2 New Section; State Veterans Council; Donations. Amend RSA 115 by inserting after section 7 the following new section:

115:8 Donations. The state veterans council may receive, on behalf of the state, all donations and bequests that may be made to support the delivery of state veterans council programs.

3 Effective Date.

I. Section 1 of this act shall take effect April 1, 2007.

II. The remainder of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

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The Internal Revenue Service has set the standard mileage rate for transportation expenses for 2007 at forty-eight and one-half cents (\$0.485) per mile. The federal mileage reimbursement rate for members of the NH Senate increases from forty-four and one-half cents (\$0.445) per mile to forty-eight and one-half cents (\$0.485) per mile for all miles incurred on or after January 1, 2007.
