Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Public Safety and Welfare; Delinquent Children; Juvenile Diversion. Amend introductory 2 paragraph RSA 169-B:10, I-a to read as follows:

I-a. If the arresting agency contemplates the initiation of court proceedings *involving a resident minor*, prior to filing a delinquency petition with the court, the arresting agency or prosecutor shall refer the minor to the department of health and human services for a voluntary needs assessment within 2 business days of arrest, to be completed as follows:

2 Public Safety and Welfare; Delinquent Children; Juvenile Diversion. Amend RSA 169-B:10, Ia(k) to read as follows:

9 (k) If the petition is filed prior to the referral and assessment, and the *resident* minor 10 has not had an assessment in the prior 6 months, the department shall make the assessment 11 available to the minor after the petition is filed and the confidentiality and admissibility of the 12 report and recommendations and related statements shall be treated the same as assessments 13 completed prior to the petition.

3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Bill Analysis: This bill clarifies that the juvenile justice voluntary needs assessments are for resident minors.

Summary of testimony presented in support:

Senator Carson introduced Senate Bill 43, relative to needs assessments for junior minors who are residents of the state of New Hampshire. She said that this bill clarifies that the needs assessments are for resident minors only. The underlying statute was passed in SB 94 (2021). The intention is to assess the needs of an individual minor as they become involved with the juvenile justice system. She said the needs assessments have been conducted for out of state minors, but it is difficult to enforce the findings of the needs assessments if the children are going back to Massachusetts, for example. She said that SB 43 clarifies that needs assessments should only be done if the child is from New Hampshire.

Joseph Ribsam, Director of the Division for Children, Youth, and Families, said SB 43 makes an amendment to SB 94 (2021), which was implemented in 2022. SB 94 (2021) created a new juvenile justice process, which includes a needs assessment that

tries to get children the correct services for their behaviors once they come into contact with the law enforcement process. He said one of the wrinkles they did not anticipate with the new system was the fact that New Hampshire borders a lot of other states. He said that they'll have children pick up a shoplifting charge at one of the malls along the Southern border and then they go through the needs assessment process with DCYF. However, since the child is not a resident of New Hampshire, DCYF cannot give that child the resources they need. This takes a lot of time and work by DCYF employees. He said that this is frustrating for both the children and the law enforcement officers involved since they are going through the process without the ability to receive any of the benefits. He said SB 43 clarifies that the needs assessment is only for children in New Hampshire.
