This bill defines "certified service plumber" and directs the mechanical licensing board to adopt administrative rules regulating certified service plumbers.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1            1 New Paragraph; Mechanical Licensing; Certified Service Plumber. Amend RSA 153:27 by  
2 inserting after paragraph I the following new paragraph:

3            I-a. "Certified service plumber" means any person who as a plumbing apprentice has  
4 completed at least 2,080 hours of direct supervision by a certified service plumber or journeyman  
5 plumber of incidental repair, installation, and maintenance of plumbing as defined in rules adopted  
6 by the board.

7            2 New Subparagraph; Mechanical Licensing Board; Rulemaking. Amend RSA 153:28, I(a) by  
8 inserting after subparagraph (9) the following new subparagraph:

9                            (10) Certified service plumber.

**Who is neutral on the bill:** Rahkiya Medley (OPLC)

**Summary of testimony presented in support:**

Senator Birdsell

- SB 362 would allow for a "Certified Service Plumber" in NH, requiring a minimum of 2080 hours of apprentice work and requiring that the applicant successfully pass a test given by the state.



- Currently an “Apprentice” has to work 4 years with a “Journeyman Plumber”, in order to be able to do even the most basic service calls, such as replacing a faucet or changing a toilet seat. This adds costs to consumers, paying for two people and makes it difficult for plumbing companies to attract new workers.
- The bill would not change current requirements for construction projects. Just residential service calls.

**Jim Fusco, Granite State Trade School stated:**

- Mr. Fusco reports that fast track certified service plumber programs are being used in about 30 other states with great success.
- There is a great need more plumbers in the trade and this bill will help get young people into the trade.

**Summary of testimony presented in opposition:**

**Ken Pierce, Artisan Plumbing and Heating**

- Mr. Pierce is opposed to the bill as it is not good for the health or safety of the people.

**Senator Reagan** asked for an example and Mr. Pierce responded that people could start a fire or a flood doing this type of work. Mr. Pierce had the proper training and wants others to do that as well.

**Senator Prentiss** asked if Mr. Pierce thinks the 2000 hour requirement is not enough. Mr. Pierce is in favor of keeping the apprentice program the way it is.

**David Pelletier, Plumbers and Pipefitters Local 131 stated:**

- Mr. Pelletier opposed to this bill based on proposed rules that are pending in the mechanical licensing board that are under consideration. These rules will allow the apprentice working in an approved apprentice program to work under the supervision (as opposed to direct supervision) after their second year.
- The board has been working on these rules for a number of years and they need to be brought forward for approval and then sent to the Joint Legislative Committee on Administrative Rules (JCLAR).

**Senator Cavanaugh** asked Mr. Pelletier to confirm that the 4 year program requires 2000 hours per year. Mr. Pelletier confirmed and further explained that the fast-track option that allows participants to test out of the first year and start as a 2nd year apprentice and at the 3rd year the apprentice could work with supervision.

**Senator Cavanaugh** asked Mr. Pelletier if the board plans to bring the proposed rules forward for approval at the February meeting. Mr. Pelletier responded that he is no longer on the board and cannot speak to that.

**Senator Prentiss** asked if Mr. Pelletier if he knows if the board is meeting regarding the rules. Mr. Pelletier suggested that people in support of this bill should go to the

board and ask them to move this forward. Mr. Pelletier states that when he was on the board they lacked an attorney and the rules process was slow.

**Bill Trombly, PFGF HVAC stated:**

- Mr. Trombly understands the bill's intent, but does not think it is needed.
- Mr. Trombly's term on the board ended in December 2021 but he is still aware of board activities.
- This committee passed a law that gave the mechanical board the ability to write rules for the apprenticeship program. They worked with the Department of Labor and the Department of Education to create a path for young people to enter the field. This includes the first year bypass test which is recognized by the Department of Labor.
- There is a difference between supervision and direct supervision. Direct Supervision means that apprentice needs to be with the sponsor. A third year apprentice should be able to contact their sponsor and should be capable of incidental plumbing that does not require a permit.
- These rules were written while at the Fire Marshall's Office prior to the move to OPLC in July 2021. COVID also resulted in delays.
- Suggested pressing the mechanical board to get the rules reviewed and in front of JCLAR.
- Currently, the mechanical board does not handle the plumbing side of educational courses, this is handled by the Department of Education.
- Certified Service Plumbers are not recognized as apprentices by the Department of Labor.
- The plumbing trade needs to continue efforts to work with the trade school and high schools to bring more young people into the field.

**Senator Cavanaugh** asked Mr. Trombly if he thought it was likely the board will move forward with the new rules. Mr. Trombly replied that the rules have already been written, but should be reviewed by the new board and the lawyers. Then there could be a public hearing in March and this process could be done by the end of the summer 2022. The board has been working with the DOE for the past 4 years trying to get high school students interested.

**Stephen Labbe, Paradigm PHAC, Inc. stated:**

- He is excited to be here and agrees that everyone is working for change, but change has not happened through the board despite tremendous efforts.
- A gas license takes 2 years to achieve, and a gas technician is allowed to install a gas furnace. Mr. Labbe states that plumbing is not as dangerous as gas.
- Supports the 4 year program, but after 2 years the apprentice is capable of working small jobs without direct supervision.
- Suggested that this bill and the work that the board has already done be combined to synergy.

**David Benedict, Derry Plumbing & Heating stated:**

- Mr. Benedict wants to start a new license for the certified service plumber. Mr. Benedict reports that the four year commitment is not appealing to the younger generation. Older plumbers are retiring and are not being replaced.
- The majority of this work is residential service work which could be done by a 2nd year apprentice.
- He's been running radio ads to hire plumbers for almost a year with incentives to include a \$10,000.00 sign on-bonus and a brand-new truck, but there were no calls.
- Most licensed plumbers work for the larger companies doing larger new construction work.
- The current 4-year program is geared toward new construction, not existing construction.
- Many states have a certified service plumber program including Kansas, Missouri, New York, Florida, Washington and many more.
- For comparison, Mr. Benedict's son went to school for 6 weeks and is now a certified medical assistant who can stick patients with needles.
- The certified auto mechanics program is only 6-10 weeks long.
- Mr. Benedict submitted written documentation of support for this bill and copies are provided to the Committee.

**Neutral Information Presented:**

**Rahkiya Medley, Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC)**

- Ms. Medley reported that OPLC is neutral on this bill and that after speaking with some board members and hearing their concerns OPLC requests the opportunity to meet with a quorum of board members to review the bill

**Senator Reagan** asked the date of the next meeting. Ms. Medley stated she thinks it is February 9<sup>th</sup>.

A master plumber should also be allowed to be direct supervising this individual to get the required 2,080 hours.

In my opinion a "service" technician is doing repairs and "fixing" something broken/not working, this description alludes to "service" encompassing much more than that. This needs better definition.

Please define what is "incidental" repairs, installation, and maintenance? This needs to be clear, so the individual doesn't work beyond what he/she is allowed to do.

Dear Licensed Business Owners:

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Recently I contacted the Mechanical Licensing Board and attended a meeting regarding the provisions of Saf-Mec 302.22, which states:

'Supervision of plumbing apprentices and fuel gas trainees' means the direct supervision of a student or plumbing apprentice or fuel gas trainee while the individual is in the process of learning and applying his/her skills or is assisting a licensed fuel gas fitter or plumber.'

As you may know, there has been enforcement action on small plumbing service providers who are doing incidental or minor repairs such as changing a toilet seat, sink trap or even repairing an outside faucet. These incidental services provided by an apprentice require direct supervision during four years of training. This is problematic because the law requires an apprentice to work for four years before they can become a journeyman that can provide services without direct supervision. As a result, there are a shortage of students and apprentices because of the direct supervision limitation. This increases the cost for the small plumbing service provider.

That the Board responded that "there is an option for an apprentice to take the first year plumbing apprentice bypass test." This could shorten the direct supervision time by three years. This is not accepted by all sponsors.

---

I have proposed a solution to the Mechanical Board to create a title of "Certified Service Plumbing" to permit incidental and minor repairs without direct supervision. A Certified Service Plumber would be permitted to do so after one year of training as well as taking and passing a test revolving around the service end of the plumbing service industry only. This will entice students to become certified service plumbers and eliminate the high cost to small service providers like us. The Mechanical Board has suggested we obtain support from business owners to consider this change in the regulations. If you support the above proposal, kindly acknowledge your approval below and return to my attention.

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

Dear Licensed Business Owners:

Recently I contacted the Mechanical Licensing Board and attended a meeting regarding the provisions of Saf-Mec 302.22, which states:

'Supervision of plumbing apprentices and fuel gas trainees' means the direct supervision of a student or plumbing apprentice or fuel gas trainee while the individual is in the process of learning and applying his/her skills or is assisting a licensed fuel gas fitter or plumber.'

As you may know, there has been enforcement action on small plumbing service providers who are doing incidental or minor repairs such as changing a toilet seat, sink trap or even repairing an outside faucet. These incidental services provided by an apprentice require direct supervision during four years of training. This is problematic because the law requires an apprentice to work for four years before they can become a journeyman that can provide services without direct supervision. As a result, there are a shortage of students and apprentices because of the direct supervision limitation. This increases the cost for the small plumbing service provider.

That the Board responded that "there is an option for an apprentice to take the first year plumbing apprentice bypass test." This could shorten the direct supervision time by three years. This is not accepted by all sponsors.



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

First, thank you for your support and interest in the creation of a Certified Service Plumber in New Hampshire. As we all know, this is something that will greatly reduce costs and efficiency for basic plumbing service calls.

Senate Bill 362, will be having a hearing before the Senate Executive Department and Administration Committee on January 19th, at 9:00am in room 103 of the NH State House. I am reaching out to hopefully get as many plumbers and industry business owners to attend as we can. You do not have to speak if you do not want to, just showing up and signing in your support will be very helpful.

SB 362 treats and defines a "Certified Service Plumber" as "any person who as a plumbing apprentice has completed at least 2,080 hours of direct supervision by a certified service plumber or journeyman plumber of incidental repair, installation, and maintenance of plumbing" as defined in rules adopted by the Mechanical Licensing Board. This will allow Certified Service Plumbers the ability to do certain common work, without the presence of a Journeyman, and they will be able to do so after just one year of Apprentice training.

This effort will save us all costs, including the homeowner, and allow for more flexibility in our businesses. If you can attend, please let us know. Please sign and send back the page below, as soon as possible.

My name is Jesse Doucette. I am the chairman of the Mechanical Licensing Board. I wanted to take this time to update you with regards to the status of where we are in the process of revising our rules. This update is in response to SB 362. We had a meeting in addition to our regular board meeting on January 27, 2022, and have scheduled another additional meeting for February 23<sup>rd</sup>. These meetings are in addition to the regularly scheduled meeting. We have been given a timeline of 4-9 months from OPLC staff to have these proposed rule changes through the rule making process.

The proposed rules changes will allow all apprentices to remain under the Federal Apprenticeship program and describe procedures so that all apprentices will be under Direct Supervision in years 1 and 2 and general Supervision in years 3 and 4. We believe this will aid companies in employing and retaining more apprentices. Please feel free to reach out to me with any questions or concerns.
