HOUSE BILL **1497-FN**

AN ACT relative to optional allowances in the retirement system.

SPONSORS: Rep. Lanzara, Hills. 28

COMMITTEE: Executive Departments and Administration

AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill clarifies the time for election of a survivorship optional allowance by members and retirees in the retirement system.

AN ACT relative to optional allowances in the retirement system.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Retirement System; Election of Optional Allowance. Amend RSA 100-A:13, I to read as
2 follows:

3 I. Any **active** member; **any member** who has reached service retirement age as provided in
4 RSA 100-A:5, I(a), or II(a), or RSA 100-A:19-b[.]; any retiree within 120 days after the [**effective**]
5 **date of the original notice** of retirement **provided by the retirement system, not to include**
6 **any future benefit adjustments that may be carried out by the retirement system relative to**
7 **a beneficiary's monthly annuity**[.]; or any retiree within 120 days after a decision by the board of
8 trustees granting the retiree disability retirement benefits pursuant to RSA 100-A:6, may elect to
9 receive, instead of the retirement allowance otherwise payable, a retirement allowance of equivalent
10 actuarial value under one of the options named in paragraph III, or to redesignate any such option
11 previously elected. When the member or retiree elects to receive an optional retirement allowance
12 under paragraph III, the beneficiary or beneficiaries whom the member or retiree nominates may
13 include the member's spouse and/or children. The notice of non-election, election, or change of
14 retirement option shall be on a form designated by the board, which, if the member or retiree is
15 married, shall include a spousal acknowledgment. The optional allowance shall be effective upon
16 retirement if the election is made before the effective date of retirement, and on the first day of the
17 month following receipt by the board of the notice of election or change of option if made during a
18 120-day grace period. When an election or change of option is made during a 120-day grace period,

*The New Hampshire Retirement System states it is not able to separate the fiscal impact of this legislation between county and local government, therefore the fiscal impact is shown together as political subdivisions.

METHODOLOGY:

This bill would allow New Hampshire Retirement System (NHRS) members to elect survivorship option allowance upon joining the retirement system with a grace period of 120 days after the original notice of retirement (not to include any future benefit adjustments that may be carried out by the retirement system relative to a beneficiary's monthly annuity). This election would only be in effect if a member is eligible for service retirement under RSA 100-A:5 and dies while in active service.

The NHRS states that in-service deaths of retirement-eligible members are rare and the fiscal impact would not be significant. However, the NHRS states the changes to the statute may entice more members to fill out a preselection form prior to service eligibility than they do under current law. Optional allowance pre-selections, may lead to an increase in actuarial liabilities, and thereby contribution rates for state and local employers, in certain cases where members die and meet the service retirement eligibility requirements at the time of death.

Bill Analysis: This bill clarifies the time for election of a survivorship optional allowance by members and retirees in the retirement system.

Who supports the bill: Rep. Goley, John McAllister and Brian Ryll (Professional Fire Fighters of NH), Arthur Beaudry (New Hampshire State Permanent Fire Fighters Retirement Association), Casey McCabe (NHRSC), Terry Donovan, Richard Gulla

Who opposes the bill: None

Who is neutral on the bill: Marty Karlon, New Hampshire Retirement System

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Rep. Goley introduced the bill.

- This bill, as amended, allows the required survivorship form for retirement pre-selection to be completed prior to the members retirement date.
- Rep. Goley reported that in his retirement experience during the COVID pandemic, by the time he got his final retirement numbers the change period had passed and he had no recourse.
- Rep. Goley suggested making the date to be 6 months after the member receives the final numbers.

John McAllister (Professional Fire Fighters of New Hampshire (PFFNH))

- Supports this bill and the testimony of Rep. Goley and Mr. Karlon.
- Mr. McAllister stated that this bill does not provide new or enhanced benefits, but is an effort to streamline the process.

Senator Reagan asked if Mr. McAllister knew the amount of the federal benefit.

Mr. McAllister said he did not know the federal benefit for corrections officers.

Senator Reagan asked about the federal benefit for safety officers.

Mr. McAllister stated the benefit is \$400,000.

Arthur Beaudry, New Hampshire State Permanent Fire Fighters Retirement Association

- Mr. Beaudry is in favor of this bill as amended and thanks the sponsors.
- The Manchester Fire Department had 2 tragic incidents of suicide.
- Under current law, the surviving spouse could lose out on half of the member benefit if the member did not make the selection.
- The untimely death of a member should not put an undue hardship on the surviving family.

Neutral Information Presented:

Marty Karlon, New Hampshire Retirement System (NHRS)

- NHRS takes no position on this bill. Mr. Karlon is here to provide background information.
- This change will allow members to pre-select an optional survivorship allowance at any point in their career.
- This bill allows members to "check it and forget it".
- There are very few in-service deaths and only a few are service retirement eligible.
- The second part of this bill was explained in Rep. Goley's earlier testimony and adjusts the post retirement grace period to change a survivor benefit optional retirement allowance to 120 days from the date of original NHRS notice of retirement.

Senator Carson asked if this issue was addressed in prior legislation.

Mr. Karlon stated that the issues in this bill are new. Prior bills in the last 3-5 years were focused on issues related to divorcing spouses and people who chose a non-spouse as a beneficiary and then wanted to change that.

Summary: “AN ACT relative to optional allowances in the retirement system.”

Analysis: “This bill clarifies the time for election of a survivorship optional allowance by members and retirees in the retirement system.”

Sponsors: Rep. Lanzara, Hills. 28

Background

Under current law, only members who are eligible for service retirement may elect a survivorship optional allowance. This bill would allow NHRS members to pre-select an optional survivorship allowance prior to reaching eligibility for service retirement. Typically, pre-selection of a survivorship allowance provides a larger lifetime benefit to a beneficiary than the statutory death benefits under RSA 100-A:8 and A-9. The optional survivorship allowance is – and would continue to be – only payable to the designated beneficiary if the member dies while in active service and is eligible for service retirement under RSA 100-A:5.

The incidence of members passing away while in active service is relatively rare, with 73 in-service deaths occurring in FY 2019, 69 in FY 2020 and 66 in FY 2021 (out of an active population of more than 48,000). Not all of these in-service deaths met the statutory criteria for providing a monthly benefit to the beneficiary. As of 6/30/2021, there were 132 beneficiaries receiving a pension benefit as a result of the in-service death of a member. As of 6/30/2015, the number was 95.

As amended, this bill also changes the time frame of the post-retirement grace period to change a survivor benefit optional retirement allowance after retirement from 120 days from the effective date of retirement to 120 days from the date of the original notice of retirement issued by the retirement system.

Financial Considerations

As compared to the number of members who pre-select a survivorship option under current law, this proposed change may entice more members to pre-select an optional survivorship allowance. This could lead to a small increase in survivorship pension benefit payments. However, because in-service deaths of retirement-eligible members are rare, the financial impact of this change is indeterminable but negligible.

The adjustment in the 120-day grace period to change a survivor benefit optional retirement allowance after retirement also has an indeterminable but negligible financial impact.

RE: Testimony in support of HB 1497-FN relative to optional allowances in the retirement system.

Dear Chairwoman Carson and Members of the Committee,

My name is Brian Ryll and I serve as the President of the Professional Fire Fighters of New Hampshire and am a Captain for the Portsmouth Fire Department. As the preeminent fire fighter organization in New Hampshire, we advocate for the health and safety of the brave men and women that protect the citizens of this great state. Part of this obligation is to ensure that a career dedicated to public service culminates in a fair retirement process for the member and their family. For this reason, I am testifying today in support of HB1497-FN relative to optional allowances in the retirement system.

HB1497-FN as amended by the NH House does two important things. First, it simplifies a paperwork issue known as pre-selection. Pre-selection is a 1-page form that members who have reached years and age of service for retirement but who choose to continue working must fill out in order to elect a maximum survivorship option for a beneficiary(ies) in the event the member dies while still in service and before they filled out their actual retirement paperwork.

The issue as the law is written currently is that this paperwork can only be filled out once a member has reached retirement service eligibility and not a day before. This creates a real-life scenario in which a member has earned their entire retirement benefit but did not fill out the paperwork immediately upon reaching age and years of service and passes away before they had a chance to do so. Therefore, their beneficiaries cannot receive the maximum survivorship option.

HB1497-FN allows members at any time to choose their pre-selection option that will only take effect once the member reaches full-service retirement eligibility. To be clear, this is not a new or enhanced benefit, it is simply a process to streamline a paperwork issue to ensure members who have earned their benefits are able to elect that their beneficiaries received a maximum survivorship option.

The second important change HB1497-FN makes is it moves the 120-day grace period to make any final changes to a member's choice of payment option of their benefit from the effective date of retirement to the final notice of retirement from the NH Retirement System. Currently, as the law stands today a member may set their retirement date, but it can take some time for the employer to complete all necessary calculations and send necessary paperwork to the NH Retirement System to calculate the member's final benefit. In certain situations, members have not received their final

benefit calculation until way beyond the 120-day grace period and therefore can no longer make changes based on their final benefit calculation. HB1497-FN moves the 120-day period to after receiving their final notice of retirement, allowing the members to fully understand what their lifetime benefit will be and make changes accordingly based on this information.

I ask this committee to move to support HB1497-FN relative to optional allowances in the retirement system
