This bill requires the attorney general to include the drug forfeiture fund in an annual report.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Two

AN ACT

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relative to the drug forfeiture fund.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Drug Forfeiture Fund. Amend RSA 318-B:17-c, II-III to read as follows:
- II. Law enforcement agencies may apply to the department of justice for grants from the forfeiture fund. Such grants shall be utilized exclusively for meeting expenses associated with drug related investigations. The attorney general shall report 60 days after the close of each fiscal year to the governor and council and to the fiscal committee of the general court a detailed accounting of the grants provided to law enforcement agencies under this paragraph by agency, including the department of safety, and the amount forwarded to the department of health and human services, bureau of drug and alcohol services, for the preceding fiscal year. [The attorney general's report shall also include a detailed accounting of the costs of investigations, enforcement programs, and prosecutions paid under paragraph I.]
- III. The attorney general shall report the receipts, expenditures, and balances and all other reporting elements of the drug forfeiture fund in the report on forfeiture activity required by RSA 617:12. The attorney general may exclude any information which would reveal the identity of an informant or compromise an ongoing investigation.
 - IV. The attorney general [shall] may adopt rules, pursuant to RSA 541-A, relative to:
 - (a) The administration of the drug forfeiture fund.
 - (b) The grant application procedures and forms to be used by law enforcement agencies.
 - 2 Report; Forfeitures of Personal Property. Amend RSA 617:12, I to read as follows:
- I. The attorney general, no later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year, shall post a report on the department of justice website detailing state forfeiture activity, for the preceding fiscal year, including the type, approximate value, and disposition of [the] each property seized, and the amount of any proceeds received or expended at the state and local levels. The report shall provide a categorized accounting of all proceeds expended. [Summary] Data on seizures, forfeitures, and expenditures of forfeiture proceeds shall be provided by the law enforcement agency in disaggregated form to the attorney general.
 - 3 Repeal. RSA 318-B:17-f, relative to forfeiture reports, is repealed.
- 4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Representative Sylvia (provided written testimony)

- In 2018 through SB498, the Legislature sought to create transparency regarding seizures in NH.
- In seeking information regarding due process rights, often told there is no problem, but it is difficult to evaluate an issue if there is little data.
- This bill will deliver the necessary data that has been kept from public view.
- In 2020, visited the Department of Justice website after SB498 was law. Expected to find the reports ordered under RSA 617:12 but found nothing on the website.
- Contacted the DOJ and was directed to the report produced under RSA 318-B:17-c, III.
- That report provides information about the status of the drug forfeiture funds, not the information required by RSA 617:12.
- Made another request for the proper report, but there was no reply.
- This bill consolidates reporting under RSA 617:12 adding a pointer in RSA 318-B:17-c, III and removes a duplication in reporting by repealing RSA 318-B:17-f.
- This bill will give the public the transparency required by law.

Ross Connolly (Americans for Prosperity)

- This bill just provides more transparency in the details of how forfeitures are gained and dived out across the State.
- This makes it a little clearer about what is to be provided, specifically adding the work 'each' on line 21 instead of 'the'.
- This will provide more detail regarding each property without divulging sensitive information like informants.
- This will increase transparency for the public and for the Legislature.
- NH does not have a strong record in transparency, but this bill will be a slight step forward in improving that.

Kathy Sanchez (Institute of Justice)

- The Institute collects a lot of forfeiture data and records.
- This bill is focused on the exact areas that need improvement.
- The Attorney General has not complied with the law.
- The specific amendments in this bill are very tailored to the issues.
- The Attorney General is currently reporting only on monies.
- This bill reinforces the requirements of reporting that are less about the money and more about what happened to the property itself.
- This will help answer questions about the efficacy of forfeiture and what was seized or forfeited, and it will provide more detail for the public and the General Court about whether this is working.

Chairwoman Carson and committee members,

In 2018 through an amendment made here in the senate to SB498 sought to bring transparency to seizure and forfeiture activity in New Hampshire. In seeking protections of due process rights, we are often told that there is no problem. It is difficult to evaluate an issue where there is little data available to make a proper judgment. HB1493 will deliver necessary data which has been kept from public view.

In the fall of 2020 in preparation for my 2021 bill HB331, I wanted to get supporting information for my testimony. Knowing that SB498 had been made law, I went to the DOJ website where I expected to find the reports ordered under RSA 617:12. I found nothing on the website. I contacted DOJ in an email and was directed to the report produced under RSA 318-B:17-c, II. That report provides information about the status of the drug forfeiture fund, not the information required by RSA 617:12. Another request was made for the proper report. No reply ever arrived.

HB1493 does two simple things. First it consolidates reporting under RSA 617:12, adding a pointer in RSA 318-B:17-c, III. Second, it removes what would otherwise be a duplication in reporting by repealing RSA 318-B:17-f. With these changes our constitution's directive under Part I, Article 8 will give the people of New Hampshire the transparency required by law.
