# ANALYSIS

This bill establishes a state death benefit for a municipal or state public works employee killed in the line of duty. The bill also eliminates the offset for workers' compensation benefits applicable to group I accidental death benefit annuities in state retirement system.

### AN ACT relative to death benefits for public works employees killed in the line of duty, and relative to workers' compensation offsets for certain retirement system benefits.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Death Benefit; Employees Killed in the Line of Duty; Public Works Employee Added. Amend  $\mathbf{2}$ the section heading and paragraphs I through the introductory paragraph of III of RSA 21-I:29-a to 3 read as follows:

6 (a) "Adult child" means a child, whether by blood or adoption, of the police officer, 7 firefighter, emergency medical technician, [or] rescue squad member, or public works employee age 18 or older at the time of death of such police officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, 8 9 [or] rescue squad member, or public works employee and who does not meet the definition of a 10 dependent child.

11 (b) "Dependent child" means a child, whether by blood or adoption, of the police officer, 12 firefighter, emergency medical technician, [or] rescue squad member, or public works employee 13 who:

14 (1) Is under the age of 25 and was dependent on the earnings of the police officer, 15 firefighter, emergency medical technician, [or] rescue squad member, or public works employee at 16 the time of death. For the purposes of this subparagraph, a child is not considered dependent if the 17 child provides more than half of his or her own support, is married, or is legally adopted by another; 18 or

19 (2) Is any age and is physically or mentally incapacitated and was dependent on the earnings of the police officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, [or] rescue squad member, 20 21 or public works employee at the time of death.

22 (c) "Family" means the surviving spouse of the police officer, firefighter, emergency 23 medical technician, [9\*] rescue squad member, or public works employee who was wholly or  $\mathbf{24}$ partially dependent, in fact, upon the earnings of the police officer, firefighter, emergency medical 25technician, rescue squad member, or public works employee or, if there is no surviving spouse, the 26 surviving dependent child or dependent children, of such police officer [or], firefighter, emergency 27 medical technician, rescue squad member, or public works employee or, if there is no  $\mathbf{28}$ surviving dependent child, a surviving person qualifying as a common-law spouse pursuant to RSA 29 457:39, or if there is no surviving common-law spouse, the surviving adult child or adult children, or 30 if there is no surviving adult child or adult children, the surviving parent or parents of such police

3 (d) "Emergency medical technician" means all levels of emergency medical technician, 4 including emergency medical responders, emergency medical technicians, advanced emergency 5 medical technicians, and paramedics, whether auxiliary, intermittent, special, part-time, volunteer, 6 call, or reserve, who is employed by a city, town, village district, or precinct within the state of New  $\mathbf{7}$ Hampshire, or any emergency medical technician who is a volunteer for or employed by a nonprofit 8 corporation in New Hampshire, or any emergency medical technician employed by a New Hampshire 9 licensed private ambulance service while in the performance of emergency medical services pursuant 10 to RSA 153-A:2, VI either under contract or agreement with a city, town, village, or precinct.

11 (e) "Firefighter" means any firefighter, including auxiliary, intermittent, special, part-12 time, volunteer, call, or reserve firefighters who are employed by a city, town, village district, or 13 precinct within the state of New Hampshire, any firefighter employed by the state of New 14 Hampshire, or any firefighter who is a volunteer for or employed by a non-profit corporation which is 15 the primary provider of fire protection for all or part of a New Hampshire municipality.

(f) "Killed in the line of duty" means a death of a police officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, [er] rescue squad member, or public works employee while in the performance of his or her duties as a result of incident, accident, or violence causing death or injuries which are the direct or proximate cause of death. "Incident" shall include any death that is determined to be occupationally related by the worker's compensation insurance carrier, a self-insured worker's compensation plan, or by the labor commissioner for workers' compensation purposes pursuant to RSA 281-A.

(g) "Police officer" means any law enforcement officer with the power of arrest, including auxiliary, intermittent, special, part-time, or reserve police officers, or sheriffs and their deputies who are employed by a city, town, village district, county, or precinct within the state of New Hampshire, police officers employed by the university system of New Hampshire, court security officers and bailiffs, and any state law enforcement officer employed by the state of New Hampshire who has power of arrest as determined by state law.

(h) "Public works employee" means any municipal or state public works or
highway employee who has the responsibility to work in hazardous locations, or as a first
responder, or in conjunction with emergency first responders in construction zones,
highway traffic areas, and other locations where the public works or highway employee is
exposed to risk of injury or fatality from construction hazards, highway traffic volume and
speed, nighttime responses, environmental issues, weather, or other hazardous conditions.

35 (i) "Rescue squad member" means any member of a rescue squad formed for the 36 purposes of responding to a state of emergency as declared by the governor or as part of a search and 37 rescue effort under the supervision of the fish and game department to recover a lost person.

I. In addition to any other benefits provided under this chapter, the state treasurer shall pay a \$100,000 death benefit to the family of a police officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, [er] rescue squad member, or public works employee killed in the line of duty. Payment to a dependent child under the age of 18 shall be made to the child's trustee for the benefit of the child. The governor, with the consent of the executive council, is authorized to draw a warrant for said sum out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

For deaths that are not reviewed by the office of the chief medical examiner, the 19 determination shall be made within 180 days of a determination that the decedent qualifies for a 20workers' compensation death benefit by a worker's compensation carrier, self-insured worker's 21compensation plan, or the labor commissioner pursuant to RSA 281-A, or within 180 days from the 22 date the commissioner received notice from the family or chief of department of the firefighter, police 23 officer, emergency medical technician, [er] rescue squad member, or public works employee 24 whichever is later.

NHRS reports employer rates have been set for FY 2022 and FY 2023 so there would be no changes to those rates as a result of this bill and any possible impact would not occur until FY 2024. The actuary for the New Hampshire Retirement System indicates this change could have a small impact on the future actuarial status of the System and employer contribution rates (i.e. less than 0.01% of payroll) and emerge over time as any new accidental deaths occur.

**Rep. Schultz** introduced this bill and referenced the unfortunate but not uncommon incident for public works employees that resulted in this bill.

- While this benefit will not help the person who passed, it will help but their surviving families.
- This bill had strong bi-partisan support last year.

Senator Carson asked about the house finance amendment.

Rep. Schultz stated the amendment was the enactment date, July 1, 2022.

# David Rodrigue Department of Transportation (DOT)

- DOT supports this bill and notes that public works employees are included as first responders by presidential direction.
- DOT has lost 8 employees while on duty. Of the top ten most dangerous occupations, DOT performs tasks defined in 8 of those occupations.
- A box van side swiped an occupied service vehicle on I-93 last week. Thankfully, the driver of the service vehicle was fully buckled and was not injured.
- Earlier today, a truck hit the Rochester toll booth. Thankfully the toll taker who occupied the toll booth at the time was uninjured.

# Susi Nord, National Council for Occupational Safety and Health

- Supports this bill and is here on behalf of Allison Wooten. In July 2016, Allison's husband Tom was killed while working for Northfield Department of Public Works (NDPW). Allison was out of state at the time and did not get to say good-bye for he died.
- NDPW employees were directed to carry a tractor trailer by hand from one area of the yard to another. During this transfer, Tom was crushed and later died.
- The cost to rent the needed equipment to move the trailer was \$500.00.
- Allison was then asked if she wanted Tom's workers compensation or his pension. This is a piece that nobody really understands about making life altering decisions in such a difficult time.
- The Governor gave a speech at Tom's memorial thanking DOT as first responders. Allison considered Tom a first responder.

# HB536 Death Benefits for Public Works Employees and Workers' Compensation Offset

We reached out to the NH Retirement System (NHRS) to help clarify some answers on questions asked at the Senate Finance Hearing for HB536. We have also included RSA 281-A:26 Workers' Compensation for Death and RSA 100-A:8 Accidental Death Benefits for reference.

- The first item to note is the \$100,000 line of duty death benefit and the workers' compensation offset are two separate items in the bill. The workers' compensation offset and the NHRS benefits in section 2 has nothing to do with the \$100,000 benefit in section 1 of HB536.
- Do you know why section paragraph III in section 2 was deleted?
  - The sponsor and others have testified it is to bring parity. The bill drafter is merging sections III and IV because separate provisions would be repetitive if the language was the same for all members.
- Can you explain the offset and how it works?
  - If the pension benefit paid to the survivor of a Group I member whose death was job related is \$2500/month and the survivor is also receiving a workers' compensation benefit of \$500/month, NHRS would only pay \$2000 under the offset.
- What is the retirement accidental death benefit?
  - Accidental Death Benefit (job-related)
     A refund of the member's Accumulated Contributions is payable to the member's
     designated beneficiary(ies) in addition to the Accidental Death Benefit described below:
    - If the member was married at the time of death, then the surviving spouse of a Group I member will receive an annual pension until death equal to 50% of the member's Average Final Compensation (average of the member's highest-paid years of membership service). The annual pension for the surviving spouse of a Group II member will be equal to 50% of the member's annual rate of Earnable Compensation at the date of the member's death.
    - If the member leaves no surviving spouse, or if the surviving spouse dies, then the annual pension will be payable to the member's children under age 18.
    - <sup>\*</sup> If the member leaves no surviving spouse and no children under age 18, then the pension will be payable to the member's dependent mother or father for life.
    - If the member leaves no survivors who are eligible for the annual pension, then the member's designated beneficiary(ies) will receive a lump sum payment equal to the member's base salary plus accrued benefits not paid at the time of death.
- How are death benefit policies setup?
  - The are no "policies." The cost of funding death benefits (and disability benefits) is already included in the employer rates. Because these offsets are exceedingly rare, this bill would not have a measurable impact on employer contribution rates.

# CHAPTER 281-A WORKERS' COMPENSATION

# Section 281-A:26

# 281-A:26 Compensation for Death. -

If death results from an injury, weekly compensation shall be paid to the dependents of the deceased employee in an amount provided by the compensation schedule in RSA 281-A:28 as follows: I. In all cases in which compensation is payable to a widow or widower for the benefit of herself or himself and dependent children, the commissioner shall have the power to determine from time to time, in the commissioner's discretion, what portion of the compensation shall be applied for the benefit of any such children and may order the same paid to a guardian.

II. In the case of the remarriage of a widow or widower without dependent children, compensation payments shall cease.

III. In the case of the remarriage of a widow or widower who has dependent children, the unpaid balance of compensation which would otherwise become due shall be payable to the mother, father, or guardian, or such other person as the commissioner may order, for the use and benefit of such children during dependency.

IV. The employer shall pay burial expenses not to exceed \$10,000.

V. Any dependent, except a widow or a widower or children, who, at the time of the injury to the person covered under this chapter, is only partially dependent upon the injured person's earnings shall receive such proportion of the benefits provided for those wholly dependent as the amount of the wage contributed by the deceased to such partial dependent at the time of the injury bore to the total support of the dependent.

VI. Compensation for a dependent child shall continue until the child becomes 18 years of age, or until the child becomes 25 years of age if such child is enrolled as a full-time student in an accredited educational institution. However, if the commissioner determines that the child is self-supporting or if the child marries or is legally adopted, compensation shall cease. A dependent child who is physically or mentally incapacitated shall continue to receive compensation as long as the incapacity continues. This paragraph shall have no effect on accidents or fatalities occurring prior to July 1, 1975, which shall be governed by the provisions of workers' compensation law prior to that date.

VII. Compensation payable to any dependent other than a widow, widower, or children shall cease when such dependent is married, is legally adopted, or is determined by the commissioner to be self-supporting.

# CHAPTER 100-A NEW HAMPSHIRE RETIREMENT SYSTEM

## Section 100-A:8

## 100-A:8 Accidental Death Benefits. -

I. Group I Members.

(a) If, upon the receipt by the board of trustees of proper proof of the death of a group I member in service indicating that such death was the natural and proximate result of an accident occurring while in the

performance of duty at some definite time and place, the board decides that death was the result of an accident in the performance of duty and not caused by willful negligence on the part of the member, a state annuity shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse; or if there is no surviving spouse, or if the surviving spouse dies before the youngest child of the deceased member has attained age 18, then to the deceased member's child or children under such age, divided in such manner as the board in its discretion shall determine, to continue as a joint and survivorship state annuity for the benefit of such child or children under said age until every child dies or attains said age; or if there is no surviving spouse or child under age 18 living at the death of the member, then to the member's dependent father or dependent mother as the board shall determine, to continue for life; provided that if none of the aforementioned beneficiaries is living or eligible for benefits under the provisions of this section, there shall be payable to the person or persons nominated by the member, if living, otherwise to the member's estate, a lump sum amount which is equal to the deceased member's base salary plus accrued benefits not paid at the time of death, in addition to the amount payable under RSA 100-A:11.

(b) Upon the accidental death of a group I member the amount of the state annuity payable shall be equal to 50 percent of the member's average final compensation.

II. Group II Members.

(a) If, upon the receipt by the board of trustees of proper proof of the death of a group II member in service indicating that such death was the natural and proximate result of an accident occurring while in the performance of duty at some definite time and place, or as the natural and proximate result of repeated trauma or gradual degeneration occurring while in the actual performance of duty or arising out of and in the course of employment or of any occupational disease arising out of or in the course of employment, as defined by RSA 281-A:2, XI and found to be compensable by the commissioner of labor pursuant to RSA 281-A:43; the board decides that death was the result of an accident in the performance of duty and not caused by willful negligence on the part of the member, a state annuity shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse, or if there is no surviving spouse, or if the surviving spouse dies before the youngest child of the deceased member has attained age 18, then to the deceased members' child or children under such age, divided in such manner as the board in its discretion shall determine, to continue as a joint and survivorship state annuity for the benefit of such child or children under said age until every child dies or attains said age; or if there is no surviving spouse or child under age 18 living at the death of the member, then to the member's dependent father or dependent mother as the board shall determine, to continue for life; provided that if none of the aforementioned beneficiaries is living or eligible for benefits under the provisions of this section, there shall be payable to the person or persons nominated by the member, if living, otherwise to the member's estate, a lump sum amount which is equal to the deceased member's base salary plus accrued benefits not paid at the time of death, in addition to the amount payable under RSA 100-A:11.

(b) Upon the accidental death of a group II member the amount of the state annuity payable shall be equal to 50 percent of the member's annual rate of earnable compensation at the date of the member's death. III. Workers' Compensation. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section and except for payments made under RSA 281-A:37, any amounts which may be paid or payable under the provisions of any workers' compensation or similar law on account of the death of any member shall, in such manner as the board of trustees shall determine, be offset against and payable in lieu of any state annuity payable under the provisions of this section on account of the same death. Any amounts offset above shall not include compensation received to pay hospital or medical bills under any private annuity or disability insurance plan.

IV. The offset provisions of paragraph III shall not apply in the case of a group II member who dies as the natural and proximate result of injuries received while in the performance of his duty. In this case any amounts paid or payable under the provisions of any workers' compensation or similar law on account of

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the death of the member shall not be offset against or payable in lieu of any state annuity payable under the provisions of this section on account of the same death. · · · ·
