Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Powers and Duties of Towns; Regulation of Hawkers, Peddlers and Vendors; Cross Reference 2 to RSA 321 Removed. Amend the introductory paragraph of RSA 31:102-a to read as follows:

31:102-a Hawkers, Peddlers and Vendors. The governing board of a city, town or village district may adopt, by ordinance or regulation, provisions for the licensure and regulation of itinerant vendors, hawkers, peddlers, traders, farmers, merchants, or other persons who sell, offer to sell, or take orders for merchandise from temporary or transient sales locations within a town or who go from town to town or place to place within a town for such purposes. Any person who violates any provision of such ordinance or regulation shall be guilty of a class B misdemeanor, and each continuing day of violation after notice shall constitute a separate offense. A city, town, or village district shall be specifically prohibited, however, from licensing or regulating a candidate for public office in the process of obtaining signatures on nomination papers, who seeks to have the candidate's name placed on the ballot for the state general election by submitting nomination papers under RSA 655:40. Provisions adopted under this section [shall be in addition to any requirements imposed by the state under either RSA 320 or RSA 321 and] may include, but shall not be limited to:

- 15 2 Repeal. The following are repealed:
- I. RSA 320, relative to hawkers and peddlers.
- 17 II. RSA 321, relative to itinerant vendors.
- 18 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Representative Tony Lekas

Hillsborough - District 37

Representative Lekas is not the prime sponsor of HB 218, but did write the House

Committee Report. He said that HB 218 would eliminate the State license for hawkers, peddlers, and itinerant vendors. He said that the Committee heard from Deputy Secretary of State David Scanlon that there has never been an investigation into one of these licenses and there have never been a use made of the bonds that are posted. He said that the Secretary of State does not do anything with these licenses. Rep. Lekas said that even if someone checks the box on the license form that says they are a felon, they will still receive the license.

- Rep. Lekas said that municipalities maintain the authority to create their own licenses for hawkers, peddlers, and itinerant vendors.
- Rep. Lekas said that Deputy Secretary of State Scanlon had no objection to eliminating these licenses, as they serve no purpose.
- Rep. Lekas said that most people who do this work are poorer people, trying to make a living.
 He said that they should not be burdened further by needing a license from the State.

Ross Connolly

Americans for Prosperity - New Hampshire

- Mr. Connolly said that RSA 320 and RSA 321 are unnecessary regulations, creating an
 additional barrier to local entrepreneurs. He said that while the State license is removed,
 local licenses and regulations still exist.
- Mr. Connolly said that cities and towns make their own regulations and all enforcement is at the local level.
- Mr. Connolly said that RSA 320 and RSA 321 do nothing to protect public safety and, instead, make life more difficult.
