Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study the feasibility of replacing the site evaluation committee.
 - 2 Membership and Compensation.
 - I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:
 - (a) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
 - (b) Three members of the house of representatives, one of whom shall be a member of the house science, technology and energy committee and one of whom shall be a member of the house finance committee, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and one of whom shall be a member of the minority party, appointed by the leader of the minority party.
- II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties of the committee.
 - 3 Duties. The committee shall study:
- I. The feasibility of replacing the site evaluation committee with an office of energy siting, within the New Hampshire department of energy, to handle all preliminary siting activities and authorizing the public utilities commission to act as a final adjudicative body.
- II. The current structure, process, authority, funding, and functions of the site evaluation committee.
- III. The structure, process, authority, funding, and function of public bodies that oversee energy siting in other states.
- IV. The role of the New Hampshire department of energy in any future energy siting process in New Hampshire.
- V. The ability of the public utilities commission to assume the adjudicative functions of energy siting in New Hampshire.
 - 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
 - 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate clerk, the house clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before October 15, 2022.

- V. The ability of the public utilities commission to assume the adjudicative functions of energy siting in New Hampshire.
- 128:4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 128:5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate clerk, the house clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before October 15, 2022.
 - 128:6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Summary of testimony presented:

Senator Giuda, Senate District 2

- SB 256 grew out of a committee on which Senator Giuda and Senator Watters served. The Committee studied necessary revisions to the site evaluation committee (SEC) that was based on inefficiencies and other issues that have come to light. The bill is based on recommendations found on the last page of the report on those inefficiencies.
- The bill establishes a committee to study the potential of removing the SEC as
 New Hampshire's main energy facility siting entity and replacing it with an

- Office of Energy Siting within the newly formed Department of Energy. The Public Utilities Commission will act as the final adjudicative body.
- The committee would study the current structure, process, authority, funding, and functions of the SEC and the structure, process, authority, funding, and function of public bodies that oversee energy siting in other states, the role of the Department of Energy in any future energy siting process in NH, and the ability of the PUC to assume the adjudicative functions of energy siting.
- One of the problems with the SEC is that its workload is very inconsistent. It may go one or two years with no workload and subsequently receive two or three proposals. The task of funding and staffing the SEC is problematic. Having an office within the Department of Energy is something worth considering.
- Senator Watters asked a question on behalf of Senator Perkins Kwoka. He asked if the Department of Energy would have permit granting authority for energy assistance systems within the same scope as the existing SEC or would that be an open question for the study committee. Senator Giuda believes that would be an open question for the study committee. The concern regarding this was more about investigations and compliance issues, however the siting remains to be determined and would be something the study committee would investigate. What was discussed in the study committee was using the different agencies of the state that already do permitting. For example, DES when siting a location and then allowing them to do an independent assessment. Each department would perform functions they already fulfill regularly and use the office within the Department of Energy as a gathering point for decisions.
- Senator Watters stated there may be cause for concern if the SEC was replaced with an office in the Department of Energy because it may not be as dispassionate or uninfluenced in comparison to if it was an independent entity. Senator Giuda acknowledged that this may be an issue. However, he believes the role of the Department of Energy would be to act as the gathering function for all the different permits that would be necessary. The responsibility of adjudication and issuance of the permits would fall to the PUC; however, this will be a topic of intense review.
- Senator Avard asked if the executive branch had looked at the legislation or given an opinion on the matter. Senator Giuda clarified that the acting commissioner of the Department of Energy supported the legislation.
