Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Department of Health and Human Services; Department of Education; COVID-19 dashboard. 1 I. The department of health and human services and the department of education shall 2 develop mutually standardized daily reporting criteria for schools and school districts. 3 II. The department of health and human services shall update the COVID-19 dashboard for 4 all positive cases of COVID-19 in each school and school district regardless of whether a school is 5 6 conducting classes remotely or in person. 7
  - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

# Summary of testimony presented in support:

#### Senator Prentiss

NH Senate District 5

- Re-opening decisions should be data driven.
- Schools with in-person learning report their cases. Schools doing remote learning do not report their COVID cases. If the school is in remote status, and staff or students test positive, it is not reported as a school case, but instead the case is reported as community transmission.
- Not all schools report to the state. Some maintain their own dashboards for COVID-19 reporting.
- Senator Whitley said, she has heard similar issues and desires for accurate data. She then asked, what have you heard about a lack of state guidance for school boards in your communities?

- o Senator Prentiss said there is a specific set of guidance on the dashboard provided by the state, but some schools are maintaining their own dashboard and there is a concern that there is a lack of guidance in schools maintaining on their own dashboard.
- Senator Bradley said, there could be a non-legislative solution to this problem.

## **David Wieters**

NH Department of Health and Human Services

- Mr. Wieters said that he manages the electronic dashboards and the system could be improved.
- Mr. Wieters said he acknowledged the two different perspectives.
  - (1) Students going to school with COVID-19 are at a higher risk at transmitting the virus.
  - o (2) It is certainly understandable why the individual school dashboard is valuable to communities as well.

• Ms. Brennan said she was here to answer any questions.

### **Brian Hawkins**

NEA-NH

- Mr. Hawkins said that he preferred to resolve this with non-legislative action because it would be quicker.
- Mr. Hawkins said he had an issue with level of guidance provided to schools in respect to how they report.
- Mr. Hawkins said he is concerned that if a student that does not test positive
  that day while they are in school, then that day is not counted as a day when the
  case is active, even though if infected, the student may be contagious on that
  day.
