Summary of testimony presented:

Representative Timothy Lang – Belknap, District 4

• This bill has had a five-year path and went through a study committee.

• He was on the study committee which looked at having unified sports in our school systems and what the hindrances were to provide unified sports programs in our schools.

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- The first-year costs associated with the creation of these programs was the main issue in getting them started.
- The most traditional type of unified programs are sports programs.
- He found that we don't have just those types of programs in NH.
- On the Seacoast, they have a theatre type unified program.
- In looking at those startup costs, they put together this grant program.
- Through this third iteration of the grant program, they have solved the mechanical defects that were in the bill.
- The grant program is an ongoing expenditure of \$50,000 to the department of education.
- That funding is for one time start up equipment costs for a unified programs.
- This will allow schools to be able to buy the uniforms and sports equipment needed.
- This does not cover labor costs as they want the schools to have some investment in these programs as well.
- He also did not want to create a bait-and-switch scenario where the state starts a grant program and then takes it away and the school is stuck with the ongoing costs.
- The school has to pay the stipend for the teacher but all equipment costs will come out of this grant program.
- The grant program is two tiered with the first tier for startup programs.
- They can apply for a grant of up to \$4,000 for initial startup costs.
- In the second year of the grant program, if all of the funding is not taken, it will allow for existing programs to apply for replacement equipment grants.
- Built into the bill is a five-year reporting requirement that has the Department of Education check into the efficacy of the program and issue a report for possible legislative changes.
- These kinds of programs create great human beings by teaching the kids how to be tolerant and work with others that may not be like them.

- Senator Hennessy commented that the first year of the biennium has passed which is when the funds for the grant are to be appropriated and asked if he would want an effective date for the first year of the next biennium.
 - Representative Lang said if that is a technical error that they would like to correct he is good with that. He will take a look at the language and provide an amendment for the committee.
- Senator Kahn asked for clarity on the term "unified."
 - Representative Lang replied that unified cocurricular is defined by the department of education but he is not sure if they added that definition to the bill.
- Senator Kahn asked what he thinks it means.

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- Representative Lang replied that generally unified cocurricular activities are cooperative programs between special needs students and neuro typical students. It is usually advocated to be a 50/50 mix.
- Senator Kahn commented that the definition on line 5 states all schools and asked if this is specific to high schools.
 - Representative Lang replied that it is not limited to high schools. There are already middle school programs across the state as well as high schools. There may even be elementary school programs.
- Senator Kahn asked if an elementary school wanted to organize a unified cocurricular activity they would be eligible to apply for this funding.
 - Representative Lang replied yes, there are no limitations to grades here at all.
- Senator Kahn commented that the bill implies that some programs have already been initiated and asked how were those originally funded.
 - Representative Lang stated that a lot of them were funded out of school budgets depending on how the school prioritized the programs. In the study commission, the number one issue for new programs was the initial funding costs.
- Senator Kahn asked if he envisioned this to be matching grants as \$5,000 can be spent really fast.
 - Representative Land stated that there is a certain amount of matching because this does not include the stipend for the teacher. This bill intends to help with startup costs and would cover approximately 12.5 grants at a max of \$4,000 per grant.

• If a school wants to start a soccer and basketball program, they could apply for 2 separate grants, one for each program.

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- Senator Ward asked how much one uniform costs.
 - Representative Lang stated that it depends, but start-up equipment costs were around 4-5,000 dollars. It depends on how big the team is. In his experience, shoes would not be included and it cost about \$4,500 to outfit a full team.
