

- Kate Horgan stated that HB 83 simply increases the threshold for the county commissioners to repair, enlarge, or erect county buildings from \$5,000 to \$25,000.
- Ms. Horgan pointed out that the statute altered by this bill has not been updated since the mid-1980s.
- Senator Gray stated that due to the similar subject matter, Amendment #1066s has been drafted for this bill, which combines the language of HB 75, HB 83, and HB 87.
 - Ms. Horgan stated that the NHAC has no issue with Senator Gray's amendment.

Testimony

Senate Election Law and Municipal Affairs Committee HB 83 relative to county commissioners' authority on county buildings.

Dear Senate Election Law and Municipal Affairs Committee Members,

This testimony introduces HB83 to your committee.

This bill updates the thresholds in RSA 28:5 and RSA 28:7 for county commissioners' authority to purchase real estate and repair, enlarge, or erect county buildings.

\$25,000 is a widely used threshold to distinguish capital project/repairs from non-capital project/repairs. Capital project/repairs are normally singled out for approval in the county budgeting process, so delegation oversight and approval of these larger projects would be accomplished during each budget cycle.

To account for inflation and the fact that not much can be done these days for non-capital improvement for up to \$5,000, it was unanimously accepted by the House that raising this threshold to \$25,000 was acceptable. It was felt that our county commissioners could make these decisions without calling a delegation meeting to proceed for these smaller projects. This streamlines the process for these smaller projects to go ahead without waiting for delegation meeting schedules and approval.

This bill as amended increases the expense thresholds to \$25,000 dollars for county commissioners' authority to purchase real estate and repair, enlarge, or erect county buildings and raises the monetary cap to \$25,000 dollars on the value of enlargements or repairs to county buildings. These thresholds have not been adjusted since the 1990's. Additionally, this legislation will increase the minimum value threshold from \$300 to \$3,000 dollars of county personal property subject to competitive bidding.
