- The bill was done at the direction of New Hampshire Fish and Game and in conjunction with the NH OHRV Association, NH Snowmobile Association, and NH Automobile Dealers Association.
- Sen. Birdsell asked if Rep. Eagan wanted the effective date to be September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025.
  - Rep. Eagan said yes. That would allow for Fish and Game to manage for transferring of their vendor in due time.

#### **Brian Labrie, Legislative Chair for NH Snowmobile Association**

- Mr. Labrie testified in support for HB 1554. NHSA has worked with snowmobile clubs to speak in support of snowmobiling.
- Mr. Labrie thanked Rep. Eagan for the bill and said that online options to renew and register would be beneficial for tourism.
- State registration agents are key components of the registration process and must be maintained.
- In neighboring states, online options had already existed for many years. Supporting online registration in New Hampshire would help make New Hampshire competitive with other states in the region.
- Tourism could suffer if individuals choose different states with easier registration options.
- Covid-19 had impacted processes, but an online registration option would be a safe way to register.
- Interacting with NH state government is very common. Fish & Game provides hunting and fishing licenses online.
- New Hampshire should adopt an online registration option.

#### **Richard Parsons, NH Off Highway Association**

- Mr. Parsons said the NH Off Highway Association is in support like the NH Automobile and Snowmobile Association.
- The bill would be good for tourism and it would be convenient for people to travel between NH, VT, and the Canadian provinces.

#### **Dan Bennett, NH Automobile Dealers Association**

- Mr. Bennett said the NH Automobile Dealer Association was in support of the bill.
- The NH Automobile Dealers Association had been strong supporters of online and in person registration.
- Sen. Sherman asked Captain Eastman if there was anything that could be done regarding online registration prior to September of 2025.
  - Captain Eastman said he didn't believe that there was a possibility for having an online option for a short period of time.

### **Testimony of Brian Labrie, Board of Directors of the New Hampshire Snowmobile Association in support of HB 1554-FN, relative to online payment of fees relating to the operation of off highway recreational vehicles and snowmobiles.**

Good afternoon, Chair Birdsell and Members of the Senate Transportation Committee. My name is Brian Labrie. I serve as the legislative chair for the New Hampshire Snowmobile Association (NHSA). I appear before the Committee today to convey NHSA's support for HB 1554. By way of background, since its founding in 1969, NHSA has worked with each of the independently incorporated local snowmobile clubs to provide a unified voice to speak for the sport of snowmobiling and to promote it as safe family recreation. The NHSA is comprised of all segments of the snowmobiling community including clubs, club members, distributors, and dealers. Today, there are 100 local clubs and 26,000 active members of NHSA.

Initially, NHSA would like to thank Representative Tim Egan for his outreach regarding the bill and his interest in helping sustain the outdoor recreation economy. NHSA has long supported an online option to initially register, or renew a registration, online. This option would supplement, but not supplant, the in person option provided at numerous registration agents across the state. The registration agents are a key portion of the registration process and must be retained. In neighboring states and provinces, this online option has existed for years and NH is currently pretty far behind the curve. The opposite side of this document provides an overview of online registration opportunities in the region.

There are several key reasons why NHSA supports moving toward an online option for registering snowmobiles:

- **Competitiveness with surrounding states and Canadian Provinces** – Snowmobilers are accustomed to traveling to various states and into Canada to enjoy the trail systems. NH should look to make it as easy as possible to properly register a snowmobile online. Otherwise, tourism will begin to suffer as consumers will not want to continue to use in-person or mail offerings currently available when surrounding states, and others throughout the country, have more convenient options.
- **Avoid COVID-19 in person restrictions** – COVID-19 has impacted many business processes in the public and private sector. Should additional unforeseen viruses create new challenges, in person or mail options will not work. If there are restrictions that inhibit existing registration agents from interacting with the public, there will be no options for individual to register their snowmobile. An online option ensures that a registration can be completed without the need for individuals to interact directly.
- **Interacting with NH State Government online is very common** – Currently, Fish and Game provides the opportunity for individuals to purchase hunting and fishing licenses online, in addition to Safe Hike Cards. The State Park Systems uses an online system to book camp sites. Recently, the Department of Revenue Administration unveiled a new online tax payment portal. The Office of Professional Licensure and Certification offers online applications/renewals for various professions. The Association believes it is time for our registration process to align with many existing processes currently in place within NH state government.

In closing, NH lags behind the region in offering this convenient option. It is time to move forward. I am glad to attempt to answer any questions you may have. Thank you.

**\*NOTE: NEW VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS. States with sales tax require new vehicles to initially be register at an agent or DMV location for tax payment or proof of payment.**

**\*NOTE TEMPORARY PLATES ARE ALLOWED FOR RESIDENTS AND NON-RESIDENTS ONLINE-** The online system allows for the issuance of a temporary plate and registration for all types of vehicles that are sold, transported and registered in Vermont. Users will enter the owner and vehicle information, the system will verify, and then the user will be asked to certify, pay a \$6 fee, and print the temporary plate and registration. Temporary plates and registrations are valid for 60 days and can be used for inspection of the vehicle if required.
