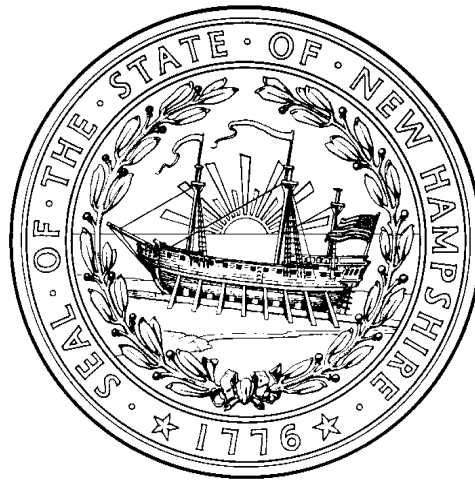

The standard mileage rate for transportation expenses set by the Internal Revenue Service has been modified. The standard mileage rate effective January 1st will be 54 cents per mile. The federal mileage reimbursement rate for members of the General Court decreases from fifty-seven and one half cents (\$0.575) per mile to fifty-four cents (\$0.54) per mile for all miles incurred on or after January 1, 2016.
