TESTIMONY 252 opens at 1:50 pm

Rep. Comtois presents the bill. Bill is seeking to address negative impacts to farms in regard to noise ordinances. The bill outlines needs and will require an amendment exempting Agri-tourism. The need stems from a farmer spraying per best practice use of sprays, and the tractor noise posed concerns in a community. Farming noises were due to the required considerations for best practice. What is the balance between municipalities and farming. Only able to feed 6% of our population currently in NH.

Rep. Knab asks about exceptions for farming at the municipal level.

Rep. Comtois unsure of how many exceptions there are out there but notes the adverse effects on farming.

- Chair Aron, asks about line 7: bylaws and ordinances amend RSA47 she thinks it may be RSA 47:17 would like to check the section of where there 21:34:a
- Rep. Bixby asks about powers of municipalities and home rule, or does that power need to be given to them by the state?

Rep. Comtois - believes that the state has delegated that power.

- Rep. Morse is there anything about the size of the farm or does a person with 3 chickens qualify? Does urbanity vs. rural nature come into play?
- Rep. Comtois Farm refers to the definition of farming per the RSA States that there is a clear distinction between homeowners having a few chickens, but

Rep. Murray asks about Homesteads included in farming.

Rep. Comtois says that there is possibly an intersection of these things.

Rep. Knab asks if logging is included Rep. Comtois says, yes it does.

Natch Grays, NH Municipal Assn – does OPPOSE the legislation. Speaks to 47:17 agreeing this should be the correct area of law. Says farming is a broad def. Says that municipalities do have the authority to use noise ordinances about decibels and decibel levels. Open to debate at town meetings, robust conversations based on what your town does.

Does note there is training to NH Municipal Members.

Rep. Bixby asks about exclusions to Agri-tourism and would that make it more palatable to the NH Municipal Assn?

Mr. Grays: our position it to protect local municipalities.

Rob Johnson, NH Farm Bureau – passes out definition of Farming (RSA 21:34-a) Speaks to membership composition. Has been a bureau for nearly 100 years. SUPPORTS HB 252. Has heard of complaints based on a myriad of issues relative to farming activities, but speaks to the flexible nature of the farming industry and weather related issues or other needs.

Agri-tourism is included in this area.

Rep. Knab, shares concerns about the broad nature – Mr. Johnson does note that it is broad.

Rep. Knab asks about equine being included in farming. Mr. Johnson says, yes, equestrian facilities are included in farming.

Rep. Aron – asks about penalties, implications of intrusion in farming.

Mr. Johnson states that it runs the spectrum of penalties imposed. Speaks to the various types of member concerns that have been brought to his attention. Feels that this presents stresses to farmers in their communities. Feels like we need to set some parameters.

Rep. Bixby – right to farm statute in our RSAs in our statutes and how it intersects.

Mr. Johnson says that does intersect with this legislation and notes that he is going to bring that info to the committee.

Mr. Johnson notes that it is RSA 432: 32-35 - Nuisance Liability of Agricultural Operations
