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## SUMMARY OF BILLS TO AMEND COUNTY RSAs

<u>Overview:</u> This document organizes the seven bills introduced to the Municipal & County Government Committee at a Public Hearing on 11 January 2023 into two general categories. The categories are dollar thresholds and clarity/consistency.

### **DOLLAR THRESHOLDS:** Four bills are in this category.

HB 148: Amends RSA 28:8 to raise the threshold for competitive bidding on purchases from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

<u>HB 75:</u> Amends RSA 28:8-a to raise the threshold for competitive bidding for the sale of personal property from \$300 to \$3,000.

<u>HB 87:</u> Amends RSA 24:13, I to raise the threshold for erection, enlargement, or repair of buildings from \$5,000 to \$25,000. There is a forthcoming amendment to HB 87 to add clarity to the grammar and verbiage of this RSA.

<u>HB 83:</u> Amends RSA 28:5 and RSA 28:7-to delete the thresholds and add a cross-reference to RSA 24:13, I for clarity and to reduce the possibility of future errors when the threshold is changed. It also deletes RSA 30-B:2 which is entirely redundant.

## **CLARITY/CONSISTENCY:** Three bills are in this category.

HB 41: Repeals RSA 24:9-d and replaces with language that cross-references RSA 91-A:2 for meeting notices. It also amends RSA 24:14-a to add a 7-day notice for public hearings pursuant to supplemental appropriations. This 7-day notice is consistent with language for public hearings relative to county bonds as described in RSA 33:10.

HB 80: Amends RSA 72:23, II to clarify the list of lands and buildings used by counties for governmental purposes that are exempt from taxation. It also includes a cross-reference to RSA 72:23, I(b) for land and buildings that are subject to taxation.

HB 43: Amends RSA 28:8-c and 28:8-d, I to clarify County Commissioner authority relative to property (both real property and personal property) and distinguish it from the county convention's authority relative to real estate. RSA 24:13 clearly enumerates specific authority to the county convention for all matters pertaining to real estate (acquisition, sale, use, and conveyance) as well as the erection, enlargement, or repair of buildings. All matters involving real or personal property — to include disposal-are the

AN ACT to raise the minimum value of county purchases of equipment or materials which

are subject to competitive bidding.

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Three

AN ACT

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to raise the minimum value of county purchases of equipment or materials which are subject to competitive bidding.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Repeal. RSA 28:8-f, relative to competitive bidding in Rockingham county, is repealed.
  - 2 Competitive Bidding on Purchases. Amend RSA 28:8 to read as follows:
- 28:8 Competitive Bidding on Purchases.
- I. The provisions of this section shall apply to all counties in the state and the offices of county sheriff, county attorney, county treasurer, and register of deeds.
- II. Any purchase of equipment or materials made by a county in an amount exceeding [\$5,000] \$10,000 shall be by competitive bidding, provided that the county commissioners by unanimous vote may waive the provisions for such bidding. In case the commissioners so vote a copy of such action shall be recorded in their offices with a statement of the reason therefor and such record shall be open to public inspection. Orders for equipment or material to be delivered at different times where the single delivery may be less than [\$5,000] \$10,000 but the total order exceeds that amount shall be construed as coming within the provisions hereof requiring competitive bidding.
  - 3 Competitive Bidding; Hillsborough County. Amend RSA 28:8-e, I to read as follows:
- I. All purchases made by Hillsborough County for materials, equipment, supplies, services, insurance, building repairs or any other item, in an amount exceeding [\$5,000] \$10,000 shall be by competitive bidding. Awards for such purchases shall be made to the lowest responsible bidder. Orders for purchases to be delivered at different times where the single delivery may be less than [\$5,000] \$10,000, but the total order exceeds that amount shall be construed as coming within the provisions of this section requiring competitive bidding.
  - 4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
