Summary of testimony presented in support:

<u>Senator Sherman, Cosponsor (Reading into the record Senator Perkins Kwoka's Introduction to SB 278-FN:</u>

- This bill is a request from Geno Marconi, Port Director of the New Hampshire Port Authority.
- In the 2019 budget package a sum of money was assigned to the Port Authority project in Rye Harbor Those funds were refunded by the contractor. Through this legislation those funds will be made available to the Piscataqua River Turning Basin Widening Project.
- The Piscataqua River turning basin has been an issue for years. With the size of the turning basin it is no longer sufficient for modern vessels. Widening the turning basin with these additional funds will be a boon to the Seacoast economically, making the area more efficient and much safer.
- In the 2021 budget package \$1.5 million was appropriated to the Turning Basin Project. SB 278-FN is taking the remaining \$251,143 from the 2019 Rye Harbor Project and adding it to the total for the Turning Basin Project.
- Although the language of the bill is not clear in this respect at first glance, this
 bill is not drawing from new funds but reallocating funds from the 2019 budget
 cycle that were reabsorbed by the General Fund because no non-lapsing
 language was used at the time.
- Senator Sherman expressed his support, as well, for this bill. He and Senators Perkins Kwoka and Watters all took a tour of the turning basin. To stay

- competitive with neighboring ports in Massachusetts and Maine, this is a vital project. The turning basin allows those long ships to come all the way up the river, with several areas for docking and unloading, but they have to turn and go back out.
- This will allow the larger vessels that we currently can't accommodate in New Hampshire to actually have a port in New Hampshire where they can offload.
- Senator D'Allesandro sought confirmation that the project needs to be done now, as the Coast Guard has it on their priority list. If you lose your spot on the priority list, your lose the ability to do this project. The money is available; it was not spent on the previous project but returned. There is no cost; that money is still available. There is no negative effect on the budget. Senator Sherman agreed. Senator D'Allesandro added if we lose our spot on the list, we hurt the economy of the state, as the turning mechanism is vital to the economic viability of the port. Mr. Marconi does a great job ensuring the Port runs well, efficiently Senator Sherman reminded committee members of similar and effectively. timing issues they had run into with both the Hampton/Seabrook Harbor dredging, and the Rye Harbor dredging. The commercial pier in Portsmouth was a bit of a surprise because that started to collapse, including the gas docks. We all understand the timing issues here, especially with the state/federal partnership. Without the project being done now, we risk losing our place. And when you lose your place, it is for a long time.
- Senator Giuda inquired if there was a federal funding component associated with the project. Senator Sherman stated there was, along with a federal timing component.
- Senator Morse questioned the \$251,143 we are reappropriating. Capital Budget project that didn't spend all of the money?" Senator Sherman believes it was. Senator Morse pointed out this bill would have been sent to the Capital Budget Committee if that fact had been recognized. The reallocation of funds should be reviewed by that committee. Senator Hennessey wondered why this issue was not addressed in the Capital Budget we just passed. Senator D'Allesandro indicated knowledge of this situation was unknown at that time. The project was done for less money and they turned the money back later after the Capital Budget was developed. It was a timing situation, thought Senator D'Allesandro. Senator Sherman agreed with Senator D'Allesandro. Senator Daniels added this was left over from the previous project because that project was closed. There was no way to be able to transfer the money over to this project. This legislation is really the only way. It goes back into the General Fund and then appropriated to this project. It is a net zero sum. Senator Morse truly believes if this was a Capital Budget item and there was a shortfall, it wouldn't go to the General Fund. It would have been a bonding shortfall that the Capital Budget Committee often goes through and scores and later reallocates the money. We need to check with the Capital Budget Committee. Senator Morse does not think this is touching the General Fund.
- Chris Shea, Deputy Legislative Budget Assistant, attempted to clarify the issue. There was a dredge project for Rye that completed in the Capital Budget for 2017. There was no lapse extension requested in the current Capital Budget, so

that ended in FY 2021. The money is a state match that goes to the Army Corp of Engineers. Once the project was completed, the Army Corp of Engineers came back to the Port Authority and said they had recalculated what was needed and had actually overbilled the state by \$251,000. That money went back to the Port Authority. Mr. Marconi approached the Capital Budget Overview Committee to see if there was a way to move that money to the Turning Basin Project. There was no way because the Capital Budget project that was associated with that money had been closed. It was suggested Mr. Marconi find a sponsor of legislation to appropriate that money directly for the Turning Basin Project. Supposedly, Mr. Marconi was directed to deposit the money back to the state: Mr. Shea is unsure if same has actually occurred. He believes that check has been deposited into the General Fund. Senator Morse asked if this now was a General Fund expenditure and not a transfer. Mr. Shea stated it was. Essentially, the \$251,000 was deposited into the General Fund. They are asking that money be reappropriated to this project. Senator Morse stated that would have been calculated into the lapse. Mr. Shea indicated that would depend upon when the deposit was made. It would not necessarily show up in the 2021 CAFR as of yet. He is unsure if the Port Authority has provided it back to the state. It may potentially show up in the 2022 lapse.
