STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty One

AN ACT

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Title. This act may be known and cited as the "Civil Liberties Defense Act."
- 2 Legislative Findings.
- I. RSA 4:45 and 4:47, together known as the emergency powers statutes, allow the governor of New Hampshire to declare a state of emergency and thereby activate emergency powers. The emergency powers statutes were passed by the general court in order to give the governor flexible, enumerated powers in a time of public disaster.
- II. On Friday, March 13, 2020, the governor issued Executive Order 2020-04, declaring a state of emergency due to the novel coronavirus, or Covid-19. This order formed the basis for several emergency orders.
- III. On Tuesday, March 17, 2020, Binford, et. al. v. Sununu became the first legal challenge to these emergency orders. The lawsuit claimed that aspects of the orders violated the plaintiffs' civil liberties.
- IV. In response to this lawsuit, the state, rather than arguing simply that the orders in question were constitutional, disturbingly asked the New Hampshire superior court to hold that civil liberties are suspended due to the state of emergency. See Binford, et. al. v. Sununu, Merrimack Cty. Super. Ct., 217-2020-CV-00152 at 10 (March 25, 2020) (Kissinger, J.) ("...the State contends [that] during a state of emergency, executives are granted broad latitude to suspend civil liberties").
- V. The superior court agreed with the state and concluded that civil liberties in New Hampshire are suspended during the Covid-19 emergency. Id. at 11 (affirming that "[i]n an emergency situation, fundamental rights such as the right of travel and free speech may be... suspended") (quoting Smith v. Avino, 91 F. 3d 105, 109 (11th Cir. 1996); id. at 16 ("the Court finds that the Governor may suspend... constitutional rights during a state of emergency..."). Although the superior court then proceeded to find that the governor's orders were constitutional, it noted that it was doing so only "for the purpose of establishing a complete record." Id.
- VI. In subsequent emergency orders, the governor has cited the superior court's opinion letter in Binford as a legal authority. See e.g. Emergency Order No. 74 at 1 (Nov. 19, 2020) (citing Binford, et. al. v. Sununu, Merrimack Cty. Super. Ct., 217-2020-CV-00152).
- VII. In enacting RSA 4:45 and 4:47, the general court intended to give the governor flexible enumerated powers during a time of disaster. It did not intend to allow the governor to suspend or otherwise infringe upon the New Hampshire bill of rights or the United States Constitution.

VIII. The general court makes no comment on the specific outcome of the Binford decision, 1 2 recognizing that case-by-case applications of legal rights are within the province of the judicial 3 branch. Yet the superior court exceeded its authority to the extent that it purported to authorize the governor to suspend or infringe upon the New Hampshire bill of rights or the United States 4 5 Constitution. IX. Civil liberties are a codification of the inherent and binding duties of governments to 6 7 their citizens. The rule of law in a free society must therefore be permanent and inviolable. The 8 New Hampshire bill of rights and the United States Constitution may never be suspended, set aside, 9 or otherwise nullified by the governor, the judiciary, this general court, or any other official 10 authority. "Government is not free to disregard the First Amendment in times of crisis." Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn v. Cuomo, 592 U. S. ____ (2020) (Gorsuch, J., concurring in the 11 12 judgment). 13 X. Since the Binford decision was issued, the United States Supreme Court has correctly reaffirmed that "even in a pandemic, the Constitution cannot be put away and forgotten." Roman 14 Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn v. Cuomo, 592 U. S. ____ (2020). 15 XI. The United States Supreme Court has never held that constitutional rights may be 16 suspended due to a pandemic. Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn v. Cuomo, 592 U. S. ____ (2020) 17 (Gorsuch, J., concurring in the judgment) ("Jacobson didn't seek to depart from normal legal rules 18 during a pandemic, and it supplies no precedent for doing so... Instead, Jacobson applied what would 19 20 become the traditional legal test associated with the right at issue—exactly what the Court does today.") (citing Jacobson v. Massachusetts, 197 U. S. 11 (1905)); Id. ("Nor does any [dissenting 21 22 Justice in the Cuomo decision] seek to explain why anything other than our usual constitutional 23 standards should apply during the current pandemic."). 24 XII. The general court does not seek to obstruct lawful efforts by the governor or the 25 governor's officials to manage public disasters. Yet New Hampshire courts may not depart from the 26 federal or state constitutions during a crisis. Given the alarming nature of the state's argument in 27 Binford, and the superior court's resulting findings, the general court concludes that it would be negligent to wait for action by the New Hampshire supreme court before enacting this legislation. 28 29 3 Purpose. The purposes of this act are: 30 I. To clarify that the general court never intended that emergency powers granted to the 31 governor would be used to suspend civil liberties, and to amend the emergency powers statutes to 32 expressly prohibit the suspension of civil liberties. 33 II. To reject as ultra vires and to preclude any judicial decision purporting to suspend civil 34 liberties in New Hampshire, whether reached under the emergency powers statutes or any other law 35 or legal principle. III. To ensure that "even in a pandemic, the Constitution cannot be put away and forgotten." 36 Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn v. Cuomo, 592 U. S. ____ (2020). Legal challenges brought 37

- under the state or federal constitution must accordingly be subject to meaningful constitutional analysis.
- 3 4 Definitions. In this act:

- I. "Civil liberties" encompasses any guarantee against, protection against, or remedy for an imposition, intrusion, fine, punishment, or penalty by a governmental entity or agent enumerated in the New Hampshire bill of rights, in the United States Constitution, or in any binding legal decision construing any part of the same.
- II. This act also applies to, and in cases of conflict supersedes, any ordinance, rule, regulation, order, opinion, decision, practice, or other exercise of the government's authority that impinges upon civil liberties.
- VII. If any provision of this act or any application of such provision to any particular person or circumstance is held to be invalid under law, the remainder of this act and the application of its provisions to any other person or circumstance shall not be affected.
 - 9 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Summary of testimony presented in support: Representative Kofalt

- This is aimed at clarifying the emergency order statute to ensure civil liberties are not suspended or limited during a state of emergency.
- This is not aimed at fundamentally changing the emergency order statute or at any specific measure taken.
- This is not an anti-mask or anti-vaccine bill.
- It is currently the position of the superior court that the governor may suspend or limit constitutional rights during a state of emergency.
- Does not think any of the measures taken over the past year were overtly or inarguably violating the constitution.
- This bill clarifies that civil liberties on no account will be suspended, nor shall the US constitution or the NH Bill of Rights be suspended, set aside, or infringed.
- This is intentionally crafted very narrowly.

- Under this bill, going forward, the courts shall apply normal constitutional scrutiny to cases that come before it even during a state of emergency.
- This passed on a bipartisan vote in the House.
- This will bring us into good company with other states including Maine.
- The governor has flexible innumerable powers to deal with a state of emergency and this bill would not change that.
- Senator Gannon asked if a variant had a 50% fatality rate and the governor says no church, under this would it then go to the courts to decide under a scrutiny test.
 - o The purpose of this bill is to ensure normal constitutional scrutiny applies. The superior court decision last year said that the court did not find any actions taken by the governor were unconstitutional even under normal constitutional scrutiny. The court stated that as long as the governor acts in good faith with the belief that a suspension of certain civil liberties is important, then the governor may limit or suspend constitutional rights under current law. If a governor determines news coverage of an emergency event was causing general panic and wanted to shut down first amendment right, if he/she were acting in good faith the emergency orders statute would extend that power to them. This bill only says that normal constitutional scrutiny would now apply then.
- Senator Kahn asked about Chapter 9, Section 13 giving the legislature this kind of emergency authority.
 - Would have to look at that. General feeling is that neither the legislature nor the governor has the right to override constitutional rights. In determining the constitutionality of a specific act, the courts are required to look at past precedent and existing law. In the case of the governor or the legislature taking actions in fundamental violation of constitutional rights, those constitutional rights should prevail.
- Senator Carson asked for an explanation of the language on page 2, line 3 in regard to the Binford decision that reads "Yet the superior court exceeded its authority to the extent that it purported to authorize the governor to suspend or infringe upon the New Hampshire Bill of Rights or the United States Constitution."
 - o The constitution is the supreme law of the land and the legislature nor the governor alone or in concert can violate the constitution. Does not believe it is a viable position for the superior court to say that constitutional rights may be overridden by an executive order whether that is established in statute or not.
- Senator Carson stated that she believes the governor's actions were affirmed by the court under the law that was changed in 2002 in response to 9/11. Asked how the language on page 2, line 30 that reads "To clarify that the general court never intended that emergency powers granted to the governor would be used" was determined.

- o With the passage of this bill that would be determined. Does not believe that was the intention of the legislature. The Binford decision did not rule that anything that would normally be unconstitutional was now allowed under the emergency powers. It established that the actions taken by the governor under any circumstances would need to pass constitutional scrutiny, but that the governor may limit or suspend constitutional rights during a state of emergency where a normal constitutional test would not apply.
- Senator Carson asked for further explanation of the language on page 3, line 20 that states, "Notwithstanding the foregoing enumerated powers, civil liberties shall on no account be suspended. Nor shall the United States Constitution or the New Hampshire Bill of Rights be suspended, set aside, or otherwise infringed."
 - o This comes down to the question of the supremacy of the constitution, and this is a clarification of the existing statute. The emergency order statute is intended to grant the governor powers to take action without the acquiescence of the legislature. Believes that is important and was valid for the current situation. After Hurricane Katrina there was a widely publicized set of incidents where law enforcement was seizing people's firearms and that was ruled as an unconstitutional seizure. In current NH law, that type of seizure is explicitly prohibited. The question comes down to whether or not emergency orders provide a level of law making by executive order that supersedes existing law or the constitution. This legislation takes the position that it does not, and that the governor must still act within the confines of constitutional constraints.
- Senator Carson asked why this was not filed as a CACR.
 - o The bill started as a somewhat different bill. It was amended to its current form due to a series of court decisions, including Binford and Mack. It could well be introduced as a CACR. Since this specifically pertains to the emergency order statute though, it probably fundamentally belongs here. It seems clear that the constitutional intent is already there and this just clarifies the statute.

Representative Silber

- Disappointed that the Binford decision was not appealed to the supreme court.
- There was a similar situation to this that occurred in NY in late November where the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn sued the governor for his actions in limiting people's ability to exercise their first amendment rights. In a 5-4 decision the US Supreme Court said that was not permissible.
- That ruling stated that even in a pandemic the constitution cannot be put away and forgotten.
- Justice Gorsuch gave an opinion stating that government is not free to disregard the first amendment in times of crisis.

- There are three levels of scrutiny the courts apply when constitutional violations are suspected.
- The strictest level is strict scrutiny which is applied when dealing with fundamental rights.
- Senator Gannon asked if on page 3 where it says, "provided that civil liberties shall on no account be suspended," eliminates even strict scrutiny.
 - o The bill says what an appellant court determines it says. In a situation where some action is challenged, it is going to be an argument of both sides and the court is going to have to decide.

Ian Huyett (Cornerstone) (provided written testimony)

- For different kinds of constitutional challenges under ordinary legal analysis there are different levels scrutiny.
- Strict scrutiny looks at whether the action is narrowly tailored for a compelling government interest for rights like religious liberties.
- Intermediate scrutiny can apply to other rights.
- The government can do an action if is passes the required level of scrutiny.
- The constitution does not categorically prohibit the government from doing things it needs to do in an emergency.
- Under the suspension theory, during a state of emergency, the courts do not apply any of the tiers of scrutiny, instead they only ask if the action was taken in good faith and was there some factual basis for it.
- Suspension should never be applied.
- The government can act during an emergency while acting under normal scrutiny.
- This bill will not throw out things like mask orders and capacity limits, as they are upheld by most courts under the constitutional analysis.
- For the past 12 months, courts in Maine have been upholding these types of orders under ordinary constitutional analysis.
- The reason this bill is necessary is that the standard under suspension is so broad it will authorize almost any future abuse by the government that could be conceived of.
- Smith v. Avino talked about suspending constitutional rights and was the case applied in Binford.
- Smith v. Avino was based on Korematsu v. US, which was the US Supreme Court's decision upholding Japanese internment.
- The government's actions in Korematsu would easily pass the suspension standard.
- Under a suspension standard any constitutional right can be treated like it does not exist.

Victoria Gulla (provided written testimony)

• The founders of the country had concerns that if rights were enumerated then the inalienable rights would possibly be thought to not be considered.

- Shared what President James Madison said about the Bill of Rights which was used for the basis of the ninth amendment.
- The ninth amendment reads. "The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people."
- It was so important to the founders that these rights can not be stopped by the courts or a single judge.
- An emergency should not make the governor able to be a potentate.
- The court is wrong, and this bill will correct the decision.

Dear Senate Judiciary Committee,

I urge you to vote in favor of HB 440-A. Th legislative findings in this proposed amendment explain, in a simple step-by-step manner, the need for the amendment and its modest scope. I hope that, if Committee members look at this proposed amendment, they will see that it's not about any partisan issue. It's simply about the place of civil liberties protections in general in our courts during states of emergency.

At the Committee hearing, there was much discussion of specific scenarios in which a Governor might need to take swift action. Strong executive action, however, simply does not require that constitutional rights be suspended or set aside. A Governor who evacuates people to contain a radioactive leak, or even limits certain gatherings, can do so under standard constitutional analysis. In fact, executive actions around the country are routinely upheld by courts under ordinary constitutional scrutiny. New Hampshire does not need to adopt the radical theory that civil liberties are subject to suspension in an emergency and that *no constitutional scrutiny* applies to emergency actions.

It's my hope that it's possible for this bill—as amended—to have some bipartisan support.

It wasn't that long ago that, on the national level, you would see civil liberties advocates on the right and left cooperating to protect some liberties. If a coalition like this is still possible on *any one* civil liberties issue, then it must be possible on the question of whether civil liberties in their entirety are subject to suspension.

I acknowledge that our Governor is not doing the kinds of things Americans might think of when we hear the words "suspend civil liberties." But a future Governor could do precisely those things under our Superior Court cases. The time to fix that problem is now, when what I am saying sounds like a legal abstraction, and not five or ten years from now, when we learn the hard way that it is never a good idea—even temporarily—to codify unlimited power.

I know there are some Republicans who are insistent that the governor should have this power. But, unfortunately, I think their position is dependent upon who the Governor happens to be at this moment. I don't think they would take that view if a Democrat were the sitting governor—and I think everyone has some incentive to place certain basic limits on the state's power in the event that the other side one day wields that power.

In New Hampshire, a future Governor who uses current emergency powers law abusively could be either a Democrat or a Republican. I hope there will be at least some agreement among Democrats and Republicans that the House should act to stop that from happening.

It is about the place of civil liberties protections in general in our courts during states of emergency. Strong executive action does not require that constitutional rights be suspended or set aside.

New Hampshire does not need to adopt the radical theory that civil liberties are subject to suspension in an emergency and that no constitutional scrutiny applies to emergency actions.

I believe that it is never a good idea—even temporarily—to codify unlimited power.

I believe that, no matter what your political party is, it is best for us all to place certain basic limits on the state's power. Our current governor has shown admirable restraint. However, a future governor could use current emergency powers law abusively.

It is for these reasons that I ask that you to vote in favor of HB440-A.

My name is Nicholas Davis, Lead Pastor of At the Cross Church here in Antrim New Hampshire. Unfourtantly because of my work schedule, I am uncertain I will be able to attend the testimony for HB 440 and HB 542. I would like to share our churches situation if someone would be willing to submit my testimony for me.

In March of 2020 our Church leadership was visited by our towns Fire Chief who informed us we would no longer be able to gather for Worship due to the threat of contacting or spreading the Corona virus. If I remember correctly, at that time there were under 10 confirmed cases in New Hampshire. Our initial response was disbelief—"what authority could tell us we could not gather and worship our God..... are we not protected by the First Amendment to the Constitution?" We were told if we were to continue gathering after that Sunday's service the department would be forced to pursue a "cease and desist" order!

Turning to the Amendment to HB 440 the general court was never intended that "Emergency Powers" grant to the Governor would be used to suspend civil liberties, and to amend the emergency powers statutes to expressly prohibit the suspension of civil liberties. In fact to ensure that "even in a pandemic, the Constitution cannot be put away and forgotten." Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn v. Cuomo, 592 U. S. _____ (2020) (Gorsuch, J., concurring in the judgment).

I would also point to, "Civil Liberties Protected. No power delegated or otherwise granted by any statute or act of this general court to the governor or any of the governor's subordinates, whether before or after the date of this act, shall be construed to suspend or permit the suspension of civil liberties.

State of Emergency; Powers of the Governor. Amend RSA 4:45 by inserting after paragraph III the following new paragraph: IV. Notwithstanding the foregoing enumerated powers, civil liberties shall on no account be suspended. Nor shall the United States Constitution or the New Hampshire bill of rights be suspended, set aside, or otherwise infringe

From Bill 542: "This bill provides that any prohibition on in-person gatherings during a declared "State of Emergency" shall not apply to houses of worship and provides that the state shall not substantially burden a persons right to the free exercise of religion unless doing so is essential to further compelling governmental interest and is the least restrictive means of furthering that compelling governmental interest."

The Frist Amendment is supposed to guarantee our freedoms concerning religion, expression, and the right to assemble peacefully. Churches have been forced to close their houses of worship---those who have continued to peacefully assemble have been arrested and fined all over our country. This blatant abuse of power has gone on for too long and has been carried out in the name of protecting its people. We the people demand that our freedoms and liberties be restored and further protected going forward.

Lastly, for those of you in elected office who are fighting to truly protect the people we honor and thank you for your hard work and service.

To the Committee,

I write in support of the eloquent House Bill 440 as Amended, the Civil Liberties Defense Act, which corrects an egregiously wrong NH Superior Court decision in *Binford et al vs Sununu* which allows a Governor to become King and Potentate for a week or for the entirety of his term of office - or perhaps longer should he decide elections are too dangerous. Who knows where it ends, according to *Binford*, there is no end!

In 1891, the US Supreme Court held in Union Pacific Railway Co. v. Botsford that "No right is held more sacred, or is more carefully guarded by the common law, than the right of every individual to the possession and control of his own person, free from all restraint or interference of others, unless by clear and unquestionable authority of law." Let's remember that Emergency Authorizations are not law. So where does the Governor get the right to deprive rights as sacred as these?

And what does the common law say about liberty vis-à-vis the individual? As defined by <u>Blackstone</u>, individual liberty is "the power of loco-motion, of changing situation, or removing one's person to whatsoever place one's own inclination may direct; without imprisonment or restraint, unless by due course of law." William Blackstone wrote that the right to "personal security" includes "a person's legal and uninterrupted enjoyment of his life, his limbs, his body, [and] his health," as well as "the preservation of a man's health from such practices as may prejudice or annoy it." [1 Commentaries *125, *130]

These rights were considered given by God, not by government. The US Constitution and the NH Constitutions are designed to create governments to *protect* our inalienable rights. So sacred are these rights, that James Madison was afraid that a Bill of Rights would lead the government to believe that these were the only rights. Indeed, u pon introducing the Bill of Rights on the House floor on June 8, 1789, James Madison spoke of the opposition to the idea of a Bill of Rights as "by enumerating particular exceptions to the grant of power, it would disparage those rights which were not placed in that enumeration, and it might follow by implication, that those rights which were not singled out, were intended to be assigned into the hands of the general government, and were consequently insecure." Because he saw that the Bill of Rights would be forthcoming, Madison proposed Amendements in his own words to protect as strongly as possible our inalienable rights. Let's look at the very simple Ninth Amendment which states

Madison wrote and spoke, " First.

That there be prefixed to the constitution a declaration—That all power is orginally vested in, and consequently derived from the people.

[&]quot;The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people."

That government is instituted, and ought to be exercised for the benefit of the people; which consists in the enjoyment of life and liberty, with the right of acquiring and using property, and generally of pursuing and obtaining happiness and safety.

Further, he spoke and wrote,

"The exceptions here or elsewhere in the constitution, made in favor of particular rights, shall not be so construed as to diminish the just importance of other rights retained by the people; or as to enlarge the powers delegated by the constitution; but either as actual limitations of such powers, or as inserted merely for greater caution.

When one recalls the imposition of draconian business closures, some businesses and way of living being told they are non-essential, the imposition of dangerous face masks that deprive clean sir, oxygen that strain hearts and lungs, deprive children of essential development and learning, we can sincerely say that

James Madison's fears have become a 14-month nightmare that must be corrected immediately with vote in favor of House Bill 440 as amended.

The legislative findings in this bill explain, in a simple step-by-step manner, the need for the amendment and its modest scope. I hope that, if Committee members carefully consider the text of this bill, they will see that it's not about masks or any other partisan issue. It's simply about the place of civil liberties protections in general in our courts during states of emergency.

No one denies that there are many scenarios in which a Governor might need to take swift action. Strong executive action, however, simply does not require that constitutional rights be suspended or set aside. A Governor who evacuates people to contain a radioactive leak, or even limits certain gatherings, can do so under standard constitutional analysis. In fact, executive actions around the country are routinely upheld by courts under ordinary constitutional scrutiny. New Hampshire does not need to adopt the radical theory that civil liberties are subject to suspension in an emergency and that no constitutional scrutiny applies to emergency actions.

This bill should have bipartisan support. It wasn't that long ago that, on the national level, you would see civil liberties advocates on the right and left cooperating to protect some liberties. If a coalition like this is still possible on any one civil liberties issue, then it must be possible on the question of whether civil liberties in their entirety are subject to suspension.

I acknowledge that our Governor is not doing the kinds of things Americans might think of when we hear the words "suspend civil liberties." But a future Governor could do precisely those things under our current emergency powers statutes as they have been interpreted. The time to fix that problem is now, when what I am saying sounds like a legal abstraction, and not five or ten years from now, when we learn the hard way that it is never a good idea—even temporarily—to codify unlimited power.

The following bills are in the Senate Judiciary Committee and need to come out with an Ought To Pass (OTP) recommendation and be passed on the Senate floor.

HB307 "The 2021 2nd Amendment Sanctuary State Act" [relative to the state preemption of the regulation of firearms and ammunition.]

This bill prohibits local officials from creating local gun free zones without General Court Approval. This bill expands what was started years ago. Current law prohibits the creation of local gun free zones, but the statute does not assign a penalty for breaking the law. Local officials seem to have no regard for willfully violating this statute. This bill will correct those willful violations by adding a penalty. This is the most important bill that we need your help to pass.

Simply displaying a firearm is not a crime. 
