AN ACT                   relative to days of operation of state liquor stores.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

- 1           1 Sunday and Holiday Openings. Amend RSA 177:5 to read as follows:  
2           177:5 Sunday and Holiday Openings. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the  
3 commission may, in its discretion, open for business on any Sunday or legal holiday any state liquor  
4 store located on a main route where traffic is heavy[; ~~provided, however, that no state liquor store~~  
5 ~~may be opened for business at any time on Easter or Thanksgiving day, whenever appointed, and~~  
6 ~~Christmas day~~]. Although full-time employees shall be given the option of working, no such  
7 employee shall be required to work on such days. The commission may employ part-time employees,  
8 subject to the rules of the director of personnel, to staff stores open on Sundays or holidays. Any full-  
9 time employee who works on such days shall be paid 1-1/2 times the employee's regular rate of pay  
10 for the actual number of hours worked.

**METHODOLOGY:**

This bill changes the regulation on places of operation of state liquor stores and allows state liquor stores to be open on Easter.

The NH Liquor Commission provided the following information concerning the fiscal impact of this bill:

- The Commission does not operate any stores located within 200 feet of a church, chapel, or parish house. The proposed change in sections 1 and 2 of the bill would have no fiscal impact.
- Regarding the change which would allow liquor stores to operate on Easter Sunday, the Commission provided the following estimates:
  - o The total gross revenue generated on a Sunday in March or April is approximately \$1 million.
  - o In March and April of 2021, the average personnel cost for stores open on Sunday was approximately \$48,000.

Any balance remaining in the Liquor Fund after paying all expenses of the commission is deposited in the general fund.

It is assumed that any fiscal impact would occur after FY 2022.

Bill Analysis: This bill authorizes the liquor commission to open certain state liquor stores on Sundays or legal holidays.

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**Who supports the bill:** Representative Timothy Horrigan, Representative John Potucek, Representative John Hunt, Joseph Brown

**Who opposes the bill:** Representative Lisa Post

**Who is neutral on the bill:** Mark Armaganian (NHLC)

**Summary of testimony presented in support:**

***Representative Timothy Horrigan***

- If this bill were passed, liquor stores could be open any day of the year including on Easter, Christmas, and Thanksgiving. However, they do not have to be open on those days if they chose not to be.
- Representative Horrigan said he wanted the liquor stores to be profitable and serve as many consumers as possible.
- It may be helpful to restaurants or caterers that are open on the days that liquor stores are currently closed.
- In addition to serving locals, state liquor stores also serve travelers from out-of-state.
- **Senator Gannon** asked if there were a projected increase in revenue from out-of-state customers.
  - **Representative Horrigan** said the fiscal note for the original bill projected that liquor stores would make \$1 million if they were open on

Easter. He believed revenue would be more if they were open for the other two holidays; however, there could be fewer customers despite people traveling.

- **Senator Gannon** asked if staffing problems were anticipated.
  - **Representative Horrigan** said they have faced similar issues like other retailers and wholesalers. Currently, liquor stores are open 10:00am to 5:00pm every Sunday, so Representative Horrigan believed they could work out any issues that arise from this change. From his understanding, the liquor stores have a fairly content workforce.
- **Senator Gannon** asked if an employee could use a religious exemption on Easter or Christmas.
  - **Representative Horrigan** replied that he did not know, but he has heard nothing to indicate that the Commission is not one of the best employers in the state.
- **Senator Cavanaugh** said the bill states, “Although full-time employees shall be given the option of working, no such employee shall be required to work on such day. [...] Any full-time employee who works on such days shall be paid 1-1/2 times the employee's regular rate of pay...”. He hoped the Commission stuck to this promise.

#### ***Representative John Hunt***

- After a conversation between himself and the Chairman of the Liquor Commission, they realized the original bill just needed to have all of the holidays removed from it.
- Representative Hunt said this bill would simply reaffirm the policy of the Commission that volunteers are needed to work on holidays. If no employee would like to work, then a store would remain closed.
- **Senator Bradley** asked if the Chairman indicated which stores, particularly if ones on highways, are likely to take advantage of this change.
  - **Representative Hunt** replied obviously. In existing statute, stores can be open if they are located near high traffic roads or highways. Representative Hunt said this provision would not be changed by this bill. In their conversation, Representative Hunt said they did not want to forget the I-95 corridor where people from Maine share their money with NH.
