Summary of testimony presented in support:

Senator D'Allesandro

- After the implementation of HB 377 which resulted in RSA 153:10-d; it was discovered that the 200 square feet per resident requirement is too restrictive.
- The 200 square foot per person standard is required for single family homes.
- The National Association of Recovery Residences (NARR) standard is 50 square feet per person in each sleeping room. This standard is consistent with the state's building code for dormitory occupant load.

Kim Buck, Executive Director of the NH Coalition of Recovery Residences (NHCORR)

- Roughly 25% of the existing NHCORR certified recovery houses cannot meet the 200 square feet standard.
- Often times recovery homes are older New England style homes that lack large common areas.
- There is significant national support for the 50 square foot standard.

Sean Toomey, State Fire Marshall's Office

• The 50 square feet standard is more appropriate.

David Mara, Governor's Advisor on Addiction and Behavioral Health

- The fact that 25% of certified recovery houses cannot meet this standard is concerning; the problem is especially acute in the northern part of the state.
- Certification is important for recovery houses to ensure the safety of the residents.
- Senator Cavanaugh expressed concern about non-certified homes and the lack of health and safety compliance in homes that are not certified.
- Concerned about non-certified recovery houses.

Testimony

Following the implementation of HB 377 (now RSA 153:10-d), it was discovered that the requirement to have a minimum of 200 gross square feet per resident is too restrictive. According to Kim Bock, the Executive Director of the New Hampshire Coalition of Recovery Residences (NHCORR), approximately 25% of the existing NHCORR certified recovery houses are not able meet that standard.

During the initial development of this language, the 200 gross square feet per person was identified as an occupant load factor to be consistent with a typical residential load factor found in the state building and fire codes for residential occupancies. This typically is residential occupancies outside the definition of a single family home. The National Association of Recovery Residences (NARR) standard requires 50 square feet per person in each sleeping room. This measurement is consistent with the dormitory occupant load found in the state building code.

It is the opinion of State Fire Marshal Sean Toomey that rather than coming up with an arbitrary occupant load for NH recovery residences, it is appropriate to modify the language to align with the NARR standard, and the state building code for dormitory-style residential space.
