**Summary of testimony presented in support:**

**Representative Erica Layon**

**Rockingham County District 6**

- Representative Layon introduced HB 1488 on behalf of Representative Andrew Prout.
- Rep. Layon said that in the House process, the Department of Health and Human Services did not oppose HB 1488 and the bill passed the House on the consent calendar.
- Rep. Layon said that HB 1488 expands the nondiscrimination statute as it relates to the immunization registry.
- Rep. Layon said that although RSA 141-C:20-f says that health care providers shall not discriminate solely based on an individual's choice not to participate, Paragraph IV permits a larger list of entities than just health care providers to access immunization

registry data, including schools, day cares, etc. She said that those entities could use that information to know who opted out of the registry and discriminate against them.

- Rep. Layon said that because those other groups could discriminate based on vaccine registry information, HB 1488 is a simple fix. She said that HB 1488 expands RSA 141-C:20-f to say that no health care provider or any entity in Paragraph IV shall discriminate.
- Rep. Layon said that HB 1488 is a clean up bill that makes it clear that if an entity can access the immunization registry, then they cannot use the fact that someone opted out of the registry to discriminate.
