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ANALYSIS

This bill prohibits a private nursing home or assisted living facility from enforcing a 30-day notice of vacancy policy in the event of a resident's death and provides that, in such cases, the month in which the resident passes shall be the last month for which payment is due.

**Summary of testimony presented in support:**

**Senator Bill Gannon**

**Senate District 23**

- Senator Gannon said that when his mother was reaching the end of her life, he signed a contract for a room at an assisted living facility. Once she passed, the facility told him

- to keep the room for as long as possible before clearing out her effects. Senator Gannon said that the total cost was \$14,000.
- Senator Gannon said that his mother's facility had a wait list for rooms, meaning that after his mother passed and her effects were moved out there was a very short period of time before the room was occupied again. Senator Gannon said that he was able to negotiate with the facility to keep some of the money due between when he cleared out his mother's effects and the end of the month. He said that there are others who have not stood up to facilities and have lost a lot of money.
  - Senator Gannon said that a 10-day process seems fair, giving the facility time to paint the room and make small repairs if needed. He said that the Nursing Home Association and the Health Care Association support SB 281.
  - Senator Gannon proposed adding "public and" before "private" on Line 3 of SB 281.
  - Senator Sherman asked if Senator Gannon's proposal should be "public or" rather than "public and".
    - Senator Gannon agreed.
  - Senator Sherman said that Line 5 should use "dies" rather than "passes".
    - Senator Gannon agreed.
  - Senator Sherman asked if the implication on Line 5 of "month" means a calendar month, not a 30-day period.
    - Senator Gannon agreed.
  - Senator Sherman asked what the standard practice was, whether someone died on the 1<sup>st</sup> of a month or the 29<sup>th</sup> of a month.
    - Senator Gannon said that the facility in his mother's case wanted payment for the full month.
  - Senator Sherman asked for clarification on Senator Gannon's answer.
    - Senator Gannon said that SB 281 is a 10-day bill. He said that 10 days gives the facility time to clean, paint, and touch up a room.
  - Senator Gray said in the case of his mother's passing, they were not able to remove her effects until a few days after her funeral. He asked if SB 281 should kick in 10 days after the effects are removed and the room is vacated.
    - Senator Gannon said that the nursing homes told him 10 days was sufficient time to touch up a room. He said that he was fine with the change suggested and could live with it either way.
  - Senator Gray said that in his mother's case, they knew the unit was paid for until the end of month so they took seven days to vacate the room, which would only leave three days under SB 281. He said that vacating the room should be what activates the SB 281 process.
    - Senator Gannon said that 10 days from when the room is vacated is still a massive improvement from the current situation. He said that most rates are \$500 or \$600 per day.
  - Senator Gray asked Senator Gannon to work on an amendment to SB 281.
    - Senator Gannon said that he would work on an amendment.

## **Gary Cahoon and Alex Koutroubas**

### **NH Association of Residential Care Homes**

- Mr. Cahoon said that he is the owner-operator of a residential care home in New Ipswich. He said that the NH Association of Residential Care Homes met for their monthly meeting and discussed SB 281. He said that Senator Gray's suggested amendment addressed the only concern that the board had.
- Mr. Cahoon said that the board voted to support SB 281 on the principle that they shouldn't be charging dead people. He said that in most situations families refusing to vacate a unit are not a concern, although they do happen from time to time. He said it is not cost-effective for a facility to pay to remove and store someone's belongings if it is an apartment-style facility.
- Mr. Cahoon provided a draft amendment to address the board's concerns but said that Senator Gray's proposal may address those concerns better.
- Mr. Cahoon referenced Senator Sherman's question of what a month is. He said that in his practice, a month is not a calendar month but a rental month – if a resident moves in on January 15<sup>th</sup>, the month runs from January 15<sup>th</sup> to February 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Senator Bradley asked Mr. Cahoon to work with Senator Gannon on an amendment.
- Senator Sherman said that the amendment proposed by Mr. Cahoon provides for the authority to charge a fee. He asked if facilities already have the authority to charge fees is residents' families do not vacate their units.
  - Mr. Koutroubas said that their written testimony showed sample contract language from a facility dealing with vacating the unit. He said that the language of the contract is actually more generous than the language in SB 281.

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**If personal property is not removed from the resident's unit, apartment, or room prior to the end of the 10-day period, the nursing home or assisted living facility, at its option, may continue to charge a fee until the personal property is removed.**

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

January 11, 2022

**Sample contract (lease) language from a NH Assisted Living Facility**

If Resident dies or Owner terminates this Agreement without cause, Resident or his/her estate shall be entitled to a prorated refund of the Monthly Fees for the month in which Unit is vacated. For purposes of this Agreement, a Unit shall be considered vacated when all of the Resident's furnishings and personal belongings have been removed (see paragraph 13).

13. Abandoned Personal Property. The Resident shall continue to be liable for the Monthly Fee for his/her Unit until all personal property has been removed from Unit, even though this Agreement has been previously terminated and/or Resident has personally vacated Unit. If personal property has not been removed by Resident within thirty (30) days after termination of this Agreement, Owner shall have the right to remove and dispose of all property in any manner it determines appropriate, including donation of the property to a public agency or a private charity. Resident or Resident's estate shall be liable for any costs incurred in removing the property from Unit and/or in storing it or disposing of it.

On behalf of the New Hampshire Health Care Association, representing most of the state's nursing homes, and many assisted living facilities, we support Senate Bill 281 (relative to nursing home policies regarding notice of vacancy.). It is good policy and consistent with the existing practices of our state's two largest nursing home providers as well as independent facilities we checked in with.

We would suggest a modest amendment by striking the word "private." Under the Equal Protection Clause of the U.S. Constitution there is no rational basis to allow a practice in government-owned facilities that would be disallowed in private facilities.
