Summary of testimony presented:

Representative Maureen Mooney

Hillsborough - District 12

- Representative Mooney Introduced HB 71.
- Rep. Mooney described HB 71 as a repeal of RSA 194-B:11-I.(e), the charter school funding chapter of New Hampshire Law
- HB 71 was written as an exact duplicate of SB 25, which was also introduced in the 2023 session.
 - o Rep. Mooney shared that SB 25 left the Senate Education Committee with a unanimous recommendation of ought to pass in January of 2023.
 - o The legislation also passed the full Senate via voice vote later that same month.
- HB 71 came at the request of the New Hampshire Department of Education.
- According to Rep. Mooney, a change in statute caused the charter school's reporting requirement within the specified RSA to be moot.

- o Previously, additional charter school money would be determined by the finance committee.
- o Rep. Mooney shared that currently, the standard practice to provide charter schools with additional money was to have the Department of Education draw a warrant, which negated the fiscal committee.
- Despite the reports no longer being necessary, the Department of Education would still produce them. Rep. Mooney said the Department used approximately 15 hours of staff time to produce each report.
- Reports on charter school funding could be found on the New Hampshire Department of Education's website.
- HB 71 passed 16-4 in the House Education Committee.
- Rep. Mooney described the bill as straightforward, and said it had considerable support in both chambers.
- HB 71 ought to be used to repeal the reporting provision in RSA 194-B:11-I.(e) per the request of the Department of Education.

Caitlin Davis

New Hampshire Department of Education

- Sen. Ward asked if HB 71 was considered a technical correction.
 - o Ms. Davis agreed and said enrollments and the Department's payment data were available online.
 - Ms. Davis further said that the reporting requirement was a carry-over from when the Department of Education had less authority over the funding of charters.
 - o Ms. Davis said that considering the fiscal committee had not demonstrated interest or inquiry regarding the annual reports, they did not provide much value to anybody.
