Bill Analysis: This bill requires the business finance authority to include the house and senate ways and means committees in its reporting on the progress relative to the regenerative manufacturing workforce development program.

Who supports the bill: Senators Lou D'Allesandro, David Watters and Jeb Bradley.

Summary of testimony presented in support:

#### Senator D'Allesandro, Prime Sponsor:

- In 2018, Dean Kamen requested a very specific exemption of the Legislature. It was an exemption to both the Business Profits Tax (BPT) and the Business Enterprise Tax (BET) for a period of ten years. The advanced manufacturing business would create much activity in the scientific community regarding the creation of organs. The U.S. Department of Defense was the prime sponsor of this initiative. They gave Dean Kamen \$100 million. He has put together a 250 entity consortium that bought into this project. The fact we gave them ten years without a BPT or BET was truly something extraordinary. This project would be revolutionary in terms of creating artificial organs, and would have an unbelievable affect on human beings.
- Only companies associated with regenerative manufacturing could receive this exemption.
- Currently, they are working on hearts.
- It is imperative an annual report be submitted to the Legislature detailing the progress that has been made.
- Senator Giuda inquired if Senator D'Allesandro had spoken with the Executive Director of the New Hampshire Business Finance Authority to determine if they

- may already have such information. Senator D'Allesandro stated he had not, but would follow up with James Key-Wallace.
- Senator Hennessey inquired if the Fiscal Committee was receiving the annual report, as required by the existing statute. Senator D'Allesandro stated no reports have been issued to date. Senator Hennessey wondered how we could encourage them to submit a report, and include the House/Senate Finance Committees. Senator D'Allesandro replied the bill would mandate an annual report be issued. Senator Hennessey asked how late their first report is overdue. Senator D'Allesandro offered they are a couple of years behind.
- Senator Daniels suggested placing a six month due date in the legislation to indicate exactly when the report is due. Senator D'Allesandro agreed.
- Senator Giuda thought in terms of lost revenues, perhaps the report should be directed to the House/Senate Ways and Means Committees rather than the Finance Committees. That was the committee of referral for the original legislation. Senator D'Allesandro agreed a report to the appropriate committee is essential.
