Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

 - I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:
 - (a) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate, one from the majority party and one from the minority party.
 - (b) Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, one from the majority party and one from the minority party.
 - II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties of the committee.
 - 3 Duties.
 - I. The committee shall study:
 - (a) The specific, individually identifiable information included on the worksheets;
 - (b) How that specific individually identifiable information is used by the department of state's division of vital records administration and the department of health and human services;
 - The process for de-identifying and aggregating the data for use in statistical analyses;
 - The specific privacy and security protections of individually identifiable data applicable under state and federal law;
 - (e) To what extent the mother may elect to decline to share the data;
 - (f) Any federal requirements to share individually identifiable data; and
 - (g) Any other related information the committee believes relevant.
 - II. In completing the study, the committee shall solicit input from the department of state's division of vital records administration and the department of health and human services, as well as any other entity the committee finds relevant.
 - 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members at the first meeting. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 30 days of the effective date of this section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.

Bill Analysis: This bill establishes a committee to study the information collected as part of the live birth worksheet as required by the division of vital records administration under RSA 5-C:19 and 5-C:20.

Summary of testimony presented in support: Senator Rosenwald

- This bill establishes a committee to study the information collected as part of the live birth worksheet as required by the division of vital records administration under RSA 5-C:19 and 5-C:20.
- The proposed committee will study the information collected by the Division of Vital Records at the time of birth.
- NH is the only state that does not house vital records in the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) as of 2003 when it was moved to the Secretary of State (SOS) as part of a budget trailer bill to combine vital records with other records maintained by the state.
- At the time, the ACLU expressed privacy concerns, but there was no discussion.
- The move was made prior to HIPPA enactment; DHHS is covered by HIPPA privacy requirements, but the SOS is not.

- Vital records issues a birth certificate that contains certain birth details such as when/where the birth occurred and name of parents and it makes sense that this information is housed at the Secretary of State.
- However, additional information is collected from the hospital or birthing center and mother that is later transferred to the SOS, that is eventually used in deidentified form by the Division of Public Health which is located at DHHS.
- The worksheet used to collect this information is not publicly available but can be viewed privately.
- Mother is required to provide information that includes her medical record number, height and weight (pre and post pregnancy), alcohol and smoking use.
 Mother is not given the opportunity to opt-out and is told that lying is a class b felony. The facility also sends confidential information about the mother that includes the date of last period, whether or not she is breast feeding, medical procedures during child birth, her conditions and risks, and drug use.
- Senator Rosenwald is concerned about this private information being housed in a location that is not covered by HIPPA.
- Breaches of protected health information can and do occur in NH and it is almost impossible to undue.
- There are options to consider including moving vital records back to DHHS and changing how birthing facilities transfer information.

Senator Reagan asked about committee membership. Senator Rosenwald has no issue if the committee changes the committee composition.

Senator Reagan asked why the study committee was suggested instead of a bill that made the changes. Senator Rosenwald explained that this is more than a policy decision and that there are cost factors to consider.

Representative Jesse Edwards is in favor of this bill. He participated in a HHS oversight review and privacy audit and reports that DHHS was very open to participating in the audit.
