AN ACT relative to a statewide facility condition assessment for school buildings.

This bill encourages school districts to provide the department of education with long range capital improvement program outlines.

HB 365 - AS INTRODUCED

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Three

AN ACT

relative to a statewide facility condition assessment for school buildings.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 School Building Aid; Grant for School Construction. Amend RSA 198:15-a, V to read as 2 follows:

3 V. The department of education shall develop and maintain a 10-year school facilities plan of 4 potential school building grant projects. Potential projects shall include, but not be limited to. 5 criteria pursuant to RSA 198:15-c, II(b). The 10-year plan is intended to create a method to identify 6 and enhance school facilities in a safe, healthy, and efficient manner while providing adequate 7 learning environments for New Hampshire's students. The 10-year plan shall be updated every 8 biennium to provide the department a summary of projects and school facility capital expenditures that are anticipated for the next 10 years. [The state board of education shall-adopt rules pursuant 9 10 to RSA 541 A relative to this paragraph.] The plan shall identify new construction, renovation, and 11 emergency projects, and describe the overall condition of projects contained in the plan. In support 12of the 10-year plan, it is recommended that each district have in place and provide the $\mathbf{13}$ department a long-range capital improvement program that identifies school facility goals, provides projected expenditures, and outlines procedures and guidelines to be ' 14 15followed to accomplish goals. Each district is encouraged to review and update the 16 district's anticipated school facility capital improvement plan on a 2-year recurring basis 17 or as needed. The department shall use this information to better plan, prioritize, and 18 project new anticipated capital construction and renovation expenditures relative to the 19 state building aid program. The state board of education shall adopt rules pursuant to 20 RSA 541-A relative to this paragraph.

21 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

Summary of testimony presented:

Madame Chair of the Committee, Senator Ruth Ward, recessed the hearing for HB 365 at 9:01 A.M.

Madame Chair of the Committee, Senator Ruth Ward, reconvened the hearing for HB 365 at 9:06 A.M.

Representative Linda Tanner

Sullivan County – District 5

- Representative Linda Tanner introduced HB 365 on behalf of Representative Rick Ladd.
- HB 365 related to facility condition assessments for public school buildings.
- Rep. Tanner said there were many school buildings that were aging and in need of repair.

- Rep. Tanner shared that Sunapee had an elementary school built over a century ago.
 - Efforts at getting bonds from the State to replace the school had failed to receive a 2/3rd vote from the Town Council.
 - Lack of substantial funds resulted in upgrades being performed intermittently.
 - Rep. Tanner described the situation as a piece-meal process and pointed to the utilization of portable classrooms in her district.
- A State Department engineer had been working with Rep. Ladd to develop public school building aid.

Amy Clark

Administrator For School Safety, Department of Education

- Ms. Clark offered technical assistance to aid in the Committee's understanding of HB 365.
- HB 365 simply recommended for schools to have long-range capital plans in place for their facilities.
- Sen. Fenton asked who was currently responsible for the evaluation of capital improvement for school districts.
 - Ms. Clark shared that each district respectively was responsible for operations, maintenance, and long-term capital planning.
 - Ms. Clark pointed to the Department of Education's Building Aid Program, which provided grants to finance significant construction projects.
 - Building Aid grants were exclusively permitted for full rebuilds and full renovations, not merely repairs or updates.
 - Appropriations were not made for the Building Aid Program in the preceding biennium.
- HB 365 was amended to instruct school districts to have facility assessments so they may improve and contribute to the Department of Education's determination of grant priority.
- Sen Lang noted that there was no explicit direction to submit facility assessments to the Department of Education in HB 365.
- Sen. Lang asked if lines 19 and 20, prescribing the State Board of Education to make rules pursuant to RSA 541-A, would ultimately satisfy the requirement for report submission.
 - Ms. Clark confirmed Sen. Lang's assessment.
- Sen. Ward asked if there were criteria determining what school districts should be evaluating in their facility assessments.
 - Ms. Clark said the industry utilized a Facility Condition Index, which was standard across the country.

- There were ten points of criteria, which included but were not limited to the building envelope, floors, walls, and conveyer systems.
- The school district would hire an engineering firm to conduct the facility condition assessments.
