[The] Any emergency medical and trauma services data [and] or [resulting] analysis collected or maintained by the division may [shall] be provided to [the bedies established under this chapter] any state or federal agency or to any third party entity contracted to work on behalf of a federal or state entity, provided that such use does not violate the confidentiality of recipients of emergency medical care. - (o) Notwithstanding paragraph II(g), the division is hereby authorized to execute all documents, and perform all other acts necessary to participate in the National Emergency Medical Services Information System or any similar data collection, sharing, or analysis system, provided that the data provided to any such system does not violate the confidentiality of recipients of emergency medical care. The commissioner shall review and approve any such authorization prior to sharing any data.
- 3 Emergency Medical and Trauma Services; Protected Health Information; Privacy Committee Established; Broadening of Permissible Uses of Information. Amend RSA 153-A:35, I to read as follows:
- I. All protected health information possessed by the department shall be considered confidential, except that the commissioner, or designee, may provide emergency medical and trauma services record information to [institutions and individuals] any person or entity outside of the department who demonstrate a need for such information for the purpose of conducting health-related research or analysis and other uses for evaluation not provided for under RSA 21-

Senator Sue Prentiss

Senate District 5

 Senator Prentiss said that the Department of Safety (DOS) had requested legislation which would clarify the language in RSA 21-P:12-b and RSA 153-A:35, II. That

- legislation is SB 337-FN. DOS has made this request so that emergency medical services (EMS) and trauma data can be shared for research and analysis.
- Senator Prentiss said that during her time as the Chief of New Hampshire's Bureau of EMS, the Bureau built and implemented an electronic data reporting system for prehospital care systems. New Hampshire became the second state in the nation to submit data to the National EMS Information System (NEMSIS).
- Senator Prentiss said that the data which is maintained contains valuable information which could, and should, be used to improve EMS and trauma system operations.
- Senator Prentiss said that opportunities present themselves at the federal and state
 levels to do needed research work upon request. Updating the language would allow a
 state or federal agency, or a contractor, to request and access data as long as it does not
 violate confidentiality rules.
- Senator Prentiss said that all of the requests for EMS data are reviewed by a privacy committee that has been established in RSA 153-A:35. This would be done under contract with the consent of the Commissioner of DOS.
- Senator Prentiss explained that supporting SB 337-FN would support DOS, EMS providers, and the Division of Fire Standards and Training. She said that supporting the legislation would improve the work that they do when data is requested to be shared and these departments do not have the internal capabilities to analyze it.

All requests for EMS data, are reviewed by a Privacy Committee that has been established in 153-A and final approval to share data, under contract would be done with the consent of the Commissioner.
