quite the contrary, it has a compelling state interest not to do so." Subsequently, a US District Court agreed.

Requiring residency, and providing proof thereof, is the expectation in 49 other states and the District of Columbia. Of those, 47 states and the District of Columbia require proof of duration of actual residency before being able to vote. Of those jurisdictions, 27 require 30 days residency.

With all of that background and court decisions, it's difficult to understand how some members of the New Hampshire General Court remain so committed to giving residents of other states a right to vote here. They apparently believe they gain electoral advantage from such voters.

For these reasons, Granite State Taxpayers opposes House Bill 1203.

## Granite State Taxpayers recommends a vote AGAINST HB 1203.
