Summary of testimony presented in support:

Senator Jay Kahn

- Cheshire County is a rural county and broadband has been a significant issue.
- In the last legislative session, they created a broadband matching grant fund.
- The BIA administers this program which is up and running with staff to organize it.
- Cellular service in the state of NH is still very spotty
- There are cell phone deserts throughout the state
- Communities are at a disadvantage when they cannot provide good wireless service.
- For business and community groups it is an economic disadvantage.
- It has been 25 years since he got his first cellphone and he still cannot it in certain areas.
- This legislation allows municipalities and cell phone service providers to apply for broadband matching grant funds to upgrade local cell phone service.
- This need is not just for the convenience of using a cell phone.
- One of the police chiefs in his district told him that he gets 911 calls that drop and he cannot reach the caller when he calls back.
- In the more rural communities public safety can depend on the wireless service.
- He knows that not all broadband funding can be used for this purpose. allowed to be used for this.
- This is enabling legislation and allows means for the funding to be explored.
- The department is looking for the legislature to provide some leadership which they will take and develop.
- The department requested that part B of the bill be deleted and he is in agreement with that.

Representative Andrew Maneval

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- In addition to representing Cheshire County, he is a Select Board member in the town of Harrisville.
- Many times, people have approached him with questions and complaints about cell service.
- They have trouble attracting families and businesses to their area due to lack of wireless and broadband services.
- Those qualities, cell and broadband, are a significant part of our daily lives.
- They have completed their negotiations for broadband expansion and now have turned their attention to cell service.
- Leaders in his community have had many requests to work towards making this better.
- This bill is just one small part of the process and will be very valuable part.

Henry Underwood - South West Region Planning Commission

- Monadnock is a rural region that is underserved with both high speed internet and wireless service.
- Approximately 13% of Cheshire County households lack internet access at any speed and 10% do not have access to a computer or a smart phone.
- Most internet subscribers cannot obtain connectivity speeds at the minimum defined by the SEC.
- Wireless providers lack incentives to develop wireless infrastructure.
- Lower population density and hilly terrain make this an even bigger challenge.
- Since the adoption of the broadband plan for South West NH in 2014, a variety of broadband champions have continued to draw attention to the issue of wireless service.
- Just ten years ago 35% of adults nationwide had a smart phone, today it is up to 85%.
- In some cases, this is a households only means of internet access.
- South West NH needs a broad array of wireless service including from cellular providers.
