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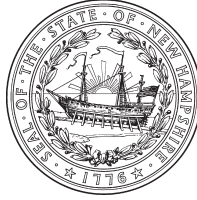

TO: ALL NEWLY ELECTED AND RE-ELECTED
MEMBERS OF THE STATE SENATE

RE: New Hampshire Constitution, Part Second

[Art.] 33. [Secretary of State to Count Votes for Senators and Notify Persons Elected.] And that there may be a due meeting of senators and representatives on the First Wednesday of December, biennially, the secretary of state shall, as soon as may be examine the returned copy of such records; and fourteen days before the first Wednesday of December, he shall issue his summons to such persons as appear to be chosen senators and representatives, by a plurality of votes, to attend and take their seats on that day.

Article 33, Part II of the New Hampshire Constitution requires the secretary of state to summon each person who has been chosen as a state senator to attend the opening session of the General Court.

Thus, in accordance with the examination of votes cast at the biennial election held November 7, 2006, you are hereby summoned to attend and take your seat as a state senator on Wednesday, December 6, 2006 at 1:00 p.m. in the Senate Chambers in the State House.
