Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Subdivision; Public Deposit Investment Pool. Amend RSA 6 by inserting after section 44 $\mathbf{2}$ the following new subdivision:

Public Deposit Investment Pool

 $\mathbf{4}$ 6:45 Public Deposit Investment Pool.

I. The state treasurer shall, with the assistance of the advisory committee created under $\mathbf{5}$ 6 RSA 6:47, establish and operate a public deposit investment pool, for the purpose of investing funds 7 of the state, and funds under the custody of governmental units, pooled risk management programs 8 established pursuant to RSA 5-B, agencies, authorities, commissions, boards, political subdivisions 9 and all other public units within or instrumentalities of the state.

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10 II. The public deposit investment pool shall be operated under contract with a private 11 investment advisor, approved by the state treasurer and advisory committee. The state treasurer 12and advisory committee shall choose an investment advisor by requesting proposals from advisors 13and reviewing such proposals based on criteria adopted by rule under RSA 6:46.

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III. The state treasurer shall make available to prospective depositors detailed information 15on the public deposit investment pool, similar to that information generally contained in a securities 16prospectus. The state treasurer shall also ensure that periodic statements of accounts and reports 17on holdings are provided to pool participants relative to their proportionate share of the pool.

IV. The state treasurer shall cause an independent audit of the pool to be conducted on an 18 19annual basis. The auditor shall be selected by the advisory committee.

20V. The state treasurer shall charge the public deposit investment pool any actual costs 21incurred by the department for the operation of the pool as well as any expenses of department 22personnel assisting in the operation of the pool. The cost for personnel assisting in the operation of 23the pool shall be determined in accordance with the per diem examination charge established in RSA 24383:11, I, provided that the requirement that no entity shall be charged or pay less than one full day 25shall not apply. The private investment advisor retained under paragraph II shall be responsible for 26processing any invoice submitted for the actual costs incurred by the department and the expenses of 27department personnel under this paragraph.
