AN ACT relative to broadband infrastructure funding.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1 1 Powers and Duties of Towns; Special Meetings. Amend RSA 31:5, I(a) to read as follows:

2 I.(a) No money shall be raised or appropriated or shall any appropriation previously made  
3 be reduced or rescinded at any special town meeting except by vote by ballot, nor unless the ballots  
4 cast at such meeting shall be equal in number to at least 1/2 of the number of legal voters borne on  
5 the checklist of the town entitled to vote at the annual or biennial election next preceding such  
6 special meeting; and such checklist, corrected according to law, shall be used at any meeting upon  
7 the request of 10 legal voters of the town. This section shall not apply to money to be raised for the  
8 public defense or any military purpose in time of war *or to money to be raised for the purpose of*  
9 *financing broadband infrastructure bonds under RSA 53-G:5, X(c)*. In case an emergency  
10 arises requiring an immediate expenditure of money, the selectmen may petition the superior court  
11 for permission to hold a special town meeting which, if granted, shall give said meeting the same  
12 authority as an annual town meeting.

13 2 Corporate Body; Powers. Amend RSA 53-G:5, X to read as follows:

14 X. Each communications district shall have the power, by vote of the members *at an*  
15 *annual meeting or at a special meeting pursuant to subsection (c) below*, to borrow money  
16 and issue its notes or bonds in accordance with RSA 33, subject to the following:

17 (a) In the case of broadband infrastructure bonds, under RSA 33:3-g.

18 (b) In the case of revenue bonds, under RSA 33-B, when the board, at a regular or  
19 special meeting called for such purpose, determines by resolution passed by a vote of a majority of  
20 members present and voting that the public interest or necessity demands communications plant  
21 improvements, or a long-term contract, and that the cost of the same will be too great to be paid out  
22 of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the district, the board may pledge communications  
23 plant net revenues and enter into long-term contracts to provide for such improvements. In this  
24 chapter, a "long term contract" means an agreement in which the district incurs direct or conditional  
25 obligations for which the costs are too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and  
26 revenues of the district, in the judgment of the board. In this chapter, the term "communications  
27 plant improvements" includes improvements that may be used for the benefit of the public, whether  
28 or not publicly owned or operated. The pledge of communications plant net revenues and other  
29 obligations allowed by law may be authorized for any purpose permitted by this chapter, or any  
30 other applicable statutes.

1           (c) *Notwithstanding RSA 31:5, the members may hold a special meeting for the*  
2 *limited purpose of voting to borrow money and issue bonds or notes in accordance with*  
3 *RSA 33 to finance broadband infrastructure bonds under RSA 33:3-g.*

4           3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

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**Who supports the bill:** Senators Jeb Bradley, Ruth Ward and Regina Birdsell; Representatives Dennis Thompson and Ned Gordon; Margaret Byrnes (NHMA)

**Summary of testimony presented in support:**

Senator Bradley, Prime Sponsor:

- This bill is an adjunct to legislation passed last year creating a broadband infrastructure matching grant program. The purpose of SB 273-A is to allow funding to proceed in an expeditious manner. The aim is to avoid a normal Town Meeting process.
- The bill was sponsored on behalf of the New Hampshire Municipal Association. It is very important to many people in the state of New Hampshire.
- The state is poised to receive approximately \$122 million for this purpose. It will help expedite broadband infrastructure.
- Amendment #2022-0050s was developed by Senators Bradley and Kahn, with assistance by NHMA.
- Senator Bradley sought to clarify the appropriation designation on the bill. He and Senator Hennessey had worked on an earlier version of SB 273-A, but were encouraged by the Governor to remove that portion of the bill.

Representative Dennis Thompson:

- Representative Thompson represents Coos County District 1, which will be greatly impacted by this bill. He is a member of the Coos Broadband Committee.
- Sooner or later the federal and state money will dry up. SB 273-A is a way for local governments to complete the broadband initiative.
- Remote learning has been an enormous problem for students in northern Coos County. Satellite dishes don't work up there as well as they should. They need this program to continue their efforts.

Representative Ned Gordon:

- Representative Gordon is Vice Chair of the Grafton County delegation, where they are working very diligently to develop a broadband backbone to serve every community in their county. They would like the initiative to be expanded to other counties if it works out. It is important they take advantage of federal funds to enable them to do that.
- Representative Gordon has also been both a Town Moderator and School District Moderator for 27 years, having done more than his share of special meetings. These meetings come with lots of angst, sometimes trauma, but more importantly delay. This bill seeks in part to correct that, so that while the money is available we can have a special town meeting without going through the formalities of that process.
- This bill is needed and we should take advantage of the available federal funds.
- Senator Daniels reminded committee members a town needs to approve a special meeting before it can be held. Passage of SB 273-A does not automatically mean a town can have a special meeting. Representative Gordon added the bill exempts the requirement you have more than half the registered voters vote by ballot. Senator Daniels agreed it will make it much easier.

Margaret Byrnes, Executive Director, New Hampshire Municipal Association:

- This bill was initiated by a few counties in the northern portion of the state. They are considering forming a communications district, and would like to put the question to their towns at this year's annual Town Meeting on March 22, 2022. Unfortunately, in conferring with bond counsel they were advised they would need to wait until next year's Town Meeting to act on a bond for broadband infrastructure.
- SB 273-A seeks to allow towns in a communications district to hold a special town meeting if they are ready to proceed on the broadband infrastructure bond.
- Currently, to raise or appropriate funds must occur at a regular town meeting or it can be done at a special meeting, but only if half the registered voters attend the regular or special meeting, or if court approval has been granted and an emergency reason articulated for appropriating money outside of an annual meeting.
- This bill carves out a narrow exemption for towns in a communications district to hold a special town meeting merely for the purpose of acting on a broadband infrastructure bond. It is expediting the process if the town is ready to go sooner than the next annual Town Meeting.
- This is a very modest change; no standards are changed nor requirements for approval of the bond.

- Amendment #2022-0050s would allow *any* town seeking to do a bond for a broadband infrastructure project to schedule a special meeting
- Senator Daniels remarked special meetings are in no way nearly well attended as annual meetings. A bond for broadband can get pretty hefty. How do we justify this should happen? We all recognize the need. But needs must be weighed against a person's ability to "foot the bill". The federal money won't be around forever. How do we find that balance? Executive Director Byrnes indicated in the situation where towns have formed a communications district, those towns have taken a lot of action already. Much research and planning would have already occurred, leading to much buy-in from those in these particular municipalities to go ahead and do the project, even before the occurrence of the special meeting. That would invite more citizen involvement. Also, a special town meeting needs to follow the same process as the annual Town Meeting. A warrant must be posted and the meeting called. That should give sufficient notice to the public for this important purpose. Additionally, when towns consider bonds at a special or annual town meeting, a bond meeting must be held prior to the special or annual meeting. That would give an additional opportunity to speak in favor or against the bond prior to the town meeting.
- Senator Daniels asked about SB 2 towns and if the bill would apply to them. Executive Director Byrnes stated it would apply to all towns.

Dear Chairman Daniels and Committee Members:

As bond counsel to many New Hampshire municipalities, I write to express my strong support for SB 273-A. With this bill's revisions to RSA 31:5, I(a) and RSA 53-G:5,X, New Hampshire towns that seek to form a communications district under RSA 53-G will be able to approve in a timely manner the necessary funding to establish the broadband infrastructure that will make their communities stronger.

Without such changes, voters which have approved their town's participation in a communications district at an annual meeting would not be able to take the next critical step of authorizing the necessary bond approval until the following year's annual meeting. Or they would have to follow the process of requesting permission from the Superior Court to hold a special emergency meeting under RSA 31:5. Instead, the revisions to these two statutes provide towns with the limited ability to hold a special meeting to appropriate money for one purpose only and as such they will sooner be able to offer broadband for work, education, healthcare, municipal, entertainment and other purposes that are important to their residents.
